## Belmont Arrests Two for Recent ATV Thefts

The Belmont Police, operating with several regional agencies have made two arrests, and recovered more than \$10,000 in stolen vehicles in connection with a recent burglary in Belmont.

According to Chief Donald Reno, John Reeder Kent II, currently of 3561 Highway 8, Fulton, and Steven James Williams, 39, of 7376 Charkbark, Southaven have been charged with grand larceny of a commercial building by the Belmont Police.

The two suspects face similar charges in Amory, and Itawamba and Lee counties, from where several of the recovered items were allegedly stolen.

Kent, formerly of Iuka, has made bond in Itawamba County, and is currently in the custody of the Tishomingo County Jail said on Wednesday morning.

Williams is formerly of Missouri. He is still in custody in Itawamba County, and will be transferred to Tishomingo County when he makes bond.

The case began with the theft of a 30-foot gooseneck trailer loaded with three Rhino 4x4 units from Tim Burton trailers in Belmont on February

20, 2009.

Alerts were issued to all agencies within a 100-mile radius, and identification and serial numbers from the stolen vehicles were entered into the NCIC database.

Belmont investigator Donald Ray Thomas was attending a class in Hamilton, Alabama when he was advised of a burglary of a Yamaha dealership in Hamilton. Working together, Belmont and Hamilton investigators examined security camera footage from a nearby business that showed the theft involved the Burton trailer being pulled by a white dually truck.

Since he was aware of the ongoing burglary investigation, Itawamba investigator Chris Umphress called Thomas when they arrested the two suspects in Fulton, where the suspects had completed arrangements to sell two ATVs to an off-duty officer.

Late on March 5th, a search warrant was executed at the Dorsey residence of John Reeder Kent II near Fulton. One of the Burton ATVs was found there, along with a new 4-wheeler and two dirt bikes that had allegedly been stolen from Honda of Tupelo.

On March 6th, a search was

executed at the other suspect's home in Southaven, and officers recovered the Burton trailer that had been seen on the Hamilton film, with an ATV stolen from Amory Marina.

The two other ATVs stolen from Burton were recovered from a residence near Kent's home in Fulton. According to investigators, the owner had bought the ATVs from Kent for \$3,500.

About \$45,000 worth of equipment has been recovered by the Belmont PD, but still missing is a John Deere 35 mini excavator. If anyone has any information, they are encouraged to call the Belmont Police at 454-3381.

"Determined people working together can do anything," said Chief Donald Reno of the cooperative effort between several law agencies. "Networking with other agencies has a positive effect on solving crimes," he said.

Reno thanks everyone who has worked on this, including Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Dispatcher Kathy Skelton and Leisha Burleson for working with Jackson to get the ATVs entered into the NCIC computer.

## Municipal Election Season Begins

The qualifying deadline for municipal elections was last day, and all the towns and cities in the county have reported qualified candidates.

In Tishomingo, Golden Paden, they have exactly correct number of qualified candidates and are hoping they will have to hold an election, are awaiting opinions from Secretary of State.

The Secretary of State's office confirmed Tuesday that Mississippi Code 23-15-361 states that they won't have to hold an election if none of the positions are contested.

In Iuka, Mayor Jackie Bryant and Police Chief Randy Stringer are running unopposed for their offices.

But, for Iuka's board of aldermen, there are several candidates: incumbents Martha Gags, James "Kissum" Grisham, Andy James and Johnny Howard are all seeking to

retain their seats on the board. Challengers include J. C. Johnson, Jr., John R. Kent, John David Murphy, Joel Robertson and Eugene "Peanut" Thorne.

### Belmont

In Belmont, alderman Buddy Wiltshire is running unopposed for mayor. Incumbents Steve Smith and Robert Hester are running to keep their seats on the board of aldermen. They face challengers Steve Ratliff, Josh Stanley, Jackie Caldwell, Mike Braden, Mike Neighbors and Brandon Pharr.

### Burnsville

In Burnsville, incumbent Mayor David Nixon faces challenges from Bobby Culwell, Heath Lovelace, Eddie White, and A.T. Marlar, Jr.

Hoping to return to the board of aldermen are incumbents John Robert Rorie, Billy Don Hamm, Robert Davis, and Brad Forsythe. Others running are Randy Walker, Charles Linton, Larry Richard Martin, J. R. Blakney, William "Russ" Brown,

and Chris Lambert.

All these candidates have submitted qualifying papers, said Burnsville City Clerk Jill Lee. They have not all been certified as qualified candidates by the Burnsville Municipal Election Commission.

### Tishomingo

In Tishomingo, incumbent James Tennyson is seeking re-election as mayor and incumbents Barbara Oaks, Ann Taylor, James Burns, and Fredia Hale are joined by Gary Harlan on the ballot for Tishomingo aldermen.

### Golden

In Golden, former mayor Davy Ginn is running for mayor, and the new slate of aldermen will be Tracy Pharr, Sherry Shook, Andy Hamilton, Dennis Pharr and Larry Bolton.

### Paden

In Paden, incumbent mayor Pam Oswalt and incumbent aldermen Jean Luttrell, Jorja Patty, Jim Murphy and Keith Deaton are all on the ballot, along with David Benson.

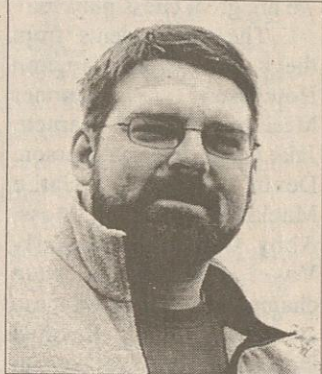


## Flack-Walters Plan March 14th Wedding
