Bluebird Variety Store Burned Monday Evening

An Iuka business on the busiest corner in county caught fire and burned Monday evening.
Todd Williams, of Williams Service Station, called 911 to report smoke from the fire at 8:23 p.m. Monday, said Iuka Fire Chief Dan Grissom. Firefighters from Iuka, Midway, Harmony and Snowdown-Pleasant Hill departments responded, and initially tried to extinguish the fire which seemed to be in the space between the ceiling and roof. But then, the flaming ceiling collapsed, engulfing all merchandise and displays in the store.
"You could look in the windows, and see the store looking ok," said Deb Wren, owner of Bluebird Variety, who watched as

firefighters tried to save the building. "Then when the ceiling fell in, I knew we'd lost it all."
Grissom said he pulled his men out because the trusses in the ceiling looked like they were weakened, and the ceiling collapsed just minutes later. Iuka volunteer John Ray was pulled out as the ceiling collapsed on him. He suffered only minor scrapes, said Grissom.
Firefighters stayed on the scene until nearly midnight, and then came out again from about 1 a.m. to 2 a.m. to put out hot spots, said Grissom.
"We are just glad no one was hurt," said Bob-o Brown, whose father, Bob Brown, owns the building. They were on site Tuesday afternoon with the state arson investigator

and an insurance adjuster.
Initial investigation suggests that the fire started near a fuse box in the back of the store, said Wren at the site Tuesday afternoon.
Grissom said the cause of the fire is still under investigation.
Ironically, Wren had just left the store and was across the street in the Shell station visiting a friend. Another customer, Tim Steele, saw the smoke, and said to Wren, "I think your store's on fire."
The building was originally built in the late 1970s or early 80s as a convenience store by a Mr. Blasingame, said Brown. Wren rented the building and operated a variety/discount store for the past several years.

Former Burnsville Clerk Indicted on 7 Counts of Embezzlement

Special agents in the State Auditor's Office arrested Elesha Dailey today following an indictment by the Tishomingo County Grand Jury on seven counts of embezzlement. Dailey was the town clerk of Burnsville from 2004 - 2007 and served as deputy town clerk from 2002-2004.
The investigation conducted by the State Auditor's Office alleges Dailey embezzled over \$62,000. She has already repaid \$12,804.73. The alleged embezzlement took place from January 2004 - January 2007 and was initially discovered and reported to the State Auditor's Office by a CPA firm conducting the city's routine audit and Burnsville officials.
"The funds in this investigation were taken by Elesha Dailey through water payments while she was working as a clerk for the Town of Burnsville," said State Auditor Stacey Pickering. "This embezzlement represents a substantial sum of money to the City of Burnsville. Our special agents have prepared an excellent case, and I am confident that we will be successful in this case on behalf of the taxpayers of Burnsville."
Dailey has been released on a \$20,000 bond from Tishomingo County Jail, and is scheduled to appear March 4th in Tishomingo County Circuit Court for her arraignment, said Assistant District Attorney Arch Bullard. A date for the trial will be set at that time.

Belmont Girls Sweep District Tournament - Make 24-Win Streak into North Half

The Lady Cardinals rocked the District last week, and begin the North Half Tournament play this week with a Wednesday game against the Riverside Lady Bulldogs.
Winter weather has altered the schedule somewhat, but as of this time Wednesday morning, the Lady Cardinals are scheduled to play for a home crowd at 4 p.m. Tuesday, according to Coach Chris Higginbottom.
If they win the Riverside game, Belmont will host the North Half Tournament, and play Friday against Nettleton at 4 p.m.

District Tournament
In the District 1-3A tournament last week at Northeast Mississippi Community College, the Lady Cardinals beat Booneville 57-34 on Thursday, and then clinched the division and extended their 24 game winning streak with a win over Ripley, 60-52.
The Belmont machine used a 27-16 run in the fourth quarter to come back and beat Ripley for the championship. One key stat, said Coach Higginbottom, was that they were 18 of 23 on the free-throw line in the second half.
"One of our goals this year was to win the district tournament and these girls have worked hard

to accomplish it," said Higginbottom. "I consider it a total team effort and by winning the District, I hope we set the tone for the North Half."
The total team effort was no doubt helped along by typical performances by Anna Brooke Page in both the semifinal and championship games. Against Booneville, she had 19 points, and she had 22 against Ripley, whose defense managed to shut down her teammate, field goal powerhouse Zoe Hammock, who had only 3 points in the championship game.
Page is ranked number one in free throws in the state, with a 71 percent average. She also ranks

21st in the state in scoring. Hammock is ranked 9th in the state in three-pointers.
Higginbottom said Tuesday that the girls are ready and healthy, and looking forward to extending the 24-game winning streak. Morgan Pearson has been playing with a minor injury, but she managed 16 points in the district championship game.
Riverside, from Avon, Mississippi (in the Delta), of Division 3A-Region 4, shows an incomplete record of 9 wins, 10 losses, and they lost to South Delta, 52-61 last Saturday, according to the Mississippi High School Activities Association.

