Iuka Man Killed in Wreck Last Wednesday

An Iuka man was killed in a one-car wreck last Wednesday morning on a country road just west of Woodall Mountain.

Bystanders outside at the scene about 10:40 a.m. December 10th said a truck went by at an apparent fast speed and then they heard the pop of a collision and went to see what had hap-

pened. A 1990-era pickup truck had gone over one tree and a mailbox and then crashed into a tree in front of the home of Glenn Marsh, 402 County Road 175. Subsequent explosions caused the driver's truck, and two trucks that were parked in the Marsh's yard to ignite, causing clouds of smoke that could be seen from a distance.

Rescue personnel from Midway, Burnsville, and Iuka Fire Departments, as well as the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department and highway patrol were on the remote scene shortly after the call was issued, but could do little to stop the fully involved vehicle fires. No one was in the two parked trucks, or at the Marsh home at the time of the collision.

The identity of the driver was unknown at the time of the wreck, according to officials on the scene. After the fire was put out, a cell phone was found where it had been thrown from the truck, aiding in the identification, which was confirmed by an autopsy.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, the victim was identified as Wayne Blythe, 66, of Iuka.

"He must have been in some kind of distress," explained Wilemon. He said Mr. Blythe, a local timber man, would not have usually been going fast on the curvy road.

Board Questions Miltec Needs at Tri-State Building

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors was firm in dealing with a Tri-State Commerce Park tenant who was looking for guidance on repairs to a county-owned building, asking him to produce proof of how many people he actually employs.

Ivey Penion of Miltec came to the board to ask for funding to repair Building 2031, which he explained has numerous maintenance and repair issues, including the need for a new roof, boiler system, and repairs to the fire protection system.

The total estimate for the repairs was \$115,000, Penion said. He said they were willing to make some investments, and that the only sense of urgency was the weather - he didn't want the fire protection system to freeze, which he indicated had occurred before.

Third District Supervi-

sor Danny Ryan, who was on the former Board when Miltec, a missile design, testing and manufacturing group, came to Tri-State Commerce Park with a promise back in 2002 of many more than the 13 jobs Penion reported, said he had rarely seen any cars there, and he wanted some evidence Miltec actually had anyone working at the site.

Penion admitted that Miltec is nowhere near its production or employment goals, but has not given up. Penion said current employees work in the offices of Building 1000, which is why cars at Building 2031 may not have been observed.

In Miltec's defense, Chancery Clerk Peyton Cummings said that Miltec is one of the county's best paying renters, and has paid \$82,500 this year.

Local Catholic Leader Scheduled to Move Away

The leader of the thriving local Catholic congregation has been scheduled for a move, and community church leaders say she will be hard to replace.

Her church is hosting a farewell reception for the lady affectionately known as "Sister" on January 3rd, from 4 to 6 p.m. in the Family Life Center of the Iuka United Methodist Church.

Officially a nun of the School Sisters of St. Francis Order, Sister Bernadette has served as Pastoral Minister to a growing congregation of Catholics in the Iuka area for the past seven years, but now her diocese has chosen to move her.

"I've been having such a good time saying, 'A Farewell to the Catholic nun at the Methodist Church,'" Sister Bernadette Engelhaupt quipped Tuesday of the planned reception.

In just a few minutes with this sweet lady, you can't help but be warmed by her joyful heart, but also impressed by her depth of knowledge and understanding of this world.

As the Pastoral Minister of the Catholic church in town, she leads a membership of about 50. Many adults have become involved in scripture study and adult study programs since she came in 2002, and that has been her favorite part of the ministry. Those are unusually high numbers for a community this size, says Sister.

But she is active in many other pursuits, too, including heading up the Catholic Social Services efforts for the area. Just on Tuesday, she was a little weary from seeing at least four families and individuals who needed some kind of assistance.

"I've seen four today, and I'm out of money to help them," she said, and she seemed saddened and frustrated. Social Services tries to meet financial and material needs for those who need

it, with funding from Sacred Heart Southern Missions of Walls, Mississippi. If she can't provide through that funding venue, she works with programs like Families First and Warm Neighbor Program to try to meet the needs.

Those in her congregation similarly are involved in showing Christ's love in a tangible way. The Good Samaritan Food Pantry originated with and has been organized in large part by members of this congregation, and they are active in many other community efforts.

Sister Bernadette has been a major force in the local pastoral community, too. She has worked with several area pastors on community worship services and in the administration of the Chaplain program at Iuka Hospital.

"She was one of the first to welcome me to the community," said Bro. Ronnie Hatfield of Iuka Baptist. When asked about Sister, he smiled fondly and explained how he would miss her - this is the response the mention of her name seems to evoke universally. "From the first I saw her vision and her heart to work together to minister to all the people in the community."

"She is just amazing, all the things she does, and she has such an incredible knowledge of scripture," Bro. Ronnie said. "She will be hard to replace."

