## County Schools in Good Shape Despite Governor's Cuts

Despite a more than \$700,000 cut to its state funding, Tishomingo County schools are still in good shape, reports Superintendent Darryl Worley.  
In his recent budget cuts, Governor Haley Barbour cut \$5 million from the state education budget. Tishomingo County was cut \$723,202, but was prepared for this cut. "We anticipated cuts when we prepared the 09-10 budget and cut spending \$1 million from the 08-09 budget," Tishomingo County School Superintendent Malcolm

Kuykendall this week.  
The funding was cut for Mississippi Adequate Education Program in the amount of \$694,470, bus funding was cut \$10,793, and instructional supplies were cut \$2,424, said Kuykendall. Also \$15,515 ad valorem money promised by the state will not be sent, he added.  
The Governor has made claims that, due to federal stimulus money, education is still receiving even more than it did last year, but Kuykendall confirmed that much of that money is earmarked for only certain uses, and can not

be used for operational expenses like teacher salaries. The District still has not received Title I money promised by the stimulus program.

"We are ok this time," said Kuykendall. "But if we have more cuts, we may have to dip into our reserve fund, and we don't want to do that."

A reserve fund based on student population numbers is required by the state for major emergencies. Tishomingo County's is \$4.5 million, which is a little more than the state requires.

## Songwriter's Showcase Brings \$32,000 for Cancer Treatment Center

Last Thursday night some went home with a Les Paul guitar. Another had a Charlie Daniels signed fiddle, and another got an Ole-Miss football helmet signed by both Eli and Richie Manning.  
And the Darryl Worley Foundation got \$32,000 to go towards its proposed cancer treatment center.  
The Songwriter Showcase and its auction are one of the most enjoyable parts of the Tennessee River Run. The \$100-a-plate catfish supper at Pickwick was good, but the entertainment was the best part of the evening September 17th.  
The simple stage featured five guys on stools with acoustic guitars. Darryl Worley and four of his songwriter friends played songs and talked about the inspirations behind music and lyrics.  
Teasing and laughter between all the songwriters kept the mood lighthearted, but there were some tear-jerker moments during some songs, like

"I Loved Her First," written by Walt Aldridge and recorded by Heartland.

They played well-known hits like "Holding Her, and Loving You," by Walt Aldridge, and humorous songs like "Things That Never Cross a Man's Mind," by Wynn Varble, recorded by Kellie Pickler.

Aldridge, a native of Florence, Alabama also sang his recent Travis Tritt hit, "Modern Day Bonnie & Clyde."

"Have You Forgotten," written and sung by Worley and long-time friend Varble, and Worley's current top 10 hit "Sounds Like Life," brought long applause from the crowd of more than 250.

All the proceeds from the showcase go toward the Darryl Worley Foundation's current goal of fund raising for a cancer treatment center in Savannah to serve the region.

Several items were signed and auctioned off at the showcase. Some of the higher-bid items were the Ole Miss helmet for \$1,750, a Les Paul Guitar

signed by all the songwriters for \$1,600 and a "gold" fiddle signed by Charlie Daniels that got \$1,100. Lots of t-shirts, the songwriters' stools they sat on, and even the Merle Haggard shirt worn by Darryl Worley in the video, "Have You Forgotten," were auctioned for the cause.

The big concert, and activities all day Friday and Saturday, earned more money for the Tennessee River Run effort that started as a Worley's vision to help his community and family. He said the idea came to him after dealing with so many people in his family who have suffered from cancer. Thanks to enthusiastic organizers, many of whom have been lifelong friends of Worley, the past eight years have seen the Tennessee River Run become one of the major entertainment events of the year in the mid-South.

Totals on the amount raised for the cancer center will be released as volunteers continue to tally contributions from all the events.

## Corinth Man Drowned at Coleman Park Saturday

A Corinth man drowned Saturday evening at Coleman Park.  
Timothy Chad Wallace, 24, of Corinth, died by accidental drowning Saturday evening in the Indian Creek area of Pickwick Lake/Tennessee River, according to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon.  
There were two females swimming with Wallace, and they reported him missing shortly after he failed to resurface around 4:30 p.m. Tishomingo County Sher-

iff's Department divers recovered the body about 6:15 p.m.

### False Alarm

Last Thursday, divers and searchers searched the Slate Rock Hollow area on Pickwick Lake for several hours for evidence of a body that someone reported seeing while fishing.