Rorie Wins Burnsville Special Election

John Robert Rorie swept the special election for a new alderman in Burnsville Tuesday.
Rorie, a former alderman, earned 149 votes to win over the other two candidates. Stevie Johnson had 55 votes, and there were 41 for Lisa Walker.
Turnout was as expected, considering the weather, said Town Clerk Jill Lee. The election was to fill the unexpired term of J. R. Blakney, who resigned his board position when he moved out of Burnsville.
The Burnsville Election Commission will validate the election results on Wednesday, and Rorie should be sworn in at an upcoming city board meeting.

Midway-Pleasant Hill Boil Water Notice Lifted

Effective last weekend, February 13th, the boil water notice was lifted for about 900 customers of the former Midway-Pleasant Hill water system.
Twenty-two samples of water taken from various places in the system came back with results within acceptable limits, according to the Mississippi State Department of Health, said Iuka Public Works Director Joshua Clingan on Tuesday.
Since before Christmas the affected customers have dealt

with water problems that included extremely low pressure, and sometimes no service at all, said some customers. The affected area included customers who are now provided water by the City of Iuka, which bought the former Midway-Pleasant Hill system about 15 years ago.

According to state standards, any time the water pressure in a system falls below a certain level, or there is a break in the line, all water must be boiled prior to use. Clingan said that a notice was placed with WTVA News in Tupelo, and posted at the Iuka City Hall, but no local media carried the notice.

Insight Into Eyesight

Dr. Phillip Gray Sensitive To Bright Light?

Some people squint to protect their eyes from too much light. Normal, healthy eyes can adjust to a range of brightness of well over a million to one, but just as skin color varies between individuals, so does the amount of protective pigment in the eye vary.

If you suffer from bright light that others seem comfortable with, don't suffer in silence! We often find that relief is obtained with relatively little density in what may appear to be a simple cosmetic eyeglass tint. Glasses with a 15 or 20% gradient tint may be all that is needed. Photo-sensitive lenses which darken in response to the sun's ultraviolet rays are also a remedy. Indoors, under office or factory fluorescent lighting, a 10% pink tint may work very well.

Squinting, however, may also be a sign of uncorrected astigmatism. We also see it among children who are becoming nearsighted. Don't let your child develop this habit if eyeglasses will cure the underlying problem.

Public Notice of Land Sale Request

Land Sale Request from Dennen Steel Corporation

TVA has received a request from Dennen Steel Corporation to purchase approximately 13.6 acres of TVA land located on Pickwick Reservoir, Tennessee-Tombigbee Mile 448.2 (right bank), Tishomingo County, Mississippi. The land is adjacent to the Yellow Creek Industrial Park and would be used for industrial purposes. The requested purpose is consistent with the property's current allocation for industrial use in the 2002 Pickwick Reservoir Land Management Plan.

The project would include disturbance and clearing of approximately six acres of vegetation; construction of a 50,000-square-foot manufacturing facility, an adjacent 2,500-square-foot office building, and access road; and installation of water and sewer service lines. The project would not require approval under Section 26a of the TVA Act.

TVA is interested in receiving comments on the potential for

the proposed action to affect the environment or historic properties, and to identify any other issues associated with this proposal. The comments will be used in reaching a decision concerning the proposed action. If this request is approved by the TVA Board of Directors, the property will be sold at public auction.

Any comments received, including names and addresses, will become part of the administrative record and will be available for public inspection. All written comments on this proposed action must be received on or before March 10, 2010, and should be directed to:

Through with Chew Week - Great American Spit Out February 14-20

More than 13 percent of Mississippi high school students use spit or chew tobacco according to the Youth Tobacco Survey. People mistakenly believe spitting or chewing tobacco isn't as bad for health as smoking.

Spitting and chewing tobacco products contain nicotine, which is very addictive, explains Roy Hart, director of the Mississippi Department of Health's Office of Tobacco. "Some spit tobacco products contain additives that increase the rate at which nicotine is absorbed by the body. Over time, the snuff user gradually becomes addicted to nicotine. Someone

who has chewed for a long time uses a stronger product and uses it more frequently to receive the same effect."

Oral cancers are highly associated with tobacco use. According to the American Dental Association, oral cancer strikes an estimated 34,360 Americans each year. In 2008, 104 Mississippians died from oral cancer.

Mississippi spit and chew tobacco users are urged to "quit spit" as part of "Through with Chew" week, a national effort to "snuff" out smokeless tobacco use. "Through with Chew" week is February 14 - 20 with Thursday, February 18 set aside as the "Great American Spit Out."

"Through with Chew"

week is a great time for Mississippians to stop using tobacco," said Faith Robinson, director of Mississippi Tobacco Free Coalition of Alcorn, Prentiss, Tippah, and Tishomingo Counties. "Quitting can be difficult, but there is plenty of help available. Mississippians who want to quit can contact the MSDH Quit Line at 1-800-QUIT-NOW to receive free counseling and medications, such as the patch or gum," said Robinson.

