## Municipal Elections Next Tuesday

Three cities in the county will hold municipal elections next Tuesday, June 2nd.

City Halls in Iuka, Belmont and Burnsville will be open for voting from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. for city residents to elect mayors and boards of aldermen.

In each election, voters can vote for one (1) mayoral candidate, and up to five (5) aldermen, according to municipal election rules.

In Iuka, incumbent Mayor

Jackie Bryant, and incumbent Police Chief Randy Stringer face no opposition, but there are several vying for the five aldermen seats. Incumbents are noted with an (i).

## No Elections in Paden, Tishomingo or Golden

Three municipalities in the county have been authorized to bypass elections this year, since they have the exact number of candidates qualified as there are open positions.

In Tishomingo, incumbent mayor James Tennyson will keep his office, and five people have qualified for the board. Barbara Oaks, Jimmy Burns, Anne Taylor, and Fredia Hale will keep their positions and Gary Harlan will fill the fifth position caused by the retirement of Bertha Tidwell.

In Paden, Pam Oswalt will

remain as incumbent mayor, and incumbents Jean Luttrell, Jorja Patty, Keith Deaton, and Jim Murphy will be joined by Dave Benson.

In Golden, the exact number of candidates have qualified as there are positions, but in Golden, no incumbents will return. The new mayor will be Davy Ginn, who previously served as mayor two terms ago, said Golden City Clerk Tina Payne.

The new board of aldermen will include Sherry Shook, Tracy Pharr, Andy Hamilton, Larry Bolton, and Dennis Pharr.

## 120 Runners in 2nd Annual Woodall Dash 5K

More than 120 runners participated in the Second Annual Woodall Dash last Saturday morning. The race was sponsored by the Tishomingo County Junior Auxiliary and raised funds for their many causes.

The conditions were cloudy, but the rain held off, and organizers said it was a good turnout for the 5K run and 1 mile fun run. For the first time, the race was timed by ShoalsTRAC, a running club from the Shoals area. The race began at the Fairgrounds and wound through Woodall Mountain Estates.

Nearly half the runners were from Tishomingo County, and many of those finished with very

good times. Runners ranged in age from 9 years old to at least 77.

The top male runners were: 1st- Israel Melendez, 41, of Plantersville, with a time of 17:26, and pace of 5:37.

3rd-Bobby Holley, 43, of Corinth, 18:41

The top three women were lead by 11th place overall finisher Emily Davidson, 15, of Red Bay, Alabama, with a time of 22:23.

3rd - Amy Webb, 44, of Iuka, (22nd overall) with a time of

25:56.

“CIVIL WAR”

Tom Parsons, from the Civil War Interpretative Center, visited our Gifted class, He shared his knowledge, and then answered all the questions that we asked!  
He came fully dressed as a soldier, including his survival gear.  
He definitely caught our attention, as we listed closely to hear!  
He talked of his jacket, and how it was made of wool,  
And how in the 100 degree temperatures, it was hard for our soldiers to keep their cool!  
The wool material was flame retardant, which made it useful, although hot.  
It kept the uniform from catching fire from the muzzle flashes as they fought!  
“Butternuts” was a nickname our Confederate troops were called by others.  
Named for their butternut colored uniforms which were made with a dye  
By boiling walnut hulls that produced the gray-brown color  
Flour, rice and corn was carried in a purse-like pouch called a haversack,  
As was his utensils and mainstays, like salt pork and hardtack!  
Eating salt pork that was packed in barrels allowed them to have meat during meals.  
Which gave them strength to carry their 12 lbs. weapons throughout the land and over hills!  
The menu of salt pork and hardtack was a hard meal to bear....  
While a soldier’s shoe was made for either their right foot or their left to wear!  
During battles, some soldiers walked over 20 miles a day.  
They even had cannons that could fire up to 10 miles away!  
Mr. Parsons shared how important two opposite teeth were in tearing  
Ammo packets before pouring the contents down the barrel of a gun.  
And how pushing the ramrod down with their pinky finger was safer  
Than if the gun fired and blew off any other one!!  
Bullets would mushroom out and shatter a soldier’s bone, if he was shot.  
Amputations were the end result, if a weapon’s inaccuracy  
Of hitting it’s target actually met it’s mark!  
A soldier’s bayonet saw more use as a cooking utensil  
And as a candleholder when writing letters home.  
And how preparing soldiers for battle and leading a  
Directional charge is mostly for what the sword is known!  
Sadly, more soldiers died from diseases than from the bullets from a gun.  
And it was caused by drinking the unsanitary water the soldiers  
Used for bathing and other such situations.

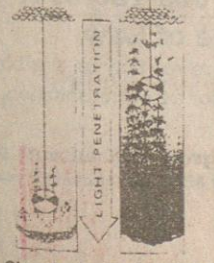
Terrie Whitehurst reported that seven had worked at the Tishomingo County Walking Park planting a beautiful cherry tree and sprucing up the park.
