G&G Steel Completes 280-ton Steel Lift Gate

A 280-ton lift gate bound for Lock 27 on the Mississippi River system near Granite City, Illinois, which is in the metro-St. Louis area, was completed and loaded onto a barge by one of Iuka's newest companies last Wednesday.

G&G Steel built it for the St. Louis District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, and the "big job" coincided with a visit by congressional staff members to the area touring the county's industries.

According to Brett Gist, President of G&G Steel, the fabricated structure is a lift

gate for Lock 27 on the Mississippi River system near Granite City, Illinois, which is in the metro-St. Louis area.

The steel structure is 115 feet long and 30 feet tall, and it was partially fabricated in G&G's Russellville, Alabama plant, and then completed and painted here at the new Iuka facility.

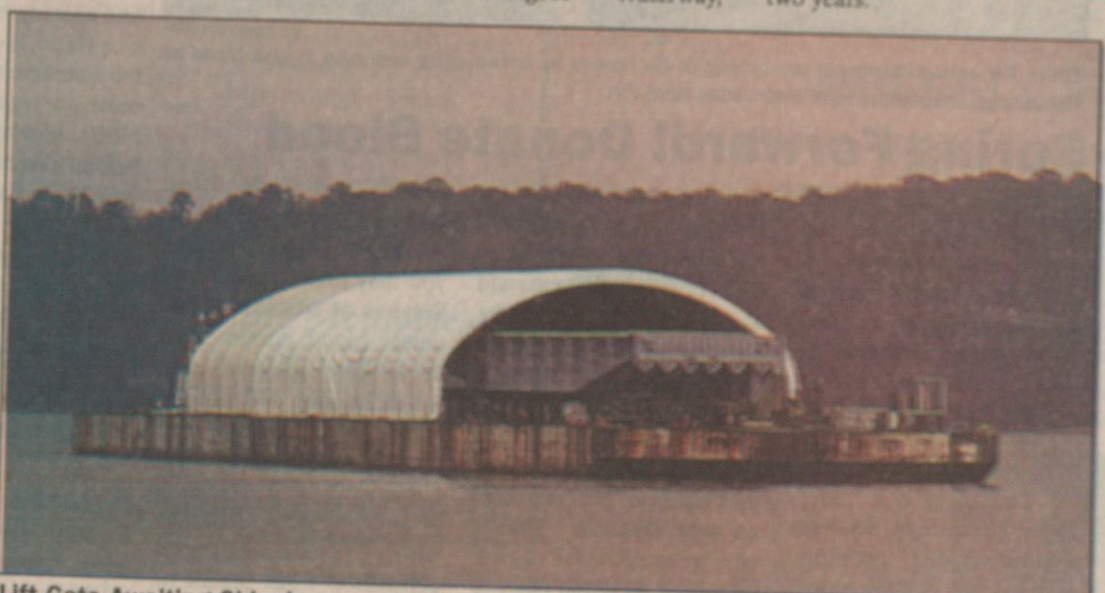
The piece was loaded onto a barge at the dock at Tri-State Commerce Park last Wednesday and is waiting there until mid April, for an identical piece to be completed and loaded before

they begin an 8-12 day journey, explained Gist. The barge will go down the Tennessee River, through Paducah, Kentucky, and on to the Mississippi River.

Lock 27 is on the Chain of Rocks canal, which bypasses an unnavigable portion of the Mississippi River.

G&G Steel is one of several companies who have located in the Iuka area to take advantage of its industrial access to the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway, and Tennessee River.

G&G is a family-owned company, and they employ 19 workers at the Iuka plant, and plan to have a total of 25-30 employees over the next two years.

Two Burglaries Early Sunday in Iuka

Two businesses were burglarized early Sunday morning in Iuka.

According to Circle L Restaurant owners Cindy & Michael, someone tore through the ventilation system to break into the restaurant at 708 E. Main around 1 a.m. Sunday morning.

"There was only about \$5 in cash," said Cindy Lynch. "We don't even keep cash here."

The damage to the ventilation system will cost hundreds of dollars to repair, though, and probably won't be covered by the liability insurance they have on the rented facility. They have only been in business three years, said Lynch.

Police think the same suspect probably broke into Handy Sandy convenience store, just a door to Circle L, the same place where he was caught on camera. The suspect did not take an undisclosed amount of cash from a safe at Handy Sandy,

said Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer.

