Armed Robber Eludes Authorities after Pharmacy Burglary Tuesday

An armed man held two pharmacy employees at gunpoint Tuesday morning, and then eluded pursuers on foot through a wooded area behind B&J's Supermarket in Burnsville.

According to Burnsville Dispatch Drugs pharmacist Terry Dalton, and technician/manager Marilyn Brady, a masked man arrived at the store just after they opened at 8:30 a.m. He pushed Ms. Brady, who had just stepped out the front door, back into the store with a sawed-off shotgun, demanding pills and that they open the safe.

Dalton saw the exchange, but failed to realize the gravity of the situation in time to retrieve the gun that he keeps under the counter. He explained that the suspect then pushed him toward the safe with the shotgun, watching Dalton as he loaded the pills that were locked up into a khaki duffel bag brought by the robber. The suspect took the bag, and headed back out the front door.

The staff and some patients at the Burnsville Medical Clinic next door had seen the masked person enter the pharmacy and several were calling 911. When he emerged from the pharmacy, he pointed the gun at a patient who was still in the vehicle just outside, and then took off running behind the building.

Dalton and nurse Chris

Grimes, of the Burnsville Medical Clinic, pursued the suspect on foot for some time through several logging roads and a wooded area west/northwest of B&J's Supermarket on Highway 365. They said they were not more than 50 feet behind him at times, but he escaped.

A dog with the Alcorn County Sheriff's Department was brought in to find the trail, and several Tishomingo County deputies and investigators were on the scene investigating, interviewing and checking video records of the event.

The man was described by eyewitnesses as approximately 5'

9", and 130 pounds. He was wearing a dark mask that completely covered his face and head, except for his distinctive light blue eyes, said eyewitnesses. Descriptions of his clothing varied from navy blue scrubs, to jeans and a steel blue t-shirt.

Ben Burns, owner of the drugstore, said he was most concerned with the safety and health of his employees who had survived the experience. Burns did not put a value on the prescription hydrocodone pills that were stolen.

Dalton, a former law officer, said he was just angry that he didn't react differently, and that he was unable to catch the suspect.

Iuka Motel Damaged by Thursday Fire

A fire last Thursday afternoon at the Iuka Motel heavily damaged one wing, and temporarily displaced 19 residents.

According to Iuka Fire Chief Brian Grissom, a fire just before 1 p.m. in room 103 was possibly caused by a box fan that was found turned over. Another contributing factor could have been a large dog that was kept in the room. It perished in the fire, he said.

The tenant, Kimberly Latten, was at work at the time, and her fiancé was incarcerated, so no one was hurt. Nineteen other tenants were evacuated and cared for by the Red Cross due to smoke damage to adjoining areas of the structure.

The Motel at 1750 Quitman has been a fixture in Iuka since the 1950s, but is actually apartments now, confirmed Grissom.

Rooms 100 through 106 were

condemned by the Iuka City Building Inspector, said Grissom, but residents have been able to move back into other areas of the Motel. The condemned rooms suffered extensive heat damage.

Iuka Fire Department was assisted by Midway, Harmony Central, and Burnsville Volunteer Fire Departments, said Grissom. They were able to leave the scene by 4 p.m.

Dennis Man Charged with Belmont Armed Robbery

A Dennis man is in custody on charges of armed robbery following an incident at the Belmont BP station late last month.

Justin Lee Justice, 19, has been charged with armed robbery and is in the Tishomingo County Jail, said Belmont Police Chief Donald Reno in a release.

Justice allegedly walked into the Kirby's #4, also known as Belmont BP North, sometime between 10 and 11 the night of August 25th wearing a ski mask, and demanded "all the money" from the cashier. The cashier recognized the suspect by voice, and thought it was a joke until the suspect allegedly grabbed the cashier and threatened him/her

with a crowbar.

After the cashier put the cash in a bag as directed, and the suspect left, the cashier called the police, and officers responded within minutes to the scene. No trace of the suspect was found at that time.

About 3 a.m. that same night, after an investigation and many phone calls, Tishomingo County Deputy Mike Kemp and Chief Reno were able to apprehend the suspect. By Wednesday, Belmont Police Investigator Donald Thomas had interrogated the suspect and received a confession from him. Authorities recovered the stolen money, \$124.50, from behind a house on Highway 4, where Justice had been staying, explained Reno.

