Suicide of Teen Devastates Family, Prompts Questions

Tim and Kristy Flanagan are dealing with every parent's nightmare.

The parents of 14-year-old Joseph Gadbow are struggling to understand the circumstances surrounding his apparent suicide in the backyard of a foster home last hours after they visited with him Monday afternoon.

They left a supervised visit with him at a church in Selmer, Tennessee about 5:30 p.m. and at 7:25 they got a call from their attorney informing them, "There has been an accident; things don't look good."

According to the Flanagans, Gadbow was in the care of the Department of Child Services (DCS) in McNairy County, after he and his 13-year-old brother were taken from their McNairy County home January 22nd, the night the parents were accused of making methamphetamine. The Flanagans and their attorney say a disgruntled acquaintance wanted precursor materials under the Flanagan's home, and pointed the sheriff's officers straight to it. Officers brought a representative from DCS with them, said Kristy, and took the boys, even though a family member was on the way to get them.

Nothing has come of the drug charges to date, and the Flanagan's lawyer's attempts to obtain a copy of the search warrant, and get the children back with their family have proven fruitless. Tim said an official hearing giving DCS custody of the children has never even been held. They

are allowed only weekly supervised visits.

"DCS has done everything they can to bully and manipulate this family," said Jonathan White who is working the case for attorney James S. Powell.

"The state of Tennessee funds DCS \$78,000 per child for children who are out of their homes for more than 6 months," said Tim Flanagan. "People need to be made aware that there is a bounty on our children's heads."

The Flanagans blame the suicide on a DCS decision to medicate Joseph with Seroquel, a prescription drug used to treat depression and bipolar disorder. They say DCS gave the teen Seroquel in the form of samples from a nurse practitioner. The family and their attorney filed a motion of denial in early February to keep their son off the drug, which they say has negatively affected other members of his family.

According to Seroquel's web site, antidepressants can cause suicidal thoughts and those taking Seroquel should be monitored daily for suicidal thoughts or actions. Also, it is not approved for anyone under the age of eighteen.

The family has relocated to their hometown of Belmont since the January incident. Joey Gadbow was known to many county students, as he attended Tishomingo, Belmont and Iuka schools in the past.

The family is desperately trying to get custody of their younger son, in view of the circumstances.

Local Pastor Recovering After Tractor Accident

Rev. Billy Paul Feltman is recovering after a tractor accident last week left him with broken ribs and damaged lungs.

According to family and Les "Bubba" Carpenter who was one of the first responders at the scene, Bro. Billy Paul, 77, was seriously hurt when he reached over to crank an old Ford tractor from beside it. The tractor was in gear, and jumped forward, pulling him under the large rear wheel, explained Carpenter.

Feltman was airlifted to Tishomingo, where he is still in intensive care. The 77-year-old Feltman suffered ten broken ribs, a collapsed lung and a bruised lung, said Carpenter, and faces a long healing period.

Late Monday, a ventilator that was helping him breathe was removed, but replaced on Tuesday, since pain was making it hard to breathe, explained his granddaughter, Emily Gwatney. His vitals, blood pressure and oxygen levels were still good, she said, and he just has a long healing period ahead of him.

A good part of the story is that the tractor had a disc attached, but it was raised, sparing Feltman additional, even more serious injury, said Carpenter.

Mrs. Peggy, his wife, thanks everyone for their prayers and calls, said Emily, and asks for their continued support.

Feltman was pastor of Harmony Hill Baptist Church in Burnsville for 20 years. He also served at New Salem, and is currently ministering as associate pastor at Harmony Hill.

Man Recovering After Car-Pedestrian Collision Monday

A man was injured when a car struck him as he crossed the road in front of the courthouse Monday around 11:30 a.m.

According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, a local man was crossing west from Jack's across Battleground Drive in Iuka when a 1988 Honda Accord in the

southbound lane hit him. The man went through the windshield and the panicked driver immediately turned right into the south driveway of the Tishomingo County Courthouse.

The man was hidden by a vehicle in the center turn lane before he stepped in front of the Honda, explained Stringer, and the driver

apparently didn't see him.

The pedestrian suffered minor cuts and bruises, and was kept overnight at Iuka Hospital for observation, said Stringer.

Since the accident is still under investigation, the police did not want to release the names of those involved.

