## Braves Pitcher Faces Long Recovery After Wreck

Senior Braves pitcher and running back Matt Davis faces an extensive recovery process after a single vehicle accident last Friday morning on the way to school.

Davis' 2002 GMC truck left the road as he was driving south on Highway 25 just north of Dexter Bottom at about 7:20 a.m.

"We didn't see what happened, but we could still see the dust floating around," said Davis' sister Ashley, who was one of the first ones on the scene. She was driving with her mother just behind Davis.

The truck was right side up, and in a driveway with the passenger side open, said Ashley. She thought he was just having car trouble, but then saw that both the driver's side wheels had been broken off. She found Davis where he was thrown 40-50 yards from the truck.

According to his mother, Sandy Davis, Matt suffered injuries to his pelvis, and spent several days in North Mississippi Medical Center in Tupelo, to where he was airlifted from the scene.

Monday night about midnight, he was taken by ambulance to University of Alabama

Birmingham Hospital. He was in surgery to repair the pelvis Wednesday morning at press time, and faces an extended time of recovery.

He is in great spirits, said Sandy, and hopes to be able to go to the school and get his diploma in person, and someday play ball again. He may be home by next week, she said, if all goes well.

"We thank everyone for the visits and calls, and ask for your continued prayers through the recovery," said Ashley.

I would like to announce to you my candidacy for re-election to the post of Alderman for the City of Iuka.

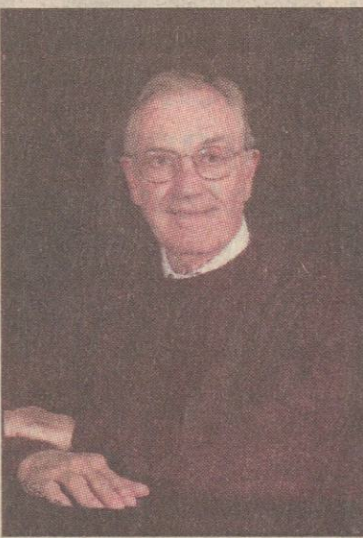

## Local World War II Vet, Avon Whitfield, Finds Closure

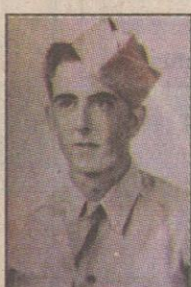
Many veterans bring home memories of battles, devastation, death, and gloom that stay with them for a lifetime. One local hero has lived 64 years with the goal to seek personal closure, and bring happiness to another military family.

Avon V. Whitfield was one of the hundreds of young men from Tishomingo County that served in World War II. Avon was born and raised in Tishomingo County, Mississippi, the son of Joseph and Flarra Whitfield. He was barely 20 years old when he joined the U.S. Army on November 3, 1942, at Camp Shelby. He was transferred to Ft. Riley, Kansas, for basic training. A skinny 150-pound young man, he had no idea what war atrocities he and thousands of others would endure.

Avon, assigned to the 9<sup>th</sup> Armored Division, 89<sup>th</sup> Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, fought under General Patton in the Battle of the Bulge over the winter months of 1944-1945, which was the last major Nazi offensive against the Allies in World War II. This battle was a last-ditch attempt by Hitler to split the Allies

in two in their drive towards Germany and destroy their ability to supply themselves. Due to the many lives that were lost in this battle, many more soldiers were sent to Germany as replacements. It was at this time that T/5 Whitfield met and became friends with Pvt. Garland Lee Loudermilk.

Another battle of significance during World War II was the Battle for Remagen Bridge. This battle marked the beginning of the end of World War II in the west of the German Reich. The Germans intended to destroy the Remagen Bridge, which crossed the Rhine River into Germany, but they were unsuccessful. Several attempts failed; therefore, the Americans obtained clear passage over the Rhine River, altering the course of the war. Though the Americans held the bridgehead from early March 1945, the Germans were still not ready to give up their efforts to

destroy the bridge at Remagen. German bombers were flown in to attack the bridge, but they too were unable to destroy it. Hitler then ordered divers from the German Navy to attempt underwater attacks, though they arrived too late to finish off the weakened structure. Shortly after 3 p.m. on the afternoon of March 17<sup>th</sup>, 1945, with a sickening roar of torn steel, the bridge at Remagen finally collapsed and fell into the Rhine River. Twenty-seven American Army Engineers were killed when the bridge collapsed while repairing artillery damage. The destruction, 10 days after it was liberated by the 9<sup>th</sup> Armored Division, did not, however, alter the American advance east of the Rhine, as a pontoon bridge had already been completed.