Tobacco use remains the single largest preventable cause of disease and premature death in the United States. "The best way to protect yourself from oral cancers is to stop using tobacco products immediately," said Robinson.

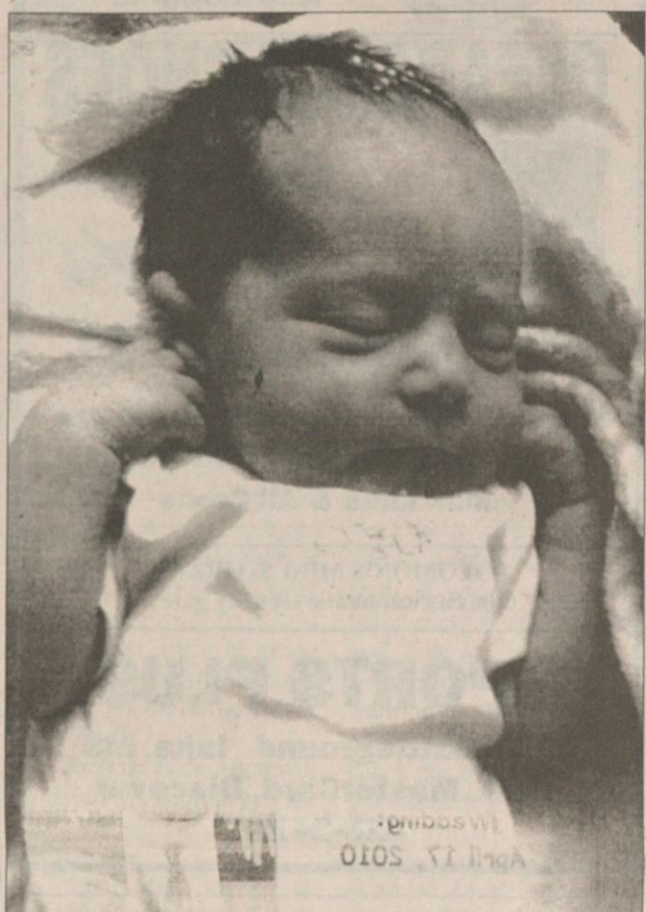

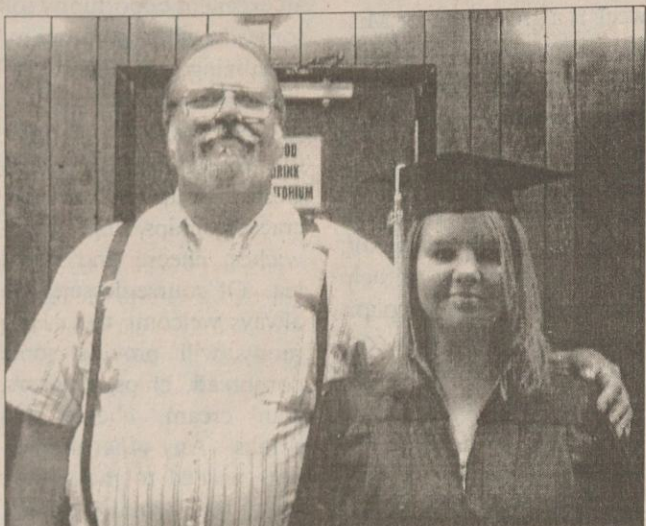

Working People Should Take Advantage of Earned Income Tax Credit

Every penny counts in today's economy, yet many working people are overlooking an important tax credit that could put up to \$5,600 or more in their pockets. The Earned Income Tax Credit, or EITC, can be the needed financial boost for working people hit by hard economic times.

Many people will qualify for EITC for the first time this year because their income declined, their marital status changed or they added children to their families. Families with three or more children get an extra boost with a larger credit this year.

But, IRS estimates that up to one in four eligible taxpayers could miss out because they don't check it out. Eligible taxpayers can get their EITC only if they file federal income tax returns – even if they are not otherwise required to file – and specifically claim the credit.

Anyone with income under \$48,000 from wages, self-employment or farming in 2009, should see if they qualify. Area residents can find more information at www.irs.gov, keyword: EITC. IRS's online EITC Assistant can help determine their eligibility and compute the amount of their credit.

Taxpayers also can get no-cost help computing their EITC and preparing their returns. Residents can locate a volunteer assistance site by calling the IRS at 1-800-906-9887.

To help accurately determine their EITC eligibility and prepare their returns, taxpayers should have:

- Photo identification
- Valid Social Security cards for the taxpayer,

spouse and dependents

- Birth dates for primary, secondary and dependents on the tax return
- Current year's tax package, if received
- Wage and earning statement(s) Form W-2, W-2G, 1099-R, from all employers
- Interest and dividend statements from banks (Forms 1099)
- A copy of last year's federal and state returns, if available
- Bank routing numbers and account numbers for direct deposit
- Other relevant information about income and expenses
- Total paid for day care
- Day care provider's identifying number.
