

Iuka Woman Killed in Collision with Train

One person was killed and other seriously injured in a collision involving a train and a car crossing west of Cherokee, Alabama Tuesday afternoon.

At about 2:30, at the Mill Creek Loop

Loop crossing just west of U.S. Highway 72, an eastbound Norfolk Southern train hit a 2002 Ford Focus Ford.

The passenger side was hit by the train, which managed to push about a half-mile down the tracks.

The passenger, Shandra Lomenick, 35, of Iuka, was pronounced dead at the scene. The driver, Glen "Hotdog" Brown, 40, also of Iuka, was transported by AirEvac helicopter to a hospital in Huntsville. He suffered significant head trauma, and was still being evaluated Wednesday morning.

The crossing has lights and crossing arms, and the crossing showed no signs of damage shortly after the collision. Witnesses reported seeing the car attempting to drive around the closed crossing arms.

The accident remains under investigation by the Alabama State Troopers and Norfolk Southern, who had several personnel on site.

Budget, Contracts, Inmate Healthcare, Topics at County Board Meetings

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors met Monday, August 3rd, for their regular meeting. Several contract proposals, a personnel policy, and a budget request were some of the items on the agenda.

The board voted to continue utilizing the services of Dickie Marks, CPA, for audit services to the county.

All present voted to approve the contracts; Board President Brandon Sisson was not present.

County Employee Policy

The board approved a revision to the county employee personnel policy. The revised employee policy provides that, in order to discipline actions for poor performance, the employee must be given two written warnings with their department manager for the first two incidents, and with the board of supervisors in case a third is necessary. The county employees will receive official notification of the change in their August 15th paycheck.

Inmate Healthcare Proposals

The board reviewed proposals from two companies and a local physician on medical services for jail inmates.

"If health care expenses continue at the rate they're at now, the jail budget is projected to exceed its \$40,000 budget by about \$10,000 this year," explained Sheriff Glenn Whitlock at the board meeting. Much of that cost is incurred when they have to take inmates to the hospital for treatments, since the current system does not provide for physician care after 5 p.m.

According to the discussion, the two outside health care service proposals offer a comprehensive plan for not only addressing the health care needs of inmates, but also monitoring and managing costs. The companies both reportedly offered to contract with a local physician to handle the hands-on care.

Board members inquired

how the plan would work if the inmate population increased to 75 or more, as could occur should a new jail be completed. The proposals were tabled, and were assigned to Board Attorney Phillip Whitehead for further review.

TCDF Budget Request

As Chairman of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation, Peyton Cummings presented the budget request of that Foundation to the Board for their consideration in ongoing budget discussions.

Since 2004, explained Cummings, the County has contributed \$11,458.33 monthly to TCDF, which essentially covers most of the salary, and some benefits, of the Foundation's two full-time employees. Currently they are Executive Director Gary Matthews, and Executive Assistant Theresa Cutshall.

The Foundation's remaining budget needs are met solely by private and corporate contributions of area businesses, and Foundation members, he said. Even though these memberships have increased slightly in recent years, the Foundation's operating fund is steadily dwindling down, said Cummings. About \$1,000 to \$1,250 from the operating fund goes (annually) to cover payroll that is above the County's contribution.

Cummings praised the steadfast and effective work of Matthews and Cutshall, who, through dedication and diligence are leading the effort to transform Tishomingo County from "the South's best kept secret," to its "best known secret," attracting both industry and tourism dollars to the area in a difficult economic climate.

Skyline Contract Amendment

The Board voted to, after final figures are provided to Purchasing Clerk Lynn West by Board Attorney Phillip Whitehead, amend the lease of Skyline

Steel to the actual amount of the project, from the originally contracted proposed amount.

Meetings Last Week

West reported that the Board met on July 30th with Ferguson and Associates Architects to discuss finalization of the jail design contract. The contract is to be amended and then reviewed for signature.

On Friday, the Board approved a quote from Southern Air Comfort for HVAC repairs at Meridian Furniture building in Iuka (old Wild Rose building). Two quotes were received: Daugherty Refrigeration for \$16,834 and Southern Air Comfort for \$16,250.

Mandated Reappraisal Could Impact Property Tax Rates in 2010

Since a recent state-mandated reappraisal of residential and commercial property may affect the amount of taxes paid by each taxpayer, the tax assessor's office is opening extra hours to address any questions or concerns.

In addition to regular business hours, the County Tax Assessor's Office will be open from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday August 15th and August 22nd.

According to Tishomingo County Tax Assessor Diana Turner, the state mandated a "re-valuation" of county property based on sales prices in the years 2004-2007.

The state requires re-valuation of all county property once each four-year period, explained Turner.

Depending on the final amount of the 2010 county budget, due to be advertised in mid-September, taxes could go up, or not, said Turner.

"It is confusing," she admits. "If the county budget remains about the same amount, but assessed value increases, the millage rate could go down, but would result in the same amount of tax revenue."

