Man Sentenced for 2007 Iuka Arson Cases

In a case dating back to a just 2007 fire in downtown Iuka, Travis Rabe has been sentenced to serve at least 15 years on several counts related to the fire and theft of All-American Sports, G&M Wholesale, and burglary and vandalism of Iuka Middle School.

The case was delayed for several years because Rabe was serving in the U. S. Army in Afghanistan, explained Assistant District Attorney Tyler Moss. The actual case was heard Janu-

ary 15th in Alcorn County, and the open plea was heard Monday afternoon in Iuka in front of Circuit Court Judge Jim Roberts, in a courtroom with several of Rabe's family present, and at least one of the victims. Though the judge noted Rabe's service to his country (Rabe was in his Army uniform), his apparently changed life since the 2007 crime spree, and several letters from family members pleading for the court's leniency in Rabe's sentencing, he said he felt he had no

choice but to hand down the sentence that mostly concurred with prosecutor recommendations.

In the fall 2007 burglary and larceny of G&M Wholesale in Iuka, Rabe was sentenced to seven years, two of which were suspended; with five left to serve. For the second degree arson charge, also of G&M Wholesale, he was sentenced to ten years, five suspended, and five years post-release supervision (PRS), to run consecutive to the first count.

In the August 2007 burglary and larceny of All American Sports, which was located at the corner of Main and Front Streets in an historic downtown building, Rabe was sentenced to seven years, with two suspended and five to serve, and that sentence will run concurrent with the G&M Wholesale counts. For the second degree arson of All American Sports, he was sentenced to ten years, five suspended and five to serve, to run concurrent with the previous sentences.

For a burglary and larceny of Iuka Middle School that same fall, Rabe was sentenced to seven years, all suspended, to run consecutive to all the previous charges.

Rabe was also ordered to pay restitution in the amount of \$351,354 to G&M, \$100,000 to owner of All American, Thomas Martin, and \$1,258 to Iuka Middle School.

Rabe was taken directly into custody of the Mississippi Department of Corrections.

Circuit Court Sentencing for January 2010 Term

In Tishomingo County Circuit Court on Monday and Tuesday, Judge Jim Roberts handed down sentencing in several Tishomingo County cases.

John Wesley Andrew, of Highway 100, was sentenced to fifteen years with MDOC for a count of kidnapping. Twelve years were suspended, and three must be served, along with five years of post-release supervision (PRS or probation). He was additionally ordered to pay \$2,100 in fines and court costs, register as a sex offender, and have no further contact with the victim.

Gaylon Lovelace, of County Road 982, Iuka, was sentenced to ten years with MDOC for a count of disposing of stolen property. He was given credit for time served, and the remaining sentence was suspended. He must serve three years PRS, and pay fines and court costs.

Debbie Johnson, of Fulton County, was sentenced to ten years, all suspended, for aggravated assault. She has to complete five years probation, pay fines, restitution to the victim, and court costs. She also ordered to have no contact with the victim or his/her family.

Tamara Gober, of Golden, was sentenced to 40 years with

MDOC, for two counts of sale of hydrocodone. All were suspended, providing she successfully completes one year of the ISP (house arrest) program, and five years PRS. She also must pay \$1,200 in fines and court costs.

Katrina Bohanna, of Johnson Street in Burnsville, was sentenced to ten years with MDOC for conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine. All were suspended and providing she successfully complete five years PRS, and pay fines and court costs.

Jason Ziarko, of 2nd Street in Belmont, was sentenced to nine years with MDOC for three counts of credit card fraud involving a family member's credit card. He was given credit for the 8-9 months he has been in custody, and the rest was suspended, providing he successfully completes four years PRS, pay \$4,440 in restitution to the victim, and pay fines and court costs.

Kristopher Walker, of CR 315 in Burnsville, was sentenced to fifteen years with MDOC for two counts of malicious mischief, and one count of possession of marijuana with intent to sell. All the sentence was suspended, providing he successfully completes four years PRS, pay \$4,440 in restitution to the victim, and pay fines and court costs.

