Local Burglaries Continue

New Salem Parsonage, Highland Baptist Suffer Break-ins

Another house in the New Salem community was burglarized while the family was in church last Wednesday night, and two churches have been vandalized in the county.

Last Wednesday, while New Salem Pastor Ron Norville's family was at church services just a half a mile up the road, their home (77 CR 276, New Salem's parsonage) was burglarized, according to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department.

"It was just terrible," said Candy Norville, of the burglary. She thought someone had made a terrible mess in her bedroom, when she returned from church and found the room ransacked. Then she realized what had happened, and called the authorities.

The suspects took most of her (mostly costume) jewelry, and a pillowcase to carry it in from the bedroom. Then they took all the keys to the house and vehicles, a checkbook, a watch and a Smith & Wesson pistol that used to belong to Bro. Ron's father.

Also taken were some prescription medicine bottles, said Mrs. Norville.

The family had to spend hundreds of dollars getting all their locks changed, and vehicles re-keyed, she said.

Sheriff's Department Investigator Christina Vaughn said the suspects probably got in the back door, and may have been riding a four-wheeler. They are still investigating the burglary, but no arrests have been made.

This is at least the third burglary of a residence in the Harmony-New Salem general area since the end of January. Investigators do not think the incidents are linked, but Sheriff Glenn Whitlock said that additional patrols will be running in the area and that anyone with any information concerning these is urged to call the sheriff's department at 423-7000. All information received will be kept confidential, assured the Sheriff.

Highland Baptist Church Break-in

Sometime early last week a side door was

kicked in to gain access to Highland Baptist Church on County Road 87 just southeast of Tishomingo.

Investigator Vaughn said the break-in was discovered Wednesday night, and it could have happened anytime between Sunday night and Wednesday night. The pastor's office was also broken into, but nothing was stolen, said Vaughn. The incident is still under investigation.

Poplar Springs Freewill Baptist

About 10 p.m. on the night of March 5th, officers were called to Poplar Springs Freewill Baptist Church on Highway 25 in response to an alarm.

According to Investigator Vaughn, the church's security alarm went off when someone threw a rock through the window of a room where audio-visual equipment was stored.

Nothing was taken in the attempted break-in, said Vaughn. The perpetrators may have been frightened off by the alarm. The incident is still under investigation.

Two Charged with Burglary

Two men have been charged in connection with a burglary in early March.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department Investigator Christina Vaughn, Luke Calton, 24, of County Road 180, was charged with burglary, and breaking and entering for the March 5th burglary of the James Brumley home, 240 CR 169.

Calton was questioned by investigators regarding the burglary after he was brought in on an outstanding justice court warrant. At that time, he also had some of the allegedly stolen items in his possession, said Vaughn. Calton is the son of Brumley's wife.

Also charged similarly was Alan Scott Mangum, 40, of Shiloh Road in Corinth.

The burglars took two

plasma screen TVs, a Wii, a laptop computer, hunting knives and guns, and a bow and arrow set allegedly stolen. Only the items Calton had have been recovered. Vaughn said the suspects took the stolen goods to Hernando and sold them out of a trunk in front of a house. Authorities are working with the Hernando Police Department to recover the goods.

Resort Status Bill Goes to Barbour

On Tuesday, both the state House and Senate passed HB 1441, which authorizes resort status for a planned \$300 million resort on Bay Springs Lake west of Dennis.

The bill has been in joint committee since late last month. The Senate passed the final committee report 31-12, including yeas by both of Tishomingo County's senators, Eric Powell and J.P. Wilemon.

The House also approved the final committee report 77-42, with both District 19 Rep. Mark DuVall and bill author Rep. Lester "Bubba" Carpenter of District 1 voting yeas.

The bill is expected to go to the governor this week, said Carpenter.

The vote, though not unanticipated, is still a disappointment to some in the county who are frustrated that there was no county-wide vote on the issue.

The bill does include provisions for a referendum for other municipalities included in the bill, Flowood and Pearl.

"The bill represents \$8 billion of investment in Mississippi," said Rep. DuVall in a statement. "Locally, the developer is willing to invest \$300 million of their own money in our county, during tough economic times."

Attempted Robbery at El Picante Foiled

A masked man armed with a shotgun attempted to rob a local restaurant late last Wednesday night.

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, 10:18 p.m. March 25th, employees closing up El Picante Mexican restaurant encountered a masked man with a shotgun outside the kitchen door. When they resisted him pointing a gun, the suspect ran.

Witnesses identified the man as a black man, about 5'10"-5'11" said Stringer.

According to 911, Iuka Police responded in two minutes to a call from an unknown person to investigate, but the suspect had already fled.

