## A ROSE FOR MOTHER

The Iuka-based Troop C members left for Camp Shelby, where they will meet up with the rest of the 155th Brigade Combat Team, and head to Iraq in the early summer.

Ms. Mary Jo was carried to the send-off ceremonies by friends at Tishomingo Manor, and it meant so much for her son to have his mother present, as well as his wife and children.

Children, spouses and loved ones were joined by many other community members last Friday morning at the Armory to say goodbye to the local guard members.

Iuka city officials were on hand to officially recognize the contributions of each soldier, the Gideons handed out new Testaments, and Senator Eric Powell urged them to take care of themselves, and come back home safely.

About half of those in the Iuka unit have already done a tour, said SSG Tabo McAnally as we rode the bus through the county Friday morning to visit students at each school. Friends and community members turned out in crowds along the highways and streets every town, and in between. They dressed in red shirts, and waved flags. It was a great encouragement to the soldiers, who saw each one who came out to wave or salute.

The last time they left, said McAnally, they did not do anything like this. He thought it was making a huge difference to the soldiers, and that was only after the first school.

All the schools put on an incredible display, with every student, teacher and staff member lining sidewalks to shake hands, or give "high-fives" to the soldiers. Students offered handmade signs with good luck wishes and encouragement. The bus had a few seats full of them by the end of the ride!

The soldiers were greatly affected by the outpouring of support. When they rounded the corner at Iuka Elementary and saw an entire line of Boy Scouts saluting, lots of folks on the bus suddenly had "eye problems."

"If you ever wondered what we are fighting for, look there," said one soldier as the bus headed up the hill to Tishomingo County High School and we saw a long line of hundreds of flags and students.

At Belmont School, the last stop before Fulton, a huge assembly sang "I'm Proud to Be an American" along with music pumping over loud speakers.

## Burnsville Opened New Boat Dock Last Friday

Burnsville celebrated the opening of a new boat dock at its ramp on the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway last Friday morning.

With the assistance of a \$37,000 grant from the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks (MDWFP), Burnsville was able to install a 10-by-25-foot commercial-grade floating dock that will allow boaters to safely tie up their boat after they launch it at the nearby ramp. It is located within sight of the U.S. Highway 72 bridge, near the existing gazebo and boat parking area.

"Your boat won't float away, and you no longer have to crawl over rocks while you go to park your trailer," explained District 1 Representative Lester "Bubba" Carpenter, of Burnsville, who helped officials in his hometown link up with Deputy Director of MDWFP Al Tuck last year.

Certain restrictions apply to any structure built on the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers-controlled Tenn-Tom Waterway. This new structure replaces an older, wooden one that deteriorated to the point of uselessness about a year ago.

The dock is handicap-accessible, and added to the newly renovated rest room facilities nearby, it makes Burnsville a

popular place for many Tennessee visitors who use it as the first place of access for the Pickwick Lake/Tennessee River water system.

"Visitors buy their gas here, they stock up on drinks and snacks before they head out boating or fishing," said Mayor David Nixon. "It's a great thing for Burnsville."

"Working with the state and local officials as a team really made this happen for the good of everyone," said Nixon. "It takes teamwork to make things happen."

## Tishomingo County Named "Hottest Market Under 22,000" in Southeast

It gets pretty hot here in Tishomingo County, but recently our county has been recognized for another kind of "hot."

*Southern Business & Development* magazine, has named Tishomingo County as the hottest market with a population under 22,000 in the southeastern United States, according to a release from the Tishomingo County Development Foundation.

The article, "Hot Markets in a Cold Economy" also lists other southeastern "hot spots," including Paragould and Russellville, Arkansas; Fayetteville and Winston-Salem, North Carolina; Lafayette and Lake Charles, Louisiana; San Antonio, Lubbock, and Ft. Worth, Texas; Tulsa and Ardmore, Oklahoma; Joplin, Missouri; Rome, Georgia; Newport News, Virginia; and Clarksville, Tennessee.

Columbus, Mississippi, also made the list, but Tishomingo County was the smallest county in population on the list.

Although we have a long way to go, and a lot of work to do, this recognition of Tishomingo County is a testament to the power of teamwork, beginning with the Board of Supervisors, the six municipalities, Tishomingo County

Electric Power Association, Yellow Creek Port Authority and the private sector.

These local partnerships link with development agencies and entities including Mississippi Development Authority, Tennessee Valley Authority, Northeast Mississippi Community College, Northeast Mississippi Planning & Development District, North Mississippi Industrial Development Association, and many others.

This recognition also points to the effectiveness of a consistent, long-term marketing program.

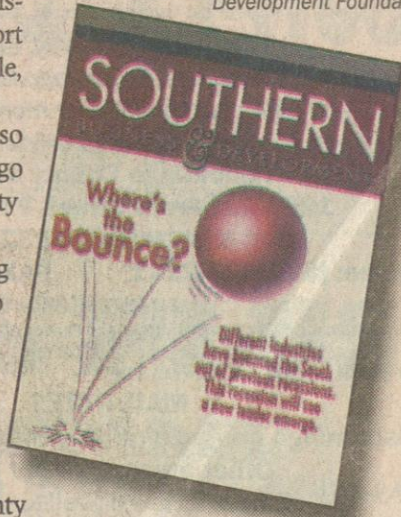
## Iuka Baseball Hosts Coach-Pitch Tournament This Weekend

Coaches and team mates welcomed back Matt Davis.