"Do not hesitate to give such assailants what they ask for," urged Chief Reno to any business owners who might ever find themselves in such a situation. "Don't

take a chance on getting hurt."

Reno said this was the first attempted armed robbery in several years in the Belmont area, but urges citizens to keep their guard up.

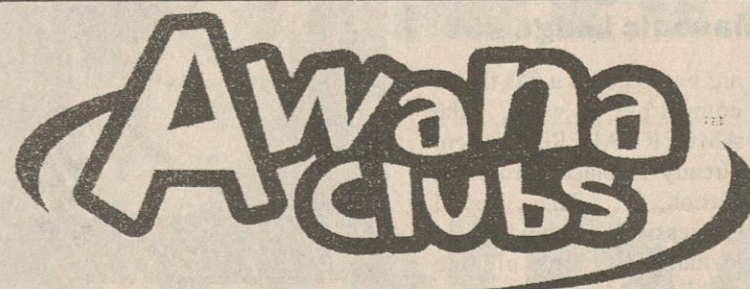

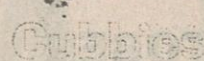

This free program will be Saturday, September 5th, 2009 from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. at the Iuka Middle School Gymnasium, 507 West Quitman St., Iuka, MS. Deemed "one of the most comprehensive child recovery and identification programs in the nation," by the National Center for Exploited and Missing Children NCEMC - the Mississippi Child Identification Program, MSCHIP is solely sponsored by the Grand Lodge of Mississippi F & AM. The program consists of six major components. Digital Video with voice print, digital photographs, digital finger prints, vital child information, a dental bite impression and a laminated ID card. The photographs, video, fingerprints and child data

are burned onto a CD that is compatible with the AMBER ALERT system already in place across the Nation. The dental impression provides a virtual diagram of the child's biting surface, which, like fingerprints is unique to each individual and supplies a DNA sample that can also be used as a scent source for trained canine search teams. Combined, this five-part process provides a dramatic, time sensitive recovery tool for authorities. On the day of the MSCHIP event, parents are urged to gather pertinent information such as phone numbers, allergies, and medications.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget for fiscal year 2009-10 on Friday, September 4th, 2009 at 10:00 AM at the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors office located at the Tishomingo County Courthouse. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax revenue increase in the proposed budget will be considered.

Tishomingo County is now operating with projected total budget revenue of \$11,783,430. \$3,912,690 of such revenue is obtained through ad Valorem taxes. For next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$12,174,699. Of that amount \$4,303,959 is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

This increase in ad valorem tax revenue means that you will pay more in ad valorem taxes on your home, automobile tag, utilities, business fixtures and equipment and rental real property.

Any citizen of Tishomingo County is invited to attend this public hearing on proposed ad valorem tax revenue increase in the budget and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.

NOTE: Increase is due to MS State Law which requires counties to update residential & commercial index. This law requires that this index be updated once each four year period.

NOTE: School System is asking for a 2 mill increase but county millage WILL NOT increase.

Some titles are available for iPods, iPhones, and Macs, but far more are available in the

MP3 format.

Home users should go to the Northeast Regional Library web site, www.nereg.lib.ms.us and begin by clicking on the

link for downloadable audiobooks which will take them to the Netlibrary web site which hosts this collection. Information about compatible players, software, and how-to's may be found in the FAQ section of the Netlibrary web site. Once the user establishes a Netlibrary account, he or she may begin to download audiobooks.

Titles available in the collection include high school reading list favorite such as *The Scarlet Letter* and *Silas Marner* as well as works for younger readers featuring characters such as Encyclopedia Brown and Horrible Harry. Adults may enjoy revisiting the works of Mark Twain or Jane

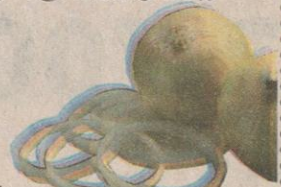

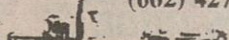

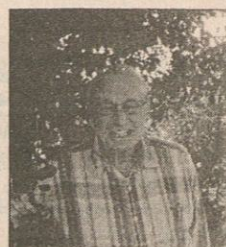

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

The Board of Supervisors, acting for and on behalf of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "County"), took up for consideration the matter of authorizing and approving a loan on behalf of the County from the Mississippi Development Authority (the "MDA") for the purpose of purchasing industrial equipment and machinery and thereby promoting commerce and economic growth.

