Supervisors Announce New Jobs for County From Several Industries

The Board of Supervisors re-

met on several new industries businesses in the county at Monday, March 16th meet-

We set goals, and we have accomplished a lot," said Board President Brandon Grissom. "There are a lot of jobs opening in the county in the next few months and years, explained Grissom, along with the other members.

Meridian Furniture
The old Wild Rose building in the Iuka Industrial Park, a furniture company is setting up and preparing to hire employees and begin production following the High Point Furniture plant.

Meridian Furniture is a new company by a group that previously operated Gentry in Ripley, which was sold to Ashley, according to the supervisors. Their lease, like many the county has issued recently, includes employment benchmarks. In the first year they are expected to employ 25; by the second year, they project employing 50 in the first year, with potential for 75 total employees once they get "up and going" said McDowell.

"We want a diversified workforce - that has been one of our goals," said McDowell. He pointed to high tech jobs announced by ATK in the Tri-State Park, skilled jobs at the steel working facilities like those at the Yellow Creek Port, and now these manufacturing jobs that are opening up when so many of the local factories have closed.

The board said that they have nearly every county-owned building under lease, including the ones at Tri-State Commerce Park. **Ershigs Expansion**
Ershigs, a company who makes fiberglass structures at the Tri-State Commerce Park is expanding its operation, said Grissom.

ATK Expansion
Also at Tri-State Commerce Park is ATK, which is expanding its operation to include the manufacture of composite structures for commercial aircraft. ATK has promised 625 jobs in the next few years. Last week, Governor Haley Barbour signed House Bill 1628, granting ATK \$25 million in state funds for facility and equipment improvements to accommodate its new operations.

Jobs Soon Available
The county reportedly has an unemployment rate of 11 percent, so job prospects are welcome. The board recommended all applicants apply at the WIN Job Center near the Tishomingo County Jail to apply for the many new jobs.

Other Actions
The board approved the appointments of Jackie Bryant, John Kent, Tom Minga, Bob Marshall and Danny Holland to the Tishomingo County Water and Sewer Board. All these were currently serving on this board.

The board denied a request by a business owner at Tri-State Commerce Park to give him an exemption for a \$2,000 ad valorem tax bill. The board said their hands were tied, by state law, they could not relieve him of the taxes owed for a business at Building 1020 in the industrial park. They told him he could take up the issue with the tax assessor's office.

The business owner was Ed Mansel, and he signed a lease with the county in April of 2008. He is starting an aluminum recycling business, Molten Metal, at the building, but the current economic situation is hurting his business, he told the board.

The board also spoke with a group regarding the proposed resort at Bay Springs, but the board did not take any action related to the issue.

Iuka City Employees Support Red Shirt Fridays
Iuka Mayor Jackie Bryant announced that the Board of Alderman and his office are supporting Red Shirt Fridays - a community-wide effort to show support for our troops.

"We think it is very important to show our support for these men and women," Bryant explained Tuesday in an interview. The local unit is scheduled to go to Iraq this spring.

Any city employees who wish to are encouraged to wear red on Fridays as a sign of support. Red shirts are also being sold locally to support the local Family Support Group. Call the National Guard Armory to purchase yours.

Iuka Man Killed in One Vehicle Crash Tuesday

An Iuka man was killed when his car left the road and crashed into a tree around 8:40 Tuesday night on Pleasant Hill Road.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, John Timothy Hamm, 43, of Iuka, was killed when his 2002 Camaro, which was traveling northbound on Pleasant Hill Road (County Road 992), left the west side of the road about three miles south of Highway 72. The car hit a tree, about 8-10 feet high, said Wilemon, and it came to rest on the driver's side.

A passenger in the car, Jesse Long, of Iuka, walked away from the wreck, after getting Hamm out of the vehicle.

Arrangements were unknown at press time, and will be released later by Cutshall Funeral Home.

Harmony Man Found Dead in Yard Tuesday

Tuesday afternoon a Harmony area man was found dead in his yard, his body badly burned in a yard fire.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, Jerry Allred, 68, of 19 County Road 285, was found by his wife, Patsy, about 4 p.m., after she came home and didn't see him at the house. A teenage grandson was at the home, and reported that his grandfather said earlier he was going out to do yard work.

