Two Tishomingo Men Arrested in Meth Lab Bust

Two Tishomingo men have been charged in connection to a meth lab bust Monday night.

Randy Turner, 43, and Ryan Hill, 29, were arrested around 10 p.m. at a residence on County Road 118 just west of Tishomingo, said Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock.

They were actually in the process of manufacturing methamphetamine at the time, and both have been charged with manufacturing, and conspiracy to manufacture meth.

Due to the timing of the arrest, authorities were able to keep finished meth product out of distribution.

Both are still in custody at the Tishomingo County Jail.

Other people were also arrested, but due to the ongoing investigation, their names are not being released. Additional arrests are expected in connection with this incident, said Whitlock.

The Tishomingo Police assisted in the operation.

County Archives & History Museum Requests Funding Help from Board

Tishomingo County's historical museum has requested increased financial support from the county to help with escalating expenses related to their historic building, and allow them to serve the public more effectively.

At the regular third Monday meeting of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors, August 17th, Jan Anglin explained that the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum has never requested an increase from the \$20,000 it has received annually for many years, but it needs one this year.

The staff of the museum, is all volunteer except Executive Director Anglin, and collections and tech specialist Christina Goss, not only give tours to groups and individuals who come see the actual museum (more than 1,000 this year, from 30 different states), but they also process more than 2,800 inquiries annually, including at least forty emails a week from people requesting information about the county, its families, and its history. Additionally, 4,800 artifacts have been donated and processed for display or archiving.

They also have received significant collections from people like the late state senator and chancery clerk Cecil Sumners, author of *Chief Tishomingo*. He was working on a book on all the courthouses in Mississippi, when he died, and this information is now at the museum.

This kind of information is available nowhere else, explained Anglin, and they have not even been able to do more than scratch the surface of processing

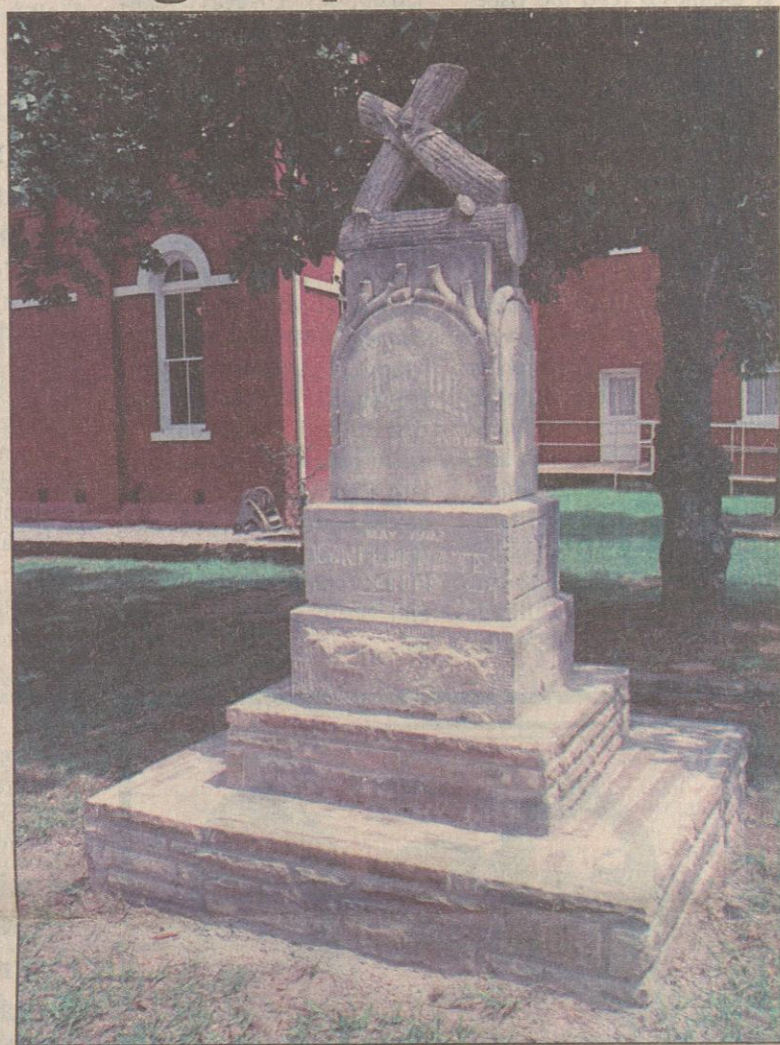

the contents of 40 boxes donated from his estate.

