## Brown's Hollow Residents Demand Action from Board on Deteriorating Road

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors met Monday morning with several residents of a lakeside subdivision who voiced concerns over the condition of their roads, and requested that the board do something about it.

At their regular first Monday meeting, the board listened to the concerns of eight residents of County Road 254, in the area known as Brown's Hollow, who said their road has deteriorated to the point of damaging their vehicles due to water leaks, drainage problems and wear and tear on the paving made worse than normal by this season's wet, cold weather.

First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom took the brunt of the comments and questions, since the road is in his district. He said he understood their frustration, and that the road was one of the first ones he paved after taking office as a newly elected supervisor in January 2008. He said it was "a learning experience" for him, and that he had crews out there as the meeting was going on starting to fix some of the problems.

Grissom did verify that the roads in question, County Road 254 and 454, are indeed county roads, and have been since 1972. There are about 25 houses on the road, which was developed as Wimble Hollow Subdivision originally.

As lakeside residents, they are in a part of the county with the highest property values, which the residents said meant they pay plenty of property taxes, entitling them to usable roads, maintained by the county. The residents said that former county

officials claimed the roads were private ones, and would not maintain them.

Some of the issues that Grissom and the rest of the board promised to address included the lack of proper ditches and other drainage devices to help keep the road from "being the main ditch" as residents reported it currently is.

The board also said they would check on the water leaks that the residents were reporting, since the Tishomingo County Water District is over that part of the former Eastport-Snowdown water system. The board first advised that the residents needed to contact their water board members, whom they elected, but then the board was advised by the clerk that actually, in the case of the Tishomingo County Water District, the Board of Supervisors appoints the members of that board.

After drainage and water leaks were addressed, Grissom said he would check into repairing or replacing the road, as funding became available. So far, the state has cut \$65,000 of the county's state aid road funding, and more funds may be subject to cuts with the lingering state budget crisis.

### Other business

In other business, the board accepted a bid of \$1,500 each for two surplus fire trucks in the Fourth District, for a total of \$3,000.

The board reviewed a job description for the combined 911/Fire Coordinator position, and agreed to look at it until the

## Burnsville to Move to New City Hall by April

manages purchase with no cost to town

Burnsville city officials will move to their new city hall next month, into a building completely paid for by grant

after 23 years in a 1,200-foot facility on Front Street. The city business will move into a new, larger facility at 1000 Avenue, behind Timbers and Auto.

With help from the North Tishomingo Planning and Development Commission, and Kevin Sweeney of the SDA Rural Development Commission, the town secured two grants to pay \$205,000 for the building.

This has cost the town nothing but a lot of paperwork," said David Nixon this week.

The town received a \$75,000 Municipalities Grant and a \$130,000 USDA Rural Development Community Facilities Grant, which have paid for the building. The town bought the 5,000-square-foot building from Sammy Darwin, but had approval from the Yellow

Creek Port Authority to use it for purposes other than industrial, explained Nixon.

State Representative, and Burnsville resident Lester "Bubba" Carpenter and Senator Eric Powell helped move the wheels of state government along on the small municipality grant. Burnsville had applied several years for the grant, and was finally successful.

"We have just outgrown this office," explained Nixon. "It has served us well, but we need the city offices to come up to modern standards. First impressions are everything, and I believe this will help Burnsville in economic development, and several other levels."

The town hall serves more than 1,100 residents of Burnsville and the surrounding area. It has offices for one full-time city clerk, and one part-time employee, and Burnsville's utilities ser-

## Holt House Catches Fire Sunday Morning

For the second time since December the home at 319 Eastport in Burnsville is surrounded with caution tape.

Early Sunday morning firefighters were summoned to the home by a 911 call reporting a fire.

This is the same home where 84-year-old John Holt was beat to death last December 22nd, with a still unknown weapon while he sat in his living room. No charges have been filed in the capital murder case, yet, but the investigation is ongoing, said Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock.

According to Burnsville Vol-

unteer Fire Department Chief Rickey Cummings, George McManus was living in the former Holt home, and called 911 from a passerby's cell phone, after going to the Burnsville Volunteer Fire Department, and finding no one on duty at 5:30 Sunday morning.

Also in the home were Patricia Hudson, and two young boys, all of whom were sleeping in the living room of the home, on a sofa and two recliners, according to Brian Grissom, Tishomingo County Fire Investigator.

No one was hurt in the fire, and the Mississippi State Fire/Arson investigator was on site Monday afternoon. He ruled

that the fire was accidental. The home's natural gas central heating unit was not being used, since the gas service was cut off, said Grissom. Apparently, the family was trying to heat the whole home with the oven, said Grissom Wednesday morning.

The home was heavily damaged, and fire fighters say that the fire may have started in the kitchen.