After extensive searching Thursday evening and Friday, no evidence was found.

There are no known missing persons, said Wilemon.

## Pleas Heard In Circuit Court

In the September term of Tishomingo County Circuit Court the following pleas were accepted, and sentences assigned:

James Frederick Brents, of 308 Pickwick Circle, Iuka, pled guilty to statutory rape and was sentenced to twenty years with the Mississippi Department of Corrections (MDOC), thirteen of which shall be suspended, and five years post-release supervision. He also shall pay all costs of court.

Melissa Hubbard, of 734 Hwy. 365 N., Burnsville, pled guilty to introduction of contraband in county jail, and was sentenced to twelve years with MDOC, twelve years suspended pending defendant's future good behavior and that she violate no city, county, state, or federal laws; and five years post release supervision. She shall also pay all costs of court.

Bernard Chesley aka Barney Wright, of 4205 Patton Rd., Huntsville, AL, pled guilty to attempted uttering of a forgery and first degree arson. He was sentenced to ten years with MDOC, two of which were suspended, and eight years to be served for the forgery. The twelve for arson were suspended, as they run concurrent. He shall also pay all costs of court, and have five years post release supervision, and stay at a restitution center until all monies are paid.

Joel Byrd, of 570 Museum Dr., Mantachie, pled guilty to malicious mischief and was sentenced to five years with MDOC with credit given for time served and the balance of sentence suspended. He will fulfill requirements of four years post release supervision, and shall pay all costs of court.

Janet Cummings, of 1000 N. Pearl, Iuka, pled guilty to two counts of sale of oxycodone, and was sentenced to a total of eight years with MDOC. She was placed in the Intensive Supervision Program/House Arrest Program for a period of one year. If she successfully completes the program the remainder of sentence shall be suspended and she shall be placed on five years post release supervision. The court reserves the right of judicial review for a period of one year from date of sentencing. She shall also pay all costs of court.

Johnny Tabor, of 1044 CR 222, Blue Springs, pled guilty to possession of methamphetamine, and was sentenced to three years with MDOC, with credit given for time served and balance of

sentence suspended. He will also serve five years post release supervision and pay all costs of court.

Ryan Hill, of 58 CR 118, Tishomingo, pled guilty to possession of two or more precursors with intent, and possession of methamphetamine and was sentenced to 24 years with MDOC. These twenty years shall be suspended pending defendant's future good behavior. He shall serve five years supervised probation, and shall be enrolled in the 1<sup>st</sup> Judicial District Drug Court Program. He shall pay all costs of court.

Jason Clay Dugger, of 129 CR 306, Glen, pled guilty to two counts of grand larceny. He was sentenced to a total of 20 years with MDOC, six of which are suspended pending defendant's future good behavior and that he violate no city, county, state, or federal laws leaving four years to serve, and five years post release supervision. He shall pay all costs of court.

Toby Lambert, of 16 CR 170, Tishomingo, pled guilty to aggravated assault and was sentenced to twenty years with MDOC, all of which were suspended. He must complete five years unsupervised probation, and pay all costs of court.

James C. Rippie, of 400 W. Rowena, Iuka, pled guilty to possession of two or more precursors and was sentenced to twenty years with MDOC, all of which are suspended pending defendant's future good behavior and that he violate no city, county, state, or federal laws, and that he complete five years supervised probation. Upon release from MDOC, defendant shall be banished from the 1<sup>st</sup> Judicial Circuit Court District for a period of five years. Banishment will not be in effect until he is accepted into the Probation Program in Tennessee. The Court reserves the right of judicial review for a period of one year from date of sentencing. The defendant shall pay all costs of court.

Deidra Bond, of 785 CR 993, Belmont, pled guilty to manufacturing methamphetamine, and possession of methamphetamine. She was sentenced to a total of 28 years with MDOC, all of which shall be suspended pending defendant's future good behavior and that she violate no city, county, state, or federal laws. She shall also complete five years supervised probation, and shall pay all costs of court.