Handy Sandy owner Alex Mohamed voiced frustration about the second break-in at his store in as many months. Several weeks ago, someone broke out a window and stole an undisclosed, but lesser amount that night, he said. Since then, he has had bars installed on the window, but Sunday morning, the thieves broke in, or at least escaped, by tearing out an exhaust fan, and going through the ceiling, said Chief Stringer.

Handy Sandy has an alarm system, but police said that they never got an alarm call to respond to. The entire event was captured on Mohamed's video surveillance system.

Stringer said he urges all businesses to keep no cash on the premises at any time.

Iuka Police Search for Suspect in Recent Burglaries

Iuka Police have issued arrest warrants for a suspect who they believe may be responsible for several recent Iuka burglaries.

Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer said that they are looking for Chris Martin, who is on probation for previous burglary and larceny convictions. Several homes have been searched in relation to the pursuit, and stolen items were recovered, but Martin

himself is still on the run, said Stringer.

With the help of the Booneville Police Department they were able to recover guns stolen from a local resident, said Stringer.

The chief added that other local burglary cases believed to be connected to Martin are being prepared for grand jury review.

Former Supervisor Killed in Wreck

Last Wednesday, former Tishomingo County Supervisor David Sanders was killed when his vehicle collided with a log truck just north of Belmont on Highway 25.

According to Tishomingo County Coroner Mack Wilemon, Sanders was killed instantly.

At 2:45 p.m. March 24th, both the log truck and Sanders were northbound near the Belmont city limits, said Wilemon. The truck was stopped, waiting for a vehicle turning left into its residence. The truck, owned by Brown Logging of Golden, and driven by Brack Loden, of Tremont, had 16 feet of logs hanging off the end of the truck. The driver was not injured, said Wilemon.

David Hughes Sanders was born February 28, 1946 to Talmadge and Helen Sanders of Iuka, Mississippi.

On November 20, 1964 he married Rebecca Terry, and they raised one son, Stephen. They have three grandchildren; Jayden, David Ryan, and Alys-

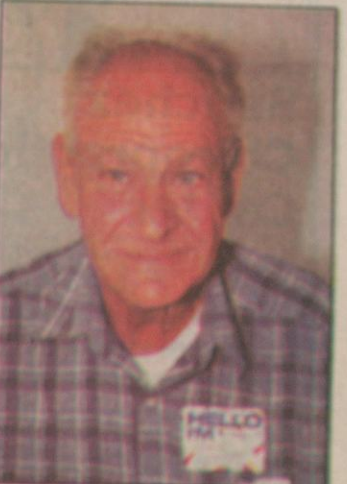
sa. These children were David's pride and joy.

David attended Gospel Lighthouse Pentecostal Church of Tishomingo.

In 1996 he was elected to the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors representing the Fourth District of Tishomingo County. He was reelected to two more consecutive terms, serving a total of twelve years.

He was born into a family that was no stranger to hard work. At a young age he began helping on the family farm and dairy business. Then at the age of sixteen, he opened his own business, the Barnette Store on Eastport Road in Iuka. The business grew and in 1966 he built a new building at the corner of Eastport and Snowdown Roads and changed to the Eastside Superette, which would later change to the Corner Store. A long list of people worked for him there, to name a few; Jimmy McVay, Lanny Borden, Bobby Southward, Calvin Southward, Benny Smith, White Williams and Fred Crowell.

After running the store for

around fifteen years he moved from the grocery business into small engine repair, running Tishomingo Small Engine Repair. In 1983 he received the Outstanding Saw Salesman of the Year by the Whitehead Equipment Company of Tupelo.

When the Tennessee-Tombigbee was being built, he worked on it. He worked as a night

Those Before Us...

If you live in north Mississippi or anywhere nearby you should know there is a large presence of those who lived here before us. We speak native words everyday like, Mississippi, Tishomingo, Iuka, Itawamba, Cherokee and many others. In 1250 AD There was a Indian city on the Mississippi river larger than London, England with a population that may have reached 40,000. Think about getting food and water to that many people without a Wal-Mart. They built mounds called navels the chief maybe lived on top and some were used for burial.

We have two of them on the Natchez Trace in the forks of the creeks at Mingo.

As a kid I watched the landowner farm cotton over the center of one of them and corn on the other half.

First European contact was in 1540 by Desoto, at that time he estimated there was about 15,000 in the area. It was another 150 years

before they saw another white man.

In the 1700's the Chickasaw were centered at the headwaters of the Tombigbee River in north Mississippi. I think the men had it pretty well figured out, the women worked the fields, gardens, collected fruit and nuts, supervised the slaves that had been captured. All the men had to do was hunt, fish and fight battles.