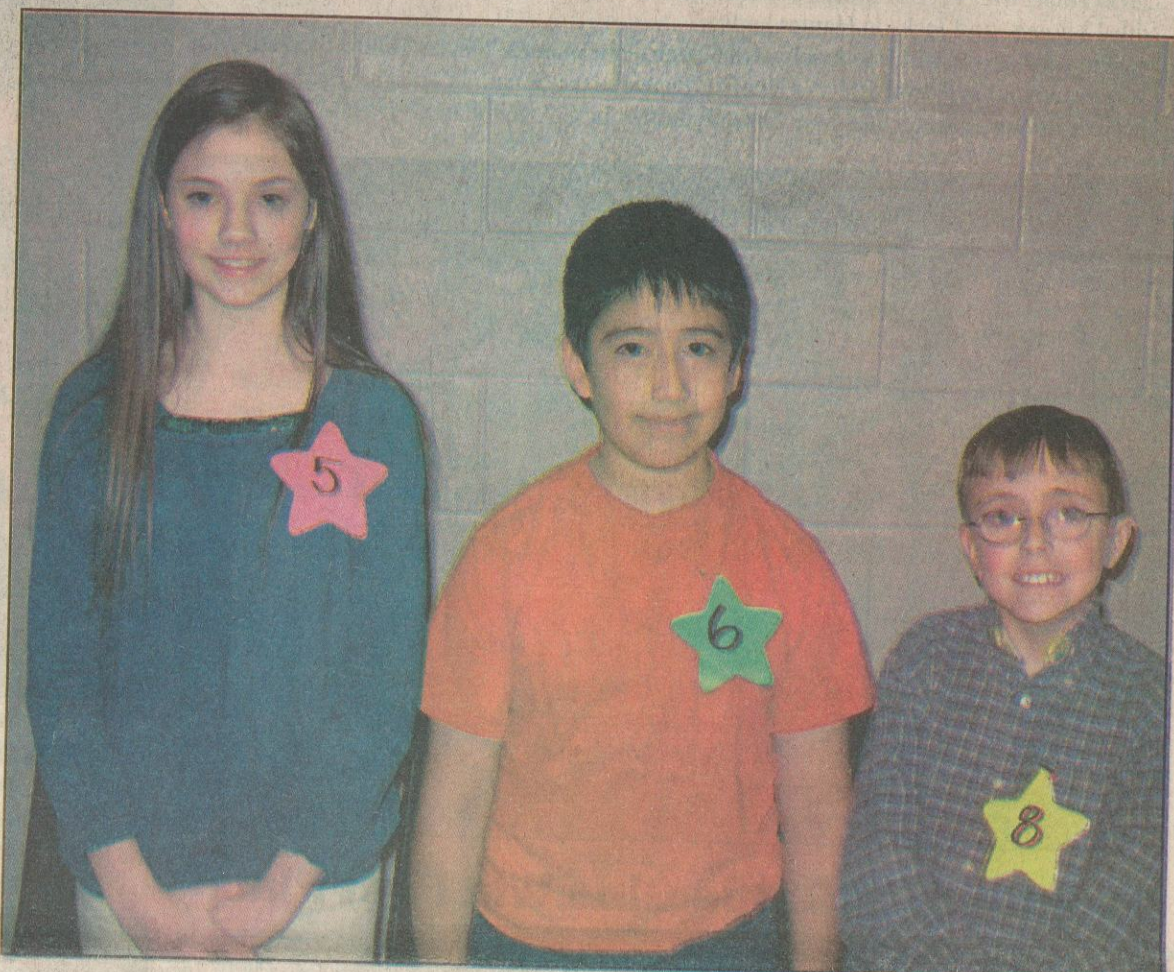

Beware Homemade Saline

Home made saline solutions made from salt tablets should not be used to rinse contact lenses after heat disinfection or before or after chemical disinfection. The only acceptable use for salt tablets is to prepare solutions to be used in the heat disinfection process, or as a rinse BEFORE heat disinfection. Evidently, contact lens wearers using home made saline solutions may be at higher risk of a rare but serious eye infection. A potential source of contamination is non-sterile distilled water often used to dissolve the salt tablets. Therefore, a solution made from it may also be contaminated.

If a contaminated solution is used before or during the heat disinfection process, the heat will kill the organism. But if the contaminated solution is used afterwards, the organism can get into the eye. Enzyme tablets used to remove protein deposits from the lenses should be dissolved only in commercially available sterile saline solution.

viding he successfully complete one year ISP and four years PRS, and pay \$800 in fines, plus court costs. This sentence runs concurrent with a sentence in Alcorn County.

January 20-22 these additional sentences were handed down by Circuit Court Judge Jim Pounds:

Derris L. Cortner, of 2nd Street in Iuka, was sentenced to 24 years with MDOC, for a count of possession of cocaine with intent to distribute. He was given credit for time served and the remaining sentence was suspended, providing he complete five years PRS, and pay fines and court costs.