## Protest Against Free Trade, Legal Immigration Planned

Those who are against free trade and illegal immigration have their chance to protest Saturday evening, September 19th at the Tishomingo County Courthouse.  
Like the Tea Party movement, the Council for Conservative Citizens is also aiming to give people a voice through rallies and petitions. They will have a demonstration at the September 26th supporting border security, fair trade and opposing outsourcing of American jobs.  
The Council believes the elimination of tariffs in imported goods had the effect of eliminating millions of middle class manufacturing jobs, explained Brian Pace of Booneville, who is Upper East Mississippi Field Organizer for the St. Louis-based council.  
"Corporations choose to operate in other countries to save on expenses," he said. "That leaves us with an underemployed unemployed middle class."  
They will also have a petition protesting illegal immigration and supporting increased border security.  
They are inviting anyone who is willing to sign to do so. They plan to present the petitions to elected officials, especially Congressman Travis Childers, who said he was for fair trade, as opposed to free trade, in his campaign.  
"Fair trade balances the play-

ing field," said Pace. "We need a trade surplus, not to be importing everything."

"He may be one of our best chances," said Pace of Childers. "We need someone to push for good economic policies. Other representatives are so pro-big business, we won't see any support for reform from them."

The Council is a "big tent" organization supporting states' rights issues and conservative causes. It started in the South, but has gone nationwide, "like NASCAR," joked Pace. More information can be found at [www.cofcc.org](http://www.cofcc.org).

I'm standing here on the upper deck of this boat in Glacier Bay, Alaska, listening to my Ipod and waiting for a chunk of this ancient ice to break and fall into the sea, drinking the best cup of hot chocolate I have ever tasted (I think they put brandy in it).

The sights and smells of this place are truly overwhelming, there are few sounds, an occasional seagull or the much anticipated crack of the ice.

This smell of cold is like the smell of snow. This place feels good, it's like Pickwick in winter, only colder and without Jimmy Dees. The hills roll like Pickwick, they just roll higher. I'm going to appreciate Pickwick more from now on and Tishomingo Park, been to several places exactly like Bear Creek. The only thing this place lacks is background music, much like life itself, but I covered

that with the Ipod.

Skagway is stuck in the 1950's---I like that. It reminds me of Paden when I was a boy. Some have chickens in the yard and a few have a pen or a shed for a hog, or something. These folks must wake up every morning to the taste of fresh eggs and maybe the smell of ham meat frying,---I like that.

I want to see a bear, a wild bear, a wild bear catch a salmon, like on TV. We have to fly out in small plane and land on the water to get to this prime bear watching place.

Our guide is a woman, a woman that wasn't sup-

posed to work that day. Somebody must have called in sick. You could see it in her face. She spent the first half of our trip telling us if we didn't listen closely to her, a bear would come out of the woods and kill us. She knew her stuff, and she had that weathered look of thirty years in the bush. I'm not saying she was ugly, I'm not saying that. I'm just saying she looked like someone who had been riding around for the last ten or fifteen years with her head stuck out the car window.

I have never in my life seen so many fish, not even at Ledbetter's! One stream was so packed, you couldn't throw a rock and not hit a fish. We saw the bear catch the fish, he brought it up into the woods, about fifty feet from us and ate it. He seemed to particularly like the head and the guts.

Our other guide showed up, turns out he lives up there within walking distance. He told me he had a permit from the state to use a net and that he caught a lot of salmon and that was what he lives on. He said he cut off the meat, boiled it and canned it in Mason jars just like we do vegetables. Boiled fish, sounds good.

He said he did his moose and reindeer the same way. You would want some variety.

"It'll last about a year, I eat a pint jar at a time" he said. This fellow had no electricity, no gas, no running water, and no TV, he laughed when I asked that one. He just had a big wood stove and a rain barrel. He knew all about what you could or couldn't eat up here and he looked healthy. Then I asked him "the" question. Are there any bad snakes up here?

"None, no snakes at all," he said. What a place to live.

