## City Working on Correcting Problem at McKinney Crossing

Iuka city officials are investigating a couple possible solutions for the ongoing problem of trucks getting stuck on the railroad tracks at the Spring Street crossing.

Just a few weeks ago, dozens watched as a train crashed into a truck stuck on the tracks around 5:15 in the morning, scattering a load of iron ductile pipe that was around for the city water treatment facility. It was the second such collision this year. No one has been hurt in the collisions.

We don't have much control, explained Mayor Jackie Bryant Tuesday. Mississippi Department of Transportation designs the crossings, and the railroad, who owns the track and the right-of-way beside it, builds them.

"We are trying to get an idea of what we can do anything to keep these trucks from wrecking," he said.

The problem is that low-clearance trucks get stuck on the railroad tracks at the Spring Street crossing, locally referred to as McKinney Crossing.

Most often, it is northbound

trucks, since they have to stop for crossing traffic on Eastport Street, often while their trailers are still on the track. Plus, the south side of the crossing is lower than the northern side, said Bryant.

The crossing is the main route from Highway 72 to the Eastport and Pickwick lake area. Construction vehicles and other cargo trailers use the route regularly.

We are looking at a quick fix, and investigating possibilities for a long-term plan, said Bryant.

The quick fix could involve the city building up the level of the road just south of the crossing, said Bryant.

In the board meeting last Tuesday night, October 6th, they voted to have Cook Coggin Engineers, of Tupelo, do a feasibility study on what should be done, said City Clerk Benny Gray.

The board also voted to temporarily open Eastport Street to truck traffic. Last year, they voted to post it as closed to truck traffic to protect the recently constructed Indian Creek bridge on Eastport, said Bryant. They have already posted warning signs before the tracks, warning low-clearance trailers to avoid the crossing.

A long-term solution could include a bridge over the tracks, like the one at Wilmuth Street, or a crossing under the tracks, said Bryant.

He appointed a committee last year to investigate the issue. Members of the committee are Iuka citizens Mike Nelson, Neil Davis and Dr. Bob Robinson, and aldermen John Kent and James Grisham.

There is a long way to go, said Bryant. The railroad is not likely to want to do anything to help, MDOT approves of the design, and we will have to pursue millions in funding, because the city does not have the money for it, he explained. There may be bridge money available, like that which was used to rebuild the Wilmuth Street bridge.

## Flu Still Active in County, but Profile of Sufferers Changing

H1N1 vaccines available to students through schools soon

Area clinics are still seeing a dozen or more patients with flu symptoms a day, but the profile of those suffering is changing.

In the past month, middle school aged children were the main group reporting symptoms and dozens of students were out at Iuka Middle School, especially. But in recent days, more older people, younger children, and high school students are reporting, said Dr. Margaret Glynn, of the Segars Clinic in Iuka. She said they are seeing about 10-12 patients a day with flu-like symptoms.

Other clinics in the city confirm that they are also seeing about a dozen patients a day with flu-like symptoms.

Doctors advise patients to call in to the clinics first. They say also, to maintain a strict regimen of hand washing, and isolation of those suffering flu-like symptoms.

Locally, some residents have been made more aware of the seriousness of complications from the flu by the case of 4-year-old Isabella Ragan, of Tishomingo. She was featured in the leading story on MSNBC's web site. The story describes her two week ordeal, including a week in intensive care at a hospital in Huntsville, Alabama when she developed additional infections and pneumonia.

Isabella came home last weekend, and is slowly recovering her previous lively nature.

### County Clinics

The Tishomingo County Health Department will hold special vaccination clinics next Tuesday, October 20th, and October 27th and 30th, from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. to give seasonal flu vaccinations.

The shots are \$25 for adults and \$10 for those under 18.

"These are the seasonal flu

shots," verified a spokesman at the Tishomingo County Health Department. They do not have the H1N1/swine flu vaccine yet, but when they do, it will be free, she said. Call 423-6100 for more information.

### Vaccinations through Schools

The Segars Clinic and Dr. Margaret Glynn have been contacted by Vaccines for Children program, sponsored by Medicaid, regarding providing administration of up to 3,000 H1N1/swine flu vaccinations for all the children of Tishomingo County at no cost.

The Tishomingo County schools have granted the clinic permission to vaccinate students at the schools, with a signed parent consent form, which will be distributed by the school nurses. Dates for these vaccinations will be announced soon, said Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall.

