Bridge Identified for Stimulus Spending Already Complete!

Lists released recently by Washington that identify beneficiaries Tishomingo County is supposed to get from "the Stimulus package" include only one item: County Road 306.

The \$30.5 million in funding that is spread over the First Congressional District for transportation projects, according to a release by Representative Chris Childers' office, includes \$2,100 for "County Road 306."

Only one problem. That bridge has already been crossed, rather, built.

Second District Supervisor Nicky McRae completed the bridge in question last fall, with help of Larry Bonds of Bonds Company, and PSP Monotech.

And for only about \$23,000, said.

Monotech fabricated the deck of the bridge, and it was paved. McRae said it had been "state inspected" and it had a 10,000-pound weight limit

sign posted.

"But I still want that money to come to the county," he said Monday while showing the steel deck bridge that he says a school bus can now cross safely.

Approximately 60 residences are on County Road 306, but McRae said there is no way to know how much the bridge is used.

According to McRae and Construction Administrator Johnny Crofts of Cook Coggins Engineering of Tupelo, the old wood decked bridge was long on the list of projects to be completed with state aid road funding. Even former Second District Supervisor Arlie South worked on getting it rebuilt according to Cook Coggins' \$348,800 estimated plans, which included a box culvert according to McRae.

But, neither supervisor could get all the adjoining landowners to agree to easements for the larger bridge plan on the tiny road that runs from Highway 365 through a part of North Cross-

roads across Cole's Mill Creek.

Crofts said Cook Coggins has "notified state aid" of the issue, and "they are working to

redirect the funds to some other state aid project in Tishomingo County."

Other state aid projects that

are on the county list include some striping and overlay projects and other bridge projects, said Crofts.

Burnsville Family Home Damaged in Fire

Firefighters fought a fire in a Burnsville home for more than an hour Monday afternoon.

The home of Jeryl Trimm

and family, at 192 Eastport Street in Burnsville caught fire in the kitchen area late Monday afternoon, according to firefight-

ers on the scene. They were able to extinguish the flames, but the kitchen suffered considerable damage.

About a dozen firefighters in three Burnsville Fire Department units worked in the attic area trying to access and extinguish smoldering areas, finally cutting holes in the roof to administer water more directly. They went through several air tanks each trying to put out the stubborn, smoking areas.

Also living in the house with Ms. Trimm are her son, Wesley, daughter, Jessica, and a granddaughter, none of whom were hurt in the event. Only Wesley was in the home when the fire caught, and he said at the scene that he was the one who called 911 when he smelled smoke and saw flames in the kitchen.

At the scene, Jessica regretted not having gone through clothing and memorabilia stored in the attic, which belonged to her late father, former Burnsville police officer James Trimm.

Lady Braves Basketball Excellence Recognized at Banquet

Basketball standouts were recognized with several awards at the players enjoyed several of the accolades of coaches at the Tishomingo County High School Basketball Awards Ban-

tyler Pritchard received a special award, in addition to being recognized for everything. Team Captain to Division Player of the Year.

The unusual award, presented by former Coach Donald Borden, recognized Pritchard's achievement of earning more than 2,000 points over his high school career. Borden reported during his freshman season, Pritchard had at least 10 points per game on a 21-10 team. Sophomore year he was Division 1-4A Player of the Year and 650 points. His junior year, he had 647 points, and this year repeated his Player of the Year performance with 682 points and averaged 25.2 points a game. Total they came up with was

"You just do not see this for a high school player to have more than 2,000 career points," said Borden.

Other awards for the 12-15 Lady Braves team members to sophomore Jake Walker for Most Rebounds; junior Josh Dean for Best Defensive Player; Alex Smith for Most Improved Player. Pritchard swept

up the Best Offensive Player, Most Valuable Player and Most Free Throws, with an 82 percent average.

"We started out 0-4, and I started to wonder if there ever was a team that never won a game in a season," said Borden of the slow start the team had. But with some wins against Belmont, several Division victories, and a great win against Corinth, the team finished the year with a respectable performance in the Division 1-4A tournament at Itawamba Community College.

With only two seniors graduating, the team holds a lot of promise for the next year. They are looking forward to hearing about getting a new coach, since Borden resigned to take an administrative position in Franklin County, Alabama.

