Northeast Signs TC's Erin Williams

Northeast Mississippi Community College head softball coach Jody Long continued to fill out his 2010-11 signing class on Tuesday as Long inked Tishomingo County standout Erin Williams to the Lady Tiger softball program.

Williams signed to play for the Northeast softball program in 2010-11 at a ceremony at Tishomingo County High School in Iuka Tuesday morning.

"It has always been a dream to go to college and play softball," Williams said. "It feels pretty good."

Williams becomes the third signee for the Northeast softball program since the signing season opened up on Friday, January 15. West Union's Kimberly Jumper and Claire Wilkerson inked with the program on the first day high school athletes were allowed to sign.

Williams, a 5'7" right-handed pitcher, accumulated over 30 wins on the mound for St. Benedict of

Auburn-dale in Cordova, Tenn., before transferring to Tishomingo County for her senior season. Williams helped lead the Lady Eagles to back-to-back appearances in the Division II A State Championship game against Chattanooga Girls' Preparatory School (GPS) in Murfreesboro. During the 2009 season, St. Benedict forced GPS to a winner-take-all final game in the state tournament.

While at St. Benedict, Williams led the Lady Eagles to a 62-31 record in two years after transferring from Tishomingo County following her freshman year.

During the 2009 season, St. Benedict won seven of its last nine games with both losses coming to the

three-time defending state champion - Chattanooga Girls' Preparatory School.

On the mound is not the only addition that Williams adds to the Northeast program, the right-hander can also do damage at the plate.

"She (Williams) has quick hands with the bat," said Tishomingo County head softball coach Malcolm Brown. "She is going to help us tremendously this year. She throws in the high 50s (mph) and lower 60s and can really hit the ball."

Williams played her freshman year at Tishomingo County racking up a 2-1 record and one save while piecing together a 1.83 earn run average for the Lady Braves. In addition to her pitching, Williams batted an even .300 for Tishomingo County.

Flight Nurse Gail Hudson Reaches 1,000th Flight Milestone

Gail Hudson of Iuka, a flight nurse for the Corinth, Miss. Air Evac Lifeteam base, recently celebrated a major milestone in her career in the air ambulance industry - her 1,000th flight with Air Evac Lifeteam.

Hudson, who has been with the company since April, 2002, has been awarded her 1,000th mission "wings" in celebration of her achievement.

"I am very proud to be part of the Air Evac Lifeteam family," said Hudson. "A lot of people took

a chance on me, and by the grace of the Lord I have been able to touch 1,000 patients. Maybe by that same grace I have made a difference in their lives."

Hudson's story is one of perseverance and determination. Nearly nine years ago, just two weeks after getting word she would be hired to open Air-Evac 15, she contracted toxic shock syndrome, and her survival was in doubt. After spending three weeks comatose on a ventilator, overcoming blindness and hearing loss, and having parts of nine fingers and all ten toes amputated from necrosis, she not only survived but fulfilled her dream of becoming a flight nurse. "I didn't think I would ever work gain, let alone fly," she admitted. "When I woke up from the coma, Kevin Walls and Bruce Carson were pinning my flight wings on my pillow in the ICU."

Hudson graduated from nursing school in 1989 and has spent 19 years as a nurse working critical care and the emergency room.

"I am very proud to be part of a team that has a mission such as Air Evac's," said Hudson.

Hudson and her husband of 23 years, Larry, have two children: Beth

(18), a freshman in high school, and Jonathan (15), a sophomore. In his spare time Hudson spends time with his family, church, reading, and line dancing. She does volunteer work at local schools and her town of Iuka.

