## Missing Jackson, Tenn. Man's Body Found

**Suspect dead after five-hour standoff with police**

The body of a Jackson, Tennessee man was recovered by police last Wednesday morning, after his family reported him missing nearly a week before.

Chico Donaldson's body was identified by the State Medical Examiner's Office in Nashville, according to a release from the Jackson Police Department. The release said he died of multiple gunshot wounds.

Donaldson is the son of Dean Donaldson, of Iuka, and attended school in Tishomingo as a young child.

Police continue to investigate the slaying, which has been attributed to Thomas Cupples, a coworker of Molly Donaldson, Chico Donaldson's wife. Police found Cupples dead of an apparent self-inflicted gunshot wound in a back bedroom of his home after a five-hour standoff with officers Tuesday night.

Cupples, 39, of Jackson, wrote that he killed Chico Donaldson, 22, in a note he left in his

home Tuesday.

The note also told police where to find Donaldson's body. Investigators found a body wrapped in a tarp behind a house in a wooded area in Jacks Creek, in Chester County.

On Friday, Molly Donaldson, 22, was arraigned in Jackson City Court on charges of tampering with evidence and filing a false police report.

Chico's parents, Dean Donaldson, of Iuka, and Charlotte Morales, of Jackson, are looking for more answers in the case.

His mother last saw him April 30th when he dropped off his 4-year-old son at her house.

"We want this case to be closed," Dean Donaldson said. "Chico left a son who has to grow

up without him; I don't want him to grow up knowing his daddy's case wasn't closed. We know more than one person was involved, but if we don't get help in the case, someone may go free."

## Thorn Seeks Support in Iuka Alderman Race

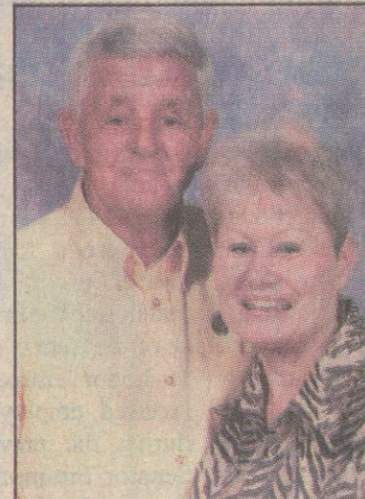
I am Eugen "Peanut" Thorn, and I would like to take this opportunity to announce my candidacy for a position on the Iuka Board of Alderman.

## Tishomingo County Hires New Boys' Basketball Coach

Tishomingo County High School Principal Dr. Eddie Britton announced Tuesday that a new boys' basketball coach has been hired.

Anthony Kummel, 41, currently with the Baldwin County school district in Alabama will move to the county as soon as he finishes his contract at Gulf Shores High School, where he is the varsity basketball coach.

He has coached varsity basketball for 12 years, said Dr. Britton. Kummel was among 24 applicants for the TC varsity coaching position, which has been open since just after the season ended, and one-year coach Donald Borden resigned.

Eleven applicants were interviewed, explained Dr. Brit-

ton, by a team consisting of him, Assistant Principal Jackie Beals, and TC Athletic Director Steve Carter.

"We are excited to have someone of his character join our great coaching staff," said Dr. Britton.

In previous positions as the basketball coach at South Side High School (5A), and before that Dallas County (4A), Kummel led teams to finish in the "elite eight" of the Alabama state high school playoffs, said Dr. Britton. His teams have been area champions, or runners-up six times.

Kummel attended Troy State University and has his masters in social studies education and administration. At TCHS, he will teach social studies/history and

physical education.

Kummel said he is looking forward to moving to the county, and having a good place to raise his family. Kummel's wife also teaches and they have a two-year-old son.