If the budget increases, and the assessed value increases, the millage would go up - meaning a tax increase.

The total county budget amount and the total assessed value are what determine the millage. Since both figures are currently open for review, no one knows if taxes will increase, said Turner.

Landowners have from August 10th through the 22nd to meet with representatives of the Assessor's office to discuss their potential tax liability for the coming year.

In 2002, when this reappraisal was last conducted, taxes increased slightly, said Turner.

Cherokee Man Killed in Wreck on 72 Last Week

An elderly Cherokee man was killed just before noon Friday when his car collided with another vehicle as he tried to cross U.S. Highway 72 just east of the Natchez Trace.

Two off-duty Tishomingo County Sheriff Department officers were in the 2005 Jeep Wrangler that collided with a car driven by Robert Major Welch, 84, of Cherokee, last Friday around noon.

Logan Vaughn and his wife, Kristina Vaughn, were taken to Helen Keller Hospital from the scene. They were treated for minor injuries and released, said Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, who verified that the two, both investigators for the county, were off-duty at the time of the accident.

Welch, whose obituary lists him as a Mississippi native, was driving north on Fossick Lane, and had apparently entered the intersection when the eastbound Jeep collided with his 1995 Ford Escort. He was pronounced dead at the scene by Colbert County Coroner Carlton Utley.

The Jeep left nearly 100 feet of skid marks as Vaughn tried to avoid the wreck. The collision

took place in the center of the eastbound lane.

Tishomingo Alderman Ballot Still Uncertain

The town of Tishomingo will hold a special election August 18th, but what names will be on the ballot is still not determined.

According to Town Clerk Paula Rushing, the Tishomingo Election Commission have qualified Shirl Butler and Charles Carr for the alderman election that will fill the nearly full term of Jimmy Burns, who died shortly after being re-elected.

Another candidate, Van Buchanan, has filed papers but his candidacy will be determined by a hearing with the town election commission this Friday to determine his eligibility.

Buchanan is listed as a registered voter with the Circuit Clerk, but his address is listed as 5 County Road 106. You must be a resident of the town of Tishomingo to be an alderman, verified Rushing.

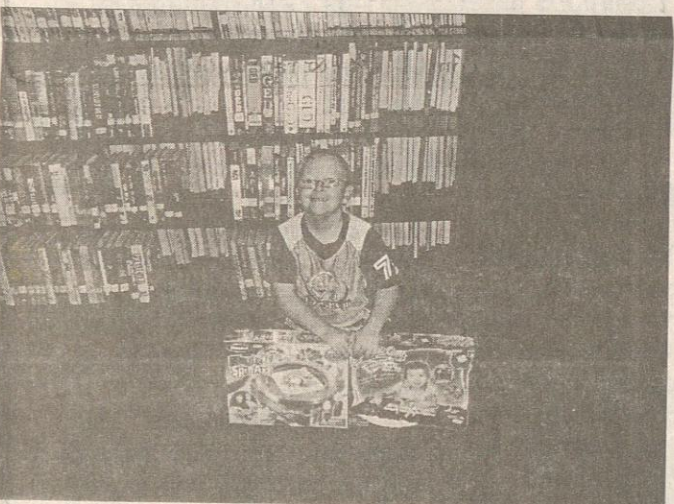
National Dairy Month Celebrated At Iuka Library

Bryant And Rebekah Lambert Tour The East Coast

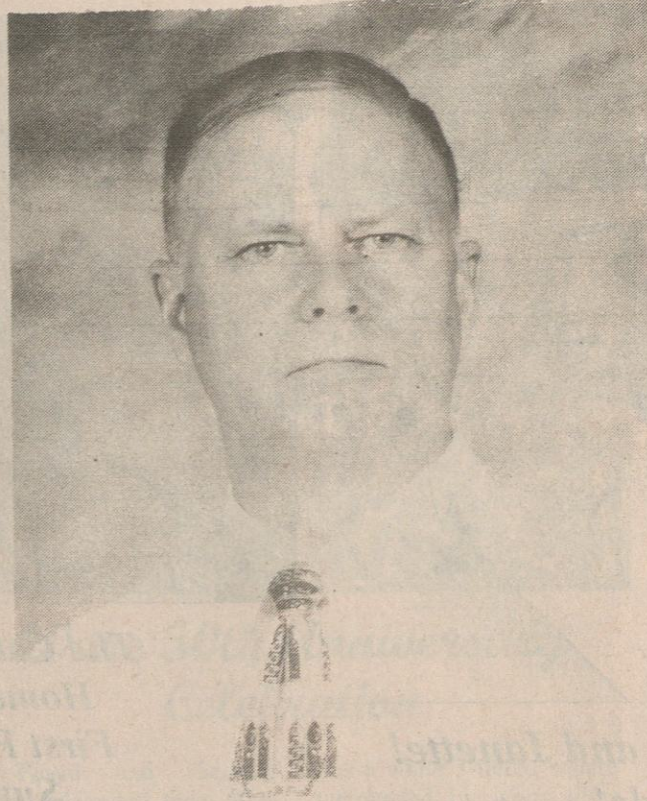

Individuals, groups, school clubs or civic organizations are encouraged to sell their "trash" in yard sales on October 2nd and 3rd. The Tourism Council works with the Tenn-Tom Tourism Association to promote the event and draw people to the area.