Homestead Exemption Filing

Homestead signing is underway and will continue until March 31, 2010. Anyone needing to file a homestead for the first time or file on a newly constructed house will need to do so during this time. The applicant will need a copy of the deed to the property, social security numbers for the applicant and the spouse, and vehicle tag numbers. Anyone that wishes to file an over 65 homestead exemption will need proof of their age such as a driver's license. Anyone that wishes to file a disability homestead exemption will need to make a change

to their homestead exemption and will need to bring their disability award letter. Anyone needing to make a change to their homestead such as becoming over 65 before January 1, 2010, loss of a spouse in 2009 either by death or divorce, or changing their place of residence also need to come in between January 1, 2010 and March 31, 2010. 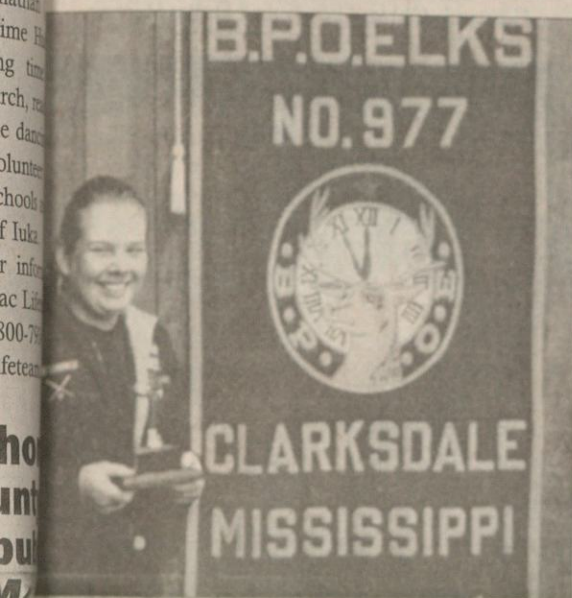

Master Gardener Classes Begin February 23rd

Do you want to be a Master Gardener? Applications are being accepted in Tishomingo County for anyone who wants to sharpen their horticultural skills and share that knowledge with others. Mississippi State University's Extension Service is conducting the Master Gardener training program on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. beginning February 23rd and ending April 1st at the Extension Office in the Courthouse in Iuka.

Enrollment will be limited to 25 participants, who, following training, are required to donate 40 volunteer hours to the County Extension Office. Training begins with instructions on the Master Gardener program concept, basic botany, and soils. Other training sessions include vegetables, ornamental plants, home fruit and nut production, and lawn care. Extension and Research professionals will be conducting the trainings over Interactive Video with the County Director on hand each night to help with the program.

A one-time fee of \$85 covers materials, refreshments, a 1-year membership in the Mississippi Master Gardener Association and a 1-year membership in the Tishomingo County Master Gardener Association. The deadline for application is February 10th. Pick up an

New Focus On Sun Protection

As we learn the overexposure to sunlight may do permanent damage to the eyes, demand for lenses that can protect eyes from ultraviolet (UV) light has grown dramatically.

Short-term overexposure to UV unquestionably causes a temporary inflammation of the front of the eye, resulting in redness, itching and a gritty feeling. However, of more concern is the growing evidence that long-term exposure to UV can contribute to cataract formation. There's also some evidence that it may contribute to some retinal disorders. Therefore, many optometrists (including yours truly) are advocating UV-protecting glasses.

Ideally, I would recommend lenses that block 100% of the UV rays below 390 nanometers wavelength. Realistically, though, even some of the good materials might transmit 1 or 2%. You can find this level of protection in both dark and clear lenses, prescription and nonprescription.

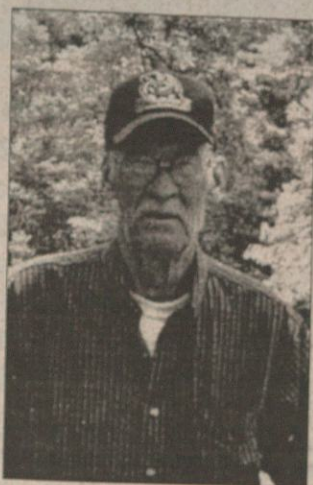
William Leroy Ledgewood, 82 years of age, died January 8, 2010 in Reno, Nevada with his family at his side.

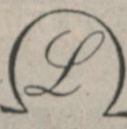
