New Aldermen Elected in Burnsville, Belmont, Iuka

Turnout was varied throughout the county in Tuesday's municipal elections, but all results were final and required no runoff.

In Iuka, of 2,254 registered voters, only 504 voted, said City Clerk Benny Gray. Two new aldermen were elected - John R. Robertson, to replace incumbent Martha Biggs, and Joel Robertson, to replace Grisham and Johnny Southward. Mayor Jackie Bryant received 381 votes, and Police Chief Randy Stringer received 381 in uncontested elections.

Man Faces 20 Years to Life After Jury Trial Last Week

A Tishomingo man was sentenced to 28 years in prison during the sentencing phase of a child molestation trial in Tishomingo County Circuit Court last Thursday.

Jack D. Moore, Jr., 39, was sentenced by Circuit Court Judge Jim Pounds about 8:40 Thursday morning in front of a small crowd of onlookers and family. The minimum sentence was 20 years, and Pounds announced a sentence of 28 years, to be served day-for-day - which means no parole, or early release for behavior, explained Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock. Moore also faces five years of post release supervision and was ordered to pay \$2,000 in fines to the Mississippi Children's Fund.

Moore showed no emotion,

nor spoke on his own behalf during the sentencing phase of his trial, said Whitlock.

In a rare Tishomingo County jury trial May 12-13th, Moore was found guilty in the case that involved molestation of a female relative over a period of time between 2003 and 2006.

Letters were submitted by both the defense and prosecuting attorneys, including one that alleged molestation of another victim, who read of the trial in the newspaper.

Judge Pounds released spectators from the defense side first, allowing them to clear the courthouse prior to releasing the victim's family and friends.

Moore was taken to Rankin County for processing to determine where he would serve the sentence, said Whitlock.

Authorities, Family Looking for Missing Belmont Woman

Authorities and the family of a young mother from Belmont are looking for clues surrounding her disappearance.

Kimberly Michelle Clark, was last seen April 19th in the Belmont area, but has not been heard from since, according to her husband of four years, Chris Clark, of Belmont. They have three children, 2- and 3-years-old, and Clark.

According to the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department

bulletin, Kimberly Clark was wearing a brown bathing suit top and a blue jean skirt when she was last seen. She has a scar on her right leg, and is described as having brown eyes, and orange brown hair. She is about 5'4," and weighs 145 pounds.

She could be headed toward the Hattiesburg area, and may be going by the name of Kimberly Ables.

Her husband said she has been known to leave before, but never before without contacting

someone, and never for so long.

"We just all wish she'd come home," he said.

Tishomingo Gears Up for 2nd Annual Motorcycle Show & Ride

This Saturday, June 6th, the town of Tishomingo will again be the site of a massive gathering of motorcycle enthusiasts as they bring their bikes to the 2nd Annual 'usin' for St. Jude Motorcycle Show and 100 Mile Ride.

Sponsored by the Town of Tishomingo, and downtown Tishomingo merchant Main Street Cycle, the show will award prizes for outstanding bikes, then the fun really begins-- when the bikes mount up and ride a 100 mile route.

Proceeds from the day go to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis.

Registration begins at 7 a.m. on Main Street Cycle.

The show will be from 10 a.m. to noon. Plaques will be awarded in five categories: Har-Metric, Touring, Trike and Bikes, and the Grand Prize of Dunlop or Pirelli tires, bars, helmet and lots more. Trophy presentation will be at 1 p.m., and the ride starts at 2 p.m. There will be entertainment

downtown, and lots of vendors on site.

The event last year was a big hit, despite inclement weather, with about 300 cycles displayed in the town of Tishomingo.

Stephen Crane, event organizer and owner of Main Street Cycle, said they expect 300 to 600 participants this year.

It's not hard to imagine where all those bikes will come from - Main Street Cycle opened in 2002 in a small store on Main in Tishomingo. It has since expanded three times, taking in storefronts on both sides, employing four people and selling cycles, parts, accessories and tires to hundreds of customers from Tupelo to Waterloo, Alabama, both through the store, and through a thriving internet sales business.

It has been a good fit for the little town, and visitors to the cycle shop visit the neighboring candle store, and gun shop, and eat at local restaurants.

The motorcycle show began last year by kicking off the

Tishomingo Centennial Celebration. Crane has taken over the organizing of the event, since it centered around his clientele, but the Town is providing advertising and sponsorship.

Supervisors Deal with Personnel Issues Extended Executive Session

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors spent most of their meeting time Monday in executive/closed session, dealing primarily with personnel issues.

After opening the meeting at 9 a.m., Board President Bran Grissom excused press and asked to allow the board to meet privately with a representative of RollForm Group, which operates a steel processing facility in Yellow Creek Port.

After that, the Board's agenda reported appointments with Parrish, and Mike Cooke and Richard Page.

At 12:15, they opened the meeting back up, and addressed other issues:

They resolved to fix the Tishomingo State Park road from Highway 25 to the ticket house, at the expense of the Mississippi Department of Wildlife and Fisheries. Park officials have previously stated that the road was scheduled to be repaired, but that they were waiting until several construction projects, and the accompanying heavy traffic, were completed.

The board accepted a copy of Constable Jeff Kemp's annual financial report, which is required each year, they said. The other constable must submit similarly, but no mention was made of it at this meeting.

