Belmont Girls Beat Ripley 60-55 for State Championship

The 2010 Lady Cardinals over Ripley in overtime at the Coliseum in Jackson Friday, March 5th, to bring home the first Division 3A state championship.

The Lady Cardinals were behind of the game, and with minutes left in regulation Belmont was 8 points down, the huge hometown crowd at the Coliseum was collectively cheering, especially after missed shots late in the fourth quarter.

In overtime, the girls rallied and pulled off their fifth win over the Ripley Lady to bring home the school's

first 3A "gold ball."

Belmont was reclassified 3A this year from years as a 2A school.

"These girls have dreamed the dream since they were girls," said Coach Chris Higginbottom in remarks at a community wide celebration Sunday afternoon. "They have seen the generations of champions before them, and worked hard all year to make this happen."

"They will always know they were a part of a championship effort," said Assistant Principal Andy Chumbley on Sunday. "They will know for the rest of their lives that they have the ability

to reach back within themselves and pull out that something extra to make a 'fourth quarter comeback' in whatever they attempt."

Higginbottom thanked the community, parents and administration for their support on Sunday.

"You can only put five people on the floor at a time in basketball, but ya'll have been the 'Sixth Man' who has made it all possible for us with your support."

The Lady Cardinals will begin Grand Slam championship play this Thursday night at 7 p.m. against Raymond, the 4A state champions.

Meth Arrests Lead to Iuka Burglary Arrests

After investigating persons involved in a February meth lab in Dennis, officials have arrested two people in connection with December burglaries in

February 7th, Tishomingo Sheriff's deputies recovered an active meth lab, at 179 Road 35 in Dennis, and arrested four people with methamphetamine-related charges. At the time, the investigation was ongoing, and names were not released.

Wednesday, Chief Deputy Jay Reynolds announced that the Swindle, 23, and Patricia Pitt, 38, were both charged with manufacturing methamphetamine.

Additionally, Jerry Brown, and Larry Dale Elrod, 30, were charged with possession of

two or more precursors to manufacture methamphetamine the same night.

At the scene of the arrest and in the ensuing investigation, authorities found items and gained information that lead to the arrest of James Tilley, 26, and a juvenile in connection with the burglaries of the Mark Farris home, and the Ronnie Tigner home in Iuka on December 29th and 30th, 2009, said Reynolds.

Tilley is still in custody in the Tishomingo County Jail, and the juvenile suspect has been processed through the juvenile court. All those arrested on February 7th have been released on bond and are awaiting grand jury and, then, Circuit Court.

Reynolds said he appreciates the assistance of the Iuka Police Department in the burglary investigation.

Tri-State Foundation Funds Two Scholarships for MSU

The Tri-State Educational Foundation has funded scholarships for students in the Engineering and Veterinary Schools at Mississippi State University.

Starting in the fall 2010 semester, undergraduates at the Bagley School of Engineering, and graduate/doctorate students at the College of Veterinary medicine will benefit from these two scholarships, each worth \$5,000 a year. The scholarships honor two local citizens, Cecil H. Brown and Dr. James Perkins.

Dr. Bob and Sylvia Ferguson, and other Tri-State Educational Foundation members chose to establish the two scholarships from the Foundation, which benefits

from the proceeds of Riverhills Bingo in Iuka. The Foundation already funds thousands of dollars in scholarships to students from Tishomingo County and the immediate area, as well.

The scholarships will be awarded by Mississippi State, who will work with the local donors to identify and prefer students from Tishomingo County, so eligible or potential students are encouraged to contact the Foundation for more information and to apply for the scholarships.

The Engineering scholarship is established by Nancy Brown, a board member with Tri-State Foundation, and will honor Cecil H. Brown, a graduate of Mississippi State University. Mr. Brown

served in the Navy prior to beginning his studies in agricultural engineering. He began his career in a teaching position working with veterans, and joined Tishomingo County Electric Power Association where he served as office manager. He retired in 1986. He has been very active in the community, with the Boy Scouts of America, 4-H Clubs, Rotary and the Iuka United Methodist Church. Tishomingo County Youth Participate in Kick Butts on March 24

On March 24, Mississippi youth in Tishomingo County will join kids in other counties and states to voice their opposition of Big Tobacco during 2010 Kick Butts Day.

Kick Butts Day is an annual nationwide initiative in which kids lead the effort to snuff out youth tobacco use. As part of this year's Kick Butts Day celebration, the Mississippi Tobacco-Free Coalition of Tishomingo County is working with area students

to help them educate their peers about tobacco companies' deceptive marketing practices.

"The tobacco companies call kids 'replacement smokers.' Kick Butts Day is an opportunity for participating youth to speak out and tell others they are tobacco-free," said Faith Robinson, Director of The Mississippi Tobacco-Free Coalition of Alcorn, Prentiss, Tippah, and Tishomingo Counties.

Tobacco use is the leading preventable cause

of death in the United States, killing more than 400,000 people every year. Every day, more than 4,000 kids try their first cigarettes while another 1,000 kids become addicted smokers, one-third of whom will die prematurely as a result. Sixty-nine thousand Mississippi kids now under 18 will ultimately die prematurely from smoking, according to the Campaign for Tobacco-Free Kids.

"Mississippi's kids play a huge role in helping to reduce youth tobacco use

in our state," said Roy Hart, Director of the Mississippi State Department of Health (MSDH) Office of Tobacco Control. "The kids participating in Kick Butts Day 2010 are sending two very important messages: they want the tobacco industry to stop targeting them with advertising and they want elected leaders to do more to protect them from tobacco."

Through MSDH's local tobacco-free coalitions, young advocates take part in a variety of tobacco

prevention activities throughout the school year including working with elected officials to develop policies that reduce youth tobacco use and exposure to secondhand smoke and educating their peers about the risks of tobacco use.

The Mississippi Tobacco-Free Coalition of Tishomingo County is a community-based coalition that works to prevent the initiation of tobacco use among youth, reduce exposure to secondhand smoke, promote tobacco

cessation activities throughout the school year including working with elected officials to develop policies that reduce youth tobacco use and exposure to secondhand smoke and educating their peers about the risks of tobacco use.

Insight Into Eyesight

Senile Macular Degeneration

If detected early enough, senile macular degeneration, the leading cause of blindness in the elderly, can be treated very successfully in the eye specialist's office with a laser beam. Treatment delayed for longer than two weeks after the first symptoms appear reduces the success rate considerably, whereas treatment started earlier prevents progression of senile macular degeneration in over eighty percent of cases.

So important is early detection and treatment that it is a good idea for the elderly to check their vision on a daily basis for this potential problem.

The test can be quickly performed without any body's help or any special equipment. Merely stare, one eye at a time (covering the other eye with your hand), at a long straight line, such as a door frame. If, to either eye, the line appears bent or twisted, or if a black spot gets in the way, tell your eye doctor about it right away.