Police are looking for a 2000-model blue extended-cab Chevrolet truck that was seen driving away from where the suspect fled west of the building which may possibly be connected to the incident, said Stringer.

Fredda Sanderson Receives Library Training

Fredda Sanderson returned to the Iuka Public Library loaded with information and ideas gained from attending Librarianship 201 Institute, hosted recently by the Mississippi Library Commission in partnership with the Southeastern Library Network, Inc. at the Cabot Lodge Millsaps in Jackson, Mississippi.

Participation in the first annual Institute was based on a statewide competitive selection process, with public library directors being asked to nominate staff members. Twenty-eight participants representing 14 of Mississippi's 50 public library systems attended the intensive, week-long training designed to assist library paraprofessionals in acquiring and maintaining skills for personal fulfillment and career enhancement. The workshop was a natural extension of the highly successful 101 Institute and offered participants a deeper exploration of the challenges of modern librarianship.

Experts in the library field from around the country provided the training. As Commission executive

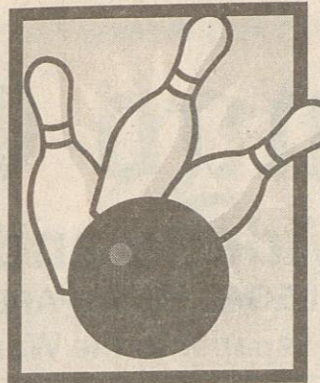


director Sherman Smith remarked, "I am still in awe of our students, of their attention to all of the information provided, and of their enthusiasm. From the perspective of the Library Commission, and because of the participants, the Institute was a great success."

The Library Commission hosts more than a dozen continuing education workshops each year to increase the skills of Mississippi's public librarians.

Workshops scheduled for this year include basic librarianship skills, youth services, library security, financial management, technology training, and summer library programs.

The Librarianship 201 Institute is supported in part by a Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian Program Grant awarded to the Mississippi Library Commission by the Institute of Museum and Library Services.

Counterfeit Bills Passed at Local Merchants

Two suspects are wanted in connection with several counterfeit bills that were passed to Iuka merchants last week.

Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer described the two suspects as a black male and a black female who distributed counterfeit \$100 bills to several merchants, including Nelson's, Piggly Wiggly, Fred's and Walmart, last Wednesday around noon.

The two bought small items with the bills and received lots of change. The bills passed the usual pen test because they were made by bleaching a real five-dollar bill, and printing a scanned \$100 bill over it. The pen reacts to the fibers in the paper, since it is real currency paper, explained Stringer, who turned the confiscated bills over to the United States Secret Ser-

vice, which is investigating the incidents.

The only way to hold the bills in light and see the watermark of a coin show the said.

This bill is used on 90 percent of the bills confiscated in the county.

An alert Fred's informant notified the odd number of bills from seeing the Wiggly shop were in Fred's the police, and retailers.

Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer said he compared security features to identify the bills and are in the police in Sasser, where the bills have occurred.

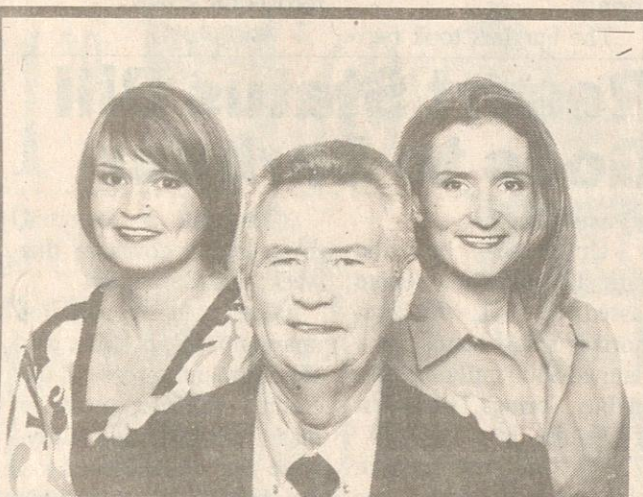

Bifocals For Young People

At one time, it was believed that whatever lens prescription corrected a youngster's vision problem - be it farsightedness, nearsightedness, or astigmatism - was automatically correct for all vision tasks and distances. Today we know this is not true. In a modern, thorough vision examination, a doctor of optometry can evaluate a child's ability to see well at all distances.

Sometimes, such an examination does reveal that a young person's most clear, comfortable and efficient NEAR vision requires a lens power that differs from the necessary DISTANCE correction. As with adults, bifocals are usually the most convenient way to provide these two different prescriptions in one pair of glasses. When this is the case, most children can become accustomed to bifocals with little difficulty. Remember: the most important thing is to allow the child to have maximum vision at all times, at all distances.