In fact, the diocese has decided not to replace her.

"The diocese has decided on not refilling the ministerial position at this time," verified Sister. She said they plan to fill the duties with a nun from Booneville and the priest in Corinth.

And where will Sister go to?

First she will go to San Antonio, Texas, where she will participate in a sabbatical program for ministers who have been in full-time

ministry.

"It will be a time of updating my spirituality and theology, and time to integrate all the experience I've had in full-time ministry," she explained. Then she hopes to be reassigned somewhere closer to family members - South Dakota, Minnesota, Nebraska or Iowa.

Will she miss this Mississippi small town?

"Oh yes, I have loved my friends and all the people, and working with the pastors," she says. "But I won't miss the summers!"

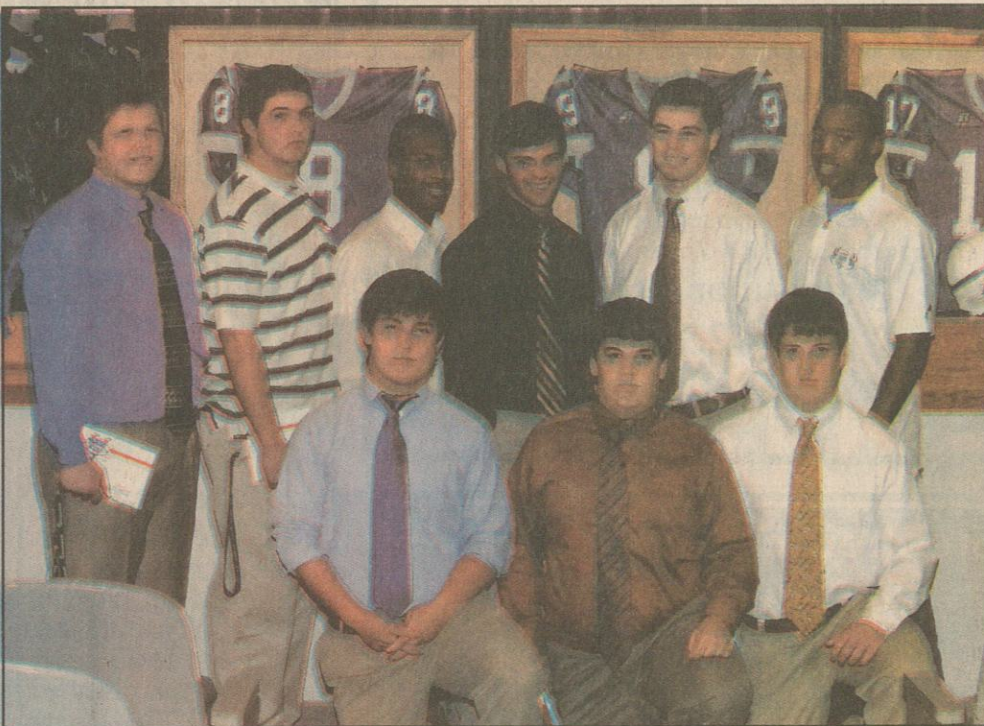

The TCHS Braves football players were recognized for their performance this past season at the annual Football Banquet last Thursday night.

Seniors and outstanding players, as well as the TC cheerleaders were recognized in an auditorium ceremony following a well-attended all-you-can eat supper for all the players, cheerleaders and their parents.

After the team awards were given, the players had some awards of their own for the coaches.

Afterwards, the seniors were presented by the

Touchdown Club with their jerseys, and a copy of the highlight film/slideshow that was shown later. Everyone enjoyed a film/slideshow presentation compiled by Artis Ezzell.

Individual Awards

Senior Tyler Pritchard was named to the All-State Team by the Mississippi Association of Coaches, and was also named Most Valuable Offensive Player in the All-District voting by all the coaches in the Division 1-4A District.

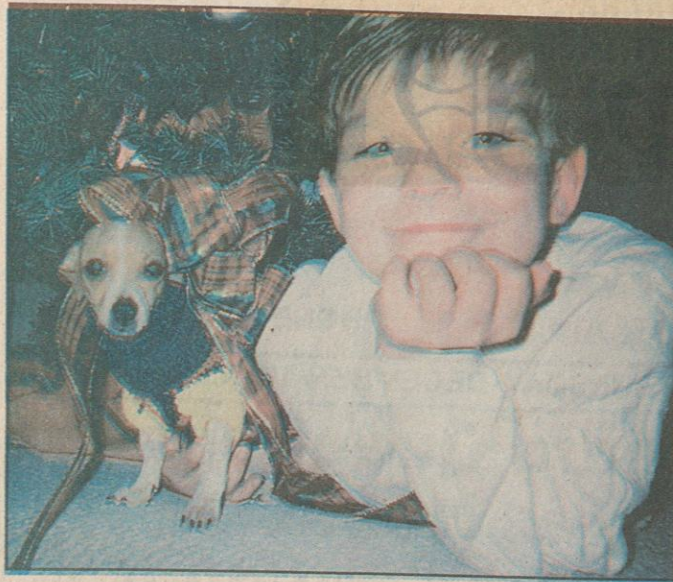
On the Braves team, players and coaches voted Pritchard Best Offensive Back on the strength of his