Thereupon Supervisor NICKY MCRAE offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE A LOAN ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY FROM THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY IN A MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FIVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$5,000,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING INDUSTRIAL EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY TO PROMOTE COMMERCE, LOCAL JOB CREATION AND ECONOMIC GROWTH.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "County"), does hereby find, determine, adjudicate and declare as follows:

1. The Mississippi Existing Industry Productivity Loan Program, pursuant to Section 57-93-1, et seq. Mississippi Code of 1972, (the "Act"), the Mississippi Development Authority is authorized to make interest-bearing loans to existing industries, county or municipal authorities for the purpose of economic development.

2. The County will agree to purchase this industrial equipment and machinery and will request the MDA to finance a portion of the cost associated with the purchase (the "Project").

3. Pursuant to the Act and guidelines adopted by the MDA, the County will file an application with the MDA for a loan to be used for the development of the Project in the amount of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) (the "Loan").

4. The County will enter into a Loan Agreement (the "Agreement") with the MDA wherein the County agrees to borrow the proceeds of the Loan subject to and upon the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

5. In order to secure the Loan, the County will execute and deliver to the MDA a Promissory Note (the "Note"). Failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4)(A) of the Act.

6. The Loan shall not be deemed indebtedness within the meaning specified in Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Governing Body of the County does hereby declare its intention to authorize and approve a Loan from the MDA in the principal amount not to exceed five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for the purpose of purchasing industrial equipment and machinery thereby promoting commerce, local job creation and economic growth.

Section 2. The Loan will be secured by a Note executed and delivered by the County to MDA. Pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4) (A) of the Act, failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due until such time as the indebtedness has been discharged or arrangements to discharge such indebtedness satisfactory to the MDA have been made.

Section 3. The Governing Body proposes to authorize and approve the Loan from the MDA in the amount and for the aforesaid purposes at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place at the County Courthouse in Iuka, Mississippi,

at 10:00 a.m. on the 21st day of September, 2009, or at some meeting held subsequent thereto. If twenty percent (20%) or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is less, of the qualified electors in the County shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the County against the authorization and approval for the Loan on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then the Loan shall not be entered into unless authorized at an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan. Such election shall be called and held as provided by law. If no protest is filed, then the Loan may be entered into without an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date above specified.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be published once a week for at least four (4) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in the City of Iuka, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, and having a general circulation in the County and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first publication of this Resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to SEPTEMBER 21, 2009, and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date, said Resolution to be published on AUGUST 27, SEPTEMBER 3, 10, and 17, 2009.

Section 5. The Clerk of the County shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of said publication of this Resolution and have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 3 hereof.

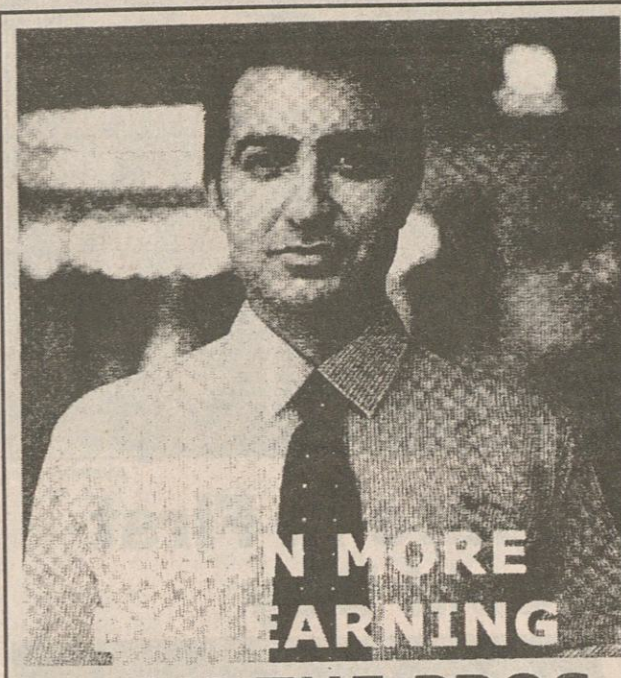

Antique Cupboard Donated to Tishomingo County Archives & History Museum

A beautiful country paneled wardrobe handmade in Eastport, Mississippi just after the Civil War was recently donated to the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum.