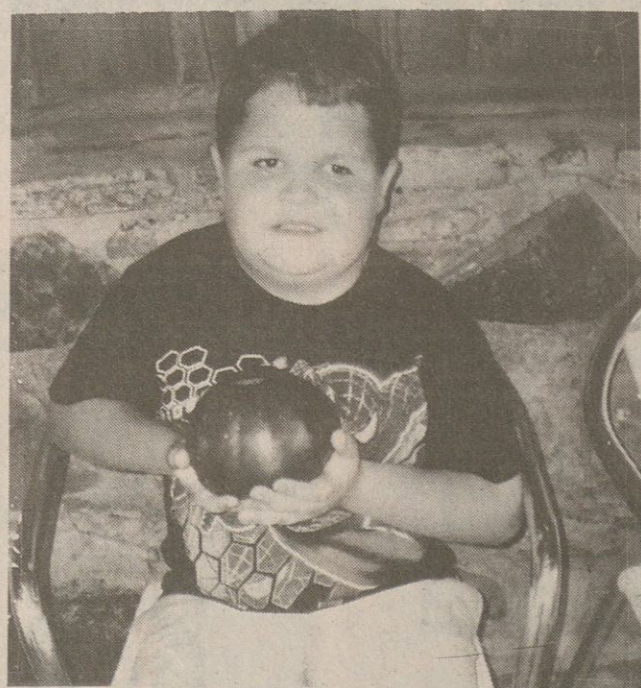

# Braves Knock Off Aggies 33-20; Prepare for Warriors Friday

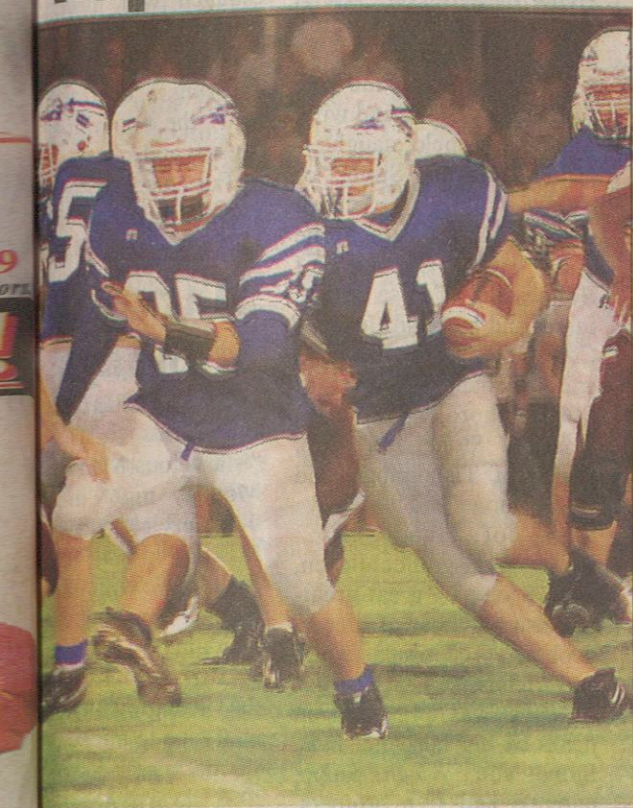

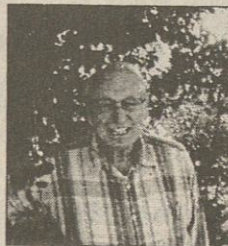

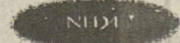

The Board of Supervisors, acting for and on behalf of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "County"), took up for consideration the matter of authorizing and approving a loan on behalf of the County from the Mississippi Development Authority ("MDA") for the purpose of purchasing industrial equipment and machinery and thereby promoting commerce and economic growth. Thereupon Supervisor NICKY MCRAE offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "County"), does hereby find, determine, adjudge and declare as follows:

1. The Mississippi Existing Industry Productivity Loan Program, pursuant to Section 57-93-1, et seq. Mississippi Code of 1972, (the "Act"), the Mississippi Development Authority is authorized to make interest-bearing loans to existing industries, county or municipal entities for the purpose of economic development.

2. The County will agree to purchase this industrial equipment and machinery and will request the MDA to finance a portion of the cost associated with the purchase (the "Project").

3. Pursuant to the Act and guidelines adopted by the MDA, the County will file an application with the MDA for a loan to be used for development of the Project in the amount of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) (the "Loan").

4. The County will enter into a Loan Agreement (the "Agreement") with the MDA wherein the County agrees to borrow the funds of the Loan subject to and upon the terms and conditions of the Agreement.

5. In order to secure the Loan, the County will execute and deliver to the MDA a Promissory Note (the "Note"). Failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of the homestead exemption reimbursement in an amount sufficient to satisfy obligations due pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4)(A) of the Act.

