## New Have Qualified for June City Elections

Towns and cities in the county have just a few candidates who have qualified the upcoming municipal elections.

May 5th is the date set by the Secretary of State for municipal primary Elections, and June 2nd for the General Election. The qualifying deadline is March 15th.

In Iuka, incumbent Mayor Jackie Bryant is the sole qualifier for the mayor's election, and the race goes for incumbent Police Chief Randy Stringer, according to Iuka City Clerk Benny Gray. For aldermen posts, incumbents Martha Biggs, and James "Sum" Grisham have qualified, along with John R. Kent and Joel Robertson.

In Burnsville, incumbent Mayor David Nixon has qualified, and for aldermen, Randy Baker and incumbent John Bert Rorie have turned in qualifying papers.

In Tishomingo, only three incumbent aldermen have turned in papers: Ann Taylor, Barbara Jones, and James Burns, though others do have papers in process, said Town Clerk Paula Smith.

In Belmont, Buddy Wiltshire qualified in the mayor's race, which is wide open, since Bob Baker is retiring. For aldermen, the Neighbors, Josh Stanley and incumbent Steve Smith have submitted qualifying papers.

In Paden, City Clerk Robyn Wells reported that no one has submitted qualifying papers yet, but that some are in process.

No one has submitted papers yet for Golden, but some papers are out, according to the clerk.

## Tishomingo State Park Building a New Swimming Pool

New pool replaces historic 1939 facility - oldest pool in Tishomingo County

Tishomingo State Park is replacing the oldest pool in the county with a new one that is scheduled to be open for swimming by Memorial Day Weekend.

Last year, the Park's pool was closed, to the disappointment of many locals and hundreds of Park visitors. The cost of repairs for the 1939 junior-olympic-size pool was just too much, according to Park Manager Bill Brekeen.

The new custom gunnite pool will be on the Swinging Bridge side of the existing pool house building, explained Brekeen. It will be just a little smaller (45' x 75'), and only six feet deep at the deepest point. It will also feature a salt-water treatment system, which is the latest technology, Brekeen said. It is

supposed to be easier on the eyes and hair than traditional chemical treatment systems.

Approximate cost for the new pool will be approximately \$386,000.

"The old pool was highly utilized by our group campers, cabins, and campers; as well as local residents," said Brekeen. "We are excited about the addition of this new facility which will enhance the recreational experience of our park patrons."

Also scheduled to be installed near the new pool are several pieces of new playground equipment.

Cost for using the pool will be \$3 for children and \$5 for adults, per day. It will open Wednesday through Sunday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Memorial Day to Labor Day. It will also be available for private bookings during the evening hours or on days when it is closed. Groups have to furnish their own certified lifeguards.

Built in the early days of the Park, 1939, the pool is surely the oldest one still in recent use. Thousands of Tishomingo county citizens recall stories of learning to swim there.

## Resort Set to Proceed After Bill Passes State Senate Friday

A planned resort at Bay Springs Lake got another boost last Friday when HB 1441 was passed by the Mississippi State Senate 29-3.

The bill now goes to Governor Haley Barbour for his signature.

The \$300 million resort planned and proposed by Martel Development will include 600-900 cabins, golf courses, boat slips, restaurants and a hotel.

The developers had requested "resort status" be granted to the 1,500-acre area, so that they could serve drinks at restaurants at the resort. The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors granted permission last summer for the developer to seek resort status for the area that lies within the "dry" county. The issue had to go through the legislature, by way of a local and private bill.

The developer has been granted a temporary, conditional lease from the Corps of Engineers, who manage the publicly-owned land bordering Bay Springs Lake.

A number of personnel from the developer's planning and development team met at the site last week. A master plan for the entire project must be submitted to the Corps for their approval, and if it passes the multiple levels of command and review, then, the developer will receive a permit to begin construction.

## Tourism Council Wins State Award for TTTT '08

from TCDF

The Tishomingo County Tourism Council recently won the statewide Tourism Achievement Award from the Mississippi Tourism Association for its Trash to Treasures along the Tenn-Tom event. The award was presented at the Governor's Conference on Tourism in Hattiesburg on February 17, 2009.

In partnership with the Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway Association and local tourism offices in counties along the Tenn-Tom Waterway, Tishomingo County Tourism Council kicked off the first TTTT event in 2007 and expanded the event in 2008 to include several counties in Alabama.

The event is a yard sale along highways adjacent to and near the Tenn-Tom Waterway in Mississippi and Alabama. Widely advertised and promoted, the event attracted thousands to the region from the southeastern states and as far away as Texas and Oklahoma.

In Tishomingo County where records were kept, most restaurants and convenience stores reported at least a 50% increase in business during the two day event. One delighted shop owner reported that she did more business during the two day event than during the previous three months. More importantly, the event introduced the region's outdoor recreation assets to visitors who had not been to the region before, visitors who are likely to return.

This event has the potential to be one of the state's top visitor attractions. Tourism Council members are already busy with plans for the October 2 & 3, 2009, Trash to Treasures event.

## Pickwick Pines Homeowners File Complaint with AG

The homeowners at Pickwick Pines Resort have filed a complaint with Attorney General Jim Hood in an attempt to get some help with their escalating membership fees.

The homeowners are facing a 260 percent increase in their membership fee, according to the complaint, and Sharon Lindley, secretary for the Pickwick Pines Association of Homeowners.

They filed the complaint with the Office of Consumer Protection of the Mississippi State Attorney General. Representatives of that office were unable to give comment on the case Tuesday.

### The Issues

The annual fee was \$500 per year in 2003, when there were less than 100 homes in the resort, and it has escalated to \$1,800 annually for 2008 and 2009. More increases are expected - to \$3,000 a year, according to the complaint. There are approximately 265 homes in the gated community.