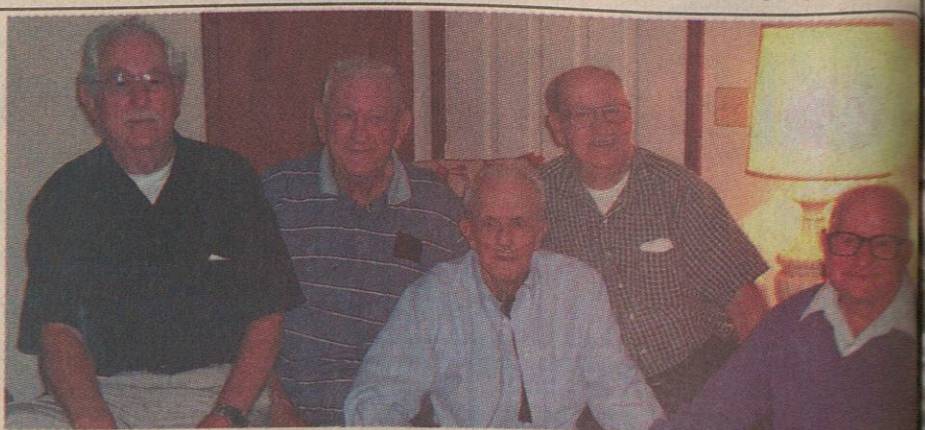
After a serious wreck about two weeks ago, and surgery to repair his pelvis, Matt is walking on his own.

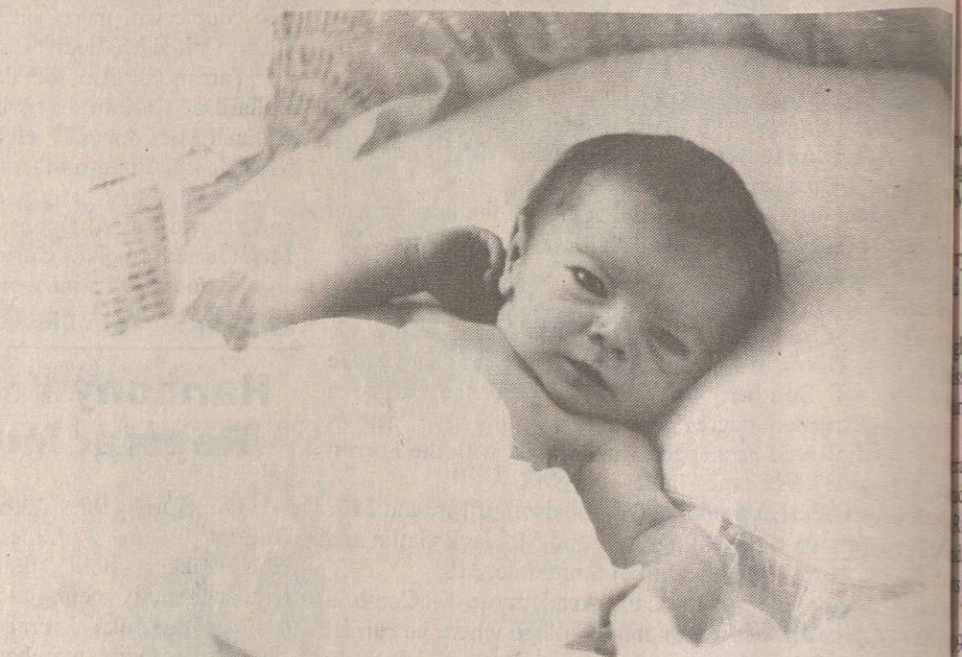
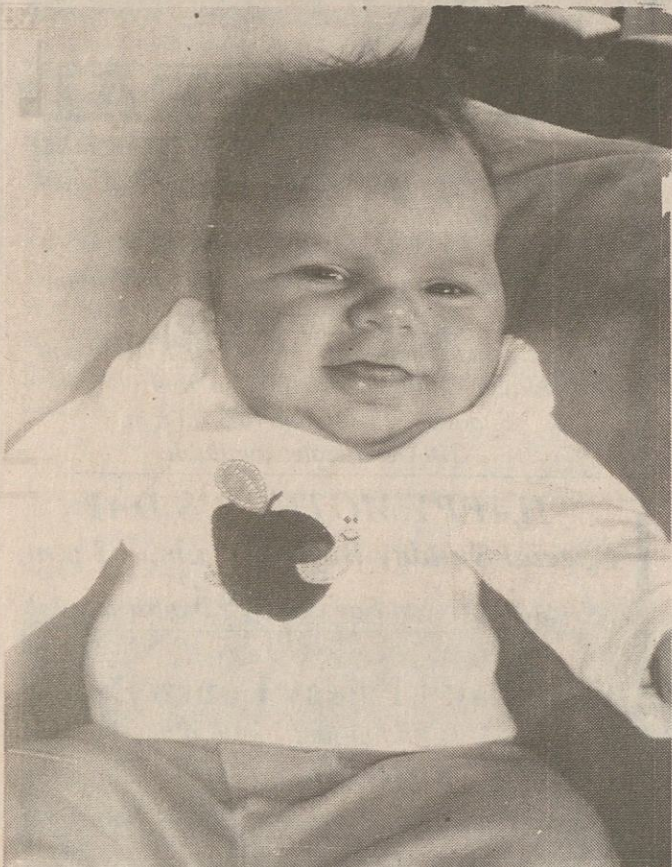


### New Arrival In Ryan Home

## Eyeglass Care

Like dirt on a windowpane, any scratches on the lenses of your glasses will make a difference in how well you are able to see with them.
