## New Signs Mark Significant Civil War Sites

The Iuka Battlefield Commission is moving toward plans making Iuka a Civil War history destination, and they recently placed four new historical markers identifying important sites of the Battle of Iuka.

Thanks to a \$50,000 appropriation by the Mississippi legislature, historic sites all over the state have new signs to designate them. The Iuka Battlefield Commission submitted nominations for about ten signs, but only received \$4,500, with which it bought three new signs at a cost of around \$1,500 each.

"I thought it was pretty good," said Iuka Battlefield Commission chairman Harold Lomenick. "We got about 10 percent of the appropriation for the whole state for our small battlefield. We have our legislators, [Lester] Bubba Carpenter and Senator Eric Powell to thank for their help."

The new signs are placed in several important sites that relate to the Battle of Iuka:

**11th Ohio Battery** - On the west side of the intersection of Sunlight Drive and Highway 25, near the Sunset Lodge. It shows where the 11th Ohio Battery held the hill where the hotel is located, repulsing four Confederate assaults before finally being overrun by cavalry and infantry troops from Texas, Alabama, Arkansas, Mississippi and Louisiana.

**Eastport** - The sign is at the end of Eastport Road (one of the oldest in the area) adjacent to the river. The river city of Eastport was a key transportation stronghold, occupied by Union and Confederate troops at different times during the War. By the end of the War, 18,000 Union troops were stationed there. Mjr. Gen. William Tecumseh Sherman un-

derstandably wanted it in Union hands.

**Brigadier General Henry Little** - In front of First American National Bank in Iuka. This designates the approximate location of where Confederate Brigadier General Henry Little was shot and killed by sharpshooters. He was originally buried in the yard of the Coman House, currently known as Twin Magnolias, near Mineral Springs Park, where he had his headquarters. Later his remains were moved to Maryland.

**Battle of Iuka** - This sign has been moved to the intersection of Highway 25 and U.S. Highway 72 to increase visibility. Placed where troops from Louisiana fought units from Iowa and Missouri, it designates the overall area where the battle took place on September 19, 1862.

### The Battle and Battlefield

In 2007, the Iuka Battlefield was listed as one of the most endangered Civil War sites, with a hotel built right in the heart of it, but the Iuka Battlefield Commission has made significant progress since 2001 when it was founded. According to Lomenick, the Commission has purchased for preservation about 70 acres of the original battleground, surrounding the hotel area, and including the Goyer Cemetery.

"In 1862, the heavily-wooded battle site was out in the country, as the young town of Iuka was centered around the railroad and current downtown area. Before Highway 25 was four-laned, the battleground included a low area, nearly a ravine, with high points where the hotel is, and across the four-lane. The highway department filled over the low area with non-native soil and cut down the hill where the hotel is about 25 feet," explained Lomenick Tues-

day. "The Confederate troops would have been between the former Iuka Ford and the highway, attempting to climb the hill where the Ohio battery was firing down on them."

This was a hastily-planned battle site, without any earthworks, or defensive barriers, said Lomenick. The Confederate troops were in town, near the valuable railroad, but when they heard that Union troops were positioning themselves on the hill, they quickly moved to where the battle would occur.

"It was a classic engagement - they just ran at each other, over and over, for about four to six hours," Lomenick explained.

Eventually the Confederates took the hill, and the cannons. But anticipating thousands of Union troops under Grant marching from Rienzi, they pulled back to prepare for Corinth rather than fighting the next day, making it technically a Union victory. In addition to 600 Confederate and 1,200 Union casualties, more than 80 horses and mules died in the battle.

Faced with the challenge of using the few existing animals to haul much needed supplies or cannons to Corinth, the Confederate General Price chose to spike the cannon, making them inoperable, and leave them. Ironically, a Union lieutenant McDonald had them repaired, and hauled to Corinth, where the same cannons were used on the same Confederate.

## Local Farm Bureau Members Leading Effort for Restricted Eminent Domain Laws

Local Farm Bureau members are leading the effort in Tishomingo County to bring the issue of eminent domain to a statewide vote.

According to Dr. Jim Perkins, a member of the Mississippi Farm Bureau Board of Directors, the goal is to get enough signatures (100,000) on petitions to put the issue on the statewide ballot November 8, 2011. That will be the next gubernatorial election, so the voter turnout numbers are always higher than some other lesser elections, explained Perkins.