The Old Tishomingo County Courthouse, where the museum is housed, was built in 1870. It recently received complete outdoor renovation, including a new roof, thanks to a grant, so it is in pretty good shape, said Anglin. But current challenges include air conditioning and heating issues, which are part of the escalating expenses normally associated with a 19th century building.

Since the Tishomingo County Genealogical and Historical Society established the museum in 2004, it has not asked for a specific amount, and has consistently been granted the same amount each year by the county.

This year, it requested \$40,000, confirmed Anglin.

The building is owned by the county, but all improvements and maintenance are paid for by the Museum. The Tishomingo County Archives and History Society (which runs the museum) receives small amounts from donations, and they are involved in a memorial brick sale currently to help raise funds, but the county contribution is the largest amount of support, explained Anglin.

In comparison, the Union County Heritage Museum, in New Albany, which has admittedly been operating longer, said Anglin, has an annual budget of \$130,000. They are housed in a city-owned building, and the director is a paid employee of the city of New Albany. Union County contributes 25 percent of the museum's budget, approximately \$32,500.

"The folks who came to this county, and made it what it is

today, they deserve this museum," said Dustin Lambert, member of the Board of Directors of the Museum, who spoke to the board in support of the funding. "The people who are here now deserve this place - a place where they can learn about their history."

Museum Donations Stolen Last Week

As if it is not difficult enough running a museum on a shoestring budget, last week a visitor stole the money in the donations box at the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum.

According to Jan Anglin, Executive Director of the Museum, the Iuka Police investigated, but since the theft was not discovered until long after the visitor had left, they have little hope of recovering the estimated \$70 that may have been in the box he took to the restroom, emptied, and then hid under an exhibit.

Though there were a couple different visitors that day, the suspect remained in the museum for an extended time, viewing a few exhibits repeatedly. He was not a local visitor, Anglin said. He acted like he signed the visitor's register, but did not. He asked the staff questions, and even complimented the facility, expressing his pleasure with the visit.

If anyone has any helpful information, please call the Iuka Police Department, or the museum.

Getting Used To Bifocals

If your eye doctor has recently prescribed bifocal lenses for you, you may have been given some tips on how to get used to this type of lens. For example, you may have been told not to look down at your feet when walking. When reading a book, newspaper, or magazine, you should hold the reading material a little closer to your body and lower your eyes, not your chin, when reading.

You have to remember to aim your eyes through the segment of lens that's been designed for specific vision needs, such as reading (near vision) or seeing objects at a distance (far vision). If you have trouble reading a newspaper, for example, move the newspaper and not your head so you can see clearly. When difficulty in seeing well near or far persists, however, it may be that your frames need adjustment so the lenses will be in the right position in front of your eyes. Frames that fit properly make a great deal of difference in the clarity of your vision.

Paden Fire Department Receives Wildfire Equipment

The Paden Volunteer Fire Department of Tishomingo County received safety equipment recently from the Mississippi Forestry Commission (MFC) as part of a National Fire Plan Program grant through the USDA Forest Service.

"This equipment will improve the capability and effectiveness of the local volunteer fire departments in east central Mississippi to safely protect lives and rural properties," said Stacy Lewis, Assistant District Forester, Northeast District located in Tupelo. This special grant was awarded to 73 volunteer fire departments and outfitted 730 firefighters statewide. The grant provides wildland firefighting personal protective equipment to help local volunteer fire department personnel to extinguish grass and brush fires and assist MFC on wildfires. Each approved volunteer fire department received 10 "Ready Kits." Each kit contains the following items: Nomex yellow coverall suit, wildland Bullard helmet, Nomex neck shroud, headlamp, gloves, safety glasses, and a yellow storage bag. (Nomex is a flame-resistant material.)