Sisters, Mildred Nixon Hill and Marguerite Nixon of Iuka, donated the family heirloom.

According to family history, the cupboard was handmade in Eastport at a cost of 13 silver dollars just after the Civil War. It was made for Susan Caroline Moore Robinson, mother of John James Loving Robinson and Charles Franklin Robinson. During the Civil War, when the twins were less than one year old, their father was taken hostage and did not return. James Loving Robinson, one of the twins,

married Laura Isabelle Lambert Robinson. They were the parents of Annie Willard Robinson Nixon

who used the cupboard for many years in her homes in Paden and Iuka. Mildred and Marguerite, who made the donation, were great-granddaughters of Susan Caroline Moore Robinson.

This type of cupboard, which features long, paneled doors and an overhanging molded cornice, is found throughout the South as well as New England, California and some areas of the Southwest. It appeared in this form in the middle of the 19th century and dates from c. 1870. It is an example of the Victorian Federal Revival style and is constructed of virgin yellow pine, indigenous to many

Many Participate in First Pickwick Secchi Day

Iuka, MS – More than 175 people reported for duty with boats and canoes at Aqua Yacht Marina August 22nd to participate in the state's first Secchi Day at Yellow Creek on Pickwick Lake.

Secchi Days are held on 10,000 throughout the country to monitor water transparency on lakes and other types of water bodies using an instrument called a Secchi Disk, a flat black and white disk lowered from a rope into the water until it disappears.

The Secchi Disk is named for its designer, Pietro Angelo Secchi, who first used the disk more than 150 years ago. The depth at which the disk disappears is a measure of the transparency of water, which can be impacted by the color of water, particles of silt and clay, or small plants called algae.

Teams participating in Secchi Day on Yellow Creek and Pickwick Lake collected data that will be sent to Kent State University for analysis and comparison.

Many local agencies and businesses that deal with the environmental health of our county were on hand in educational booths.

Results of Water Quality Tests

These are the results of the Secchi Day at Yellow Creek/Pickwick Lake as provided by TVA, Pickwick-Wheeler Watershed Team.

Temperature: MDEQ Water Quality Criteria require temperatures less than 30C (86F). No site exceeded this limit, and late August should be the warmest time of year for the reservoir. An interesting note, no site had surface and bottom temperatures vary more than 1 degree (only one site varied more than 0.5 degree), which means the reservoir has probably not thermally stratified this summer (increased precipitation, increased flow).

Dissolved Oxygen: Most aquatic organisms must have levels greater than 4 mg/L. Water Quality Criteria require average DO to be greater than 5.0 mg/L with no single measurement less than 4.0. In reservoirs, these criteria refer only to surface waters (mid-depth up to 5 feet from surface). Deeper waters may become anoxic due to lack of photosynthesis. Note that only four sites were measured below 4.0 mg/L in deep waters. Again, a sign of increased mixing due to higher precipitation and flow rates.

pH: Water Quality Criteria, based on aquatic life needs, require all measurements to be between 6.0 and 9.0 S.U. All measurements are within that range.

Conductivity: Water Quality Criteria require no measurement to exceed 500 µmhos/cm for public drinking water sources and 1000 µmhos/cm for recreation and fish/wildlife uses. Waters in this portion of the Tennessee River typically do not exceed this criteria. Measurements from the Yellow Creek embayment were lower than those from the main channel Tennessee River (sites 1-3, 31, 32). An interesting observation, waters in the southern end of Yellow Creek embayment (sites 20-22) had lower conductivities, while those

closer to the mouth (sites 28-30) had higher readings. This probably indicates water from the Tennessee River is pulled into the embayment.
