The State Fire Marshall is investigating a fire from last Friday at the Tri State in the Homestead shopping center.
At 10:35 p.m. Friday, Iuka Fire Department responded to a fire alarm indicating smoke at Battleground Drive, Suite 100, which houses Money Mart. This was reported by Iuka Fire Chief Brian Grissom.
Firefighters saw smoke in the building but were unable to contact the owner, said Grissom.
Firefighters forced entry, but didn't get in. The smoke was coming from the ventilation system, said Grissom, so they moved to the next unit, a vacant one, and entered there. The firefighter found a fire in a back room, some shelving, said Grissom.
The cause of the fire is still under investigation, said Grissom, and the state fire investigator is at the site with Grissom, the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Office.
There were some reports of a fire in another store in the shopping center, but Grissom said there was none. Iuka Police Department had no information on any investigation.

Supervisors Briefed on Economic Development Progress

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors met for their regular meeting Monday, and were briefed on economic development progress by Gary Matthews, Executive Director of the Tishomingo County Development Foundation.
Matthews regularly meets with the board to keep them apprised of current economic development status. Monday he provided a briefing of all current progress, including a couple unannounced projects (see the complete briefing inside.)
At this point, said Matthews, the county has no more empty, publically-owned buildings, which will make marketing the county even more challenging. The Foundation could use much more for a marketing budget to compete with the hundreds of other communities who are all trying to attract new and expanding industries.
Even so, the county currently has \$190 million in private investment, \$30 million in grants, and \$7.7 million in loans committed, as well as 1,008 jobs committed - in one of the most difficult economic times.

Sheriff Warns of Most Recent Scam Attempt

Chief Deputy Jamie Reynolds is warning area residents of another check scam with some county residents being approached.
Reynolds said that a company called Tampa Green Consultants has been sending out checks for \$125,000, telling the recipient they have won a \$125,000 prize. To claim the rest of the money, said Reynolds, they are directed to cash the check, keep \$1,000 and send back the rest to cover fees and taxes on the larger award.
These people are listed on the internet as a scam, assured Reynolds, and he advises residents to check out any such offers, because, "if it sounds too good to be true, it is too good to be true."

Sanders' Murder Conviction Upheld by Appeals Court

The Mississippi Court of Appeals upheld the murder conviction and life sentence of Keir D. Sanders in the 1985 murder of his grandmother, Elma Sanders, but his attorney says he is requesting a rehearing.
In 2008, Sanders was tried in Tishomingo County of Crawford. The same jury found him not guilty by reason of insanity in the murder of her grandfather and his grandfather, Crawford just moments before.
The court of appeals voted to deny Sanders' appeal. Sanders has issues with are jury could find Sanders and presumably sane, of his grandmother's murder, and during his grandfather's just moments before.
He will definitely ask for a rehearing with the Court of Appeals with the Mississippi Court of Indigent Appeals, said Sanders.
Sanders questioned the jury's verdicts, as well as a

variety of alleged errors during the trial. The appeal also argued that the overwhelming evidence indicated Sanders was insane when he committed the murders.
If a rehearing is denied, Aikens said he will take the appeal to the state Supreme Court.
Sanders is accused of shooting and bludgeoning his grandfather, W.D. Crawford, and then shooting his grandmother with a shotgun while she was still in her bed.
Gone for 20 Years
After the murders, he managed to stay on the run for twenty years, until he tried to file for disability in San Antonio, Texas in 2005, and had his true identity on his person to complete the paperwork, recalled Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock at the time he was brought back into custody.
Sanders was ordered during the 2008 Lee County trial by Circuit Court Judge Thomas Gardner to serve his life sentence before being committed for the insanity case, which is another item his attorney plans to contest in rehearing.
Sanders has been in custody at Rankin County and Parchman since the 2008 sentencing.

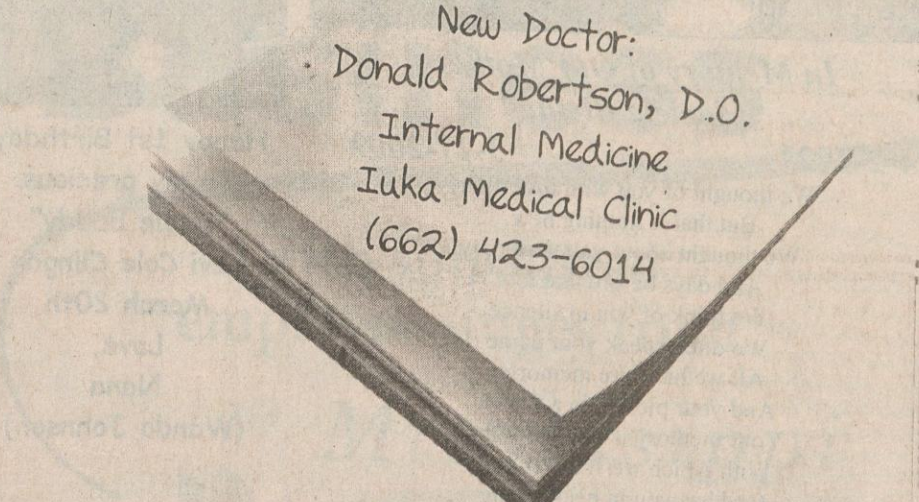

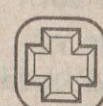
Iuka Medical Clinic welcomes new internal medicine physician Donald Robertson, D.O.

