Pleas heard in circuit court

The January 2008 session of Tishomingo County Circuit Court began last Thursday with a day. Pleas for several cases were heard, but more are set to be heard January 20th. A trial will be heard Wednesday, January 21st, reported Donna Dill, Circuit Court Clerk.

On Thursday, January 8th, the following pleas were heard by Circuit Judge Jim Pounds:

Karen Cornelius, of 110 West Street, Burnsville, pleaded guilty to one count of prescription fraud and was sentenced to five years with the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC), with credit for time served and the balance suspended, and two years of post-sentence supervision. She also was ordered to enter into a payment plan to pay \$999.50 in fines, fees, and court costs.

Roger Dale Sparks, of 815 Highway 30, Tishomingo, pleaded guilty to possession of a motor vehicle with an altered VIN, and one count of possession, transfer or distribution of a chemical or controlled substance with intent to unlawfully manufacture a controlled substance. He was sentenced to 8 years with MDOC, all suspended and five years of supervised probation. He was also ordered to enter into a payment plan to pay \$2,140.50 in fines, fees and court costs.

House Fire Claims Life of Iuka Man

Jim Walker, 83, died in a house fire near Indian Creek in the early hours of last Thursday morning.

On his way to work January 8th at 5:38 a.m., Jimmy Hughes, a volunteer with Eastport-Mill Creek Volunteer Fire Department, saw the home at 258 County Road 256 already completely burned and called 911.

When fire fighters from Eastport-Mill Creek, Coleman Park and Iuka Fire Department arrived on the scene, all the wood of the two-story home was already burned up; the block-wall basement contained all that was left of the Walker home.

Mr. Walker, 83, most likely died as a result of smoke inhalation, according to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, who was at the scene. His remains were located later in the day by investigators. Wilemon said he was likely on the second floor at the time of the fire.

The cause of the fire will probably never be known, but Tishomingo County Fire Investigator Brian Grissom and the state fire marshal inspected the devastated scene Thursday. They believe the fire started in the south central portion of the home.

Phase II of Midway School Renovation Started

A second phase of renovation of the historic Midway School building started in December and will result in more improvements to the picturesque schoolhouse at Midway.

Improvements paid for by a \$100,000 grant from the Community Heritage Preservation Grant program include additional floor cement in a second classroom and on the stage, reported by Nelson, curator for the

Midway School Museum, and one of the Midway Homemakers, who are the stewards for the building. It is actually still owned by the Tishomingo County School District.

Many other interior and exterior improvements will also be included in the second phase. These are in addition to \$47,500 worth of work already completed on the building in a previous phase of renovation.

Local funds of \$9,500 were a

part of phase one, and spoke volumes of the public's response to the need to preserve this piece of county history, said Nelson. Rentals of the historic structure for reunions, birthdays and other events have tripled since the last round of improvements were made.

All the Commissioners were elected in the November election. On Friday, several of them were at the courthouse working on updating the voter rolls.

More than \$5 Million Awarded by Tri-State Educational Foundation

More than five million dollars in scholarships have been awarded since the founding of the Tri-State Educational Foundation in 1998.

The charitable organization that was formed to receive the proceeds from the Riverhills Bingo operation on U.S. Highway 72 in Iuka now funds scholarships and other educational grants to graduates from not only Tishomingo County, but also students of all ages from a 50-mile radius surrounding Iuka.

In accordance with Mississippi law, bingo operations like the ones in Tishomingo County must support a charitable organization. For Riverhills, it is the Tri-State Educational Foundation.

Origins

In July of 1998, after many months of filing papers and answering questions, Dr. and Mrs. Bob Ferguson of Iuka, MS were awarded a non-profit, (501-c3), certificate by the Federal Government to operate the Foundation.

The purpose of the Foundation was, and is, to award monetary grants and scholarships to eligible and selected applicants who have needs and goals related to education. The first of many scholarships were awarded in April of 2000.

The Foundation is governed by a five member Board of Directors who operate under local by-laws, and state and Federal laws and regulations. Audits are con-

ducted monthly, annually and unscheduled. Day to day activities are conducted by an Executive Director and a part-time secretary.

Since that April date in 2000, over \$5,100,000.00 has been awarded in scholarships and grants to recipients residing in the service area. Residents and other non-profit organizations of Tishomingo County receive priority consideration.

Grant awards total over \$800,000.00 and have ranged in amounts from a few hundred dollars to several thousands of dollars and have been used to defray expenses for such things as underwriting field trips and convention cost for students and teachers, for students to attend state and national competitions, for purchasing reading, science and math materials and equipment for schools, for training employees for certain occupations and to support the local Boys and Girls Club as well as the local heritage museum.

In addition, grants have also been awarded for such needs as buying gasoline and paying for childcare for students who must drive to school, don't have jobs and no one to keep their child. Grant funds are also being expended to pay the cost of testing for eligible GED participants and

to defray tuition cost for twenty-nine local teachers to earn their Master's degree from Delta State University.

