## **Tri-State Foundation Funds** Two Scholarships for MSU

The Tri-State Educational Foundation has funded scholarships for students in the Enginneering and Veterinary Schools at Mississippi State University.

Tobacco use is the leading preventable cause

Mississipps youth in their peers about tobacco States, killing more than 400,000 people every year. Every day, more than 4,000 kids try their first cigarettes while another 1,000 kids become addicted smokers, one-third of whom will die prematurely as a result. Sixty-nine thousand Mississippi kids now under 18 will ultimately die prematurely from smoking. according to the Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids.

> "Mississippi's kids play a huge role in helping to reduce youth tobacco use

Senile Macular Degeneration

If detected early enough, senile macular degeneration, the leading cause of blindness in the elderly, can be treated very successfully in the eye specialist's office with a laser beam. Treatment delayed for longer than two weeks after the first symptoms appear reduces the success rate considerably, whereas treatment started earlier prevents progression of senile macular degeneration in over eighty percent of cases.

So important is early detection and treatment that it is a good idea for the elderly to check their vision on a daily basis for this potential problem.

The test can be quickly performed without anybody's help or any special equipment. Merely stare, one eye at a time (covering the other eye with your hand), at a long straight line, such as a door frame. If, to either eye, the line appears bent or twisted, or if a black spot gets in the way, tell your eye doctor about it right away.

### Letter To The Editor