Teresa Cook, in an open plea, was sentenced to eighteen years with MDOC for sale of hydrocodone. The sentence was suspended, providing she complete one year ISP, five years PRS, and pay fines and court costs.

Robert Smith, of Red Bay Road in Golden, was sentenced to twenty years with MDOC for possession of two or more precursors to manufacture methamphetamine. All were suspended,

providing he complete five years unsupervised probation, and pay fines and court costs.

Rodney Wigginton, of 1252 Hwy 25, Tishomingo, was sentenced to twenty years with MDOC for two counts of uttering a forgery. All were suspended, providing he complete five years PRS, and pay fines and court costs.

Lisa Deaton, of North Main Street in Iuka, was sentenced to twenty years with MDOC for one count of uttering a forgery and one count of burglary and larceny of a dwelling. Six-

teen years were suspended, and two terms of two years each are to be served currently. Afterwards, must successfully complete four years PRS, and pay fines and court costs. Shana Butler, of 1st Street in Burnsville, was sentenced to ten years for aggravated assault. She was suspended, providing she successfully complete five years PRS and pay fines and court costs.

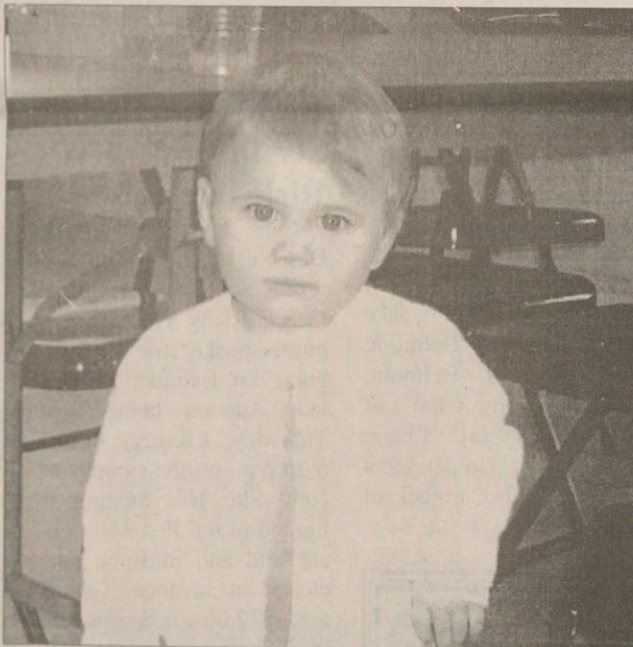

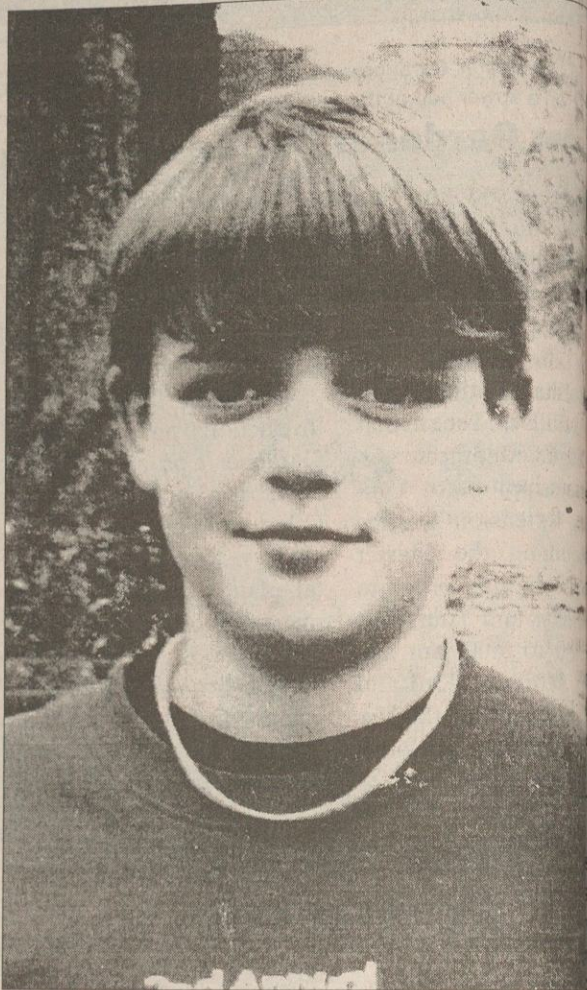

Army Spec. Keith C. Alexander has deployed to Iraq to serve in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.