The fee is designated to permit homeowners to utilize resort facilities, like the paths, pools, lodge and tennis courts, and covers garbage and refuse disposal, security and utilities. It is paid in advance each year and set by Pickwick Pines Resort.

Homeowners have not been allowed access to books and records to verify reasonable value of services. They contend that services have significantly decreased, including reduced security coverage for the gated community, and the county doing the garbage pickup. Maintenance of common areas has decreased, also.

Some reasons for the increase can be traced to costs for improvements to the Short-Coleman water system that serves the resort, which was a concern last year, but on which repairs have been or are being completed. Pickwick Pines residents would like the cost for repairs spread over the entire Short-Coleman system, rather than coming from the homeowners.

## Presley Addresses Utility Service Concerns

In a forum with about 30 ratepayers Tuesday night at the Courthouse, Northern District Public Service Commissioner Brandon Presley addressed some utility rate concerns and answered questions.

Presley promised to look into power bills over \$500 a month for a couple of attendees, and encouraged everyone to take advantage of programs designed to provide funding to those who need assistance. He also stressed that everyone could do better conserving energy and encouraged people to call him, or their elected utility board representatives for help.

in national travel, sporting, retirement, and tourism related magazines such as *Budget Travel*, *Compass Family*, *Insert*, *Memphis* magazine, *Mississippi* magazine, *Trailer Life* magazine, *Life on the Water* magazine, *Mid-South* magazine, *Retirement Lifestyles* magazine, *Young at Heart*, several local and regional newspapers, and the Mississippi Tour Guide.

The tourism council and the development foundation partnered on a new format full-color visitor's guide. 30,000 copies were printed and most were distributed to the state's welcome centers, neighboring chambers of commerce and visitor centers, and others.

Tishomingo County Tourism Council is a member of the Natchez Trace Compact and the Mississippi Hills Heritage Area Alliance.

According to the 2008 Mississippi Development Authority tourism impact report, visitors in Tishomingo County spent \$10,986,630 in 2008, an increase of \$889,830 in one year, one of the largest percentage increases of any county in Mississippi. Increases have averaged 6.5% to 8.0% per year over the past five years, so this indicates that

the efforts of the TCTC are effective and are bringing new visitors and dollars to Tishomingo County. The MDA report also found that approximately 180 jobs in Tishomingo County are due to tourism and that state and local taxes attributed to tourism amount to \$848,256.

TCTC was formed in 1993 with 15 volunteers. A legislative act provided a 2% hotel-motel tax for operation of the tourism council and for tourism marketing of the county. The tourism council receives additional funds from the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors and the municipalities of Belmont, Burnsville, Golden, Iuka, Paden, and Tishomingo.

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation also partners with the tourism council. TCDF Chairman Peyton Cummings offers congratulations to the tourism council and stated that "this well-earned honor focuses statewide attention on Tishomingo County and demonstrates that tourism can yield significant economic benefit. Tourism generated jobs are not as likely to relocate to China like so many manufacturing jobs."

### Cataract Symptoms

If you have the beginning of a cataract condition, there are certain signs to look for. There may be a sight blurring or clouding of vision, for example, often beginning in just one eye. Sometimes you may find bright light glaring or you may experience multiple images. The clouding of the lens of the eye causes the glare by scattering light rays as they enter the eye. In the same way, dust on a windshield causes glare when it scatters bright sunlight or light from an oncoming car. Tinted glasses or sunglasses can help reduce the glare.

A cataract condition can begin at any age, but it usually afflicts older people. Slowly and progressively the lens of the eye becomes more cloudy until surgery is recommended to correct it. However, it may be many years before the condition is serious enough to warrant surgery. The problem with cataract symptoms is that they may be caused by some other eye problem.

show up, assuring her of a berth in the state.

Beginning with the text of the Constitution itself, Norvell charted how the right to vote was extended over time from only white property-owning males to women, African-Americans and people as young as 18.

She ended with a call for young people who waited the longest to vote and now cast ballots at a lower rate than any other group to take an active part in government and help revitalize democracy.

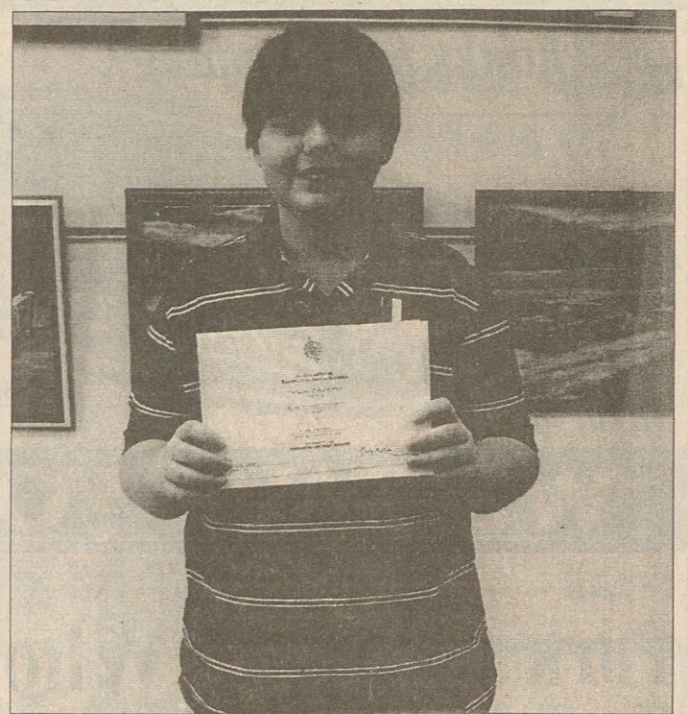
## 12th Annual Spring Disc Golf Tournament
