Chris Berryman, from the ennessee Valley Authority ooke briefly with the board at eir regularly scheduled third londay meeting, offering exanations on several issues that ave kept the Tishomingo Board om signing onto the agreement, hich has already been signed Alcorn and Prentiss county pards of supervisors, as well as ecities of Iuka, Booneville and

Berryman stressed that the ree counties working together ould open possible funding oors, and improve visibility of e region as an economic develoment option. TVA is in support such alliances to help it's reon attract large manufacturing cilities like Toyota, which was, part, lured to Blue Springs by e cooperative agreement called e PUL Alliance - made up of entotoc, Lee and Union coun-

"A tremendous amount of fort goes into marketing your ea for economic development," id Berryman. "This will show ospective industries a level of st and cooperation that shows at you are who they want to

work with to establish a business. You just can't have too many salesmen out there promoting

The Tishomingo County board has previously voiced opposition to the alliance, stating that it didn't want to lose its proven ability to lure smaller employers like Meridian Furniture, G&G Steel, and several others who have chosen Tishomingo County due to the county's own

Berryman assured the board members that their own successful recruiting efforts would not be hindered - all prospects won't have to go through a TAP alliance filter that could risk their location in Alcorn or Prentiss

"The same pluses you have from an alliance like this help to lure smaller projects, too. Plus, Tishomingo County has the strengths of the Yellow Creek Port, and lots of land, and lots of available buildings," said Ber-

Supervisor Danny Ryan has often been supportive of industry locating anywhere in the region.

"Our people work in Booneville, in Corinth, and their people come over here to work, it evens out, and what's good for please see



WHAT IS COPD?

Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease, or COPD, is a group of conditions that includes emphysema, chronic bronchitis, and asthmatic bronchitis. Because these conditions exist together in many people, they are lumped together as a diagnosis of COPD. COPD has been diagnosed in sixteen million Americans.

COPD is primarily caused by smoking. Long-term exposure to cigarette smoke has a damaging effect in the airways causing swelling of the airways, excess mucus production and destruction of mechanisms that clear mucus from the airways. These changes to the airway reflect the chronic bronchitis part

of COPD. This often results in difficulty getting air in and out of the lungs (shortness of breath), cough and may eventually: lead to too little oxygen in the bloodstream.