They approved a plan to renovate a section of the Chancery

Court Clerk's office to consolidate the payroll operations. They also discussed an upcoming update of the courthouse's computer network and data storage system that is estimated to cost \$80,000.

Annual Collectible Ornament Features Swinging Bridge

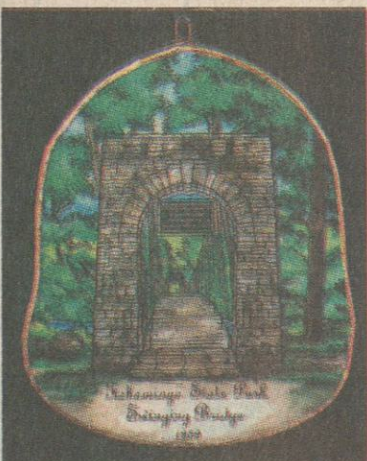
The Iuka United Methodist Women's organization is now offering 2009 commemorative ornaments featuring the historic Swinging Bridge at Tishomingo State Park.

Constructed by young men in the Civilian Conservation Corps in 1939, the native stone and steel cable bridge spans Bear Creek and leads from the swimming pool area to the Park's system of hiking trails.

In any season its picturesque beauty and incredible flexible strength are a pleasure to enjoy, and many generations of Park visitors and locals have watched Bear Creek flow by from its wooden deck. Countless scrapbooks across the country feature a snapshot of smiling campers, visitors and tourists perched on the stone steps of the bridge - the same vista featured on the ornament.

This 2009 collectible ornament celebrates the natural beauty of the Park's most recognizable structure on stained glass. Each ornament is hand tinted and kiln fired by North Carolina artist Tina Steenerson. The edges are edged in copper.

The first ornaments will be received by the end of the year, and orders are being taken

Jim Mercer

Jim Mercer wasn't an electrician, but by his own admission, he did "enjoy" it when the light goes out. Mercer wasn't referring to the flow of electricity through wires and outlets. Instead, he was talking about his excitement as a student in one of his classes grasped a math concept. The 73-year-old Mercer, who died Saturday, spent 51 years teaching at the high school and college levels. The son and nephew of educators, Mercer was a 1953 graduate of Olive Branch High School.

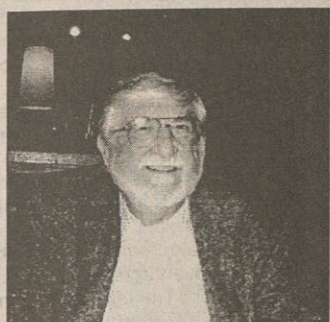
In 1957 he earned his bachelor of science in education degree from Mississippi State University, later earning his master's from the University of Mississippi. Mercer also advanced work on his doctorate degree. After finishing high school math history in Anniston, Mercer accepted a position teaching algebra geometry at Tupelo School. He remained there for eight years, serving as assistant principal his last year.

In 1968 Mercer moved to DeSoto County, accepting the post of assistant superintendent of education/curriculum coordinator under former superintendent Walter S. Mercer. During his tenure, Mercer helped establish the county's adult basic education program and assisted in the opening of Southaven High School and Greenbrook Elementary School.

After an unsuccessful attempt to replace the retiring Mercer, Mercer went to work at Northwest Mississippi College in Senatobia. At Northwest he served as associate academic dean, an instructor, personnel director and vice-president. He was instrumental in starting the college's chaperone department, as well as NWCC's faculty and credit union. Working at Northwest also meant, at times, traveling to the college's satellite campuses.

One semester I drove back-and-forth to Ashland one week," Mercer recalled. "At one point I was spending my mornings in Senatobia, afternoons in Madison and evenings in Southaven." Mercer decided to retire in 1986, but accepted an offer to continue teaching on a part-time basis.

"I continued to teach until I started drawing my retirement," he smiled.



"Some semesters I would teach as much as 15 hours in two days, with in excess of 200 students. I had morning classes in Senatobia and evening classes at DeSoto Center." During his lengthy career, Mercer found himself teaching the siblings, spouses and even children of former students. In later years, as his health worsened, he would often find he'd touched the lives of those who were working in the medical field.

"When I would go to the doctor's office or to the hospital, a lot of times one of the nurses or technician would come in and say, 'Mr. Mercer, I had you for math at Northwest,'" Mercer recalled with a laugh. "I'd always ask them 'did you pass?'" But while he rarely was able to go out in public without seeing at least one former student, Mercer never tired of teaching.

"I don't get tired of teaching," he explained. "You teach the same thing to two different classes and it's different because you have a different group of students and a different group of responses."

"What I enjoy the most is the reaction of students when they begin to understand the math concepts they didn't understand before," Mercer said. "I enjoy seeing it when the light goes on."

Mercer leaves his wife of 53 years, Marjean; a daughter, Jackie Meadows and husband, Johnny of Olive Branch; a son, Jamie Mercer and wife, Michele of Southaven; and three grandchildren, Matt Meadows of Houston, Texas, Aubrie Steele of Orlando, Fla., and Becca Mercer of Southaven.

Mercer was born in Booneville, Miss., the son of B.L. and Velma Blissit Mercer, and the nephew of Luvera and Gertrude Blissit, all of Tishomingo County.

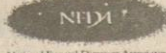