The people holding yard sales benefit from the increased traffic to the area, and visitors also spend money in the towns, so it is good

for everyone, explained organizers.

There is no charge to participate, but organizers ask that participants observe all applicable ordinances about signs or booths on public property.

Dedicated Group Restoring Bethany Cemetery

Some dedicated people with connections to one of the oldest cemeteries in the county are working to restore it and preserve its history in writing.

Ava Nell and Herman Harrison live in Red Bay, Ala., James L. Carr lives in McKenzie, TN. Both Ava Nell and James have family connections to Bethany. Herman has adopted Bethany and enjoys helping preserve its history. This is the second year that these three people have devoted many hours of their time and labor to cleaning and restoring the cemetery. They have researched the recommended methods of restoration and apply those techniques in their process. Through their efforts, many headstones in Bethany Cemetery are now cleaned and restored.

A book on the historic Bethany Church and Cemetery is currently being compiled. This book will serve to document the history of pioneering families connected to Bethany Church and Cemetery.

Bethany is one of the oldest churches in our county. Reportedly the first service was held at Bethany Presbyterian Church in December of 1840. Several members of the Paden family comprised its charter members. Bethany once housed the Euclid Academy,

established by E.W. Carmack. In 1853, James W. McDougal and wife, Mary, deeded seven acres to Bethany. The oldest headstone found in the Bethany Cemetery is Francis E. Reid, born 1816 and died 1842. Seventeen Confederate soldiers who fought in the Civil War are known to be buried in Bethany Cemetery.

If you have an ancestor or family member who attended church at Bethany, or is buried in Bethany Cemetery, and you would like their information in the book, please contact one of the preservation committee members.

Types of information could be obituaries, church attendance records, marriage licenses, land deeds, parents, siblings, or children of members. Pictures of earlier decoration days at Bethany, photos of the first church building, information on Euclid Academy or other school records. Family legends, stories by word of mouth, or memories connected to Bethany will also be included in the book.

FREE Child ID Program Sponsored By Iuka Masonic Lodge #94

The Iuka Masonic Lodge #94 and Eastern Star Chapter #126 will be sponsoring a Child Identification Program: Keeping Mississippi Children Safe. This free program will be Saturday, September 5th, 2009 from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. at the Iuka Middle School Gymnasium, 507 West Quitman St., Iuka, MS. Deemed "one of the most comprehensive child recovery and identification programs in the nation," by the National Center for Exploited and Missing Children NCEMC - the Mississippi Child Identification Program, MSCHIP is solely sponsored by the Grand Lodge of Mississippi F & AM. The program consists of six major components. Digital Video with voice print, digital photographs, digital finger prints, vital child information, a dental bite impression and a laminated ID card. The photographs, video, fingerprints and child data are burned onto a CD that is compatible with the AMBER ALERT system already in place across the Nation. The dental impression provides a virtual diagram of the child's biting surface, which, like fingerprints is unique to each individual and supplies a DNA sample

that can also be used as a scent source for trained canine search teams. Combined, this five-part process provides a dramatic,

time sensitive recovery tool for authorities. On the day of the MSCHIP event, parents are urged to gather pertinent information such as phone numbers, allergies, and medications. Height charts and scales are available at the event to provide the most current details regarding the child. As would be expected, Security and privacy are of the utmost importance. All the information and specimens are collected on site, processed and provided to the parent or legal guardian in a manila envelope. After each child is processed, databases are erased using state-of-the-art software. The only item retained by the Grand Lodge Mississippi, F & AM is a signed permission slip. The MSCHIP program was adapted from The National Masonichip Foundation and since its inception in May 2008, MSCHIP has quickly become a very successful program. Collectively the CHIP programs across the United States and Canada have processed more than 1,100,000 children.

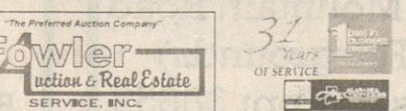

NEMCC Announces Latest Iuka Welding Graduates

Seven students completed a six week comprehensive welding training program covering shielded metal arc welding, gas metal arc welding, flux core arc welding, and gas tungsten arc welding and on June 26th to become the newest graduates of the Northeast Mississippi Community College program offered at their Mobile Welding Lab located behind the Tishomingo County Courthouse in Iuka.

NEMCC's Division of Workforce Training and Economic Development offers the six-week welding course to give trainees basic welding knowledge to prepare for industrial employment. Admission

priority is given to the unemployed. The Workforce Investment Act (WIA) and Tri State Education Foundation

funding have been available to pay tuition for most trainees. A new group of trainees began the day course on July 6th.