City of Iuka, Schools Prepare to Honor Soldiers When They Deploy

Tishomingo County's National Guard unit is leaving for Iraq May 1st, and officials plan to give them a memorable send-off.

When the soldiers of C-Troop 1-98 Cavalry Regiment leave the National Guard Armory at 8 a.m. May 1st, Iuka Mayor Jackie Bryant, city officials, and their families will be there to wish them a safe journey, and speedy return. From there they will go to all the schools in the county, where students will be outside to greet them.

"We all need to wear red on Fridays, and especially that Friday, to show them we will be keeping them in our hearts and prayers as they go to serve our country,"

said Bryant. American flags will be put up next week in Iuka, and "they are going to stay up until our boys come back home," said the Mayor.

Officials are asking that people line the streets throughout the county to show their support. Sgt. Jim Henry shared the planned route, so that everyone can decide where they will stand to wave and wish them well:

From the Armory, they will go west down Quitman, and go down Pearl and Meigs the back way through Iuka Middle School. Then they will go to Iuka Elementary, the back way by the soccer fields, coming out on Paul Edmondson Drive to pass the TCE-PA offices before heading south

on Constitution/Battleground to First American Drive between the bank and Walmart.

They will head to Burnsville School and enter through the east gate to greet students on campus before heading south on 25 to Tishomingo. People need to look for them on Trace Street before they turn toward Tishomingo School on 4th Street. They will greet students on the street in front of the historic Principal's Home.

The bus will head out of town on Jackson, and go south to Belmont, where they will loop the school on Cleveland, heading out to Main/Highway 25, and south to Fulton, where they will meet up with the rest of their troop.

I.M.S. CHIEFS (Changing Hurtful Intent By Enforcing Friendship Structure)

Noah Robertson, 7th grade student at Iuka Middle School and Life Boy Scout, felt he wanted to do something to change lives while working on his Eagle Scout Rank. Noah decided that working with students to change their behavior toward one another would do just that; so, he spoke with the Iuka Middle School administration about presenting an anti-bullying program. With complete support of Iuka Middle School, Noah began planning and developing the

program with the assistance of his fellow Scouts from Troop 26 of Iuka. Noah led the troop members in designing and developing a pamphlet about bullying, an anti-bullying contract for fellow students to sign, wooden drop-boxes for students to privately place notes regarding bullying issues, and skits for the presentation. Noah decided to call the program IMS CHIEFS (Changing Hurtful Intent by Enforcing Friendship Structure), so the program would have a

personal impact to the students of Iuka Middle School.

On Thursday, April 9th, 2009, at 2:15 p.m., all the students of Iuka Middle School convened in the school activity building for the program. Members of Troop 26 handed out anti-bullying pamphlets and anti-bullying contracts to each student and teacher. The lights then were dimmed and a video was played providing students with motivation to not bully one another, but to respect one another. Next, Noah

provided the students with opening remarks stating that bullying is a problem everywhere, but working together, it can be stopped. He continued by relaying a story about a student who was so bullied that he eventually committed suicide. Noah explained that we are all friends and classmates and need to take care of one another.

Then, members of Troop 26 performed a skit showing how pushing and shoving is a form of bullying and ways to change negative behavior. This was followed by a video poem, which showed how anyone can be a bully and how it can be overcome. Next, the scouts performed another skit about how name-calling affects a student and ways to stand up and help in a positive manner. Next, a Stop Bullying Now video was shown, which was highly compelling and brought the student body to complete silence. The scouts then performed their last skit giving evidence of working together to help someone, rather than hurt them. This was followed by a final video, which gave students insight into standing up and helping others, rather than watching or walking away while a fellow student is being bullied.

During the closing, Noah commented that bullying takes place, but the

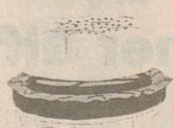

Shorter Sand & Gravel Plant Manager Ready for Retirement

The following article appeared in the January/February issue of *The Conveyor*, a Martin Marietta Materials Publication. It was written by David MacDonald, senior communications specialist

at Martin Marietta Materials in Raleigh, North Carolina.

Faye McKissick has now retired with Martin Marietta Materials and resides in Iuka with husband Billy. She is busy enjoy-

ing time with her daughter and son-in-law, Leigh Anne and Brant Rutledge and granddaughters, Anne Houston, MaryEllen and Scarlett Faye.

"Miss Faye" is stepping down.