Another senior standout swept the Lady Braves' awards. Beth Hudson, a four-year starter, had the statistics to win Most Rebounds, Most Assists, Most Free Throws (with 85 percent), Best Defensive Player, and also was selected to the All Division 1-4A team.

Megan Allred and Courtney Tigner were recognized for taking the most charges on the team.

First year coach Cliff Little praised the dedication and character of all the girls on the team, who endured many 6 a.m. prac-

Local Church Furnishes GBN Satellite Programming to Jail

Inmates at the Tishomingo County Jail will soon have new television programming thanks to Iuka Church of Christ and S&S Electronics.

Tuesday morning, Scotty Scott of S&S Electronics was installing a satellite receiver that will allow the inmates to view the programming of the Gospel Broadcast Network (GBN).

GBN broadcasts from Ringgold, Georgia and features a variety of Christian programming. GBN is overseen by the elders of the Highland Church of Christ in Dalton, Georgia and is being used by Churches of Christ throughout the Southeastern United States for outreach.

The new local system is being paid for by the Iuka Church of Christ, according to Bob Wimbish, an elder with that church.

There are usually about 35 state, county and city inmates housed at the Tishomingo County Jail, said Jail

Administrator Benny Parrish. They currently have cable programming, but he hopes to move them to all GBN programming next few months.

A Memorial to John Timothy Hamm

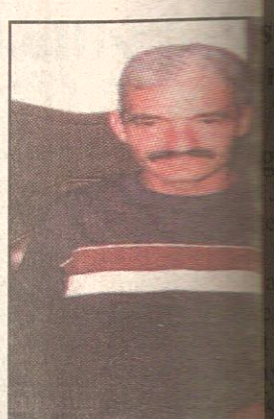
John Timothy Hamm, age 43, died Tuesday, March 17, 2009, as the result of an automobile accident. Services