1,190 total rushing yards this season (fourth season in a row for 1,000 yards, some sources have reported). Coach Steve Carter further described his statistics: 157 rushing attempts, averaging 7.6 yards each; his longest rush was for 91 yards, and he had fourteen touchdowns. On punt returns, he was eleven out of 176, and on kick-off returns six for 206 (Carter said, "No one would kick to him!") As a receiver, he had 26 receptions for 391 yards,

averaging fifteen per game, and 35.5 yards. His longest reception was 46 yards, and he had one touchdown reception.

Pritchard was also named Team Captain, co-Best Offense Player, and co-Best Defensive Back with teammate Lee Griffin.

Senior quarterback Lee Griffin was named to the All-District Team as quarterback and defensive back.

On the Braves team, Griffin was named best Offensive Player with 115 rushing attempts for 562 yards and a per game average of 62 yards. His longest rushing attempt was 48 yards and he scored seven touchdowns for the Braves. He completed

56 of 92 passes for 743 yards - an outstanding average of 61 percent. He had only three interceptions, and four touchdown passes.

The ultimate all-around player, Griffin also earned Best Defensive Player, and Best Defensive Back honors (which he shared with Matt Davis and Tyler Pritchard, respectively.) As a defensive back, Griffin assisted in 69 tackles, and had 27 solo tackles, for a total of 96. He made four interceptions, and blocked one punt; caused one fumble and recovered two and broke up ten pass attempts.

Senior Matt Davis was named to the All-District

Team as tight end and linebacker.

The Braves teammates and coaches chose Davis as recipient of Best Receiver Award (shared with Steven Atkins) and Best Linebacker Award (shared with Jacob McDuffy.) As a receiver, Davis had 86 rushing attempts for 448 yards and an average per game of 41 yards. His longest rush was 86 yards, and he had thirteen rushing

touchdowns. Davis had sixteen receptions for 243 yards, and his longest reception was nineteen yards.

As linebacker, Davis had 54 tackles, eighteen of those solo, and fifteen of them for a loss. He had nine sacks, one caused fumble, broke up one pass, caused three hurries and blocked one punt.

Senior Steven Atkins received Honorable Mention for the All-District Team as kicker and punter. The Braves recognized him as one of two Best Receivers. He had eight rushing attempts for 65 yards and a long rush of 26 yards. He had six successful receptions for 184 yards, and two touchdowns.

Junior Jonathan Whirley was named to the Division 1-4A All-District Team for his outstanding performance on the Braves offensive line. Coach Carter said he "is looking forward to even greater things next year from this college prospect as he leads the Braves as a senior next year."

Sophomore Jacob McDuffy received votes for an Honorable Mention on the All-District Team, and was chosen as co-Best Linebacker by his team. He had 102 tackles, eighteen of those solo; and two tackles for loss, and caused one fumble.

Co-Best Defensive Line-man honors went to juniors Harrison Brown and Andrew

Quillen. Brown had 70 tackles; eleven solo. He had three sacks and nine hurries.

Quillen had 79 tackles, 25 solo, and eleven tackles and one sack. He caused one fumble, recovered two fumbles, and caused five hurried pass attempts.

Braves chose as Most Improved Brent Robinson and Josh Lyles. The Brave Award winners were Lee Griffin and Mike Mitchell.

We love you very much Diane and you will be missed by us terribly.

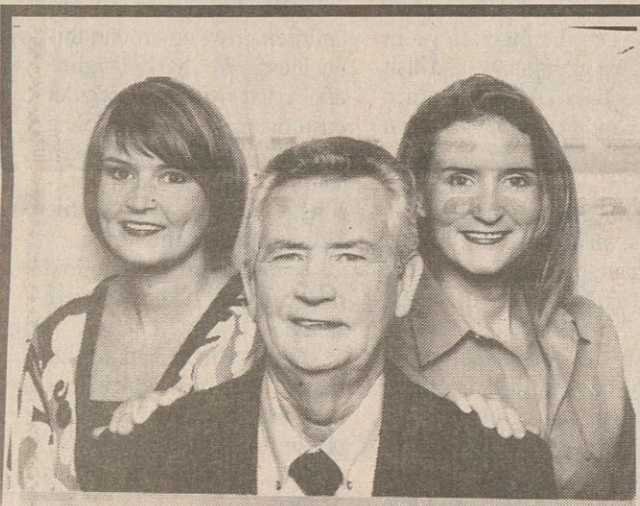