There were no operating smoke detectors in the home, said Cummings.

McManus is the brother of Linda Holt, John Holt's former daughter-in-law, who owns the house, said Cummings.

### Meeting with Jail Designer

The board met with G.G. Ferguson, of Ferguson and Associates, the architectural firm from Madison who is under contract with the board to design a new county jail. The county is under some pressure to provide jail facilities that meet court-ordered minimum requirements, and the board rejected all bids on the first

G&G design, since the bids came in much higher than the board expected.

Board members were advised by Ferguson of the next steps in the re-bid procedure, including:

1. Board of supervisors approve moving ahead with the redesign (immediately.)
2. Architect meets with sheriff to incorporate the sheriff's department into the design (immediately.)
3. Ferguson & Associates redesign (about one month.)
4. Ferguson & Associates to present updated Design and Cost Estimate to Board.
5. Board to approve new

After asking Ferguson in several different ways, the board was assured that the county would be billed no additional cost for the redesign. Ferguson assured them that the county would not get another bill from them until the county approved a bid and started construction.

"You only owe if you accept one of the bids," said Ferguson.

The board further asked if the bids would be open to any bidders, conventional or dome construction contrac-

tors, and Ferguson pointed out that the design they requested was for a partial dome construction and partial conventional construction.

"If it's not going to cost anything, I say go for it," said Supervisor Grissom, and the board voted 3-2 to go ahead with the redesign; Danny Ryan, Brandon Grissom and James McDowell voting For, and Nicky McRae and Steve Thorne Against.

Before the board adjourned, Third District Supervisor Danny Ryan asked the board to pass a resolution supporting efforts by the City of Iuka to seek

funding for the re-routing of traffic that currently uses the Spring Street crossing over the railroad tracks at McK-inney Crossing, where trains have collided often with flatbed trailers or trucks that get stuck on the tracks. The county and city are seeking help from Congressmen Travis Childers, Ryan said, and hoping to secure some stimulus or other federal funding to build a new at-grade crossing further east that will connect Highway 172/Quitman to Eastport/

## Census Takers Begin Hand Delivering Census Questionnaires

About 56,000 census workers began March 1st hand delivering 2010 Census questionnaires to roughly 12 million addresses across the nation, mostly in rural areas where people do not receive mail at the same location as their residence. Most of nation's 120 million households, about 90 percent of the U.S. population, should look for their 10-question forms to arrive by mail mid-March.

While the majority of areas covered by this operation are rural, the Census Bureau also is delivering forms to Gulf Coast areas affected by Hurricane Katrina to ensure everyone is included in the once-a-decade count. Census takers will deliver 2010 Census questionnaires directly to each residence in these areas, leaving a form packaged in a plastic bag at the home's main

door. Residents are encouraged to fill out and mail back their census forms — using the enclosed pre-paid envelope — as soon as possible.

"Regardless of whether your census form gets dropped off at your front door or you receive it within a few weeks in your mailbox, it's important that you fill it out and mail it back as soon as possible," said Census Bureau Director Robert M. Groves. "With only 10 questions, the 2010 Census should only take about 10 minutes to complete."

In 2000, about 72 percent of the population mailed back their census forms — halting a three-decade decline in the national mail participation rate. Mailing back the forms save taxpayers money, as it reduces the number of census takers that must go door-to-door to follow up with households that

failed to do so. The Census Bureau saves about \$85 million in operational costs for every percentage point increase in the national mail response rate.

"It costs us just 42 cents in a postage paid envelope when households mail back their 2010 Census forms," Groves said. "The Census Bureau will spend about \$25 per person if we have to go out and knock on the doors of households that don't mail them back."

The Census Bureau is urging everyone to take 10 minutes to fill out their census forms and mail them back. Starting March 22, visitors to the 2010 Census Web site will be able to track how well their communities are participating in the census on a daily basis. Communities will even be able to embed a Web-based tool on their own Web sites that automatically

updates the daily rates. An interactive Google-based map is now online that allows visitors to find out how well their communities did in the 2000 Census. The Census Bureau is challenging all communities to improve their 2000 mail participation rates in 2010.

All census responses are confidential. Answers are protected by law and cannot be shared with anyone. The Census Bureau takes extreme measures to protect the identity of individuals and businesses. By law, the Census Bureau cannot share respondents' individually identifiable answers with anyone, including tribal housing authorities, other federal agencies and law enforcement entities.



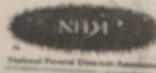

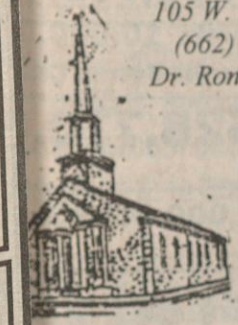