Son of Iuka Couple Trains Hundreds of Air Force Recruits

LACKLAND AIR FORCE BASE, Texas - Rising at 3 a.m. is a small sacrifice for the son of an Iuka couple - the future of the Air Force awaits.

With a uniform in perfect order, he pulls the immediately identifiable campaign hat low and straight, down the forehead to nearly the eyebrows. With a stern voice and a stoic physical presence, he directs raw recruits as they scramble into a unit formation. It's the start of another day during an eight-and-a-half week indoctrination in becoming warrior airmen. Many will soon serve overseas or in a war zone.

Air Force Staff Sgt. John M. Dicks, son of Robert and Jane Dicks of County Road 989, Iuka, is a military training instructor, or MTI. He is the face of the Air Force for hundreds of trainees throughout the year. He molds recruits through a recently overhauled and expanded Air Force Basic Military Training here with curriculum today that focuses on a 'warrior first' philosophy. Seven days a week Dicks facilitates basic war skills, military bearing, discipline, physical fitness, drill and ceremonies, Air Force core values and subjects relating to Air Force life.

Dicks' duties and responsibilities in training re-

cruits are extensive.

"I am responsible for 50 to 60 trainees at a time," said Dicks, a 1994 graduate of Brandon High School. "I am also in charge of a total of four flights as a 'floor chief.' I am the senior instructor in my section. I teach and train tomorrow's leaders, so I get to mold young men and women into confident leaders."

A job recognized within military ranks as 'down right tough,' Dicks is dedicated in giving recruits what they need to become successful Air Force warriors.

"I have to train them to handle stressful situations, so they are prepared to defend our country. One day, I will work with one of these airmen. My job is tough because these young adults come from so many different backgrounds. We have to train them to become warrior airmen," said Dicks.

Dicks holds an extreme sense of pride in knowing he is taking young people off the streets and molding them into airmen.

"It's awesome to see the look on the familiar faces when they come to graduation and see the change for themselves. Many come up to me in tears of thanks. To see the change for myself makes the long hours and hard work worth it," said Dicks.

Dicks holds a broad Air Force background, making him a model mentor for recruits.

"My first job was as a maintenance technician for nuclear missiles. I cross-trained to be a health services journeyman, specializing in training people to deploy in medical readiness. I have been in the Air Force for 10 years. I have not deployed myself, but have trained thousands to deploy," said Dicks.

Without his yelling, long days, warrior training or marching step by step with recruits, the Air Force could fall short of meeting its future missions. But tomorrow he'll again rise early, ensuring the recruits learn the tools they may need to survive.

In talking with many of you, I have learned that our concerns for the town are much the same. Given the opportunity, we can change the direction of our community.

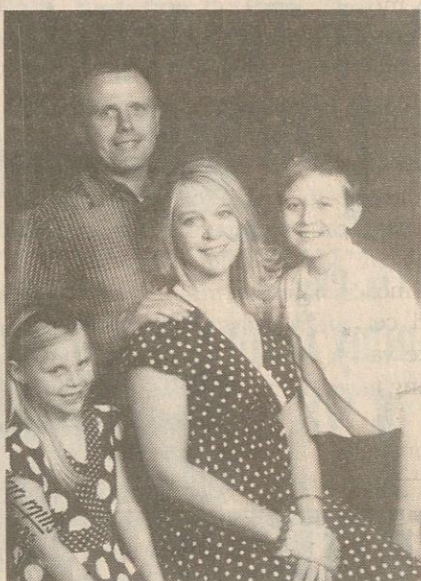

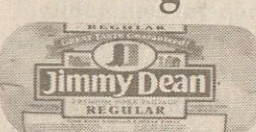

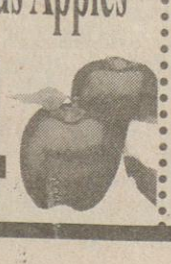

class presented the Christmas program, "The Littlest Christmas Tree", during the 1st semester. The 1st grade class presented their space program, "Interplanetary Jammin'", on March 12th. The TMS Chorus also performs at each program. We would love for you to join us for two upcoming performances - TES 4th Grade Mississippi Program on April 23rd at 6 p.m., and the TES 3rd Grade Music All Over Me program on April 30th at 6 p.m.