Eminent domain is the inherent power of the state to seize a citizen's private property, expropriate property, or seize a citizen's rights in property with due monetary compensation, but without the owner's consent. For many years, this has meant for public use, such as bridges, roads, or utilities. But in recent years, precedent has been established to take land for private use, or industrial development - for example, the Toyota plant in Blue Springs, or the Nissan plant in Canton. In some states, land has even been taken for subdivision development.

And it also theoretically means that if the land is later not used for the purpose intended, it can be returned to the land owners from whom it was taken, but locally, there are some former landowners around the Tri-State Commerce Park who can tell you

differently, explained Dr. Perkins. The current issue in Mississippi is to restrict eminent domain laws to only public use applications. In 2009, a law was passed by the Mississippi State Legislature, but the economic development-minded Governor Haley Barbour vetoed it. The House overrode the veto, but the Senate did not, explained Perkins.

And when that happens, it seldom will be brought back up,

said Perkins. That is why they are trying to get it on the statewide ballot, to allow all the people to choose.

More than 20 other states have passed this kind of eminent domain restriction into law, said Perkins.

It is on the Mississippi Farm Bureau's agenda because many farmers are landowners, explained Perkins.



# South Represents Mississippi in National Shooting Competitions

After four years of competitive shooting that started right here in the Tishomingo County 4-H, Luke South has found his very favorite thing to do.

And it's been a good thing, because the junior from Iuka is participating in several shooting competi-

tions this summer, and the next one will take him to Colorado Springs.

Luke South will be representing Mississippi in the American Legion National Junior Shooting Championships the first week of August at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs.

To qualify for this national competition, he shot in two rounds to qualify. Qualified shooters have to score in the top 15 in both Sporter and Precision

classes. Sponsored by Alcorn County's Post 6 of the American Legion, South will spend several shooting-filled days at the OTC in Colorado Springs. Two-

thousand young people from across the nation competed for the top 15 slots, and in August they will be trying for a \$2,000 prize.

South has already been to Colorado Springs this year. In March, he participated in the 2010 USA Shooting/CMP National Junior Olympics, where he placed 87th out of 114 shooters - all under 20 years old. All the participants had to qualify at the state level to receive an invitation to the Nationals, and Luke qualified at the state event in Oxford.

In these competitions, South shoots 60 shots in a standing position from an air rifle to hit a tiny bullseye at 10 meters (33 feet). The shots must be fired within a certain time limit, one shot at a time. In other competitions, he shoots twenty shots each in prone, kneeling and

standing positions. The event South is in is actually an Olympic event. Several organizations cultivate and develop young sports, including Shooting, the NRA CMP (Civilian Marksmanship Program). USA Shooting and CMP offer events in hopes of developing a future Olympian for the United States.

ate troops a couple weeks later in the October battle of Corinth.

### More to Come

The Battlefield Commission has plans for additional markers, allowing Civil War enthusiasts to tour the area on a "windshield cruise." A visitor center telling about Iuka, one of the bloodiest, but lesser known, battles of the war would also be great, said Lomenick. Civil War-related tourism is a growing, multi-million dollar industry, and Iuka could be a key destination, since Shiloh and Corinth's locations are so close.

They also hope to raise awareness and funds with

the re-release of several historical accounts of the Battle of Iuka, including two by Dr. Ben Kitchens - *Gunboats and Calvary* - a *History of Eastport*, and *Rose-*

*crans Meets Price - The Battle of Iuka*, written in 1987. Dr. Kitchens has agreed to donate the rights of publication and future proceeds to the Iuka Battlefield Com-

mission. There will be book signing events, and special events for Iuka's Heritage Day celebration nears, said Lomenick.