Many area teacher assistants are participating in a program partially funded by the Foundation and co-operatively conducted by Mississippi State University and Northeast Mississippi Community College that provides an avenue allowing them to earn credit hours toward a teaching degree. Also, funds are expended to support programs for students and teachers at the Crow's Neck Environmen-

tal and Education Center and to help pay for the training of welders in a program administered by Northeast Mississippi Community College.

Scholarship funds have also been awarded in amounts ranging from a few hundred dollars, to buy books or a lunch ticket, to several thousands of dollars used to defray tuition and other cost over a period of several semesters. These awards are based primarily on need and are supplemental to other scholarships and grants that an applicant

might receive. Such funds are paid directly to the school, college or university and since the year 2000 over 1080 students have been awarded scholarships totaling almost \$4,300,000.00.

Scholarship funds are not limited to college students or to recent high school graduates. Awards are often made to persons who wish to enter some vocational training program such as nursing, welding, diesel mechanics, law enforcement, aviation, and cosmetology. Funds have also been awarded for teachers to earn advanced degrees, to become Board Certified teachers, and to become re-certified in a different field. Many of these participants have been out of school for varying lengths of time.

TRI STATE scholarship recipients attend schools all over the country. But most remain in or near Mississippi. For example, since 2000, the Foundation has made payments and has obligated scholarship and grant funds for the following total, rounded, amounts to nearby colleges and universities:

- Northeast Mississippi Community College - \$1,200,000.00
- Itawamba Community College - \$260,000.00
- The University of Mississippi - \$806,000.00
- Mississippi State University - \$670,000.00
- Delta State University - \$440,000.00
- The University of North Alabama - \$430,000.00

The intent of Dr. and Mrs. Ferguson, their Board of Directors and the staff of the Tri State Educational Foundation is to give people in need an opportunity at bettering themselves and making a worthwhile contribution to their community through an educational endeavor. Treating A

If you were injured in a fight when you were young, you probably have a black eye or a black eye with a black eye. But exceptions.

If a blow or injury to the eye is severe enough to cause a "black eye" under the eyelid, the eye may also have been injured. Some of the complications are serious.

Master Gardener Classes Begin February 24th

Do you want to be a Master Gardener?

Applications are being accepted in Tishomingo County for anyone who wants to sharpen their horticultural skills and share that knowledge with others.

Mississippi State University's Extension Service is conducting the Master Gardener training program on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. beginning February 24th and ending April 2nd at the Extension Office in the Courthouse in Iuka.

Enrollment will be limited to 25 participants, who, following training, are required to donate 40 volunteer hours to the County Extension Office. Training begins with instructions on the Master Gardener program concept, basic botany, and soils. Other training sessions include vegetables, ornamental plants, home fruit and nut production, and lawn care.

Extension and Research professionals will be conducting the trainings over Interactive Video with the

County Director on hand each night to help with the program.

A one-time fee of \$85.00 covers materials, refreshments, a 1-year membership in the Mississippi Master Gardener Association and a 1-year membership in the Tishomingo County Master Gardener Association.

Photography Exhibit At Iuka Public Library

Iuka Librarian, Fredda Sanderson discusses a photo exhibit at our local library with amateur photographer, Bill Avery. The photos in the three library cases were taken by Lisa Wilbanks and Bill, members of Corinth Camera Club.

The photo exhibit will be displayed through the end of January. All of the photos were taken in the immediate area. The theme of the exhibit is "Feathers & Fowl". Avery points out that due to greater interest and protection by the Mississippi and Tennessee Wildlife Agencies the population growth of eagles and ospreys around the Pickwick Lake area are on the rise.

Three of the photos are of an eagle family that raised two chicks in Shiloh National Park in May this past year. There are photos of both the male and female eagle tending to a nest in a tall pine tree. One shows the mother eagle taking a catch

to the chicks which some say is a baby pig and others say a soft shell turtle. You be the judge. Avery says the most interesting thing about this photo session was watching the mother landing in the tree with the object she was carrying. Not only was it nearly as large as her, but having to release them each with one foot in order to make a one foot landing in the tree was an ominous site.

The osprey show in the exhibit is making a landing on this nest in Pickwick Lake near Bruton Branch on top of the marker light 209.6. This photo was shot in May, 2008. Avery says he also took pictures of a family at the same location in 2007. Once the nest was deserted the Tennessee Game and Fish Agency tore the nest down as it was blocking the navigational marker light. The osprey rebuilt in 2008.

Bill and Lisa hope you enjoy the photos as much as they enjoy sharing them with the community.

Foreign travels began for her in 1970 and have continued until the present. She often travels with her dentist husband and

Cottons, brocades, silks, and tapestries are all part of her varied collection. Yard

goods as well as finished ethnic art are included.

Many fabrics are purchased with the idea of converting the raw goods into finished quilts, handbags or pillow covers. The only thing slowing her craft production rate is her continuing travel schedule!

In the past year she has spent time in Vietnam, Cambodia, Thailand, Szechuan Province in China, Argentina, northern India and Guatemala.
