Iuka Woman Dies in Accident on Hwy 72

An Iuka woman was killed Saturday evening trying to cross Highway 72 when a truck struck her car.

Sara Lunsford, 80, was pronounced dead at the scene of the wreck, about 6:08 p.m. December 12th, according to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon.

She was leaving Riverhills Bingo, and attempting to cross Highway 72 to turn east, when a westbound pickup truck driven by Edward Roach, of Burnsville, struck the driver's side of her Buick Regal. The collision knocked her car onto the median, said Wilemon. She was not wearing a seat belt.

Mr. Roach was not injured.

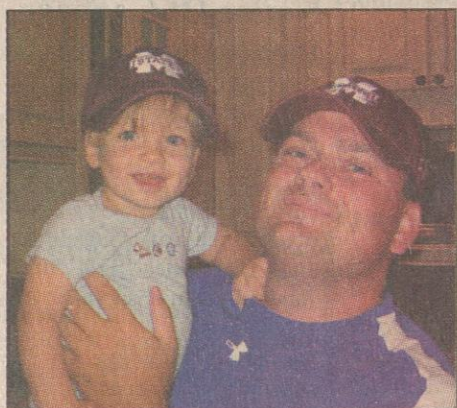
During his years of service to the university since graduation, Russo has been Vice-President

Iuka Teen's Wish Granted

Last Friday, Ashley Lambert had a big surprise when one of her fondest wishes was granted in front of her fellow students at Tishomingo County High School.

Thanks to the help of Make-A-Wish Foundation, and her friends at school and in the community, Ashley, her parents, and two younger brothers will go to Walt Disney World over Christmas break!

Ashley, 17, was paralyzed as the result an automobile accident in the fall of 2008, and has been slowly recovering with the help of her family, and many medical professionals from Tishomingo County to Atlanta. She is still confined to a wheelchair.

Over the past year, the Tishomingo County High School Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) Chapter has organized many fund raisers, including cookie sales, Halloween card sales, a womanless beauty review,

and a successful raffle of decorated Christmas trees, which was completed just last week.

With the help of all the organizations involved, the school raised a little more than \$5,000, which is the amount needed by the Make-A-Wish Foundation to make a dream like Ashley's come true.

The Make-A-Wish foundation grants the wishes of children with life-threatening medical conditions. Visits to Disney parks, attending sporting events, meeting celebrities, and visiting TV and movie sets are some of the "wishes" that the Foundation grants each year, with the help of local organizations like the FBLA.

Disney-themed wishes continue to be the most popular requests by children in the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

At TCHS, Ashley was surprised by the wish being granted, though her parents, Thomas and Nancy Lambert, had been contacted a few days ahead of time, to

help finalize travel arrangements to Disney for Ashley, themselves and her little brothers, T. J., 13, and Tyler, 9.

After a show choir concert attended by the entire school, Ashley was wheeled onto the stage. "When You Wish Upon A Star" was playing, and some fellow students, dressed in Mickey Mouse ears, gave her a crown and wand, declared her princess for the day, and a huge box of goodies was unloaded for her.

Audience members held up huge signs that read, "YOUR WISH HAS BEEN GRANTED!"

Her fellow students in the audience were as surprised as Ashley.

"It was so special that we could be a part of that in just the little ways like buying cookies, or paying to go to the womanless beauty review," said one student who was especially touched by the presentation.

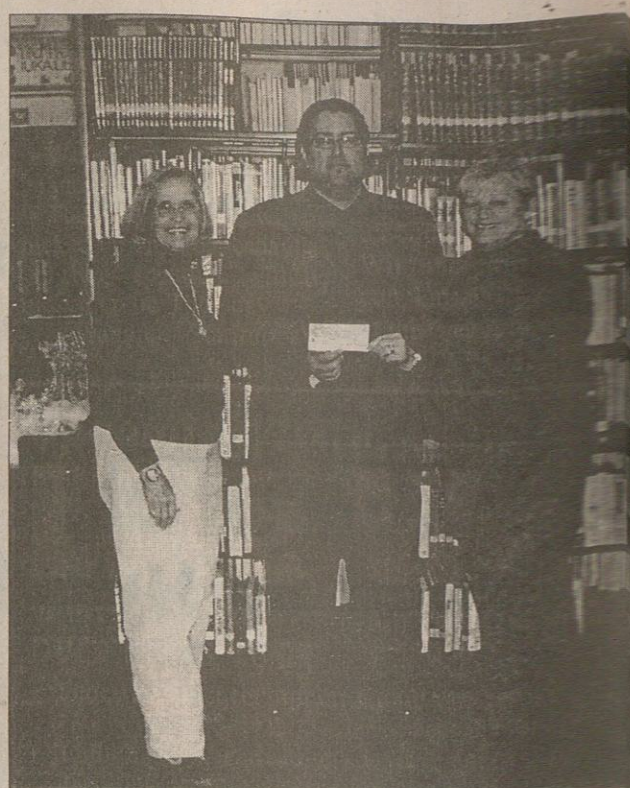

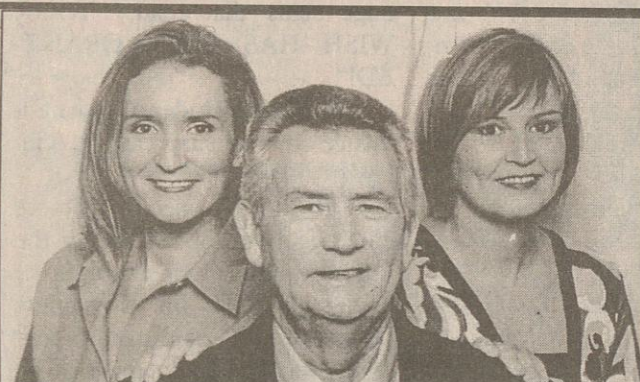

Astigmatism

Astigmatism is a vision condition in which images at all distances may be distorted or blurred. Astigmatism is not a disease. There is not particular time of life when it is most likely to occur, but sometimes it is present from birth. Most eyes are at least slightly astigmatic.