When they looked for him, they found him dead, in an area where he had apparently been burning brush or leaves, said Wilemon.

The cause of death is still under investigation, as Allred reportedly suffered some health problems, said Wilemon. An autopsy was ordered, as is routine with a found death.

Ludlam Funeral Home will release arrangements when available.

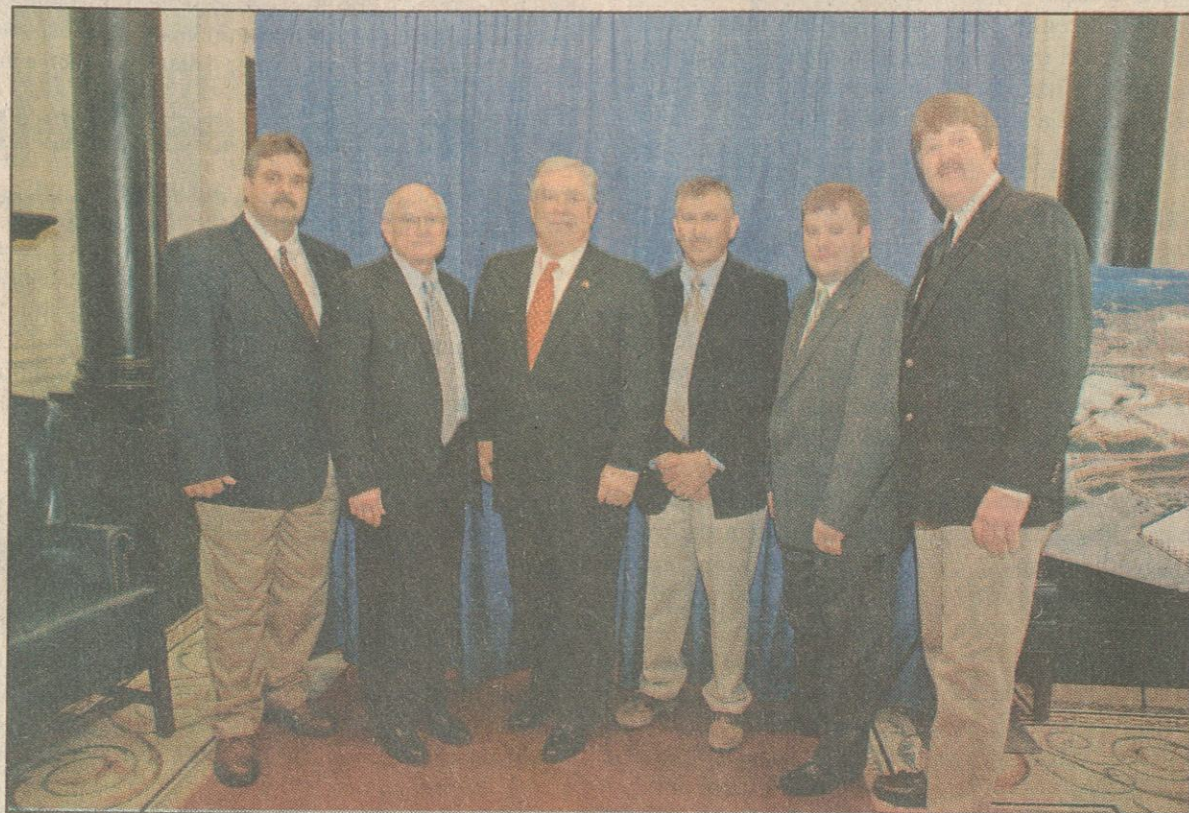

You can take used tires to the landfill, where they collect them and take them

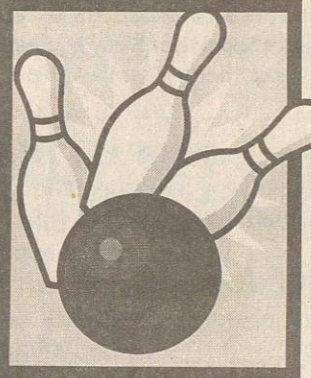
to a recycling facility, said Grissom. They are certainly not going to break down and go away if you dump them on the side of the road, he said.

