Rush Sweeney Awarded Economic Teacher of the Year

Rush Sweeney of Brandon, an economics teacher and coach at Northwest Rankin High School, is the state's 2009 U.S. Senator Thad Cochran Economics Teacher of the Year.

The Mississippi Council on Economic Education chose Sweeney for a unit titled "Human Demand Curves, Marginal Product of Peanut Butter, Buy This, Buy That." At the conclusion of the unit, Sweeney's students raised their scores 38 percent on a test on the Human Demand Curve and 44 percent on a test on Supply.

The award includes \$1,000 and an all-expense-paid trip to the 2010 Council for Economic Education annual conference in Miami.

The award was announced at the sixth annual U.S. Senator Thad Cochran Forum on American Enterprise, where more than 700 business, government and education leaders gathered to recognize Mississippi's progress in providing economic and personal finance education to kindergarten through 12th grade students. The event also hon-

ors Cochran for his leadership in bringing economic education opportunities to the state.

Sweeney teaches economics and advanced placement economics and coaches ninth grade football at Northwest Rankin. He earned the "Master Teacher of Economics" designation from the state Department of Education by completing a specialized course of professional development through the MCEE.

Sweeney is the son of Charles and Barbara Sweeney of Iuka, and a 1987 graduate of Iuka High School. He lives in Brandon with his wife, Tonya Welch Sweeney, and their three-year-old son, Seth.

Smokers Were Encouraged to 'Butt Out' on November 19th

Mississippi smokers were challenged to quit smoking "cold turkey" this Thanksgiving season as part of the American Cancer Society's 2009 Great American Smokeout Event.

Mississippi annually designates the third Thursday of each November as a day for smokers across the United States to kick the smoking habit for 24 hours in the hope they will consider quitting for good.

Faith Robinson, director of the Mississippi Tobacco Free Coalition of Alcorn, Prentiss, Tishomingo Counties, says there is plenty of help available for individuals who decide to nix the habit permanently.

nently. "Mississippians who want to quit using tobacco can contact the Mississippi State Department of Health (MSDH) Quit Line at 1-800-QUIT NOW to receive free counseling and medications, such as the patch or gum," said Robinson.

According to Roy Hart, director of the MSDH Office of Tobacco Control, getting professional help can make the difference between success and failure. "Quitting tobacco use can be difficult; however, those who get help are twice as likely to quit tobacco for good," said Hart.

"It is a good idea to choose a day in advance and designate it as your day to quit smoking," said Robinson. "Once you've chosen your quit day, let your friends, family and coworkers know and ask for their support and understanding. Nicotine withdrawal can cause feelings of stress and anxiety, and having a support network around you can help in the difficult days ahead."

Tobacco use remains the single largest preventable cause of disease and premature death in the United States. Each year in Mississippi, smoking accounts for an estimated 5,250 premature deaths, including 550 deaths among nonsmokers as a result of secondhand smoke. Sixty-nine thousand Mississippi children now under 18 will ultimately die prematurely from smoking, according to the Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids.

"With all of the resources available today to help, there has never been a better time to quit smoking," said Robinson. "The Mississippi Tobacco Free Coalition of Alcorn, Prentiss, Tishomingo Counties is here to help."

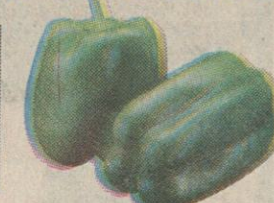

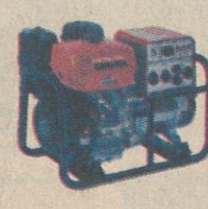

Truck Wagon

When I was about seven years old we, this includes some older brothers and teenage friends, built what we called truck wagons. They were not trucks, but would go down hills faster than wagons or most trucks of those days.

As I think what we did when it was more like suicide attempts. First remember we had no tv, no cell phones, no computers. It could get boring with limited things we had to do. Lets get back to the narrative and build a truck wagon.

We would find a good wide plank and cut it to about six feet long. This is a seating area and holds the front and rear axials.

The front and rear axial was two-by-four most often about three feet long. When we could find steel rod we would attach it to the two axials to attach the wheels.

If not we trimmed down small trees to make the axle. Here comes the hard part, wheels were hard to come by so most often we cut them from logs with a crosscut saw. They would be about 12 inches in diameter with a hole bored in the center with a brace and bit.

Young folks might need to ask someone what a brace and bit is. With wheels attached to the axials we had our truck wagon. A rope was attached to the front axial for steering and towing. A lot of grease made for easy rolling.

Here comes the good part. We had some good hills in the cow pastures so to the top we would go and aim down hill climb on and scream. That was the fun part, now we had to pull it back for the next rider. Most hill finished up at the bottom with a branch or small creek and we finished up wet. Nascar was established in 1948 but we probably had not heard of it. Of course we had to compete so we had to build more than one truck wagon and race to the bottom.

The red wagon came along, Western Flyer by name. It was no competition as it was not low enough or wide enough and was wrecked very easy. Of course the open pasture was not difficult enough. To the woods we went. We cleared small bushes and brush on the steepest hill we could find and created an obstacle course.

When we didn't make the turn and hit a tree is where the hurt began, and repair to the wagon. No helmet, no protection, no broken bones thank goodness. Today parents wouldn't allow such, besides we would have to get insurance, written approval of landowner, safety gear etc. Wouldn't be any fun.

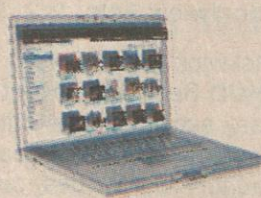
