the position united. A job description will be compiled using an EMA guideline, said Board President James McDowell. "The main concern is for this position to most effectively serve the residents of the county," said McDowell.

New Collector for Justice Court

The board also approved allowing the Justice Court office to utilize a probation/collections service, called Judicial Corrections Services, Inc. to stay in contact with the many people who have not paid fines. The board said that the justice court reported that there are more than \$190,000 in outstanding fines, and that this company will collect the fines from the individuals, and charge the individuals the fee for collecting, so that there is no cost to the county. Reportedly, several cities in the county are already using the collection service.

The board agreed to review the service in six months to see if the process was beneficial to the county. Looking for Road Funds

The board passed a resolution to ask for any available state funds for repair of roads damaged by freezing weather this year. They planned to send the resolution and an estimated cost for the roads to the Legislature via Brandon Grissom, who was scheduled to take it to Jackson last Wednesday. The estimated amount needed, based on about 5 miles of road in each district that needed repair, was \$875,000, and included DBST patching. Bids Opened

The board accepted a low bid of \$28,300 from Rock Creek Construction in Belmont for removal of the remaining rubbish at the former shoe factory site. The rubbish is to be dumped on county owned property at the fairgrounds.

The board accepted a bid of \$1,500 for a surplus 1989 C70 truck with a tanker bed from Parson's Earthworks.



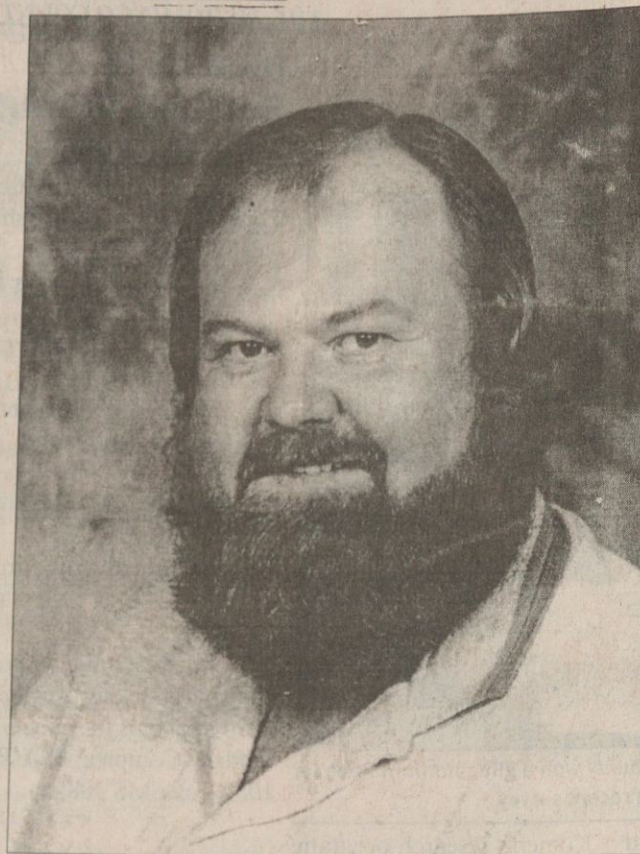

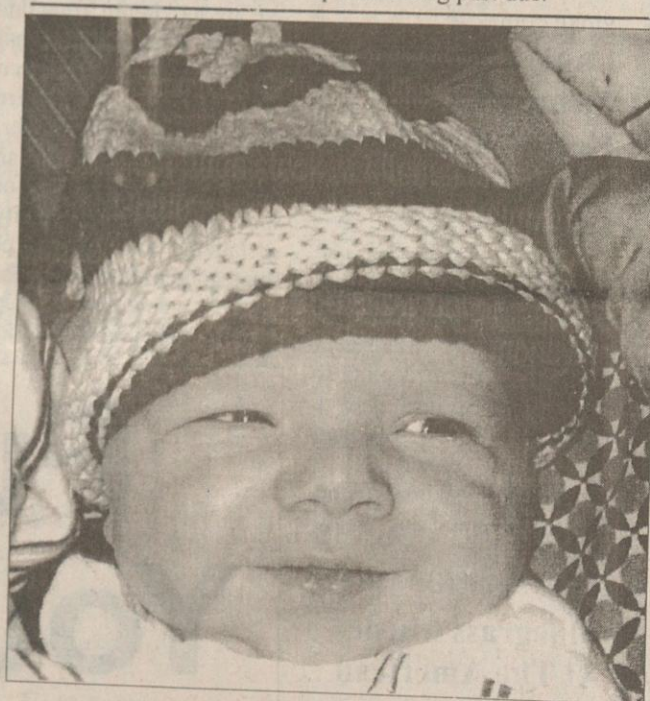

CHILD FIND PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN
AND DISTRICT CONFIDENTIALITY**

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is participating in an ongoing statewide effort to identify, locate, and evaluate children, birth through the age of twenty-one, who have a physical, mental, communicative and/or emotional disability. Early identification of children in need of special education experiences is most important to each child. Furthermore, this information gathered from contacts with parents and other agencies will be used to help determine present and future program needs as progress is made toward the goal of providing a free appropriate public education to all children with a disability.

