Late Tuesday evening, auprities made their first arrest nnected to the recent armed bbery of Burnsville Discount

According to Tishomingo unty Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, nneth Keith Vandiver, 29, of County Road 298, has been arged with one count of armed bery, and is being held at the shomingo County Jail pending ond hearing. He was already probation with the Missispi Department of Corrections an unrelated crime, said

The week-long investigation rted with the pursuit of the spect (on foot) by two of the ople at whom he pointed a wed-off shotgun last Tuesday orning in the course of forcing way into Burnsville Discount ugs in the B&J shopping cenon Highway 365 South. The spect was not located that day, d the investigation has conued all week, with many tips led in, and one that finally ecked out, said Whitlock.

"We are so pleased," said n Burns, owner of Burnsville scount Drugs, regarding the est. "Most of all, we are glad ne of our people got hurt, and at they can all rest a little easier w that this guy has been ar-

Burns confirmed that 2,915 frocodone pills were taken the robbery, with an estiated street value of \$14,575 to 9,150. Burns credited the quick

thinking of pharmacist Terry Dalton with only giving the masked suspect that much, and concealing other drugs that were in the safe. Additionally, the suspect was seen forcing clerk Mari-

lyn Brady into the store, and so his time inside was limited.

At a little wooded home site ar Burton, some people are tting feet to their beliefs. They building a home for a family nine who face daily challenges y few of us can begin to un-

rstand.

w it Started It all began with a man with ift of teaching and caring for Idren. Earl McAnally was special education teacher at homingo Elementary until s school year, and as a part of job, he cared for the very baneeds of a boy named Justin, lo loves music. Justin, 8, has a ter who is also part of the spel education program at Tishongo, Caitlen. She is nine.

As a part of his calling, he is caring for Justin and Caitlen, their very special family.

Bro. Earl is the pastor Dennis United Methodist urch, and he shared his heart out Justin and Caitlen, and ir little sister Kenedie, with church family. He shared lat it means to help "the least these," which in their case is ignantly true.

ecial Needs

Caitlen was born in 1998 to m Karen, and it didn't take ng for Mom to realize that aitlen was not developing norally. Caitlen started rehabilitan exercises as an infant. She ways smiles, but is wheelchair pendent, and others have to Ip her with all her basic needs.

When Karen was 13 weeks egnant with her second child, gall bladder ruptured, necesating surgery that caused Justo be born in 2000 with severe edical problems. He is also in a wheelchair, but he loves music!

Her third child, Kenedie, is a third grader, and comparatively normal, though she is definitely more grown up than many of her classmates. For all these years, Karen and Kenedie met the daily challenges of caring for two special needs children together, as the father is "not really a part of things," as Karen explained.

When Karen met Daniel Watson through their church and decided to marry, they knew it would be difficult.

"We had both gone through rough marriages, and we both knew what it was like to watch our kids go through so much," says Karen.

Daniel also has a special needs child, the charming and active Cheyenne, now in kindergarten. She has Down's Syndrome, and like Justin, she spent a lot of time in Le Bonheur Children's Hospital in Memphis. Eventually she had surgery to repair three holes in her heart.

And, Daniel also has three other children, Little Daniel, Annabelle, 3, and Brandon, 2.

Since their marriage in July 2008, the family of nine has been living near Tishomingo in two house trailers, put together. The home is not "wheelchair accessible," and with nine children it is quite cramped.

Daniel drives a truck, and Karen stays with the children, and it's not easy, but they do well. The children are as well-behaved as any students and have good attendance records at school. You can not tell which children belong to whom, they have become so closely knit.

Kenedie is a mother hen to all of them, says Karen, and Lil' Daniel is their protector.

Christmas Visit

When some of Bro. Earl's congregation visited the family with Christmas treats in December, and saw how they were living, they knew they had to do something to help.

One of the ladies was Nancy Collier. In her heart, she knew she had to take action to help the Watsons, and could do it, with the contacts she had through her

family's construction business. The dream of a handicappedaccessible home for the Watsons was born, and this week, drywall is being installed in a home that will give the family more room, and ease their daily challenges considerably.