Astigmatism usually occurs when the shape of the front of the eye is more oval than round. Why this happens is not known, but some say it is an inherited condition or caused as the eye develops. Other theories blame such factors as poor lighting, incorrect posture or increased amounts of close work. Higher degrees of astigmatism may cause distorted or blurred vision. Slight degrees may cause headaches, fatigue and poor school work. Squinting, eye irritation and discomfort are also symptoms. The best way for astigmatism to be diagnosed is with a complete optometric exam. It is usually corrected using prescription eyeglasses.

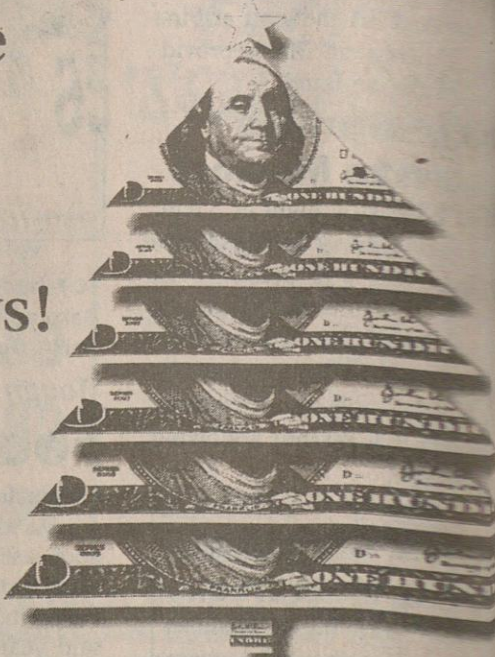

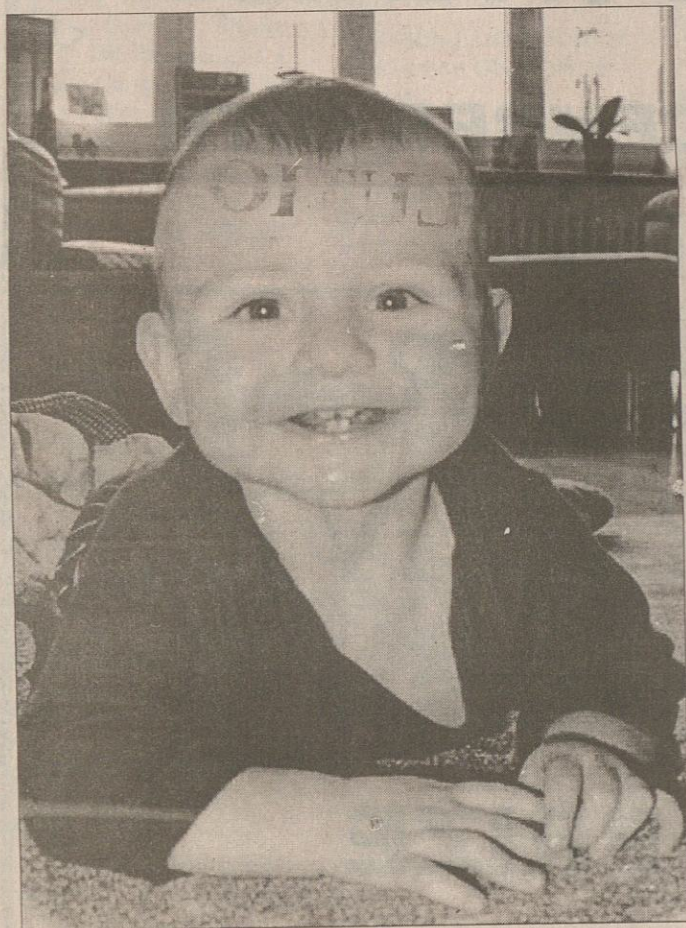

Letter To The Editor...

With all the education cuts, I was stunned to read that library funds and personnel have been cut. The Library is the last, and sometimes only, resort for many children whose parents don't have the resources to assist them with classroom work, and late afternoon and early evening are the only times they have access to computers and research materials.

Federal, state and local governments are constantly pushing our children for higher academic scores, and more and more of these kids become frustrated with school and end up in juvenile court. The Library offers not only educational materials but entertaining ones as well. Our local librarians have become supplemental teachers and in some cases, adolescent child minders. They do it with grace and good humor, teaching computer and research skills to children who aren't even aware they are being educated. They are also learning self control and manners, as the very nature of a Library demands

these social skills.

I have seen tables full of children waiting for their turn at a computer. They were READING while they were waiting. Think of the implications.

Our Library creates displays that are often works of art themselves, catching the eye the minute you walk in the door. A child's natural curiosity insures a bit of learning just by looking at the displays.

We can't afford to whittle down the hours and personnel of our Library without first fighting to keep them; they should instead be expanded. "It takes a village to raise a child." The Library has become the heartbeat of our village. These children to go school because they HAVE to, and are often looking for excuses to skip. They go to the Library because they WANT to. And I haven't even mentioned the adults who are there until closing, and groan aloud when the announcement is made that it's time to vacate the premises.
