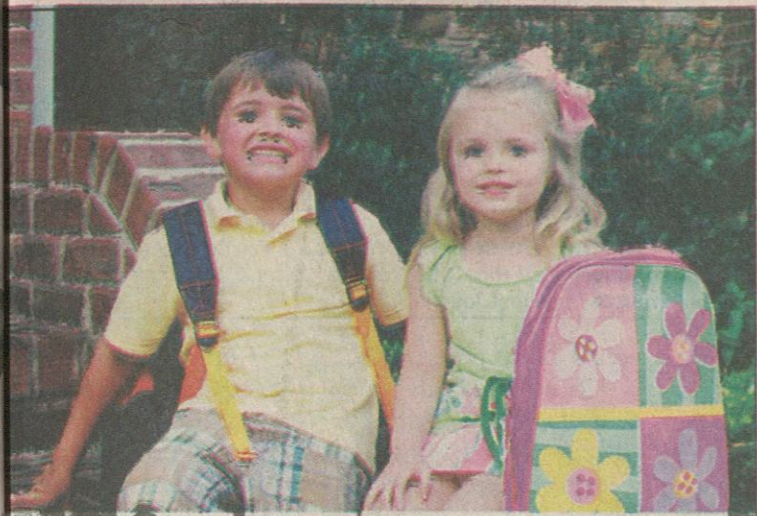

IMS will have an open house for parents to meet teachers on August 10th from 5-7 p.m.

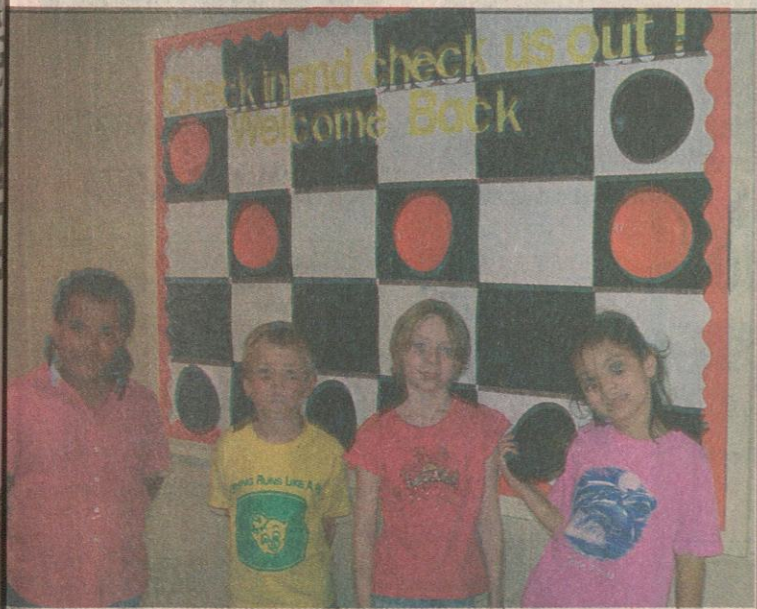
The Junior Auxiliary of Tishomingo County will be sponsoring a health fair during the IMS open house night, August 10th.

Local Retailers Hoping for Boost from Sales Tax Holiday

Beginning this Friday, Mississippians can benefit from legislation that provides a sales tax exemption for most items of clothing and footwear priced less than \$100 per article.

This legislation that aimed at spurring Mississippi's economy in these tough economic times passed the 2009 legislature with bipartisan support.

The sales tax holiday allows consumers to purchase clothing or footwear free from Mississippi sales tax. The Mississippi Legislature provided for the sales tax holiday in the 2009 regular session.

"For one weekend a year, retailers will be able to compete favorably with internet companies and out-of-state catalog sellers that pay no sales tax, and consumers, particularly back-to-school shoppers, can purchase goods without the state's 7% markup," stated Senator Walter Michel, who has introduced tax holiday legislation every year since 2000.

This year the holiday will begin Friday morning, July 31st at 12:01, and end Saturday night, August 1st, at midnight. A Mississippi Tax Commission memo indicates that the tax holiday will coincide with the last Friday in July each year.

Local Retailers Prepare

"We anticipate it helping. We are having a big sale, which will help add to the savings for each customer," said Donna Solomon, owner of Sports Plus in Iuka, possibly the county's only independent retailer of quality shoes.

"It's really about time, because Tennessee and Alabama have tax holidays, and people travel out of state to take advantage of them," said Solomon.

The holiday may be a little late to benefit Tishomingo County, where only a few independent retailers still sell clothing or shoes.

ing or shoes.

Caytee Belle's Closet, an upscale resale boutique in Iuka, will also be having a sale to coincide with the tax holiday.