"Today is a celebration of the exceptional hard work and achievements of some of our please see

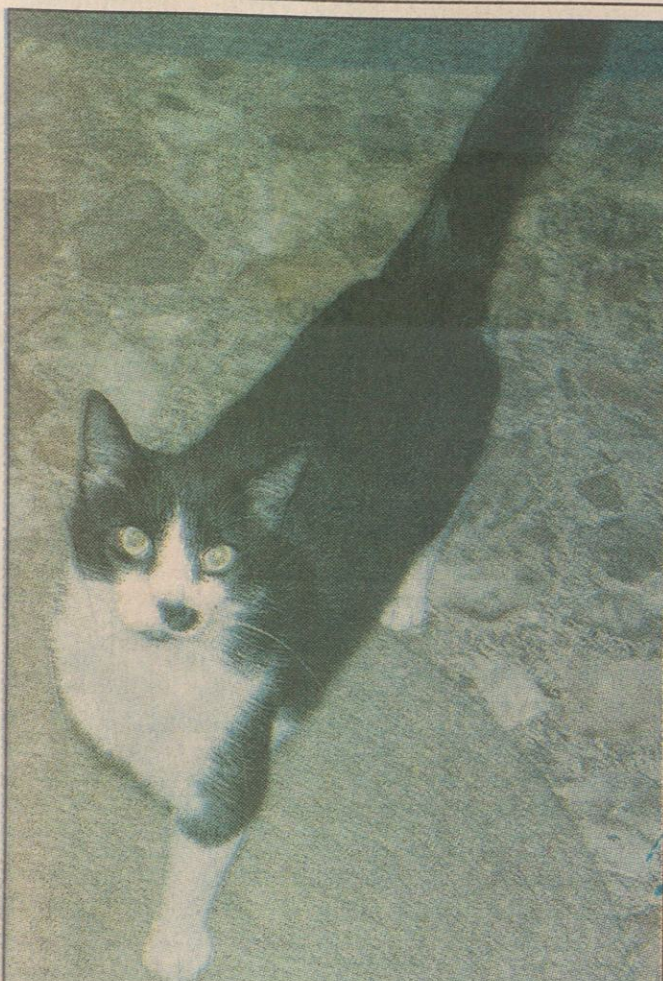

## Tenn-Tom History At The Iuka Library

On Tuesday, May 19th at 12 noon the Booneville born, Mississippi historian, Nathan Horn will be speaking at Iuka's Public Library about a topic that is very close to our hearts around here: the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway.

Mr. Horn says that while the Tenn-Tom's economic impact failed to live up to people's expectations its environmental influence more than exceeded them. The region embraced the environmental changes forced upon the project by national legislations which allowed the waterway to be built. Today it offers a model of how economic and environmental forces intersected and changed within the rural South during the 1970s, 80s, and 90s.

Nathan comes to us well prepared to show the many faces which the

waterway has exhibited. Last summer he was the Assistant Producer and Script Writer for a documentary entitled The Building of a Dream: The Tennessee Tombigbee Waterway, and among his notable

Papers, Presentations and Awards is: Sacrificed for Progress: The Destruction of Holcut, Mississippi and Its Historical Memory, which he presented at the Forum on Agricultural and Rural History, in the Spring of 2008. Nathan is currently finishing his Masters Degree in History at Mississippi State and will begin work on his PhD this fall.

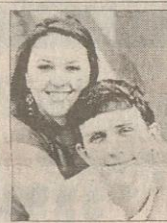

## Stimulus Package Funding Summer Jobs for Youth in County

Looking for a summer job?

If you're age 14 to 24, now is the time to apply for one of approximately 300 jobs that have been made available in Northeast Mississippi Planning & Development District area thanks to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act that was passed by Congress earlier this year.

The part-time and full-time jobs will vary, said Sharon Gardner of the Northeast Mississippi Planning & Development District in Booneville.

Twenty-five jobs in Tishomingo County are funded, and they will be in city halls, courthouses, libraries, schools ... they can do all sorts of things, Gardner said. Workers will be paid \$7.25 per hour, and the jobs are based on family income.

Gardner said it is the first summer youth program for the region in a decade. The program is being administered by the Mississippi Partnership Local Workforce Area through Three Rivers and in cooperation with Northeast Mississippi

Planning & Development District in Booneville.

The program, funded by \$750,000 made available through the federal stimulus plan, will begin June 15. Administration will be accomplished by five county coordinators, which are also open for applications at this time, and one district-wide coordinator. Interested applicants for these temporary positions can apply at WIN Job Centers, and those are not based on income, said Sadie Hardin, of NEMP-DD.

Applications, along with required documentation, are being taken through May 15 at Chancery Clerks offices, city halls and local Win Job Centers. Applications also are available online at [www.nempdd.com](http://www.nempdd.com).