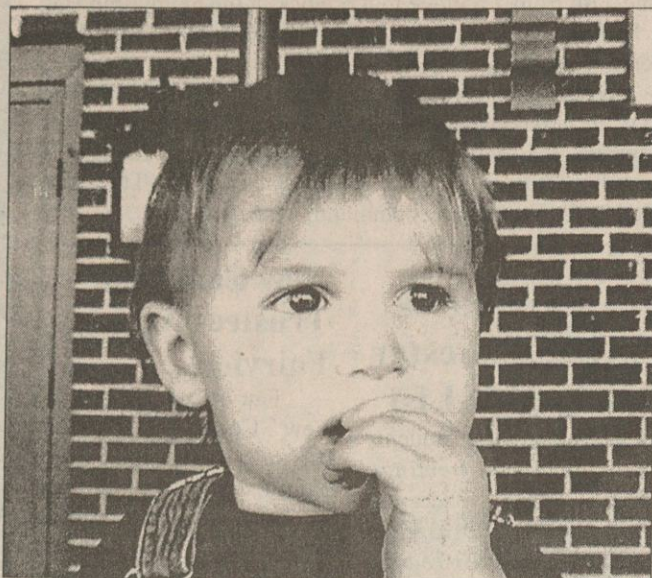

Work was started on this project in February, 1893 by several Confederate organizations. It was built in stages as funds were available. The bronze equestrian statue was the work of Alexander Doyle, a New York sculptor, and cost \$15,000.

Beauregard is shown sitting astride his prancing horse, with its right foot in a lifted position, which indicates that the General died of normal death.

The entire monument stands 27 feet in height with the statue being 16 feet tall. The base of the monument reads: G.T. Beauregard (1818-1893)...General C.S.A. 1861-1865.

In a letter from HAI President Matthew Zucaro, he stated, "You can

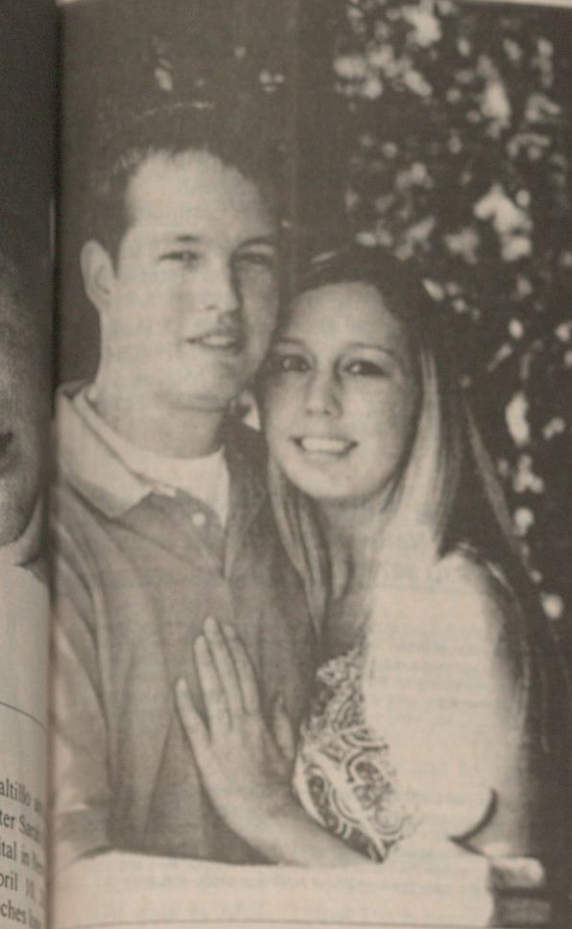
take great pride in the fact that you have met the requirements for this award. You achievement not only reflects favorably upon your organization but HAI members and the entire international helicopter community as well.

### Is my water safe?

Last year, as in years past, your tap water met all U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and state drinking water health standards set for quality and safety. Local Water vigilantly safeguards its water supplies and once again we are very proud that our system has not violated a maximum contaminant level or any other water quality standard. This report shows the results for our monitoring for the period of January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2009. Included are details about where your water comes from, what it contains, and how it compares to standards set by regulatory agencies. We are committed to providing you with information because informed customers are our best allies.

### Do I need to take special precautions?

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. ### Where does my water come from?

Our water is purchased from the City of Iuka which consists of four (4) wells, three that draws from the Paleozoic Aquifer and one drawing from the Fort Payne Chert Aquifer.

### Source water assessment and its availability:

The source water assessment has been completed for our public water system to determine the overall susceptibility of its drinking water supply to identify potential sources of contamination. A report containing detailed information on how the susceptibility determinations were made has been furnished to our public water system and is available for viewing at our office upon request. Listed below are the ratings for the wells of the City of Iuka where Walker Switch purchases water.