## Lt. Governor Bryant to Speak at Burnsville Chamber Monday

Lieutenant Governor Phil Bryant will be the speaker at the Monday evening meeting of the Burnsville Chamber of Commerce, reported District 1 Representative Bubba Carpenter Tuesday.

## Cherokee Tribe Of MS To Seek Federal Recognition

A group of Tishomingo County residents with Cherokee heritage have banded together and will be seeking official recognition for the Cherokee Tribe of Mississippi from the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), the Interior Department arm of the federal government charged with making those determinations.

The new Tribe held its first meeting last Saturday and elected Gary Walls as chief, Donnie Dingler as Deputy Chief and Darlene Walls as Secretary Treasurer. All three tribal council members grew up locally. Walls was graduated from Tishomingo Agricultural High School before serving in the U.S. Navy. Dingler and Darlene Walls are graduates of Tishomingo High School.

The meeting, held at Tribal Offices in the Burnsville Plaza, was open to anyone, with proven Cherokee heritage or anyone who suspects Cherokee ancestry and is interested in working through the process of confirming their family tree.

Walls said the reason for organizing and seeking recognition is that it was "simply time for the ancestors of those on the Trail of Tears and other horrific relocation programs, to benefit from programs being offered to other Native Americans."

"We applaud others who have worked to honor our heritage and preserve our culture and this is just a natural progression in that effort," Walls said. "There are many programs - education, health service and social services (senior programs) that would benefit members of the Cherokee Tribe of Mississippi, but would also have a positive effect on the community."

Walls explained that the recognition process is long and involved, but well worth the time and effort.

Walls said he and wife, Darlene have been researching and studying the acknowledgment process and ancestral information intensely for the pasty ninety days.

"Few other tribes have the compelling story that we have," Walls said. "The abuse suffered by our ancestors is unparalleled in American history and after talking to some very knowledgeable people both in Mississippi and Washington, D.C., I am convinced we have a very good chance for success."

This date assigned to authorize and approve the aforementioned loan documents has been set to meet program requirements which mandate that four public notices be issued prior to loan closing. This will allow sufficient time for public comments.

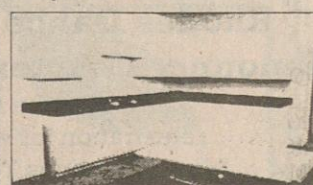
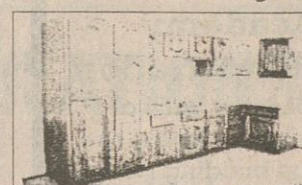

### Allen Brown Selected To MS Sports Hall Of Fame

For the second year in a row, the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame will have a Natchez native inducted. Former Ole Miss All-American and two-time Super Bowl champion, Allen Brown, will be inducted into the Hall of Fame Class of 2010.

Brown said he received a call recently from the Hall of Fame telling him he would be inducted in a ceremony next July 30th.

"It's the best honor you can get, because all your peers and other people in other sections of sports chose you," Brown said. "It's a real big honor. I've played in a lot of big games, but this is the biggest thing that's ever happened to me."

Brown played end for the Rebels from 1961-64 and was named an All-American by the Associated Press after his senior season.

Space Brown was named AP All-American in 1964, only five other Ole Miss players have received the honor; tight end Wesley Walls in 1988, offensive tackle Everett Lindsay in 1992, tight end Rufus French in 1998, linebacker Patrick Willis in 2006 and offensive tackle Michael Oher in 2008.

Brown went on to play for the Green Bay Packers in the NFL, winning two Super Bowls before injuries ended his career in 1968.

Brown said the fact that people still remember him playing over 40 years after he retired is the most special part of being inducted into the Hall of Fame.

"People in their 30s don't know who the heck I am," Brown said. "People my age know who I am. That makes it real special that they thought enough of me to induct me into the Hall of Fame."

Brown said he was surprised when he got the call as well as humbled.

"I'm not saying I belonged there, but I'm glad I got there," Brown said. "I've always wanted to be in the Hall of Fame, anybody that plays who is from Mississippi wants to be in it." And now that Brown will be enshrined in the Hall of Fame, he knows he will have a permanent place in Mississippi sports history, which he is very proud of.

"It will be there 100 years from now," Brown said. "People will look up and say 'Who's Allen Brown?' It's something to be real proud of and I am."

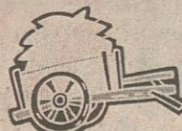