Qualified applicants will be notified if they've been accepted, then assigned a date and location for orientation. Once the orientation is complete, they'll begin working June 15.

We expect the program to have a duration of approximately six to eight weeks with some older youth possibly continuing in the fall, Gardner said. The program is available to youth in Alcorn, Benton, Marshall, Prentiss, Tippah & Tishomingo counties.

The Little Flock Primitive Baptist Church was constituted June 11th, 1892, by seven people that had obtained letters of good standing from the Sardis Church. The Sardis Church was located about 42 miles away between Jacinto and Rienzi. Pastor, Elder J.C. Reed, and the Church Clerk, J.A. Carter, along with Elders J.J. Akers and J.D. Huddleston formed the Presbytery. The members of the church to be constituted were Brethren Milton Hardwick, J.G. Stepp, and J.R. Streetman. Sisters Nancy Caldon Hardwick,

Elizabeth Streetman, Frances E. Holder, and Martha Frances Holder were constituted as well. All of these members were connected by marriage or blood relations.

The church was constituted in a community building in the Berea community, south of Burnsville, Mississippi, and was used for a church until 1894. At that time, some land was purchased, and the old church, that is still standing, was built. A cemetery was formed on the ridge north of the church. One monument dates back to 1883.

In the mid-1980's, a building fund was started, and in 1995, a new church building was built. The building was completed in 1996 and dedicated June 1997. The old building would not hold the large crowd during cemetery decoration services or when a funeral was held. The kitchen and dining area were too small for a family with lots of members and friends when the weather did not permit eating outside.

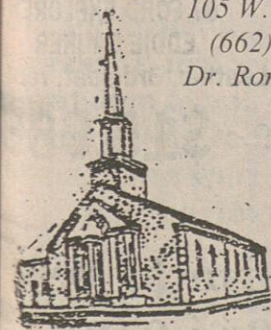

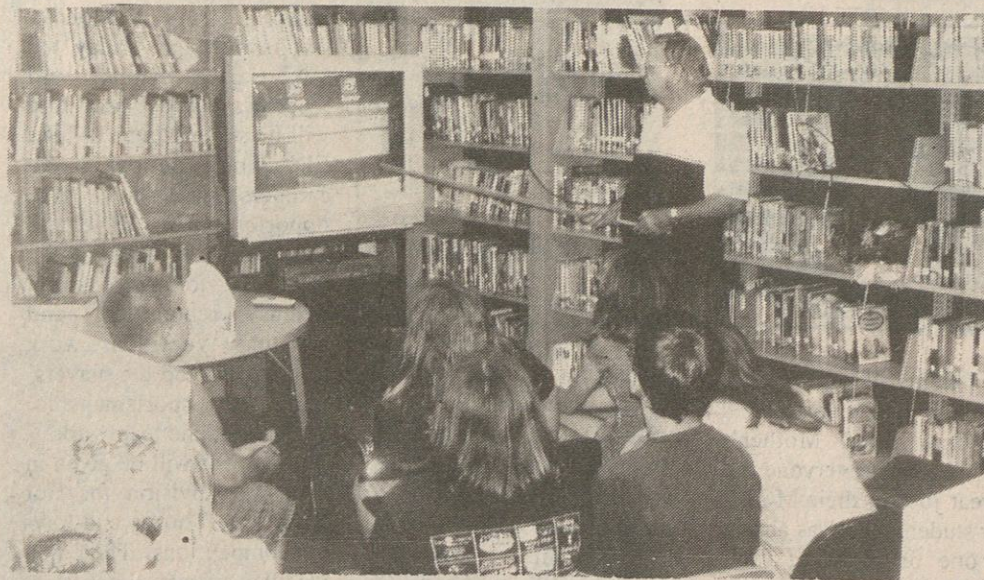

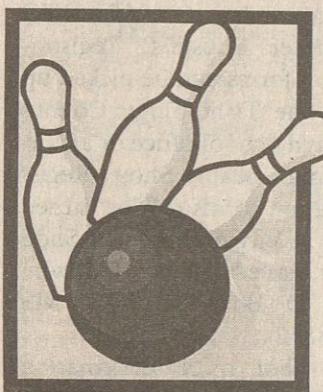