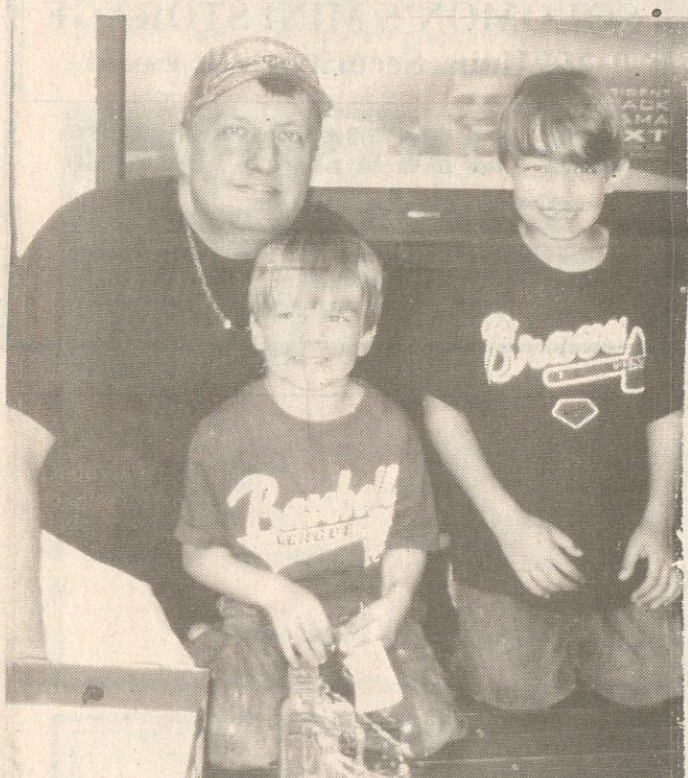

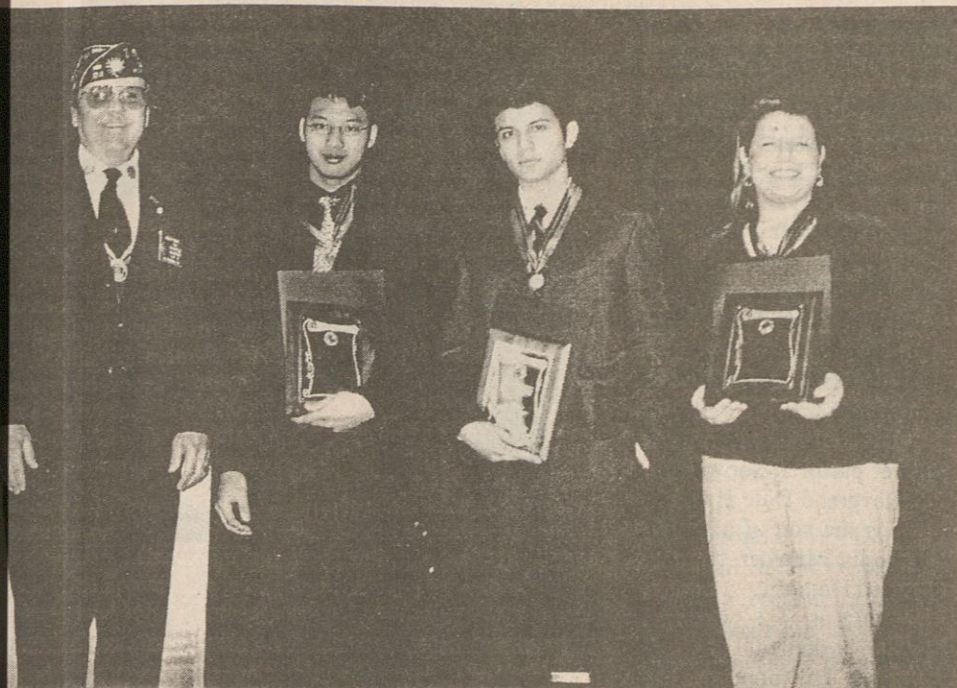

Tishomingo County Junior Wins American Legion Oratorical Contest

Julie Marie Norvell of Mississippi, won the Medal, 1st Place Prize in the title of Champion in the Mississippi State Final competition of the American Legion High School Oratorical Championship Program "A Constitutional Speech Contest" March 14th in the War Memorial Auditorium in Jackson.

Julie, the daughter of Bro. and Candy Norvell, an Junior Student at Tishomingo High School and a 3-member of the Mississippi State All-State Youth Choir Orchestra, is now destined to compete in the National Finals at Indianapolis, Indiana, 18th-19th, 2009, and present Mississippi with her award-winning speech titled "Our Rights As Women." Sponsored by the Tishomingo County American Legion Post 15 of Iuka, Julie is nominated for the Shelby James American Legion Oratorical Scholarship to the University of Southern Mississippi and is also the recipient of the Allen B. Carter Oratorical Championship, a \$2,500 scholarship awarded by the B. Carter Post 24 of Hattiesburg.

Anthony (Tony) M. Martinez, a junior from St. John Catholic School at Iuka, is sponsored by the Louis-Grayson American Legion Post 112 of Jackson as 1st runner-up with his speech entitled "Protectors of the Constitution." Last year, he was Mississippi's Oratorical Champion, and this year he is Mississippi's

American Legion Eagle Scout of the Year.

And Timothy Lin, a senior from Presbyterian Christian School at Hattiesburg sponsored by Allen B. Carter Post 24, was 2nd Runner-Up with his speech "Don't Take This For Granted." Timothy is also this year's state winner in the Veterans of Foreign Wars "Voice of Democracy" Contest.

The runners-up were also awarded \$1,500 and \$1,000 Oratorical Scholarships from Post 24, good to the school of their choice. Each student received a Certificate of Distinction, an American Legion Oratory Medal, and an engraved plaque for their outstanding achievements, and all were awarded savings bond prizes at every level of competition.

Now in its 72nd year, the American Legion National High School Oratorical Contest was begun to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation of the United States Constitution on the part of high school students. To compete they must speak without notes, lectern, or sound system on some phase of the U.S. Constitution with emphasis on the duties and responsibilities of citizenship. This toughest of all oratorical contests in the nation also has the objectives of developing leadership qualities and

