Board Signs to Form TAP Alliance with Alcorn & Prentiss Counties

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors voted Monday to ally Tishomingo County with neighboring Prentiss and Alcorn Counties for future economic development efforts.

Chris Berryman, from the Tennessee Valley Authority spoke briefly with the board at their regularly scheduled third Monday meeting, offering explanations on several issues that have kept the Tishomingo Board from signing onto the agreement, which has already been signed by Alcorn and Prentiss county boards of supervisors, as well as the cities of Iuka, Booneville and Corinth.

Berryman stressed that the three counties working together would open possible funding doors, and improve visibility of the region as an economic development option. TVA is in support of such alliances to help it's region attract large manufacturing facilities like Toyota, which was, in part, lured to Blue Springs by the cooperative agreement called the PUL Alliance - made up of Pontotoc, Lee and Union counties.

"A tremendous amount of effort goes into marketing your area for economic development," said Berryman. "This will show prospective industries a level of trust and cooperation that shows you are who they want to

work with to establish a business. You just can't have too many salesmen out there promoting you!"

The Tishomingo County board has previously voiced opposition to the alliance, stating that it didn't want to lose its proven ability to lure smaller employers like Meridian Furniture, G&G Steel, and several others who have chosen Tishomingo County due to the county's own efforts.

Berryman assured the board members that their own successful recruiting efforts would not be hindered - all prospects won't have to go through a TAP alliance filter that could risk their location in Alcorn or Prentiss county.

"The same pluses you have from an alliance like this help to lure smaller projects, too. Plus, Tishomingo County has the strengths of the Yellow Creek Port, and lots of land, and lots of available buildings," said Berryman.

Supervisor Danny Ryan has often been supportive of industry locating anywhere in the region.

"Our people work in Booneville, in Corinth, and their people come over here to work, it evens out, and what's good for

TCDF Annual Banquet

Cothren Compares Economic Success to Vaught-era Teamwork

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation presented awards for outstanding industries and businesses last week at its Annual Meeting.

About 120 TCDF members and representatives attended the meeting at Homestead Restaurant in Iuka. Author, and former college and professional football player Paige Cothren was the keynote speaker. He regaled the gathered company with stories of his football years at Ole Miss (pre-facemask years, he said). Cothren said it was obvious from the recent economical development successes here in the county in the past year, that the people in the county had definitely learned the value and power of teamwork, just like he did all those years ago under Coach Johnny Vaught.

Cothren has more than 25 books published, and the latest ones are set in Tishomingo County, which he praised as the most beautiful in the state. He actually lives in Houston, Mississippi, but does "receive the Tishomingo County paper."

TCDF Chairman Peyton Cummings handed over leadership duties to Dan Young, and Mary Ann Grant gave a report on the success of tourism promotion efforts of the Tishomingo County Tourism Council, including the 2009 Trash-to-Treasures Along the Tenn-Tom, and lots of advertising that is proving effective in bringing people to Tishomingo County.

"Tourism is the most significant underdeveloped economic development resource in Tishomingo County," stated material passed out at the meeting, and the CTC is working hard to promote the county as the best place to enjoy natural beauty and resources in the state. Both state parks in the county received national recognition this year for their respective attributes.

One of the highlights of the night was a professionally produced video promoting Tishomingo County, produced by CCI Video Productions of Iuka. It is used to promote the county's as-

sets to prospective industries and businesses.

TCDF reported expansions at Dynasteel and ATK in 2009, as well as new projects that started, including G&G Steel, Meridian Furniture, and Wood Industries. The economy in the county is defying the national trend, according to TCDF, with plant layoffs reported only at new River Homes and Monotech. Some businesses did close down, as well, including Price Busters, Esperanza Restaurant, Tucker Furniture and Appliance, Earl's Red Roof Cafe, Movie Gallery, and Factory Connection.

The close-downs were outnumbered two-to-one by new and expanded retail/service businesses include Park Place Dental, Whistle Stop Video Rentals, Running with Scissors, Affordable Repair, new Dollar Generals at Tishomingo and Belmont, The Back Porch BBQ and Grill, Brian's Tamales, The Doll House,

the region is good for all of us," he said.

"We already pull from a 50-70 mile radius to provide a suitable labor force for the industries that are already located here. We can't support the labor needs of a big plant with only Tishomingo County people," said Gary Matthews, executive director of Tishomingo County

Development Foundation.

In other business, the board postponed the opening of bids on the proposed new county jail to Thursday at 2 p.m. After the bids are opened, the architect will take them for review. After the bid process is completed, funding avenues for the proposed jail will be explored, explained purchasing clerk

Lynn West.

The board approved APAC as the successful low bidder to resurface/repair Mt. Evergreen Road. The estimated cost of the project was \$63,452.80, and APAC's bid was \$55,488.97, according to purchasing clerk Lynn West.

The board approved an emergency facility upgrade

grant on County Road 346 (Goat Island Road), said West. The grant will pay to repair the road under which a water line had burst.

The board met in executive session to discuss a personnel issue, and also with TCDF Executive Director Gary Matthews regarding a potential industry.

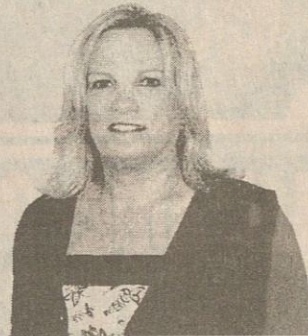

WHAT IS COPD?

Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease, or COPD, is a group of conditions that includes emphysema, chronic bronchitis, and asthmatic bronchitis. Because these conditions exist together in many people, they are lumped together as a diagnosis of COPD. COPD has been diagnosed in sixteen million Americans.

COPD is primarily caused by smoking. Long-term exposure to cigarette smoke has a damaging effect in the airways causing swelling of the airways, excess mucus production and destruction of mechanisms that clear mucus from the airways. These changes to the airway reflect the chronic bronchitis part of COPD. This often results in difficulty getting air in and out of the lungs (shortness of breath), cough and may eventually lead to too little oxygen in the bloodstream.

Smoking also leads to the destruction of many of the small air sacs in the lungs. Their purpose is to get oxygen into the bloodstream. This is the emphysema component of COPD. The early symptoms include a morning cough and shortness of breath. Because these symptoms occur gradually over a period of time, many patients dismiss them as a part of "just getting older."