It was cold in Germany, and the Army issued each driver a Mackinaw, a coat of thick, woolen material. Avon didn't particularly like his coat; it was heavy and cumbersome. T/5 Whitfield loaned his Mackinaw to Pvt. Garland Loudermilk, the young soldier who had joined the unit earlier. Shrapnel hit Pvt. Loudermilk, cutting a hole in his left arm pit and across his chest. Garland

told Avon that the Mackinaw saved his life, and Avon told him to keep the coat. A few weeks later, on March 8<sup>th</sup>, 1945, Garland Loudermilk was killed in action. He was still wearing T/5 Avon Whitfield's Mackinaw. Eventually, Avon's coat was returned to him by a buddy, and inside a pocket was a wallet belonging to Pvt. Loudermilk. The wallet was devoid of any information, and Avon thought that Pvt. Loudermilk had received it as a gift from his wife that very day. Avon intended to return the wallet to Pvt. Loudermilk's family, but life got in the way.

He was honorably discharged, came home, and in December 1946, married Louise Curtis Whitfield. They have three children, three grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren. After working with TVA for several years, he is now suffering from asbestosis.

A few weeks ago, Mr. Whitfield's family contacted the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society to see if they could assist him in locating the Loudermilk family. Society president, RaNae Vaughn, quickly agreed to assist in the endeavor. Pvt. Loudermilk's military record stated that he originated from Greenbrier County, West

## TCDF Chairman Invites Everyone to Participate in Tishomingo County's Growth Opportunities

*Editor's Note: In this open letter to county citizens, Tishomingo County Development Chairman Peyton Cummings issued an invitation to everyone to help with current and upcoming development opportunities:*

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation is a public-private partnership created by the citizens of Tishomingo County to create new jobs and investment. Although TCDF has one of the smallest budgets of any local economic development agency in Mis-

issippi, the development foundation has been successful over the past few years in competing for new and expanded projects. None of these projects could have happened without fine partners like the Board of Supervisors, the municipalities, Tishomingo County Electric Power Association, foundation members, Mississippi Development Authority, Tennessee Valley Authority, Northeast Mississippi Community College, Northeast Planning & Development District, and many others.

Join us in marketing our county by becoming a member of the foundation. Memberships are a minimum of \$50 for individuals and a minimum of \$100 for businesses. Most invest

more than the minimum.

Membership fees are used only for marketing of Tishomingo County. There are no membership forms to fill out and members may deduct these investments on federal income tax returns. Members also receive periodic news updates and are the first to learn of new and expanded projects.

Following this letter is a summary of what is involved in economic development in the new global economy.

We hope you will review this summary and decide to join us as we create the future.

## Tishomingo County's Economic Development Program

Tishomingo County's economic development program involves several activities:

- Industrial and business recruitment
- Assistance to existing business and industry
- Small business development
- Tourism
- Retiree attraction

Tourism has, by far, the greatest potential.

Economic development has changed drastically over the past 20 years. Some of those changes are listed below:

### Trust and Long Term Partnerships

Economic development is no longer about recruiting low wage factory jobs. Economic development nowadays is built upon trust and long-term partnerships with business, industry, and economic development partners.

### Cost

Competition for business and industry is so fierce now that industrial recruiting is essentially just bidding on projects. Few rural counties can afford most industrial projects.

### Time

We used to implement projects in months. Now it takes years. Normally, it takes two to five years at the front end before the project is announced and three to seven years to fully implement the project after it is announced.

### Jobs

Most manufacturing

jobs nowadays require more education and training than in the past.

### Due Diligence

Due diligence is required to weed out those projects that are not real.

### Work Lots of Projects

We have to work a lot of projects just to find one that works.

### Buildings

Most industrial prospects are seeking existing publicly owned industrial buildings with high ceilings and several transportation options.

### Home Grown Is Best

Home grown businesses and industries are best. Nationally, branch manufacturing plants last an average of 6.5 years before moving on. Home grown small businesses stabilize an economy. Nowadays, industrial recruiting is the least important source of new jobs nationally.

### Marketing Is Constant and Continual

We have to market our community constantly and continually and focus our severely limited marketing resources on businesses and industries that we know and trust. Once we stop marketing, our community falls off the radar quickly.

### Non-Disclosure

Even small projects nowadays demand non-disclosure agreements that are legally binding.

## Iuka City Leaders Earn Certification in MML Courses

Three Iuka government officials have earned certification in municipal government management through the Mississippi Municipal League.

Iuka Alderman James "Kissum" Grisham graduated from the Certified Municipal Officials Basic program. Under this program, local elected officials complete training and activities directly related to understanding and improving the management of local municipal issues. The most recent graduating class

was recognized at the MML Mid-Winter Conference.

The Basic CMO certification was based on sixty hours of training presented by MML, and takes about two years to complete. Although the certification is voluntary, it requires the completion of four courses: Municipal Organization, Municipal Law, Municipal Finance, and Municipal Land Use.

Mayor Jackie Bryant and Alderwoman Martha Biggs have both completed the Advanced Certified Mu-

nicipal Officials program, the second level of the program, and also received recognition at the Mid-Winter Conference.

The Advanced CMO program provides the participants additional training to help them better prepare for economic development opportunities that might become available for their city. It requires 40 additional hours of course work and focuses on economic and community development.
