Water Inundates County, Damages Roads

For the second weekend in a row, stormy spring weather ravaged north Mississippi, with numerous thunderstorms and heavy rainfall Sunday afternoon that caused flash flood conditions.

Though Tishomingo County recorded no storm-related deaths, there were some close calls for a few people, and several county roads are still impassable.

Perhaps one of the most dramatically damaged areas is County Road 321, where it crosses Martin Branch, a barely noticeable creek most days. On Sunday, floodwaters in the branch tore away culverts and a good part of the road surface. County Road 321, also called the TVA Access Road, which runs from Highway 25 to the Tri-State Commerce Park/Coleman Park area. A 2003 Ford Windstar went into the gap created by the rushing water.

The passengers got out safely, according to first responders who were at the scene, before the current carried the van down the creek, where it came to settle about 400 feet from the road. It was stopped by some fallen trees there, said wrecker operator Bill Timbes, who got the vehicle out Tuesday.

The people in the van were from Collierville, and were apparently going to visit a relative who lives by Coleman Park.

But when Timbes and his crew went to get the van out Tuesday, it was mostly occupied by snakes.

"We saw several small ones," said Timbes, who had to take a bottom boat down to the van to connect cables to it. "And then I saw one, big as a log, come after that - we thought it was a alligator! I didn't think snakes could get that big. We had been over that van...[connecting cables to tow it]."

First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom said Wednesday morning that preliminary estimates on fixing that road alone are \$350,000 to \$400,000.

Timbes' crews also helped rescue a mother and two preschool-age children from a car, which they had tried to cross a road covered in water. By the time rescuers arrived the water was up to their waists. That was County Road 944, north of Highway 72 in Burnsville.

"If they had left the car, or if the car had been carried off the road, they would have really been in trouble," said Timbes.

Slower damage came to the Burnsville Pentecostal Church, when the waters started to rise

Sunday afternoon and eventually flooded both that church and the family life center. Services were already complete, and when congregation members came back after lunch to retrieve cars from the lot, water was already coming in the church. Tuesday, the congregation was salvaging furniture, setting it outside in the parking lot.

Several homes in the area surrounding that church were also flooded, with many vehicles, and yard buildings, tools, and vehicles damaged by the flood waters.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors heard damage reports from county Emergency Management agent Bill Strickland and Floodplains Assistant Hannah Ham on Monday, and they announced a long list of roads that had been flooded. Photo documentation and a preliminary estimate on damage was being prepared to send to state MEMA officials, to see what help the county might get for road repairs.

Lieutenant Governor Phil Bryant was scheduled to tour the area Wednesday afternoon and survey the damage, according to Representative Lester "Bubba" Carpenter.

Grissom said he and his crews started clearing roads around noon on Sunday, and worked until nearly 11 p.m. clearing fallen trees, putting up barricades at dangerous areas, and pushing mud off roads. Second District Supervisor Nicky McRae reported several damaged areas, as well, and went to work on road problems directly after the meeting, and Third District Supervisor Danny Ryan was not even at the meeting; he was out working problems in his district the board reported.

Related Issue

A lady came to the board Monday to ask the supervisors to establish some guidelines about pets in emergency shelters. Apparently, there were dozens of dogs at the county courthouse on Saturday, where several elderly residents were taking shelter. The dogs were smelly, and large, and scared some of the people taking shelter, said Pauline Cox.

The Board stated that animals would not be welcome in the county storm shelters, and encouraged people to take care of their animals in some other way during stormy weather, to allow for maximum human use of the shelters.

Resource Officer Catches Two Stealing Car Stereos at TCHS

During a routine patrol of TCHS parking lot last week, school resource officer apprehended two people allegedly stealing stereos from student's cars.

According to Ryan Glover, who works the school campuses in the north part of the county as part of the School Resource Officer program, he was doing a routine patrol of the student lot Thursday around 11:45 a.m. when he noticed a man walking around cars.

"It looked like he was trying to avoid me seeing him, ducking behind cars," explained Glover, who was in his Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department patrol car at the time. Glover approached the suspect, who explained he was "waiting on his friend."

Glover was suspicious of a man on the suspect's hand, and handcuffed him while waiting for

backup from the sheriff's department. The suspect led Glover to a woman who was waiting for him in a nearby car, who told the same "meeting the cousin" story, said Glover.

Glover said he could see tools in the floorboard of the car, which

the suspects may have used to break into several cars. At that time, said Glover, he arrested them both for trespassing, and when students came out a few minutes later, some of them noticed their cars had been burglarized, with CD players and an MP3 player.

Additional review of the school's video surveillance system revealed the couple had been busy in the parking lot all morning, said Glover.

Charged with trespassing and burglary of a vehicle are Kali Dawn Mangrum, 31, a black fe-

male from Florence, and Deme-trius Wayne Robinson, 29, a black male of Sheffield. Both have been released on bond from the Tishomingo county jail.

"We are extremely proud of Officer Glover and the great things he does here in his day-to-day work, as well as him being available for when unexpected situations like this arise," said TCHS Principal Eddie Britton. "We would be hard pressed to do without him. This provides an extra measure of safety for our students, and student safety is one of our top priorities."

Resource Officer Program May Be Victim of Budget Cuts

In recent county board meetings, school resource officers Ryan Glover and Jeff Sparks, who patrols campuses in the southern end of the county, have met with supervisors with hat in hand.

They explained in the April 4th meeting that the Tishomingo County School District had given them notice that no funding for their positions would be available beginning in May. The school district had sent them to

the county to see if the county wanted to pick up the funding for the three-year old program.