After 43 years, Faye McKissick, Plant Manager at Shorter Sand & Gravel in Alabama, is retiring at the end of this month.

And, while her gender is noteworthy (she became the Company's first female plant manager in 1994), those who work with and for her don't define her in those terms.

"We don't see Miss Faye as the female of the bunch," says Maylene Quarry Plant Manager Rickey Horton. "She's just one of the guys, and we have a tremendous amount of respect for her."

"I don't see her as a woman or look at her achievements in that way," adds O'Neal Plant Manager Rich Knizner. "I just see her as a high performing manager and a natural leader."

Everyone who comes

in contact with McKissick, and not just those within the Company, sees her simply as "someone who runs a very good operation," says David Jones, Vice President - General Manager of the Alabama District.

A 'Joyful Ride' Revisited

With her father and grandfather in the business, it's no surprise that McKissick's first job out of high school in 1966 was Clerk at Cherokee Quarry in northwest Alabama. What is surprising, she says, is what's happened since then.

"I didn't see that first job as being a permanent thing," she says, "and I never could have imagined it leading to what it has."

In 1994, after 28 years at the quarry (as clerk and office manager), McKissick was named Plant Manager at Cherokee. The decision to promote her, says retired Production Manager Ron Summers, was an easy one.

"She knew that plant inside and out. You could ask her a question about anything and she could give you a history of it," he says. "She handled people very well and had always done a really good job for us."

McKissick says she recognizes and appreciates the opportunity she was provided.

"I thank the Lord every day that they saw something in me," she says. "I didn't have the education that normally goes with this position, but they still gave me the opportunity. I decided to run with it and it's been a joyful ride ever since."

Team Player Personified

In 1997, McKissick moved to Tremont, Mississippi, to become plant manager at the Company's newly acquired R&S Sand & Gravel operation. In 2002, she took on the same role at Adamsville

(Alabama) and in 2004 moved into her current role at Shorter.

On several other occasions, McKissick has helped newly acquired operations assimilate themselves into Martin Marietta.

"Faye has always been a good Company person," notes Summers. "She's always done whatever is asked of her to support the Company and its objectives."

When Vance Quarry in Alabama was purchased from Southern Ready Mix in 2002, the plant's manager, Knizner, found McKissick there, ready to help.

"Miss Faye really impressed me as to how organized she was and how well she had everything laid out for us," he says. "From that point on, as far as I'm concerned, she's always been the district's 'go-to gal.'"

"Even now, when I have a problem with the numbers part of our busi-

ness, she's the one I turn to."

Strong Manager, Great Friend

When McKissick came to Shorter in 2004, it didn't take her long to settle into her new position, says Quality Control Technician Kenny Brown.

"After a couple of months, everyone was on board and realized that she was the boss," he says. "A lot of things changed when she arrived, but they changed for the best."

"Faye works hard to build the trust of her employees," says Office Manager Gwen Robinson. "It doesn't take them long to see that she is someone who will take good care of them."

Plant Foreman Clyde Dicks calls McKissick the "best manager [he's] worked for."

"She's a great administrator, but beyond being my manager and my boss, she's been a great friend, to both me and my family," he says. "She's just a great

person."

District Production Manager John Stalcup calls McKissick a natural leader and strong advocate for her employees.

"I've never worried about this operation," he says. "When I got here, it was obvious to me, very quickly, that we had a strong manager at Shorter and a strong business-minded person that handles things brilliantly."

"She's a very special lady who's good at what she does," Stalcup adds. "She'll be dearly missed, not only by me, but by the entire district."



Application for a development permit shall be made to the Floodplain Administrator on forms furnished by him or her prior to any development activities, and may include, but not limited to, the following plans in duplicate drawn to scale showing the nature, location, dimensions, and elevations of the area in question; existing or proposed structures, earthen fill, storage of materials or equipment, drainage facilities, and the location of the foregoing structure or development.

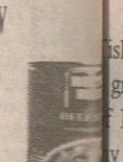

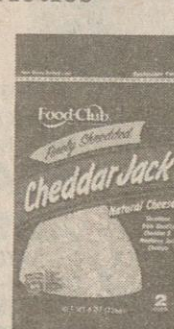

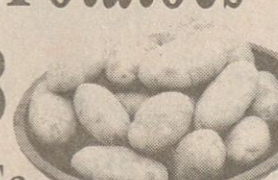