"We hope it will help, especially since we have lots of children's clothes," said Carly Carman, owner of Caytee Belle's.

Management at Walmart and Fred's both reported that they were not extending hours, or offering anything other than the usual sales to take advantage of the holiday.

First District Representative Bubba Carpenter suggested that some items that are eligible for tax free purchase are hunting boots and apparel, which can be purchased at a savings this weekend in anticipation of the fall hunting season.

School supplies, which many shoppers will spend hundreds of dollars on in the next few weeks, are not included in the tax-free days.

To determine the top campgrounds and locations, over 4,000 parks were reviewed and evaluated on criteria including educational programs, overall beauty and scenery, visitor centers and camping amenities such as hot showers and laundry facilities.

The featured locations were selected based on testimonials, campground ratings, and feedback provided by park rangers, regional park management and campers throughout the year.

In addition, Tishomingo State Park was recognized again as the Best Hiking Destination by Mississippi Magazine. For the past few years, Tishomingo has either won, or shared the hiking award that is based on a survey of Mississippi Magazine readers.

Turnpike Mtn. Home Destroyed in Sunday Morning Fire

A house at Turnpike Mountain was destroyed by fire and heat early Sunday morning.

The home of Ricky and Barbara Dillard, 62 County Road 236, caught fire a little after 2 a.m. Sunday.

Barbara Dillard was awakened from where she slept on the sofa by a smoke detector alarm. She was able to see flames in the hallway between a bedroom and bathroom, and escaped the house through the front door, according to Harmony Central Volunteer Fire Chief Tommy Bonds.

Her husband was away from home, camping with friends, at the time, said Tishomingo County Fire Investigator Brian Grissom.

Mrs. Dillard called 911 at 2:16, and Harmony Central and Burnsville Volunteer Fire Departments responded. Some Iuka firefighters also responded to assist.

Fire was visible through

the front door and windows beside it, said Bonds, who was one of the first firefighters inside. The sofa on which Dillard had been sleeping moments before was in flames.

Firefighters ventilated and searched for fire with a thermal imaging camera due to the thickness of smoke, explained Bonds. They had the fire under control in about ten minutes, and out in twenty. Burnsville volunteers and some Iuka firefighters also responded to help.

The fire was ruled accidental by Tishomingo County Fire Investigator Brian Grissom, who said it was caused by a shorted-out wire to a plug.

Bonds said that the working smoke alarm likely saved the life of Mrs. Dillard.