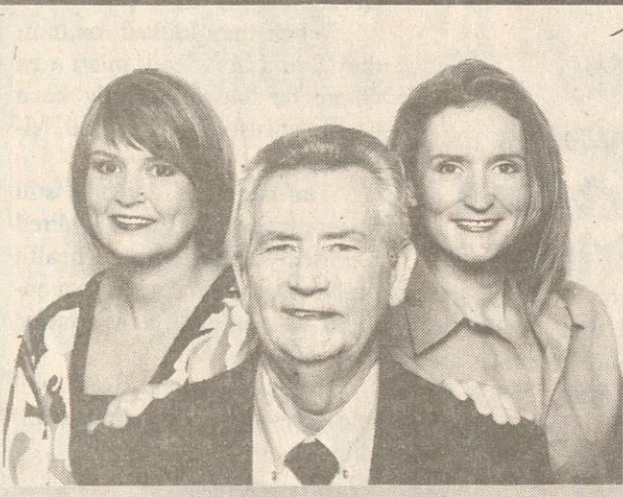

Insight Into Eyesight

Holding Books Too Close

If your child holds books too close when reading, you may want to have his eyes checked to find out if he has a vision problem.

When children first begin to read, they usually look at books with large print and lots of space between the lines. Once in school, however, and as they advance into upper grades, the type is not as large. Getting used to the difference in type size may be the only problem at first. To compensate for the difference, they may hold books closer to their eyes for awhile. If the habit continues beyond a reasonable time, it would be wise to have the child's eyes checked.

Even if your child passed the eye test at school, you should not take it for granted that he doesn't have a vision problem. Eye tests given at school are usually simple tests of what a child can see at 20 feet. Passing this test with a "20/20" rating, however, does not mean that he has perfect vision. It means only that he can see at 20 feet what the normal child can see at 20 feet.

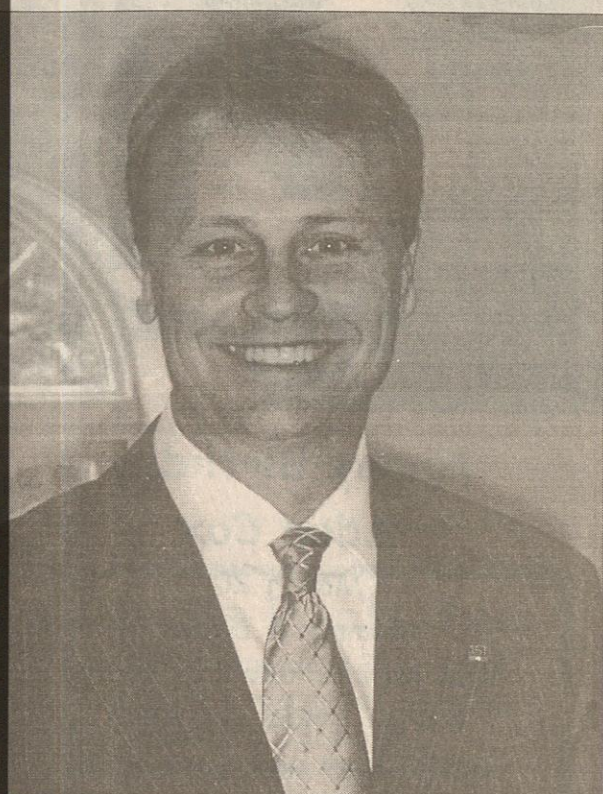
It's Kindergarten Registration Time!

Parents must be a Farm Bureau member to qualify. An application may be picked up in the office at each school or at the Farm Bureau Office in Iuka or Belmont.

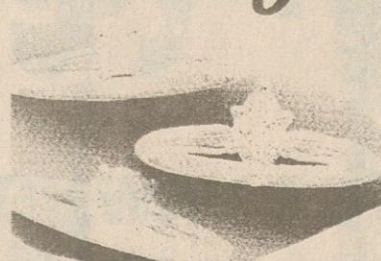