The school district had been paying the two officers with funds from a federal "Title 6" grant, but the funds have apparently been lost due to the county's poverty level going below 20 percent.

"Most school districts have resource officers through the county sheriff's department, so that's why we went to them to pick up these two officers," explained Malcolm Kuykendall.

Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock, for whom both Sparks and Glover also work as deputies, was present at the April 4th meeting. He explained that the sheriff's department had no funds to support the resource officer program.

At this week's meeting, the board stated that they are still looking for funding, and that they recognize the value of having the presence of lawmen on our school's campuses.

Last Friday night, April 30th, fire fighters from the Tishomingo and Paden Volunteers fought and contained a fire in apartments on Main Street in Tishomingo.

According to Tishomingo County Fire Investigator Brian Grissom, firefighters managed to contain a fire to apartments 3 and 4 in the apartments at 1252 Main. No one was hurt, though some units were occupied. An occupant called in the fire around 10:24 p.m., and was taken to the hospital for treatment, but released.

The cause of the fire is under investigation, and the state fire/arson investigator was on the scene with Grissom Tuesday afternoon analyzing the scene.

As with any fire, said Grissom, the state offers a \$1,000 reward for anyone providing information leading to arrest or conviction of anyone involved in arson. Information can be called in to Grissom at the Iuka Fire Department, 423-5011.

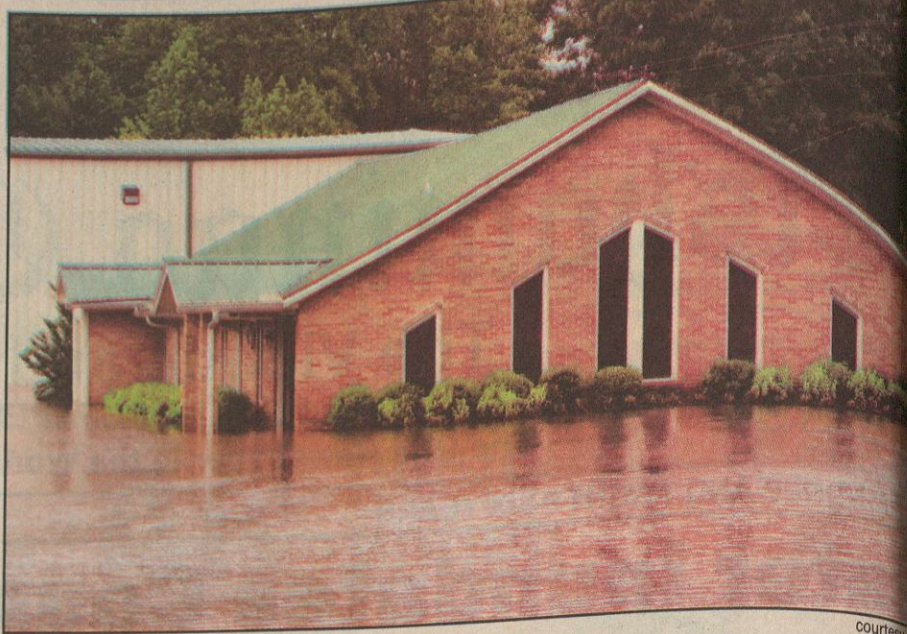

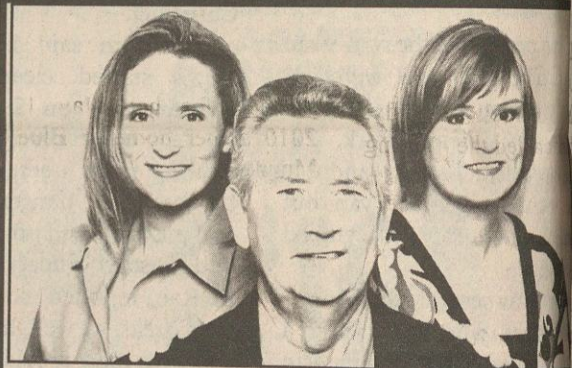

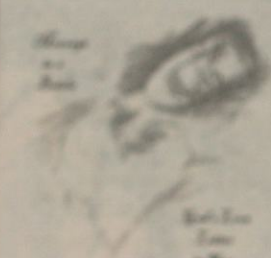

MAY IS NATIONAL OSTEOPOROSIS AWARENESS MONTH

The Clinic recently purchased a new Bone Densitometry Machine, Hologic QDR 4500C. Please call for an appointment with Dawn Doren for your Osteoporosis screening.

What is Osteoporosis?

Osteoporosis simply means "porous bone". A person's bones change throughout life, as a natural process breaks down and builds bones up at the microscopic level. Children and young adults build more bone than they break down. After age 35-40, breaking down exceeds building, and all adults start to lose bone. For a few years around menopause, women lose bone more quickly, probably because they no longer have extra stores of minerals to support a developing fetus. Osteoporosis occurs when the natural aging process goes too far and bones become weak and fragile. The most harmful fractures usually occur after age 70.

Screening

The most common screening tool is a DEXA-A-ray scan, which measures bone mineral density (BMD) in the hip or spine. DEXA results are called "T-scores". Compare a middle-aged woman's bone density to that of a healthy young adult (normal). A woman whose bone density is significantly lower than a young adult's is diagnosed with osteoporosis. Some clinicians are now testing women with bone density that is only slightly lower than the young adult average. They have "osteopenia" - a term that describes reduced bone density but is neither a disease nor a disorder.