At IMS, a Show Choir consisting of 7th and 8th grade students is selected each spring for the following year. This group performs at various venues throughout the school year. This year, the IMS Show Choir has performed at Heritage Day, for the IMS Veteran's day breakfast, and for several of the local nursing homes. They will travel to Brandon, Mississippi in April for a Junior High Show Choir competition. IMS also has a 5th grade Chorus and 6th grade Chorus. Stimulus Funds to Benefit Local Law Enforcement & Housing Authority

A local housing project and the sheriff's department will benefit from \$181,210 in funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.

According to releases from First District Congressman Travis Childers' office, funds from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program in the amount of \$1,087,118 will benefit law enforcement agencies throughout the First District, and Tishomingo County gets \$22,928.

Sheriff Glenn Whitlock said the funding is being made available to applicants to upgrade outdated computer, radio and communications equipment.

Additionally, Whitlock said he has the Board of Supervisors authority to pursue additional funds through the stimulus program recently authorized by the Congress and President to hire three more officers. The feder-

ally-funded COPS Hiring Recovery Program will pay for three years salary for a new hire, if the agency will keep the officer on payroll for at least 12 months after that period.

"It would be like a 75-25 match for four years of service," said Whitlock.

Whitlock said he is also trying to get some state MEMA money to bring back the rescue dive team. He would like to get new people certified, update the equipment and get a boat divers can work with.

Iuka Housing Authority

Also in information released by Representative Childers, the Housing Authority of the City of Iuka is the recipient of \$158,282 in funds from the Public Housing Capital Fund Formula Program. The entire First District is projected to receive \$10,639,771.

According to Onita Golden, executive director of the Housing Authority, the agency plans to use the funds, combined with additional 2009 capital funds, to upgrade and replace sewer lines at low-income housing in the city of Iuka.

Sewer lines at Hiatt Circle and Oak Grove will be replaced, as they were the next item on their list of existing plans, said Golden. At Hiatt Circle, built in 1983, 50 units will be affected, and at Oak Grove, built in 1958, 26 units will.

Just recently, the agency that oversees the low-income apartments combined three years of funding to renovate kitchens, repaint and replace flooring at Hiatt Circle.

Her honors include class president (three years), class favorite (three years), Homecoming Maid, Best All Around, State Senate Page, Academic All-Star and honor roll.

Taylor also writes "Smoke Signals" for the school newspaper and the local newspaper. She is the daughter of Phillip and Sandy Kirk.

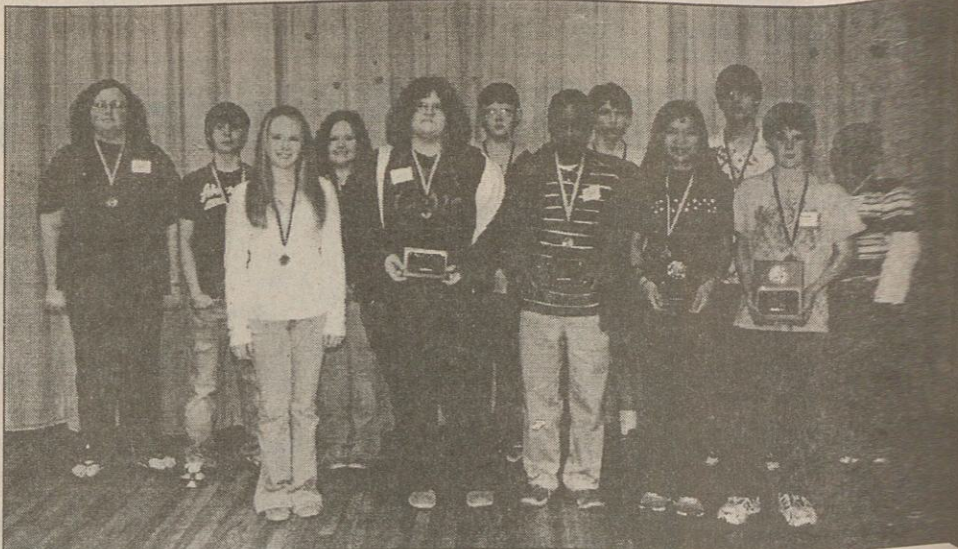

Tishomingo County To Receive FSA Disaster Loan Applications

Emergency loans for farmers, ranchers, and processors are available through the Prentiss County Office of the Farm Service Agency, Harold Mills, FSA Farm Loan Manager, said today.

Mr. Mills said this authority is pursuant to Secretary Vilsack's declaration on February 11, 2009, of a major disaster in Alabama, caused drought that occurred from January 1st through December 31st, 2008. As a result of this disaster, Tishomingo County as a contiguous county in Mississippi is named as an eligible for Federal disaster assistance pursuant to Section 321 (a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act.

Applications for assistance in the disaster-stricken county will be accepted by FSA through October 13th, 2009.