### Why are there contaminants in my drinking water?

All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. It's important to remember that the presence of these contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791). The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity. Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, that may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife; inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial, or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming; pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban stormwater runoff, and residential uses; organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff, and septic systems; and radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

### Additional Information for Lead

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. Walker Switch Water Association is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. ### Monitoring and reporting of compliance data violations

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific constituents on a monthly basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. Beginning January 1, 2004, the Mississippi State Department of Health (MSDH) required public water systems that use chlorine as a primary disinfectant to monitor/test for chlorine residuals as required by the Stage 1 Disinfection By-Products Rule. Our water system passed all of these monitoring requirements. We did complete the monitoring requirements for bacteriological sampling that showed no coliform present. In an effort to ensure systems complete all monitoring requirements, MSDH now notifies systems of any missing samples prior to the end of the compliance period.

The tables below list all the drinking water contaminants that we detected during the calendar year of this report. The presence of contaminants in the water does not necessarily indicate that the water poses a health risk. Unless otherwise noted, the data presented in this table is from testing done in the calendar year of the report. The EPA and the State requires us to monitor for certain contaminants less than once per year because the concentrations of these contaminants do not change frequently.

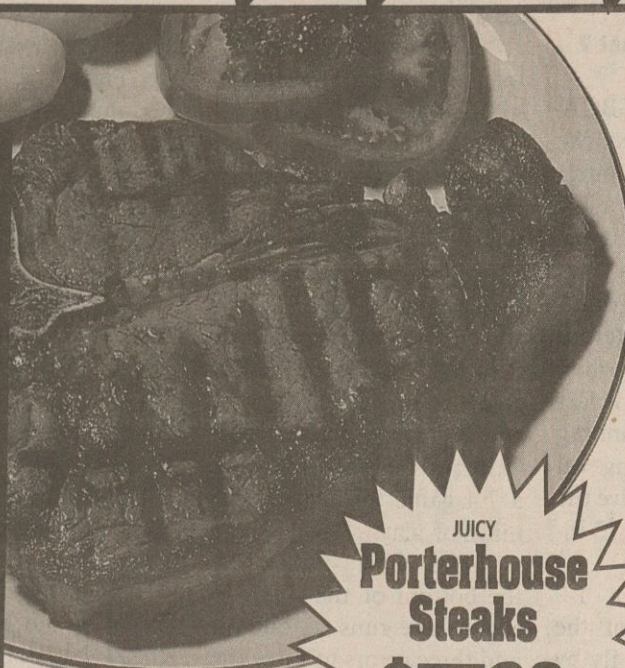

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF IUKA, MISSISSIPPI, TO ISSUE COMBINED WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS OF SAID MUNICIPALITY IN THE MAXIMUM PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF TWO MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,775,000) FOR IMPROVEMENTS, REPAIRS AND EXTENSIONS TO THE COMBINED WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM OF SAID MUNICIPALITY, CONSISTING PRIMARILY OF IMPROVEMENTS, REPAIRS AND EXTENSIONS TO THE WATERWORKS AND WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES OF SAID SYSTEM; AND DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Iuka, Mississippi (the "Governing Body" of the "Municipality"), acting for and on behalf of the Municipality, hereby finds, determines, adjudicates and declares as follows:

1. The waterworks, water supply, sewage and sewage disposal facilities of the Municipality have heretofore been combined and are operated as a combined system known as the combined water and sewer system of the Municipality (the "System").

2. It is necessary and advisable and in the best interest of the Municipality and its inhabitants to issue combined water and sewer system revenue bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of Two Million Seven Hundred Seventy-five Thousand dollars (\$2,775,000) for improvements, repairs and extensions to the combined water and sewer system of said municipality, consisting primarily of improvements, repairs and extensions to the waterworks and water supply facilities of the System (the "Authorized Purpose"), for which purpose there are no other available funds on hand.

3. The Governing Body has employed Cook Coggin Engineers, Inc., Corinth, Mississippi, a competent engineering firm, to study the System, determine the nature and extent of the improvements, repairs and extensions necessary thereto, and make an estimate of the cost thereof.

4. Said engineers have determined the nature and extent of the necessary improvements, repairs and extensions to the System and have made an estimate of the cost thereof. Based on that information, the estimated cost thereof is the aggregate amount of Two Million Seven Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$2,775,000).