"When volunteer fire department personnel respond to a wildland fire or grass fire they normally

wear their structural fire-fighting clothing, which is very heavy and hot. The structural firefighting clothing is not designed for the extreme wildland firefighting activities," states Lewis.

"There are plans in the future for local volunteer fire department personnel to receive some specialized wildland firefighting training through a new distance learning program called Fire in the Field," Lewis said. The National Fire Plan Program grant does not cover the cost of the wildfire training.

Many towns and communities in the Forestry Commission's Northeast

District are at high risk for wildfires. It is important that the volunteer fire department personnel have this safety equipment to protect them on these dangerous and often unpredictable wildfires. Most fire chiefs will tell you that fighting a wildfire is different from extinguishing a structural fire. The local volunteer fire departments rely on grants from the USDA Forest Service and the Mississippi Forestry Commission for this special safety gear. 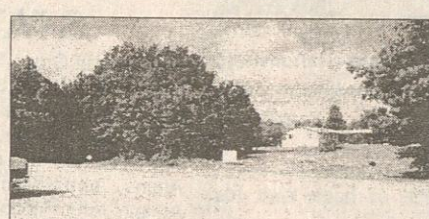

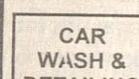

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

The Board of Supervisors, acting for and on behalf of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "County"), took up for consideration the matter of authorizing and approving a loan on behalf of the County from the Mississippi Development Authority (the "MDA") for the purpose of purchasing industrial equipment and machinery and thereby promoting commerce and economic growth.

Thereupon Supervisor Nicky McRae offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE A LOAN ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY FROM THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY IN A MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FIVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$5,000,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING INDUSTRIAL EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY TO PROMOTE COMMERCE, LOCAL JOB CREATION AND ECONOMIC GROWTH.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "County"), does hereby find, determine, adjudicate and declare as follows:

1. The Mississippi Existing Industry Productivity Loan Program, pursuant to Section 57-93-1, et seq. Mississippi Code of 1972, ("the Act"), the Mississippi Development Authority is authorized to make interest-bearing loans to existing industries, county or municipal authorities for the purpose of economic development.

2. The County will agree to purchase this industrial equipment and machinery and will request the MDA to finance a portion of the cost associated with the purchase (the "Project").

3. Pursuant to the Act and guidelines adopted by the MDA, the County will file an application with the MDA for a loan to be used for the development of the Project in the amount of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) (the "Loan").

4. The County will enter into a Loan Agreement (the "Agreement") with the MDA wherein the County agrees to borrow the proceeds of the Loan subject to and upon the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

5. In order to secure the Loan, the County will execute and deliver to the MDA a Promissory Note (the "Note"). Failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4)(A) of the Act.

7. The Loan shall not be deemed indebtedness within the meaning specified in Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Governing Body of the County does hereby declare its intention to authorize and approve a Loan from the MDA in the principal amount not to exceed five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for the purpose of purchasing industrial equipment and machinery thereby promoting commerce, local job creation and economic growth.

Section 2. The Loan will be secure by a Note executed and delivered by the County to MDA. Pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4)(A) of the Act, failure of the County to meet its repayment obligation shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due until such time as the indebtedness has been discharged or arrangements to discharge such indebtedness satisfactory to the MDA have been made.

Section 3. The Governing Body proposes to authorize and approve the Loan from the MDA in the amount and for the aforesaid purposes at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place at the County Courthouse in Iuka, Mississippi, at 10:00 a.m. on the 17th day of August, 2009, or at some meeting held subsequent thereto. If twenty percent (20%) or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is less, of the qualified electors in the County shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the County against the authorization and approval for the Loan on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then the Loan shall not be entered into unless authorized at an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan. Such election shall be called and held as provided by law. If no protest is filed, then the Loan may be entered into without an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date above specified.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be published once a week for at least four (4) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in the City of Iuka, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, and having a general circulation in the County and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first publication of this Resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to September 21, 2009, and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date, said Resolution to be published August 20, 27, September 3, and 10, 2009.

Section 5. The Clerk of the County shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of said publication of this Resolution and have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section hereof.

Supervisor James McDowell seconded the motion to adopt the

foregoing Resolution, and the vote thereupon was as follows:
