Arrest Made in Burnsville Pharmacy Armed Robbery Case

Late Tuesday evening, authorities made their first arrest connected to the recent armed robbery of Burnsville Discount Drugs.

According to Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, Kenneth Keith Vandiver, 29, of 9 County Road 298, has been charged with one count of armed robbery, and is being held at the Tishomingo County Jail pending bond hearing. He was already on probation with the Mississippi Department of Corrections for an unrelated crime, said Whitlock.

The week-long investigation started with the pursuit of the suspect (on foot) by two of the people at whom he pointed a loaded-off shotgun last Tuesday morning in the course of forcing his way into Burnsville Discount Drugs in the B&J shopping center on Highway 365 South. The suspect was not located that day, and the investigation has continued all week, with many tips called in, and one that finally checked out, said Whitlock.

"We are so pleased," said Burns, owner of Burnsville Discount Drugs, regarding the arrest. "Most of all, we are glad one of our people got hurt, and that they can all rest a little easier now that this guy has been arrested."

Burns confirmed that 2,915 fentanyl pills were taken in the robbery, with an estimated street value of \$14,575 to \$19,150. Burns credited the quick

thinking of pharmacist Terry Dalton with only giving the masked suspect that much, and concealing other drugs that were in the safe. Additionally, the suspect was seen forcing clerk Mari-

lyn Brady into the store, and so his time inside was limited.

Meth Lab Busted

In the course of the investigation, deputies and the Burnsville

police also found a meth lab in operation, and two suspects are being held for questioning, said Deputy Eric Harris on Wednesday.

Community Unites to Give Family of Nine a New Home

Love thy neighbor. Be joyful givers. Serve wholeheartedly.

It's easy to "talk the talk" every Sunday for most church folks around here. It's the "walking the talk" part we have trouble with.

At a little wooded home site near Burton, some people are putting feet to their beliefs. They are building a home for a family of nine who face daily challenges that few of us can begin to understand.

How it Started

It all began with a man with a gift of teaching and caring for children. Earl McAnally was a special education teacher at Tishomingo Elementary until his school year, and as a part of his job, he cared for the very basic needs of a boy named Justin, who loves music. Justin, 8, has a sister who is also part of the special education program at Tishomingo, Caitlen. She is nine.

As a part of his calling, he is caring for Justin and Caitlen, and their very special family.

Bro. Earl is the pastor of Dennis United Methodist Church, and he shared his heart about Justin and Caitlen, and their little sister Kenedie, with his church family. He shared that it means to help "the least of these," which in their case is significantly true.

Special Needs

Caitlen was born in 1998 to Karen, and it didn't take long for Mom to realize that Caitlen was not developing normally. Caitlen started rehabilitation exercises as an infant. She always smiles, but is wheelchair dependent, and others have to help her with all her basic needs.

When Karen was 13 weeks pregnant with her second child, her gall bladder ruptured, necessitating surgery that caused Justin to be born in 2000 with severe medical problems. He is also in a

wheelchair, but he loves music!

Her third child, Kenedie, is a third grader, and comparatively normal, though she is definitely more grown up than many of her classmates. For all these years, Karen and Kenedie met the daily challenges of caring for two special needs children together, as the father is "not really a part of things," as Karen explained.

When Karen met Daniel Watson through their church and decided to marry, they knew it would be difficult.

"We had both gone through rough marriages, and we both knew what it was like to watch our kids go through so much," says Karen.

Daniel also has a special needs child, the charming and active Cheyenne, now in kindergarten. She has Down's Syndrome, and like Justin, she spent a lot of time in Le Bonheur Children's Hospital in Memphis. Eventually she had surgery to repair three holes in her heart.

And, Daniel also has three other children, Little Daniel, Annabelle, 3, and Brandon, 2.

Since their marriage in July 2008, the family of nine has been living near Tishomingo in two house trailers, put together. The home is not "wheelchair accessible," and with nine children it is quite cramped.

Daniel drives a truck, and Karen stays with the children, and it's not easy, but they do well. The children are as well-behaved as any students and have good attendance records at school. You can not tell which children belong to whom, they have become so closely knit.

Kenedie is a mother hen to all of them, says Karen, and Lil' Daniel is their protector.

Christmas Visit

When some of Bro. Earl's congregation visited the family with Christmas treats in December, and saw how they were

living, they knew they had to do something to help.

One of the ladies was Nancy Collier. In her heart, she knew she had to take action to help the Watsons, and could do it, with the contacts she had through her family's construction business.

The dream of a handicapped-accessible home for the Watsons was born, and this week, drywall is being installed in a home that will give the family more room, and ease their daily challenges considerably.

On land donated just south of Burton, it's being built with donated labor, materials and funds. It is wheelchair accessible, and features a large common living and dining area with four adjacent bedrooms and a bath designed for a wheelchair. The new home will be energy efficient and low maintenance so that the family can enjoy their hours spent there together.

A Community Effort

Dennis UMC is just the contact for the project, they insist, but many there have helped fund the project, or do the actual building. Several other churches are also helping similarly, and many different construction companies have donated everything from concrete to drywall. Tammy McDowell from Calvary Baptist, and Bro. Earl's sister-in-law, Vicki McAnally, also help to organize labor, acquire needed donations, and coordinate construction crews.

They are also helpful when five little Watsons come zooming through to check on "their rooms," which is pretty often!

Karen and Daniel, who also help with the construction effort, say they are so appreciative of everything people have done for their children, to ensure they have a hope and a future.

Our Scotch-Irish Heritage: Snake-Free Ireland to Being Snake Handlers

Most of the people reading this are Scotch-Irish, me included. We came here at different times and for different reasons. Some were sent here.

We were trouble makers.

The King first sent us from Scotland to Ireland to calm the rowdy Irish; which didn't work. And so for a couple hundred years we lived in a land of no snakes, thanks to St. Patrick. We came from a land of very few snakes (Scotland had only the adder and it was scarce.)

The point here is, we have a long standing predisposition to live and function without snakes. But, here we are, four hundred years later, in the thick of copperheads and cotton mouths.

I asked the only genuine true Irishman I know, Dr. Al Flannery, what it was like to come from Ireland and be dropped down here in a land where snakes roam freely.

"It scared the hell outta me," was his reply, which is pretty much my feeling.

So we go about the summer days with a sharper eye than we would have back in Ulster.

And then there are the snake handlers. They are us, for the most part, Scotch-Irish, protestant, and with definite scriptural authority for what they do.

How did we go from taking a garden hoe to the

storm house with us when the weather gets bad, (remember the storm house kit consists of a long-handled garden hoe, a flashlight and a coal-oil lamp), to a point where we can reach into a box at a church house and pull out a full grown rattle snake?

I did a paper on snake handling when I was in College, and I learned a lot. Some of the folks who do this are so worked up, they actually go into a trance and their body temperature drops. The touch of their hand, to the snake, is no more than the side of the box they came from, so they don't feel threatened.

I did not try to confirm this by putting my hand in ice and then touching one and I don't recommend it. It's an explanation, and maybe its true.

The bottom line is we are deathly afraid of snakes, so much so, that some would pick one up to prove his faith.

As a Methodist, praise God, I've not been called on to do that.

The purpose of this meeting was to address issues directly related to ensuring school buses operate as safely as possible. Tishomingo County School District has many drivers with over 30 years of school bus driving experience; with a majority of the drivers having over 10 years experience. "We are so blessed in Tishomingo County to have such highly-qualified school bus drivers who truly care about the students riding the bus", stated Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall.

Numerous safety topics were covered in order to increase driver safety, student discipline, and public safety. The following items are a sample of what was discussed:


- Ensuring drivers make complete stops at stop signs
- Adhering to the speed limit
- Reporting any signs of mechanical issues
- Performing pre-trip inspections
- Proper discipline on the bus
- Ensuring students are seated and facing forward
- Railroad Crossing Operations
- Loading and unloading of students
- Students crossing the road - driver/student eye contact and hand signals
- Inclement weather related issues

Also discussed items the district will bring to the attention public in an effort to increase the safety of students who ride the bus.

- Remain a safe distance behind a school bus
- Significantly slow down when you see a school bus
- Buses make starts and stops
- Pay close attention to Stop Arm on the side of the bus, if arm is out, Stop
- Look for children on and off the bus
- Look both ways for children crossing the road
- Slow down in school bus operating areas
- Work with children to remain seated and low to allow driver to see them on driving the bus.

There are many things that go into operating a school bus system every day, and together as a community create a safer transportation system protecting the children served by Tishomingo County School District. School bus is one of the safest modes of transportation in the world and Tishomingo County School District will strive to ensure all students are protected while on the bus.

The Board of Supervisors, acting for and on behalf of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "County"), took up for consideration the matter of authorizing and approving a loan on behalf of the County from the Mississippi Development Authority (the "MDA") for the purpose of purchasing industrial equipment and machinery and thereby promoting commerce and economic growth.

Thereupon Supervisor NICKY MCRAE offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:
RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TISHOMINGO COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE A LOAN ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY FROM THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY IN A MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FIVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$5,000,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING INDUSTRIAL EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY TO PROMOTE COMMERCE, LOCAL JOB CREATION AND ECONOMIC GROWTH.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "County"), does hereby find, determine, adjudicate and declare as follows:

1. The Mississippi Existing Industry Productivity Loan Program, pursuant to Section 57-93-1, et seq. Mississippi Code of 1972, (the "Act"), the Mississippi Development Authority is authorized to make interest-bearing loans to existing industries, county or municipal authorities for the purpose of economic development.

2. The County will agree to purchase this industrial equipment and machinery and will request the MDA to finance a portion of the cost associated with the purchase (the "Project").

3. Pursuant to the Act and guidelines adopted by the MDA, the County will file an application with the MDA for a loan to be used for the development of the Project in the amount of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) (the "Loan").

4. The County will enter into a Loan Agreement (the "Agreement") with the MDA wherein the County agrees to borrow the proceeds of the Loan subject to and upon the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

5. In order to secure the Loan, the County will execute and deliver to the MDA a Promissory Note (the "Note"). failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4)(A) of the Act.

6. The loan shall not be deemed indebtedness within the meaning specified in Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Governing Body of the County does hereby declare its intention to authorize and approve a Loan from the MDA in the principal amount not to exceed five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for the purpose of purchasing industrial equipment and machinery thereby promoting commerce, local job creation and economic growth.

Section 2. The Loan will be secured by a Note executed and delivered by the County to MDA. Pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4) (A) of the Act, failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to repay obligations due until such time as the indebtedness has been discharged or arrangements to discharge such indebtedness satisfactory to the MDA have been made.

Section 3. The Governing Body proposes to authorize and approve the Loan from the MDA in the amount and for the aforesaid purposes at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place at the County Courthouse in Iuka, Mississippi,

at 10:00 a.m. on the 21st day of September, 2009, or at some meeting held subsequent thereto. If twenty percent (20%) or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is less, of the qualified electors in the County shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the County against the authorization and approval for the Loan on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then the Loan shall not be entered into unless authorized at an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan. Such election shall be called and held as provided by law. If no protest is filed, then the Loan may be entered into without an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date above specified.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be published once a week for at least four (4) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in the City of Iuka, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, and having a general circulation in the County and qualified under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.