5. Said improvements, repairs and extensions are necessary, are economically feasible and would be in the public interest and of benefit to the Municipality, and the findings of said engineers are hereby adopted, including the estimate of the costs of said improvements, repairs and extensions.

6. Under the provisions of Sections 21-27-11 through 21-27-69, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended (the "Act"), the Municipality is authorized to make such improvements, repairs and extensions and to provide for the payment of the costs thereof, or any portion of such costs, by and through the issuance of bonds, the principal and interest of and on which shall be payable from the revenues of the System.

7. The Municipality reasonably expects that it will incur expenditures for the aforesaid purpose prior to the issuance of said bonds and that it should declare its official intent to reimburse such expenditures made in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds.

8. A sum not exceeding Two Million Seven Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$2,775,000) must be provided and raised by the issuance of special obligation bonds in said amount, payable both as to principal and interest from the revenues of the System, as authorized by the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Governing Body does hereby declare its intention to issue combined water and sewer system revenue bonds of the Municipality in the maximum principal amount of Two Million Seven Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$2,775,000) (the "Bonds") for the Authorized Purpose. Pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations (the "Reimbursement Regulations"), the Governing Body hereby declares its official intent to reimburse expenditures made for the Authorized Purpose prior to the issuance of the Bonds with proceeds of the Bonds to the extent permitted by the Reimbursement Regulations.

SECTION 2. Said bonds in the amount, for the purpose and secured as aforesaid will be authorized to be issued at a meeting of the Governing Body to be held at the City Hall on July 6, 2010, at 7:00 o'clock p.m., which date so fixed will be more than ten (10) days after the third (3rd) date of publication of this resolution, as directed by Section 3 hereof. If a petition signed by not less than twenty percent (20%) of the qualified electors of the Municipality be filed objecting to and protesting the issuance of such revenue bond issue on or before the aforesaid date and hour, then an election on the question of the issuance of such bonds shall be called and held as provided by law. If no such protest be filed, then such bonds may be issued without an election on the question of the issuance thereof, and may be sold under the regular procedure for selling such bonds.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be published once a week for at least three (3) consecutive weeks in the Tishomingo County News, a newspaper published in and having a general circulation in the Municipality, and being a qualified newspaper under the provisions of Section 13-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972. The third (3rd) such publication of this resolution shall be made not less than eleven (11) days prior to the date specified in Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk of the Municipality shall be and is hereby directed to procure from the publisher of the aforesaid newspaper the customary proof of publication of this resolution and

to have the same before the Governing Body on the date and hour specified in Section 2 hereof.

## Computer Screen Problems

People with minor vision defects often see well enough in their day-to-day lives, but add the stress of staring at a computer screen and they begin to have trouble. Most can find relief with a mild lens prescription worn only on the job.

Those who are already wearing glasses may find that their present glasses are not geared to computer work. This is common with bifocal wearers. The reading segment is usually designed to give a sharp focus at the normal reading distance of 16 inches. Computer terminals are regularly viewed at 21 inches. Innovative, wide-band trifocals are a good solution. They have a wide segment for intermediate distance viewing that provides a full view of the screen, and smaller segments at top and bottom for distant and near vision. There are also anti-reflective tints to make computer work easier on the eyes. Just as important as proper glasses are the right "ergonomics," such as proper lighting and height of the screen.

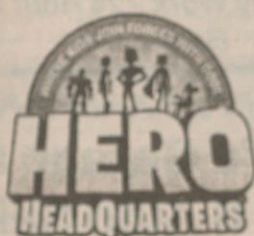



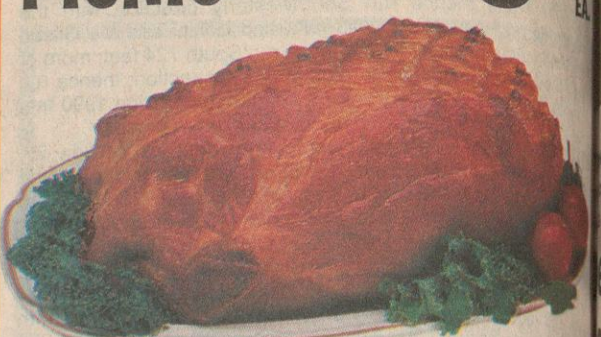