6. The loan shall not be deemed indebtedness within the meaning specified in Section 19-9-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. The Governing Body of the County does hereby declare its intention to authorize and approve a Loan from the MDA for a principal amount not to exceed five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for the purpose of purchasing industrial equipment and machinery thereby promoting commerce, local job creation and economic growth.

Section 2. The Loan will be secured by a Note executed and delivered by the County to MDA. Pursuant to Section 57-93-1(4) (A) of the Act, failure of the County to meet its repayment obligations shall result in the forfeiture of homestead exemption reimbursement amount sufficient to repay obligations due until such time as indebtedness has been discharged or arrangements to discharge such indebtedness satisfactory to the MDA have been made.

Section 3. The Governing Body proposes to authorize and approve the Loan from the MDA in the amount and for the aforesaid purposes at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at its regular meeting place at the County Courthouse in Iuka, Mississippi,

at 10:00 a.m. on the 21st day of September, 2009, or at some other time held subsequent thereto. If twenty percent (20%) or fifteen percent (15%), whichever is less, of the qualified electors in the County shall file a written protest with the Clerk of the County against the authorization and approval for the Loan on or before the said date and hour, then the Loan shall not be entered into until such time as the County has held a public hearing on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan. Such election shall be called and held as required by law. If no protest is filed, then the Loan may be entered into without an election on the question of authorizing and approving the Loan at any time within a period of two (2) years after the date specified.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be published once a week for four (4) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in the City of Iuka, Tishomingo County, Mississippi, and having a general circulation in the County and under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. The first publication of this Resolution shall be made not less than twenty-one (21) days prior to SEPTEMBER 27, 2009, and the last publication shall be made not more than seven (7) days prior to such date, said Resolution to be published on SEPTEMBER 27, SEPTEMBER 3, 10, and 17, 2009.

Section 5. The Clerk of the County shall be and is hereby authorized to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper a customary proof of said publication of this Resolution and have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 3 hereof.

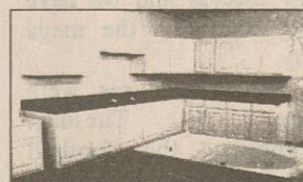
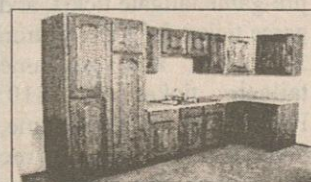

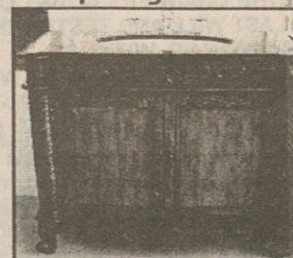

### Eyes Inside And Out

When you go for an eye exam to find out if you need new glasses or contact lenses, your eye doctor will check your eyes inside and out. In examining your external eye, he or she may use a small flashlight for a series of tests. For instance, your eye doctor may shine the light into your pupils to see if they react properly. In bright light they will close, but in dimmer light they will open.

Your eye doctor will also inspect your eyebrows, eyelids, eyelashes, and eyeballs for any signs of growths, scars, excessive tearing and other problems. It's also important to check the balance of your eye-muscles to see if they are properly coordinated.

In one test, your eye doctor will ask you to follow an object up and down and left and right to find out if your eyes are working together to help you see things clearly. If you have been having any problems with your vision, even though they may seem slight now, see your eye doctor for an examination before the problem gets worse.

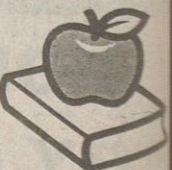

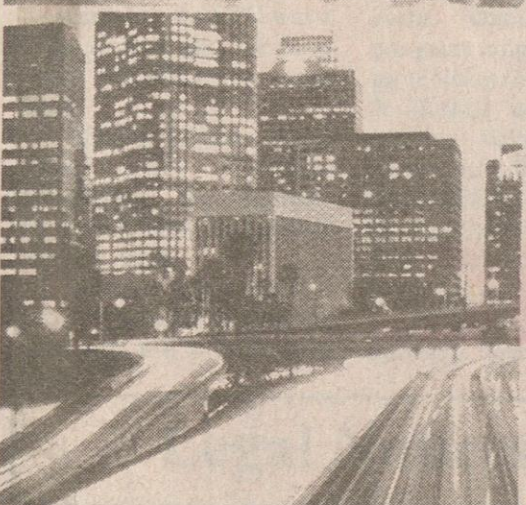
