Prescription Discount Card Available to All County Residents

Tishomingo County is offering its citizens a pharmacy discount card to help its citizens cope with the high price of prescription drugs.

Board President Brandon Grissom announced Monday that Tishomingo County is a member of the National Association of Counties (NACo), through the Board of Supervisors, and NACo sponsors a discount pharmacy card program that offers average savings of 22 percent off the retail price of commonly prescribed drugs.

The discount cards, which will be available immediately at all the Tishomingo County Courthouse offices, area pharmacies and some doctor's offices, may be used by all county residents, regardless of age, income, or existing health coverage, said Board President Brandon Grissom. There are eight pharmacies in the county that will accept the NACo card, and a national net-

work of more than 59,000 participating retail pharmacies also will honor it.

Grissom, and the rest of the board, have been working since June to get the county on the benefit program, since representatives of other counties spoke at a state supervisors' meeting about how it was helping their residents.

"Using the NACo prescription discount card is easy," said Grissom. "A cardholder will simply present it at a participating pharmacy. There is no enrollment form, no membership fee, and no restrictions or limits on frequency of use. Cardholders and their family members may use the card any time their prescriptions are not covered by insurance."

There is no cost to county taxpayers for NACo and Tishomingo County to make these money-saving cards available to residents, according to a NACo release.

Justice Court Fines Now Payable Online

The Tishomingo County Justice Court is now providing online payment for tickets, and it is proving convenient for not only out-of-town people but also county residents.

According to Justice Court Clerk Nancy Dexter, in October, the court office started taking online payments for most all traffic fines through the nCourt system, and collected \$2,000 online in the first two weeks.

Through the nCourt online system, people with tickets that are payable at Tishomingo County Justice Court can go online at www.tishomingocotix.com and pay with credit or debit card. There is a processing fee added.

Some fines are not payable online; offenses like drunk driving, or assault still require a court appearance, all of which is clearly stated on the site.

Other area counties that offer online ticket payment include Monroe and Tippah. Alabama counties have had an online pay-

ment system for some time.

The site is powered by, nCourt, of Woodstock, Georgia. They send the county a check each week, and handle the transactions.

Dexter said many of those paying online have been from outside the area, but people from the south part of the county have used it, too. She said it is difficult for some people to get to the courthouse during business hours.

"It's good for the County, and it benefits the people, too," she explained. "It makes it more convenient to pay on time, and that helps them avoid a contempt charge if they don't pay on time."

Current or old fines are payable online. More information is available by calling the Justice Court office, but area state troopers have information available to hand you about paying online, should you get a ticket, Dexter said.

"Forest Land Conservation"

Are you a forest land owner who has recently harvested the timber from your land? Have you thought about what you need to do with the logging roads and loading areas? Do you hunt or lease your land to a hunting club? If your answer is yes to any of these questions, then why not make these areas into wildlife feeding habitats by planting wildflowers, native grasses, and other game animal forage mixtures to attract game birds, and large and small game? You can also plant trees and other vegetation in a buffer area along the side of streams to protect them from erosion and to benefit animal species that prefer this type of habitat.

If this land is the Yellow Creek or Bear Creek watershed area of Tishomingo, Alcorn, Prentiss, or Itawamba Counties, there is cost share assistance available to prevent eroding away of these roads and loading areas through your local Mississippi Forest Commission office or Tishomingo Soil and Water Conservation District office. This program will cover 60% and the landowner covers the other 40% of the projects cost. TVA may be able to provide the wildflower, native grass seed or hardwood seedlings free of charge. The seed mixtures provided will depend upon what type of wildlife you want to attract. The monetary value of these seeds and seedlings can be used toward your 40% cost share.

The benefits of establishing plantings on these areas instead of

abandoning them are many. First, maintaining the roads and loading areas will boost the value of the property. It will also give you a permanent access into the property for timber inspection or hunting. The plantings will provide habitat and feeding areas for wildlife, increasing the lease value for hunting clubs or improving the chances of game harvest for yourself or other hunters. And lastly, when the timber is ready to harvest again the logging roads and loading areas will already be established for the harvesters.

Unlike the wooded area itself, these areas need special attention and are considered critical areas because the top layer of soil has been scraped off by equipment or eroded away. These roads and loading areas become severely compacted by heavy machinery during harvest. This keeps the natural vegetation from regrowing, making these critical areas prone to erosion. Over time these areas will continue to wash away and become degraded beyond repair. When the timber is ready for the next harvest, new roads and loading areas must be built in a different area and the erosion cycle will start all over.

"The Panther"

Living in Mingo (that's between the two creeks) at some age 9 (early 50's) to 13, we had heard about the panther that passed thru on some schedule of its own. Maybe every year or maybe ten, locals of older age had never seen it but had heard it. They said it sounded like a woman screaming and now I agree, as for sure we heard something like a woman crying and laughing at the same time. Back to the story, we were sitting in our chalet one night with too much to do as most nights rolled thru. Daddy was listening to Grand Ole Opry or wrestling on the stereo. Most of the time he was moving the antenna around trying to get a station that did not fade every 2 minutes. Mother and Grannie had kitchen things to do.

We "chillen" fought, fussed, studied a little to keep the folks happy. We had a fenced (chicken wire to keep the chickens out) front yard, no grass, it was swept clean with a broom.

Some of us was in the yard and on the porch when it happened and we almost took the screen door off its hinges.