But of course the lineage followed the woman, so I would be a Rutherford and not a Bolton. Each town had a chief or king that was called Minko. Minkos didn't speak at counsel meetings but delegated to his advisor the "Tishu-minko."

They got their first horses in the 1700's when

the settlers started showing up. The Indians stopped the French; if not for them the South would be speaking French like our Quebec Canadian neighbor.

A Nashville council in 1792 said that America did not want the land of the red man, that was a lie. In 1801 the Chickasaw signed to let a road run thru their homeland, the Natchez Trace.

In 1809 there were already 5,000 squatters on Chickasaw land. Mississippi became the 20th state in 1817 and the Chickasaw owned about 6 million acres in the north of the state. Our great government passed the Indian Removal Act in 1830, and in 1832 the Chickasaw signed to sell out in Mississippi for \$3,046,000. If I remember right they never got all the money.

So in 1837 about 4,000 went west, the last finished moving in 1850. Their new government was located in Tishomingo, Oklahoma. I visited the other Tishomingo area because my maternal grandparents moved to that area in the early 1900's. My mom was born there in 1910. Grandmother used to tell stories about the Indians and also how the wind blew all time. She said it would hold your hat up against the wall while they ate lunch.

Some say Tishomingo died on the Trail of Tears in 1838 to 1841, in Little Rock others say he died in Oklahoma. He would have been about 105 years old. I mentioned Tishu-minko early in this story, that is where Tishomingo came from.

Iuka came from the chief Ish-taki-yu-ka-tubbe; look in the middle and find Iuka.

So look around; the other early Americans left tracks way before we got here in Mechasipi.

watchman for the City of Iuka, and as a night watchman at the Iuka Shirt Factory. He worked at Heil and ran his own cleaning service cleaning Heil, the Tishomingo Branch of First American National Bank, and various other businesses. He also opened and ran the Country Store on Highway 30 outside of Tishomingo. Many of these jobs he worked simultaneously, working sixteen to twenty hours a day. He always said, "You can find a job if you're willing to work."

While Supervisor, he served on the Northeast Mississippi Community Service Board. In 1997 and 1999, he was awarded the Outstanding Citizen Award by the Tishomingo Chamber of Commerce, and served as a Grand Marshal of the Tishomingo Christmas Parade.

During the later part of his life he faced many health problems and underwent several major surgeries, if these problems slowed him

down at all, it was temporary, even after he remained active in the community going to church, helping people who were sick in any way that he could.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Madge and Helen Sanders; grandparents, Doshie Sanders and Anna Barnette; and Anna Barnette's brothers; Bobby Sanders, Paul Clayton Sanders, one sister, Lois Green, is survived by his wife, Becca Sanders, one son, phen and his wife, three grandchildren; sisters; Anna Mae Sanders, Betty Shields and Sanders, and many and nephews.

Disposable contact lenses have not been on the market very long, yet eye specialists are already noticing a disturbing trend. More and more patients are risking the health of their eyes by trying to squeeze a few extra days - sometimes even weeks - out of the one week recommended usage of the lenses in order to save money.

Used by an estimated 10 percent of patients, disposable lenses are made to be worn for a week then thrown away. What is happening instead is that some patients are bypassing their doctor's instructions about proper care and length of usage.

Disposable contact lenses, if used according to instructions, insure cleanliness and eliminate the tank of solutions, cleaning and sterilizing. There is a secure feeling of having that extra sterile packed replacement handy when you need them. However, trying to stretch out extra days of wear in order to save a few dollars, defeats the whole purpose. It's a surefire recipe for eye infection.

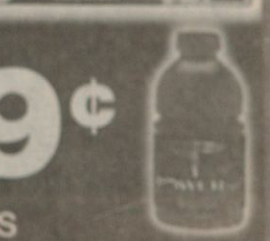

Shiloh National Military Park Offers In-Depth Battlefield Hikes

Shiloh National Military Park will offer in-depth hikes on Shiloh battlefield on the actual dates of the historic battle, April 6th, 7th, and 8th, 2010.

"We are excited to be able to offer visitors to the park the opportunity to participate in detailed battlefield hikes on the actual ground where the events occurred at the actual times of the day they occurred, 148 years after the fact," Harrell stated.

of this special commemorative anniversary event," added Harrell. For the visitors who participate in the anniversary hikes, the park entrance fee of \$3.00 per person and \$5.00 per family will be charged. The entrance fee is valid for seven days.