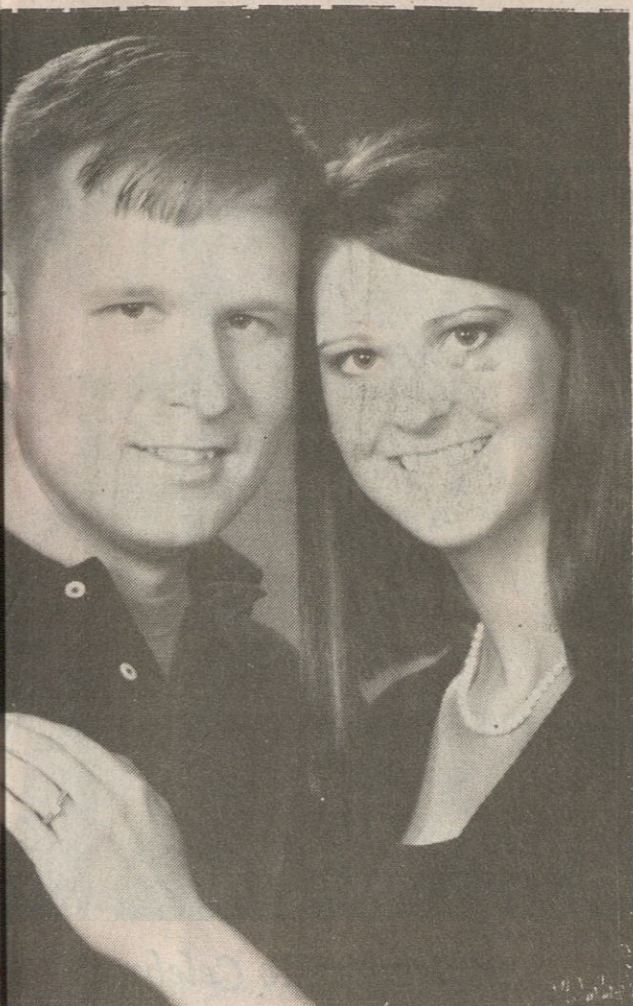

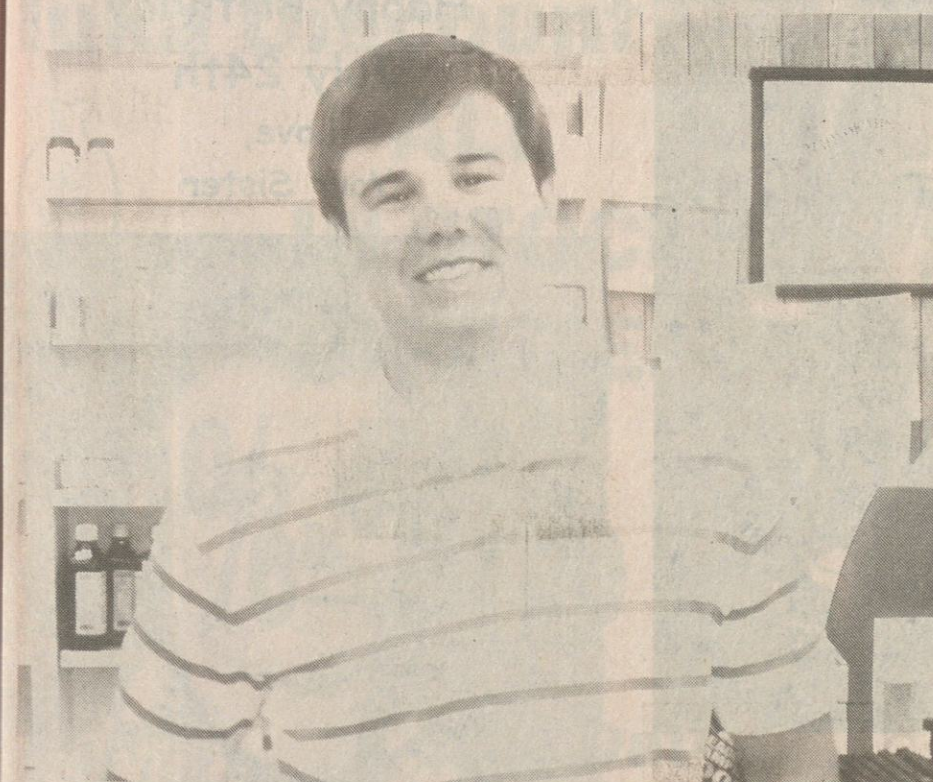

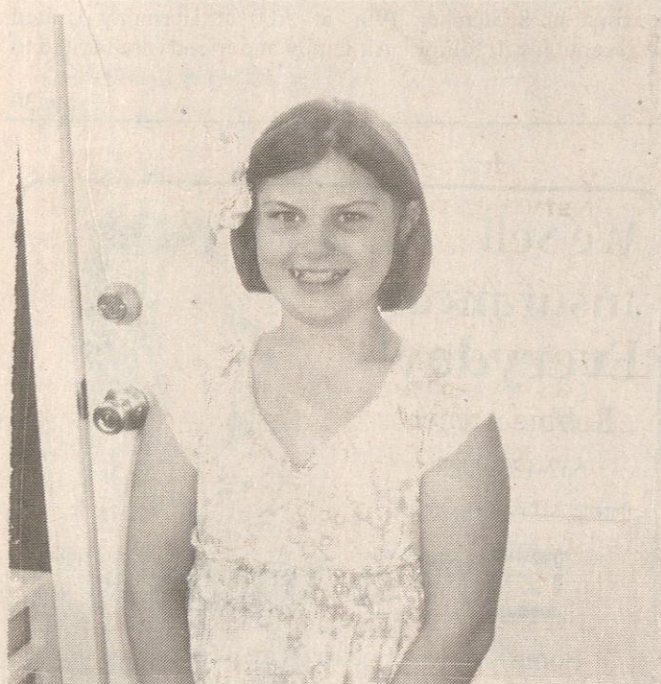

Marcey-Anne Sykes Participates In MS Governor's School At MUW

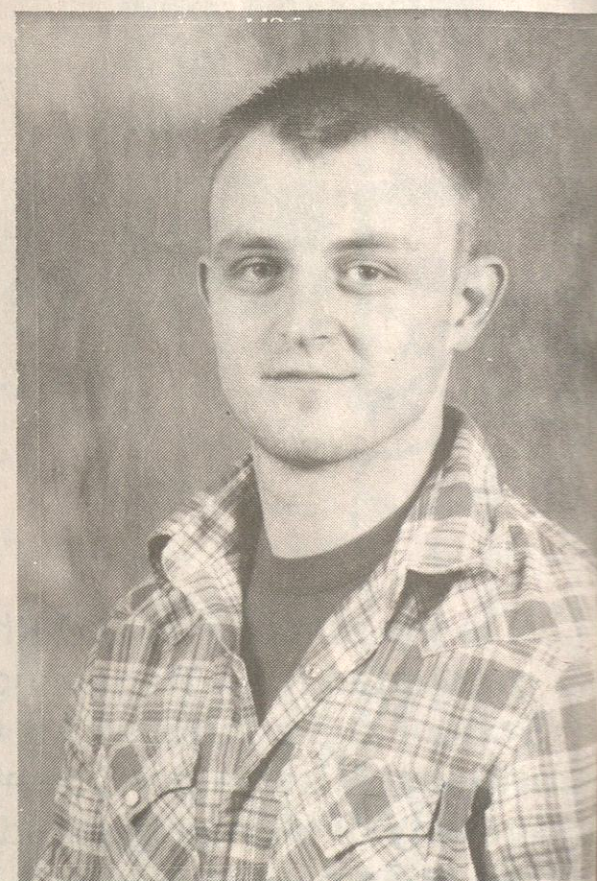

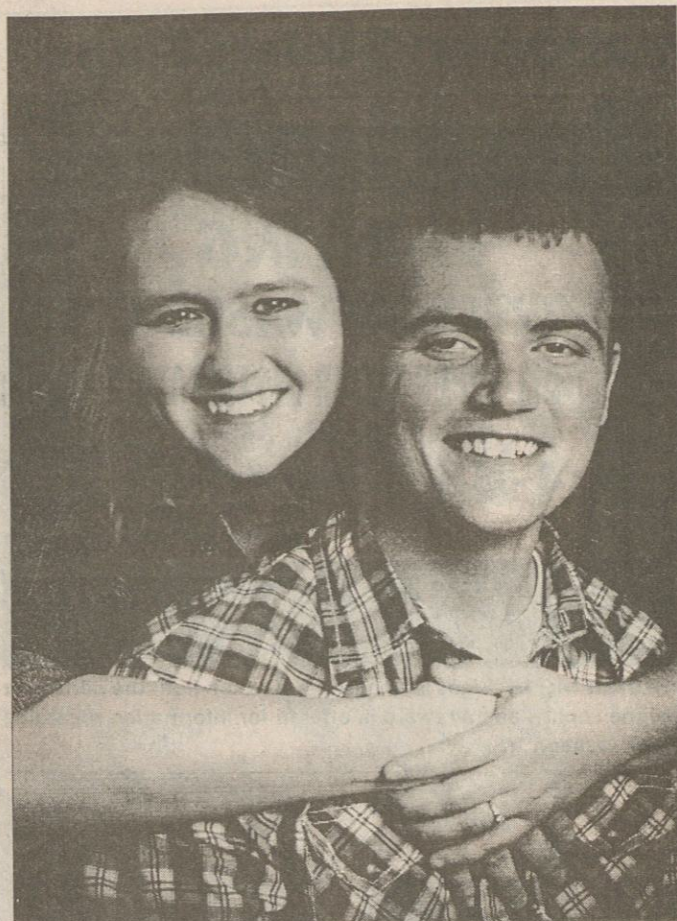

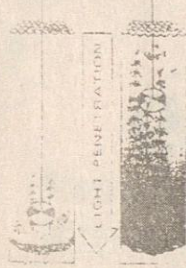

NMMC-Iuka Makes Changes To ED Entrance

In order to improve the flow of traffic at North Mississippi Medical Center, changes are being made to the Emergency Department entrance.

Until now, someone coming in a patient to the hospital has had the choice to go to the ambulance entrance. From now on, all patients coming to the hospital (except those being transported by ambulance) will be coming through the front doors of the hospital, including those coming to the ED.

From midnight - 7 a.m., the front doors will be open. There is a phone at the entrance, that when you call will ring straight

to the Emergency Department. There will always be someone to answer that phone and open the front doors.

"We hope this process will be less confusing to our patients and visitors," said Fred Truesdale, NMMC-Iuka administrator. "People coming to the hospital - no matter for what reason - will use the same entrance."

Assistance will be available for those who need help getting someone out of a vehicle.

"This will not change how processes work in the Emergency Department," Truesdale said. "Patients will still be seen in order of

the severity of their illness - not what door they come in." No vehicles, except ambulances, will be allowed to drive around to the ambulance entrance to the ED.

"This will be a change in the way everyone is used to getting into the hospital," Truesdale said. "But we want people to know that it is a change based on the best interests of our patients and visitors. It should improve the flow of traffic, as well as make it easier on our patients to know that they always come to the same door, no matter what."