On land donated just south of Burton, it's being built with donated labor, materials and funds. It is wheelchair accessible, and features a large common living and dining area with four adjacent bedrooms and a bath designed for a wheelchair. The new home will be energy efficient and low maintenance so that the family can enjoy their hours spent there together.

A Community Effort

Dennis UMC is just the contact for the project, they insist, but many there have helped fund the project, or do the actual building. Several other churches are also helping similarly, and many different construction companies have donated everything from concrete to drywall. Tammy McDowell from Calvary Baptist, and Bro. Earl's sister-inlaw, Vicki McAnally, also help to organize labor, acquire needed donations, and coordinate con-

struction crews. They are also helpful when five little Watsons come zooming through to check on "their

rooms," which is pretty often! Karen and Daniel, who also help with the construction effort, say they are so appreciative of everything people have done for their children, to ensure they have a hope and a future.

Our Scotch-Irish Heritage: Snake-Free Ireland to Being Snake Handlers

Most of the people reading this are Scotch-Irish, me included. We came here at different times and for different reasons. Some were weather sent here.

We were trouble mak-

The King first sent us storm from Scotland to Ireland to calm the rowdy Irish; which didn't work. And so for a couple hundred years we ived in a land of no snakes, thanks to St. Patrick. We ame from a land of very few snakes (Scotland had only the adder and it was

The point here is, we have a long standing predisposition to live and function without snakes. But, here we are, four hundred years later, in the thick of copperheads and cotton mouths.

I asked the only genuine true Irishman I know, Dr. Al Flannary, what it was like to come from Ireland and be dropped down here in a land where snakes roam freely.

"It scared the hell outta me," was his reply, which is pretty much my feeling.

So we go about the summer days with a sharper eye than we would have back in

And then there are the snake handlers. They are us, for the most part, Scotchfrish, protestant, and with definite scriptural authority for what they do.

How did we go from taking a garden hoe to the

handled garden hoe, a flashlight and a coal-oil lamp), to a point where we can reach into a box at a church house and pull out a full grown rattle snake?

I did a paper on snake handling when I was in College, and I learned a lot. Some of the folks who do this are so worked up, they actually go into a trance and their body temperature drops. The touch of their hand, to the snake, is no more than the side of the box they came from, so they don't feel threatened.

I did not try to confirm this by putting my hand in ice and then touching one and I don't recommend it. It's an explanation, and maybe its true.

The bottom line is we are deathly afraid of snakes, so much so, that some would pick one up to prove

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "County"), does hereby find,

determine, adjudicate and declare as follows:

1. The Mississippi Existing Industry Productivity Loan Program, pursuant to Section 57-93-1, et seq. Mississippi Code of 1972, (the "Act"), the Mississippi Development Authority is authorized to make interest-bearing loans to existing industries, county or municipal authorities for the purpose of economic development.

In order to secure the Loan, the County will execute and deliver to the MDA a Promisory Note (the "Note"). failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4)(A) of the Act. The loan shall not be deemed indebtedness within the

meaning specified in Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Governing Body of the County does hereby declare its intention to authorize and approve a Loan from the MDA in the principal amount not to exceed five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for the purpose of purchasing industrial equipment and machinery thereby promoting commerce, local job creation and economic growth.

Section 2. The Loan will be secured by a Note executed and delivered by the County to MDA. Pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4) (A) of the Act, failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due until such time as the indebtedness has been discharged or arrangements to discharge such indebtedness satisfactory to the MDA have been made. Section 3. The Governing Body proposes to authorize and approve the Loan from the MDA in the amount and for the aforesaid purposes at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place at the County Courthouse in luka, Mississippi,

at 10:00 a.m. on the 21st day of September, 2009, or at some meeting held subsequent thereto. If twenty percent (20%) or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is less, of the qualified electors in the County shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the County against the authorization and approval for the Loan on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then the Loan shall not be entered into unless authorized at an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan.