Grady Jolly, Jr., and Ms. Stacey R. Moore of Jackson, Law Clerk for Judge Henry T. Wingate, both of the U.S. District Court, Jackson; and Dr. Jim Rosenblatt of Jackson, Dean of the Mississippi College School of Law. The contest was moderated by Department Oratorical Chairman Joseph D. 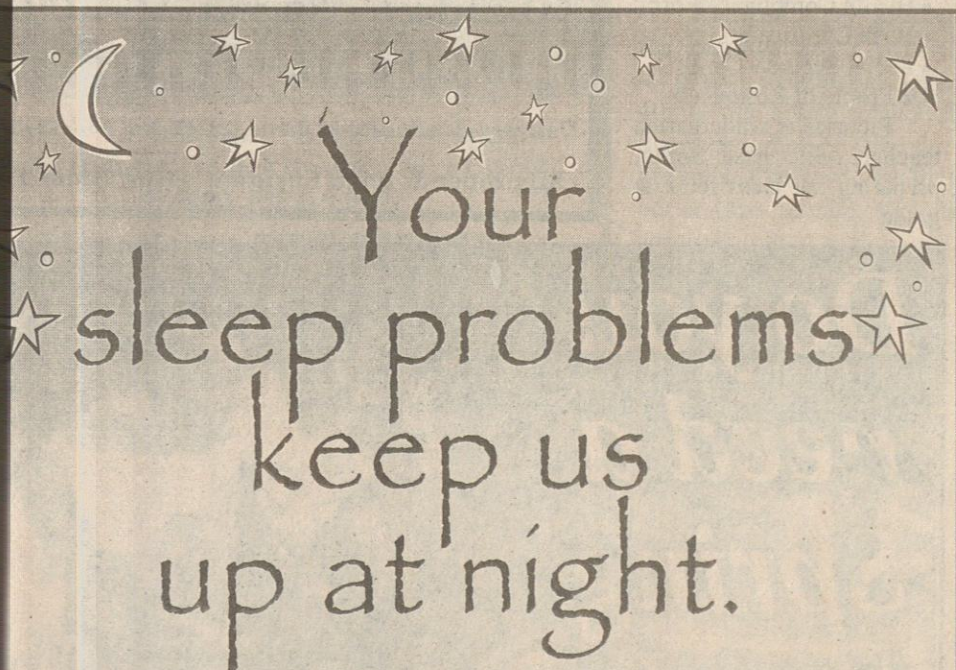

Book Signing To Be Held At Courthouse Museum

A book signing will be held at the historic courthouse museum at 203 East Quitman Street in Iuka on Friday, March 27th, 2009, from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. Mr. Robert Perry, an elder with the Chickasaw Indian tribe, wrote a "how-to" book entitled *The Turkey Feather Cape: My Creation from Beyond History*. This is a story, rarely told, from the Indian viewpoint, for those who undertake making a turkey feather cape and for those who love history.

The Turkey Feather Cape is a book that encourages inspiration and creativity, challenge and "giving back." Honored elders of the Chickasaw Indians, who once inhabited the Tishomingo County area, wore turkey feather capes in ancient times. Unfortunately, after countless heartaches, the knowledge on how to create the cape was lost or forgotten. Faced with the challenge of making a traditional turkey cape, Mr. Perry undertook the arduous process and succeeded. Desiring to preserve this

cultural knowledge, he wrote the book to share his success. Starting with the feathers of a wild turkey carcass, the ancient cape was recreated in part using modern creative-solving techniques. These techniques may be used in other complex problems.

In his book, Mr. Perry encourages a "time out" from busy lifestyles which, in turn, encourages visualization and inspiration. To give substance to the long-forgotten knowledge of how to create a turkey cape, Mr. Perry explored past written history back to 1540 when the Chickasaws met DeSoto, and also researched back to the Mississippian era from 1000-1500 A.D. This early information is compiled from archeology finds.

Other books by Robert Perry include *Life with the Little People*, *Uprising: Crumbo's Indian Art*. Mr. Perry's books are a must for those who enjoyed early southeast U.S. history, retold by a Chickasaw elder.

Double Vision

In a child whose eyes are normally aligned, both eyes focus on an object at the same time. When the brain receives the image, it is the result of what is seen by both eyes fused into a single image. This is known as binocular single vision.

However, when one eye is out of line, the child will see two objects. One image will show the object in its proper position. The misaligned eye will show the object displaced or off center, a phenomenon known as double vision. A child who experiences double vision will compensate for it by ignoring the image received by the misaligned eye. He suppresses the disturbing second image. The misaligned eye then becomes a "lazy eye", referred to medically as amblyopia.

Sometimes the misaligned eye can be straightened by wearing corrective glasses alone or in combination with drops and exercises. The success of any treatment depends on how soon it begins.
