Heavy Winds Down Old Tree - Phone & Cable Out

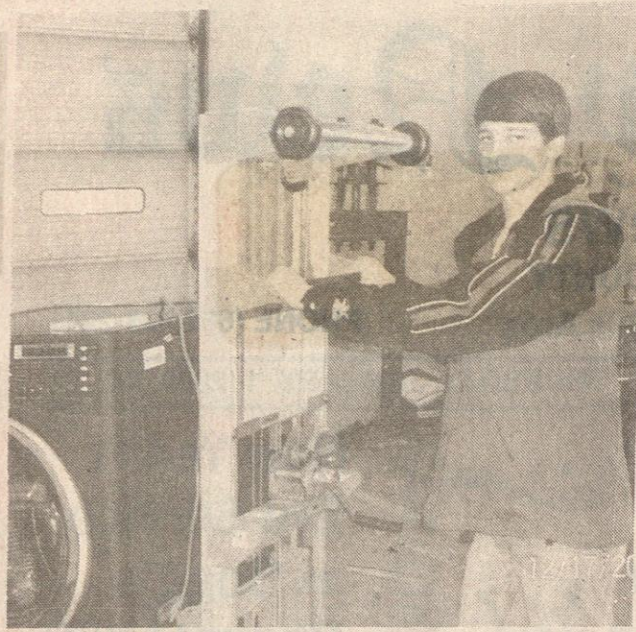
An unknown number of Iuka phone and cable customers experienced a temporary loss of service when heavy winds and soggy ground caused a large old oak tree to fall across Main Street.

At 8:08 Saturday night Tishomingo County 911 received the call of a downed tree on Main Street just north of Eastport.

The tree fell from the bank of the yard of the old Moss Rose home (c. 1845) one of the city's oldest homes, across the road onto the Iuka United Methodist Church property, blocking the road, and damaging phone lines.

Crews were working Monday to finish the cleanup and restore service.

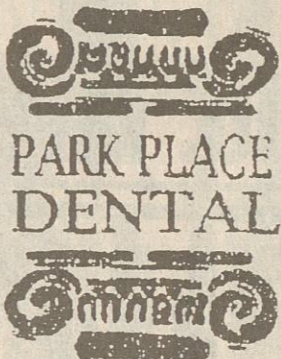


Pinholes And Squinting

Have you ever wondered why some people squint? They're trying to see better. When squinting, they're partly closing their eyelids in order to narrow the opening through which light is entering their eyes. This can sharpen the focus in the same way that narrowing the lens of a camera sharpens the picture.

If you wear glasses, you get the same effect by taking your glasses off and looking through a pinhole punched in a piece of paper. Without your glasses, your vision may be blurred, but by sharpening your focus by looking through the pinhole, objects can become clearer.

Squinting is not harmful, but it doesn't improve anyone's appearance, and it doesn't take care of the need for good vision. If you depend on squinting to see well, you'd be much better off by making an appointment for an eye examination to find out how your vision can be improved.

Log Rollings Cleared New Ground in Old Days

The booklet, *Moore-Millican Memoirs*, was compiled by Elma Lou Maxwell in 1966 for the Tom and Salla Millican Maxwell family. A copy was presented to the Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum in July 2008 in memory of Elma Lou Maxwell by Clint and Juanita Maxwell. The following excerpt was transcribed as it was written by RaNae Vaughn of the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society and its Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum.

One of the festive occasions of those days was a "Log Rolling" which was to clear "new ground" for new fields to cultivate and usually included the whole neighborhood. Some men would come with oxen and log chains, others with long

poles, saws and axes. They would assemble on the plot of ground to be cleared and on which the small growth

had been cut and the larger trees "belted" and left to die. When these trees were dry enough to burn, some would saw and cut them down, trim the limbs, and saw the trunks into manageable lengths. The men with the oxen and log chains would then hitch on to the logs and drag them to a desirable place where the men with long poles would roll or pile them into large stacks so that they could be burned. If the ground was heavily wooded, which it usually was, there would be several big piles. "Log Rollings" could be held

anytime during the year, but they usually occurred during damp weather in the late winter or early spring when the forest fire hazard was not so great and before spring land preparation for crops began.

The owner of the land did not pay for the help of

the men or the oxen, but he in turn would help his neighbors in the same manner when needed. All he had to do was furnish feed for the oxen and a bountiful dinner for everybody, and that called for food and more food to be prepared by the women.

When a "Log Rolling" was going to take place at the Tom Millican place, preparations began days

before. Plans had to be made and food prepared—calf, hog, or goat had to be butchered, tables made longer, and the whole house had to be spick-and-span throughout. Choice recipes were brought out and dusted off such as Lucy Ann's clabbered milk custard pie, Ella's red-green salad (hard-boiled eggs, pickled in red beet vinegar with shred fresh green onions and tender collard buds mixed with sweet

cream), Sarah Millican's corn lightbread, beef or mutton hash, and other food to load down the table, and gallons and gallons of coffee.

"Log Rollings" were one of the gay occasions of

the entire year. Everybody looked forward to the next one, with all the good times and fun and most of all the good eats. The youngsters would take over with a party and frolic after all the logs had been rolled. They had music, dancing, and lots to eat, and sometimes with "possum" and sweet potatoes roasted in the low-burning coals and ashes of the log fires out under the stars. The gaiety always lasted well into the wee hours of the morning, and everybody went home looking forward to the next "Log Rolling."

This is apparently a kick back from a time when the South was mostly unsettled, and black eyed peas were fed to the cattle. At one point, no supplies coming in or out, the settlers had to eat the black eyed peas fed to the cattle to survive a harsh winter until supplies could come, and it was the black eyed peas that were meant for the cattle that kept them alive.