Information which could identify an individual child will be maintained by this agency and will be provided to other agencies only in accord with the Family Rights and Privacy Act and EHA-B. As a parent, you are guaranteed the right to inspect any such information about your child and to challenge its accuracy. Access to this information is forbidden to any unauthorized person without informed consent.

Please contact Debbie Walker, Child Find Contact Person for the Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District, if you know any children who may have a disability by calling 423-3206 or writing her at the following address: Tishomingo County Schools, 1620 Paul Edmondson Drive, Iuka, MS

38852.

The Child Find implements identification, location, evaluation of children through twenty-one who have disabilities, regardless of the severity of the disability, who are of special education related services. The Find Person works with local Head Start Services, Department, and Health Agencies, as well as local education agencies, physicians, and individuals to identify and locate children out of school and in school who need of special services.

Once a referral is made, it is the responsibility of the Child Find Contact to insure that the Child Find to-Placement Process is followed. She will coordinate the Local Survey Committee at each school to insure these procedures are followed. The following activities described the process:

As a part of the Study, parents are invited to attend a Local Survey Committee Meeting to review a child's educational record and performance and determine a need for evaluation. Prior to evaluation, copies of the Parent Pamphlet and Pre-Safeguards are given to parents. District personnel explain these copies to parents and insure they understand the Pre-Safeguards. This will be reviewed at parent meeting.

Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is in an ongoing effort to identify, evaluate children age of twenty-five or older who may have a disability. The Department of Education has established a process to increase the number of students with Emotional/Intellectual Disabilities (EmD) to .55% of the total population. The 2008-2009 Profile Report identified that the district identified 15 total students as EmD.

It is an educational goal that is included in the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. It indicates a need for education and services. EmD does not mean temporary children at risk, who are only adjusted, unless it is an emotional problem. An Emotional problem involves the

- inappropriate types of behavior or feelings under normal circumstances;

It was far beyond shock and surprise to us, when thirteen months later, we found her words coming to pass as she left this earth and joined him in Heaven. How our hearts have grieved and how we miss them! They were a pillar of love and

support to us, showing us in their day-to-day lives to lean on God in good times, as well as trials and temptations. We know God is "I AM", and we trust and praise Him in all things. We know this life is not where it ends, because there is an even greater love story of Jesus on the cross. It is my prayer and was theirs that if you do not know Him as your personal Savior, you will ask him to come into your heart, to be the Lord of your life, and save you. Only that can give you peace that passes all understanding when life, as we know it, falls apart.

And now in conclusion to my own Cinderella love story, it is just a tiny portion of a larger picture including them; of how their stories molded and shaped mine. Come to think of it, our first bedroom suite was one they bought in Virginia included in the \$500.00 house full of furniture. I have so many memories, including the day at the courthouse when mine and Benny's mother's signed permission for us to get married, as I was not quite 18. Now, having been married to Benny, for almost 28 years, there have been more than one occasion when I've said, "I'm leaving," and he replied, "Let me get my coat, I'm coming with you." If there could really be a "Cinderella" story, may I say my life with Benny has been even better. I am thankful for a Godly mother, and for Alvis and Wanda's example of a Godly marriage.

Alvis and Wanda's love for one another and others left such a legacy that it truly lives on in so many things. When it snows, I think of them running through that snowstorm when she took his dare to make a snow angel. When I look in my son Jonathan's blue eyes, I see that twinkle from Alvis' blue eyes. And when I look at my husband, the love of

my life and my best friend, I am so thankful for that rainy Valentine's Day in 1939 where it all began....

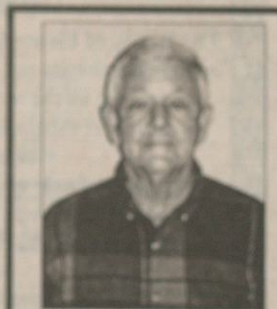

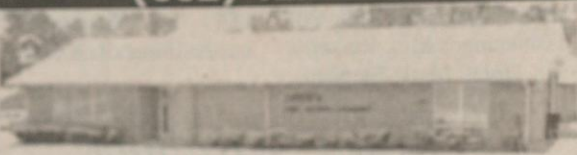