Hair standing up (what little we had seeing it was cut close to last longer between cuts) chill bumps rose up on our skin about 1/4 inch. This scream cannot be described by word or deed. Mother thought something bad had happened at our nearest neighbor to the south. Mr.

Whitt and Maxine lived about 1/2 mile away. Whatever it was would have to wait until daylight as we had no means of transport other than a mule and a bike (the pedal type). The nearest telephone was a mile away. We were not leaving the house much less the yard that night. Daddy had grandpa's old single barrel 12 gage but without a light other than a coal oil lantern, no way was he that brave. I didn't sleep much that night and probably the rest didn't either. We checked on the neighbors or they checked on us the next morning. Everbody was ok. Some had heard the cat, or it could have been an alien from another planet who knows? Maybe black panthers do exist, I would have to agree because my wife says I have to as she and her mother saw one in the Midway area a few years back.

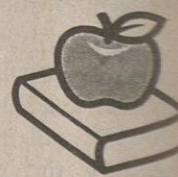

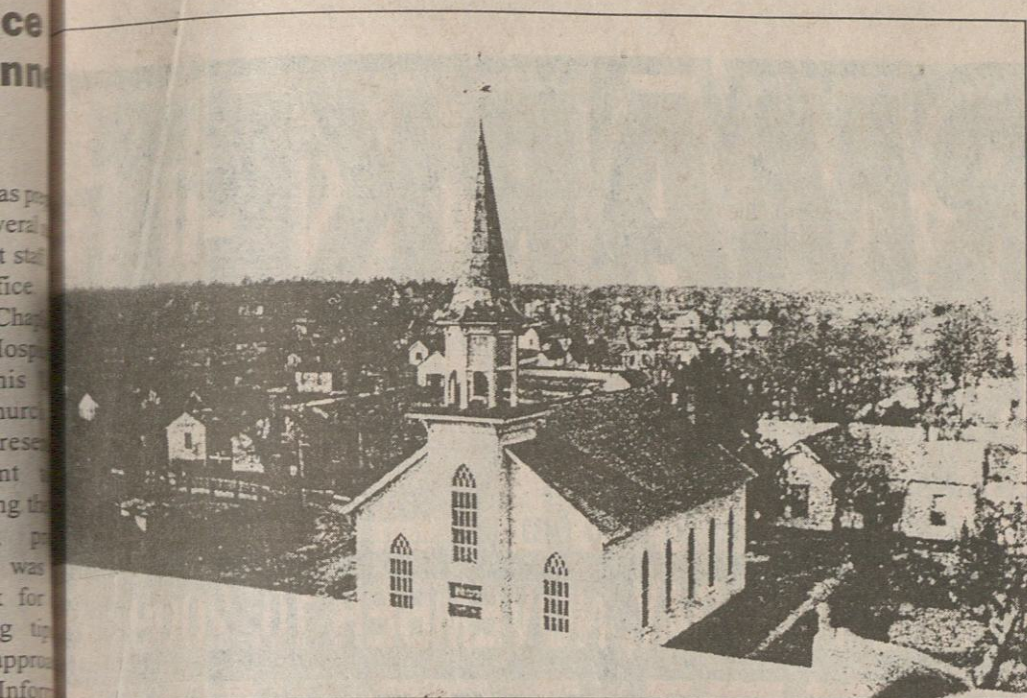

Iuka United Methodist Church Celebrates Its Sesquicentennial, 150 Years of Ministry

In 1857 the golden spike marking the completion of the old Memphis and Charleston Railroad was driven, the rail lines were complete and the town of Iuka was being planned. At this time period this section of Mississippi was under the jurisdiction of the Memphis Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. The circuit riders served as pastors of the small group of Methodists who lived in the area. The group was so small that no church building had been established. Two years later, in 1859 there were enough Methodists to begin erection of a church, and the foundation was laid.

The men entered through the right door and sat on that side while the ladies entered and sat on the left. Families were separated, as was the custom of the day. An aisle extended from each of the doors to the pulpit, dividing the seats into three sections. Though handmade, the seats were neatly finished. The windows were in the fashion of the day, high and shaded

with blinds. The pulpit featured colonial columns at each side, which were used as stands for candles and lamps. The altar was straight and followed the lines of the box pulpit.

The dark days of the Civil War wrought many changes to the church. The building served as a hospital, and through the doors were carried the wounded and dying of both the Union and Confederate Army. The Iuka church also becomes a mission station with the pulpit often filled by Methodist ministers of the armies in the area.

The church was remodeled again in 1897. The ceiling was changed, the floor was inclined, new seats replaced the handmade benches and memorial art windows were installed. In the spring of 1898, nearly 40 years after the church was established, the church was dedicated with the Bishop presiding.

In June of 1934 the church began construction of a two-story educational building and the existing sanctuary was remodeled.

The interior of the sanctuary redecorated and all of the existing woodwork was stained to harmonize with the choir rail, communion table and chancel. The two front windows were replaced with cathedral glass. The transom was replaced with art glass. The transom in the choir loft was also replaced with cathedral glass as was the upper half of the choir door. The communion table was replaced and the replacement continues to be used to this day.

In 1988 a family life center was added to the church. The Family Life Center consisted of a kitchen, a dining area, and a half court basketball court, and a stage for use in expanding the use of the church for the members.

A renovation of the existing education building was started in 2001 and was completed in March of 2002.