Farmers qualifying for emergency loans may borrow up to 100 percent of their actual production loss or the amount needed to restore their operation to its pre-disaster condition, whichever is less. The new emergency loan and outstanding principal balance of any existing emergency loan owed by the applicant or any individual member of an entity cannot exceed \$500,000.00.

FSA emergency loans cover losses from designated disasters and are made to qualified farmers who cannot obtain credit from other lenders in the local area.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) prohibits discrimination in all its programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, disability, and where applicable, sex, marital status, familial status, parental status, religion, sexual orientation, genetic information, political beliefs, reprisal, or because all or part of an individual's income is derived from any public assistance program. 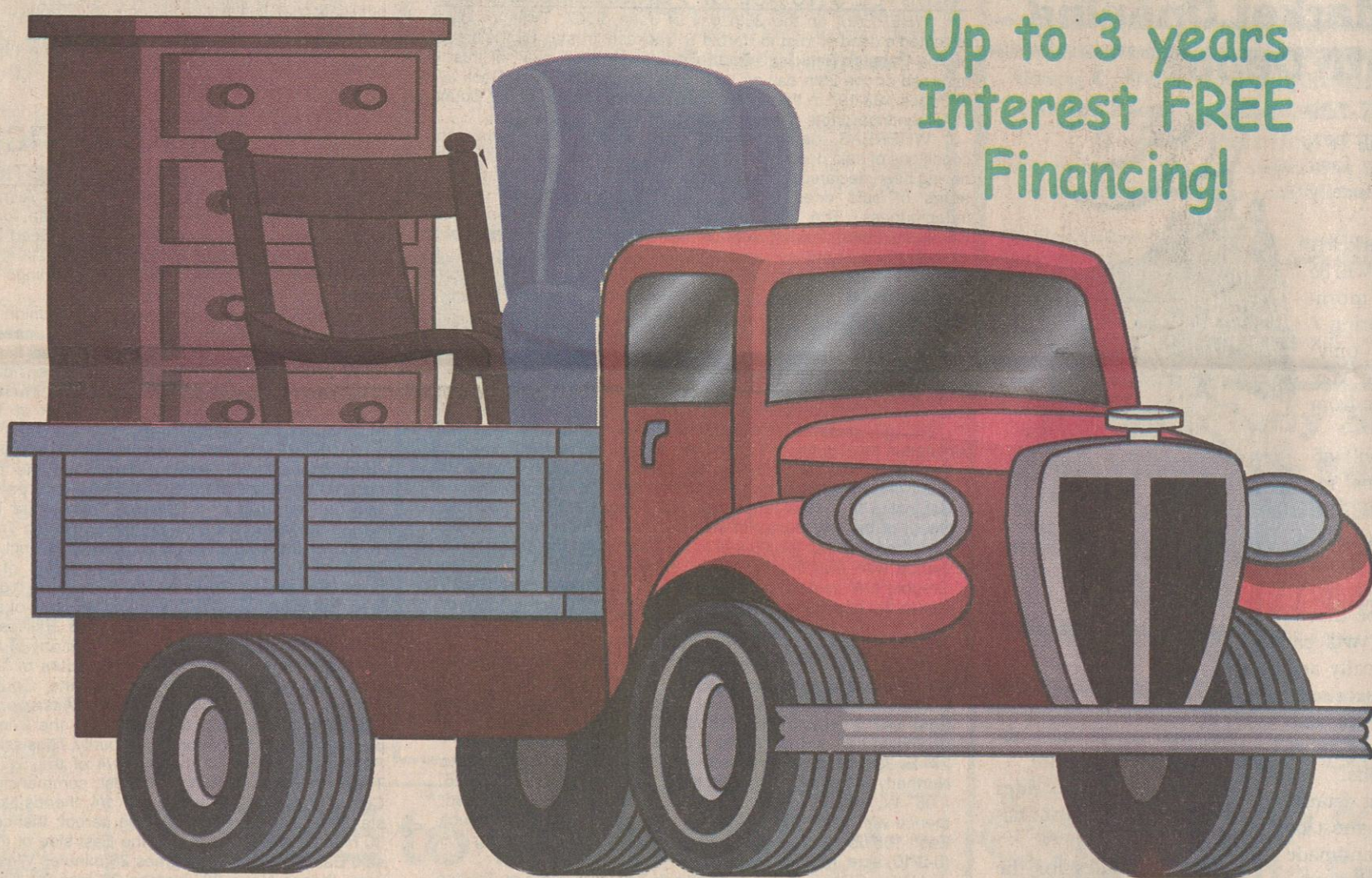