Participation in the historical hikes is by registration only. To participate in one or more of the hikes, please contact Park Rangers Joe Davis, Charlie Spearman, or Chris Mekow at

Registered participants should meet the guides at the appointed sites for each hike and are encouraged to wear appropriate clothing and footwear as some terrain will be difficult. 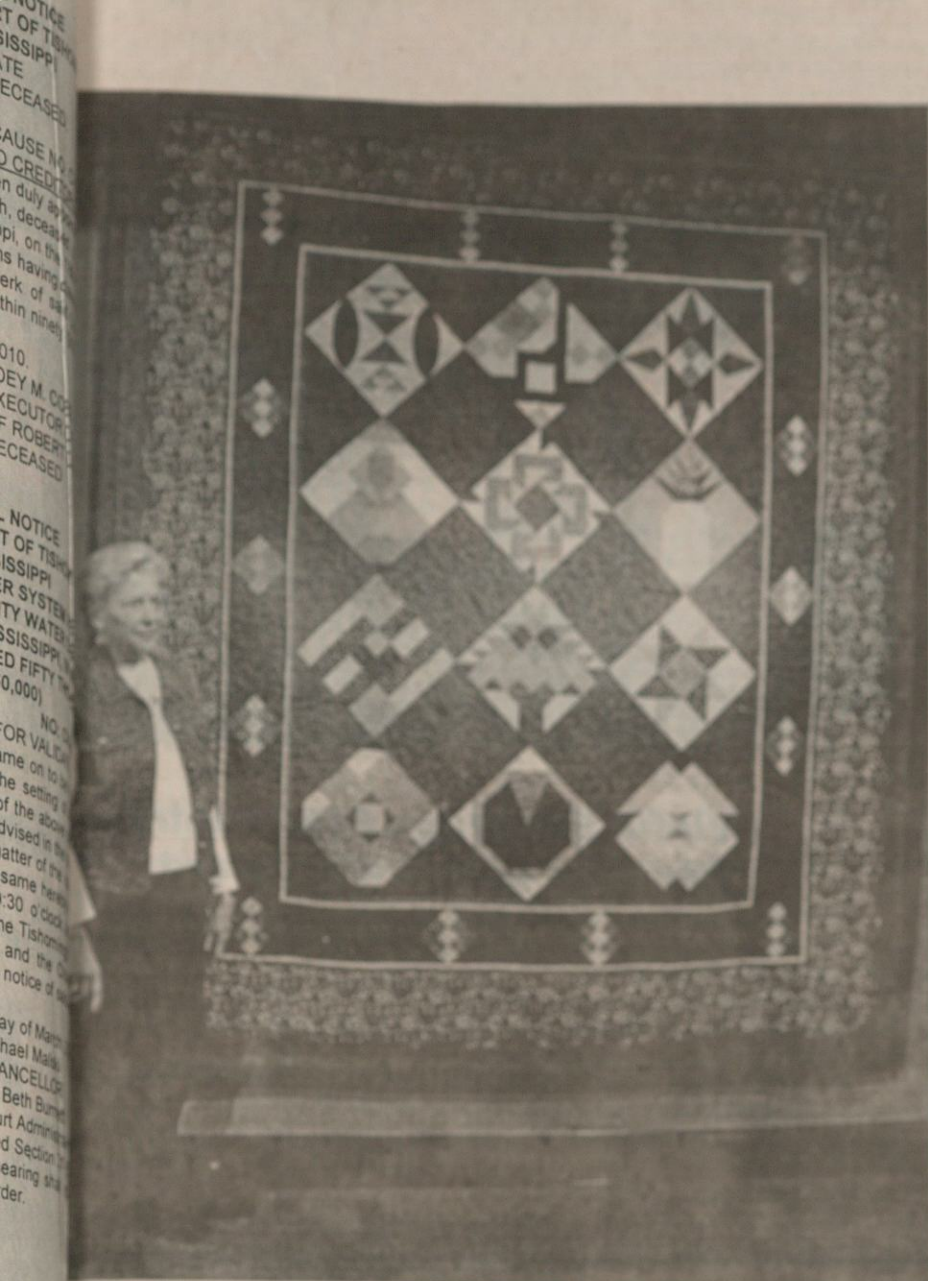

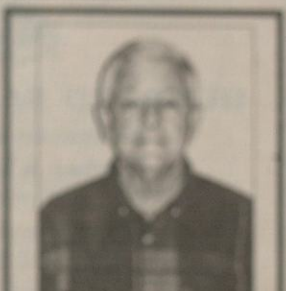