Insight Into Eyesight

Dr. Phillip Gray Rapid Vision Change

Something seems strange. Not long ago, you could read the license plate on the car in front of you clearly. Now, you have to squint through the blur to make out the numbers. When distance vision changes rapidly, in, say, two or four weeks, you should suspect a generalized or systemic cause. Drug side effects may be the problem; environmental poisons may be at work. More commonly, however, it is a consequence of diabetes.

When high blood sugar prevails in the body, the lens of the eye swells, shifting its focus towards myopia. Although diabetes always has other symptoms, the emotionally disturbing change in vision may blot out your consideration of these and send you, in a panic, to your eye doctor. Perhaps this is good because early detection of diabetes and correction of the high blood sugar will allow the eye to return to its normal state, making eyeglass changes unnecessary. Early detection will also add years to your life.

Tishomingo County Development Foundation Working on Award Winning Economic Development Projects

The Tishomingo County Development Foundation board of directors met at Tishomingo City Hall on Tuesday, March 9, 2010, to work on several ongoing and new economic development projects.

TCDF was honored this winter by Southern Business & Development magazine's naming of Tishomingo County as the "hottest market in the Southeastern United States for communities under 22,000 population." The honor was based on new and expanded projects over the past five years. Southern Business & Development is the recognized authority on economic development projects in the south.

In March, TCDF was notified that Tishomingo County has won the 2010 Corporate Investment and Community Impact Award from Trade & Industry Development magazine, a respected economic development journal that tracks projects in North America. Tishomingo County was selected from over 1,000 projects throughout North America.

Board members discussed the impact of new and expanded projects on Tishomingo County and the three state region. Legally binding commitments are in hand for over \$190,000,000 in new private investment, over \$30,000,000 in new grants, and almost \$8,000,000 in low interest loans. The loans will be repaid by industry. 1,008 new jobs are committed over the next couple of years.

New and expanded projects may take three to five years involved in negotiations, engineering, legal, environmental, financing, incentives, job training, procurement, and other issues before we know if a project will work. Then, if the project survives all the front end

issues, it may take another three to five years to reach full employment. Manufacturing jobs are much more complex and require much more training and skills than ever. Unskilled, semi-skilled, and even some skilled jobs have relocated to China, Mexico, and other low cost labor sources. Globalization of the economy also means that any project in the USA can be impacted at any time by events in far away nations.

ATK. Board members discussed the status of ATK. ATK has advertised for proposals on a new building and management is reviewing those proposals. A developer will finance the new 350,000 SF building and lease it to ATK. The selected proposal will be referred to corporate headquarters for a final decision. Over \$82,000,000 in incentives and financing are committed to the ATK expansion.

TAF. The TAF Alliance is working on a long term marketing strategy for the three county region. The TAF Alliance consists of Tishomingo, Alcorn, and Prentiss Counties and the Cities of Booneville, Corinth, and Iuka, and is modeled on the PUL Alliance.

Project Atlas. The funding, incentives, engineering, environmental, appraisal, surveying, and other issues have been worked out for Project Atlas. We are awaiting action by TVA on the land issue. Tishomingo County and Yellow Creek Port will develop the infrastructure and construct the 50,000 SF building for Project Atlas. Approximately \$4,200,000 is committed in grants and loans for this project. The loans will be repaid by the industry.

JAMCO. The JAMCO Furniture Industries expansion in Tishomingo and the

new plant in Belmont may be announced soon.

G&G Steel. G&G Steel has completed a temporary expansion while we work on funding for dock improvements at Tri-State Commerce Park. Approximately \$750,000 is needed to expand the dock. Expansion of the G&G Steel building is also planned.

Expansion Project. Another expansion project worth \$15,000,000 is also awaiting a TVA land decision. Approximately \$1,200,000 in grants and other incentives are committed to this project.

Bargain Center of the Mid-South. TCDF is working with the outlet, import, and closeout businesses in Belmont and Golden on a cooperative marketing effort. A preliminary flyer has been developed and additional marketing efforts will be discussed at a March 16 meeting at Belmont City Hall. The Belmont-Golden area has several outlet, import, and closeout businesses and is hoping to market itself as the "Bargain Capital of the Mid-South".

Membership Campaign. The board members discussed the membership campaign and the need for marketing funds. Other communities our size outspend us in marketing. Since the county no longer has any publicly owned industrial buildings, the community must ramp up its marketing efforts to compete with over 30,000 communities with privately owned buildings and industrial parks. Membership fees are used only for marketing. Board members appealed to the citizens to become involved in your community and join the Tishomingo County Development Foundation. Individual memberships are \$60 individuals, \$120 for businesses with ten or

fewer employees, \$280 for businesses with 11 to 50 employees, \$550 for businesses with 51 to 200 employees, and \$3,000 for businesses with over 201 employees and for banks. Membership fees are tax exempt. For the cost of a family meal or a magazine subscription, you can play an important role in bringing new jobs and private investment to Tishomingo County.
