## ATK Pulls Promised Project & 600 Jobs

Alliant Techsystems announced last week that it has canceled plans for an additional 600 jobs at its luka facility.

Citing the recent downturn in the economy and the company's need to consolidate its engineering, development and production efforts, the Airbus program, officials at Alliant Techsystems (ATK) announced that the company will not be moving forward with its plans to add jobs at its luka facility.

At the conclusion of negotiations, the company reimbursed the State of Mississippi, in full, more than \$30 million in economic development incentives made available to in exchange for the large number of premium jobs the company was committed to create.

"The State of Mississippi is extremely disappointed by ATK's decision to cancel the Tishomingo County project and cancel its plans to create high-

er paying, composite technology jobs in luka," Governor Haley Barbour said. "We understand that the economy and the need to create efficiencies in its engineering, development and production areas drove ATK to take this position."

ATK will not locate its Airbus A350 full rate production operations at its luka facility, but rather will centralize them at an existing location to optimize the program in support of its customer.

Local officials were understandably disappointed, but resilient.

"The county worked many long hours with MDA and ATK," said James McDowell, president of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors. "We are very disappointed, but it's a business decision and it's theirs to make."

McDowell said the \$5 million loan the county had arranged with MDA for the county's con-

tribution to the expansion has been negated, like the MDA incentives.

"The biggest disappointment is the loss of 600 additional jobs," said McDowell. "But we have dealt with losses of many previously promised jobs, and we have some very good projects in the negotiation phase, so we will bounce back."

"It is truly regrettable that ATK is unable at this time to move forward with its commitment. To protect the taxpayer, this administration has been diligent in including clawbacks in

contracts for all major economic development projects," Mississippi Development Authority (MDA) executive director Gray Swoope said. "The company has met the conditions of the clawback provisions stipulated in its contract."

Company officials have indicated they do not believe this decision will affect the current workforce at ATK's luka facility and have voiced their intention to maintain the plant's existing Mississippi workforce, retaining the 160 people currently employed there. The facility and its

employees primarily support the production of large composite aerospace structures for government and commercial launch vehicles.

"I want to thank state and Tishomingo County officials for their support of ATK's luka facility and its employees. Our Mississippi employees are a great asset to our company," said Blake Larson, president of ATK's Aerospace Systems group. "We look forward to maintaining our relationship with MDA and working together on future initiatives."

## Nunnelee of Tupelo Wins Republican Nomination

In a low turnout day for the Republican Primary Tuesday, Senator Alan Nunnelee won the right to challenge incumbent democratic Representative Anne Vogel in the November General election.

Nunnelee received 52 percent of the District 1 votes in official returns, giving him the victory over candidates Henry Ross, former mayor of Eupora, with 33 percent, and Angela McGlowan, of Oxford, with 15 percent.

Ross did not concede the race Tuesday night, saying it was still close to determine if there would be a runoff necessary.

McGlowan, who has de-

scribed Nunnelee as a "career politician," said she would vote for him, but she would not endorse him unless he changes his "career politician ways."

Nunnelee scored strongly in the larger counties of Lee, Lowndes and Lafayette. Ross carried only Marshall, Panola, Chickasaw and Webster counties, and McGlowan did not receive a majority in any counties.

In Tishomingo County, Nunnelee received 61 percent of the vote, Ross, 25 percent, and McGlowan 13 percent in unofficial totals. Only 782 votes were cast in the county, according to the Tishomingo County Circuit Clerk's office.

## Bear Creek Farmers' Market Opens Saturday

Tishomingo County will be joining the national trend toward community farmers' markets with the opening of the Bear Creek Farmers' Market this Saturday in Belmont's Shock Park.

From 7 until 11 Saturday morning, local farmers will be offering locally-raised produce for sale. There will also be several artisans set up to sell locally-made soap, jams, jellies, and cakes, and hanging flower baskets.

"This is a good thing for everyone - producers have a market for their products, and consumers can buy food grown and processed not only in America, but right here in the local area, by people they know," said organizer and vendor Stephen Holland.

As an added bonus, the market will also be open Monday evenings from 4-7 p.m.

Organizers have at least nine vendors committed. The vendors will be set up on the west side of the C.C. Shock Park, which is conveniently located right on Belmont's Main Street/Highway 25.

In luka, the Farmers' Market in Jaybird Park is supposed to open about June 15th and will be open Tuesdays and Fridays from 6 a.m. to 11 a.m.

In Tishomingo, farmers will sell produce in town as it is available.

## Northeast Tuition Increase Announced

In a recent monthly meeting, the Board of Trustees at Northeast Mississippi Community College announced that full-time tuition will be increased 11 percent beginning in the Fall of 2010.

Current tuition for one full-time semester is \$945. That cost will rise to \$1,050 beginning with the fall semester.

This is the first tuition increase at Northeast since 2006.

In remarks to the Board, NEMCC President Johnny L. Allen cited the ever-increasing cost of operating the college coupled with the lack of adequate funding due to the state of Mississippi's severe shortfall in revenue collections as the primary reason for the increase in tuition and other fees was absolutely necessary.

"We feel this is a modest increase (\$105), but, we recognize this is not completely harmless to our students," stated Allen.

"This is not the only action we will take to help prevent an interruption of services to our students, but we feel it best to act now in an effort to give our students and their families adequate time to plan for the coming school year," said Allen.

Allen's recommendation also included slight increases for dorm meal plans, and a 7 percent increase to per participant fees at the Crow's Neck Environmental Education Center in Paden, in which Northeast is a managing partner.

**FSA Disaster Loans Available for Farmers**

"Emergency loans for farmers, ranchers, and operators are available through the Prentiss County Office of the Farm Service Agency," Harold Mills, FSA Farm Loan Manager, said today.

This authority is pursuant to President Obama's declaration on May 14, 2010, of a major disaster in Mississippi, caused by storms, tornadoes and flooding that occurred from May 1-2. As a result, Tishomingo County has been designated a primary natural disaster area eligible for Federal Disaster assistance pursuant to Section 321 (a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act.

Applications for assistance in will be accepted by FSA through January 14, 2011. This Disaster Designation number is M1916.

Farmers qualifying for emergency loans may borrow up to 100 percent of their actual production loss or the amount needed to restore their operation to its pre-disaster condition, whichever is less. The new emergency loan and outstanding principal balance of any existing emergency loan owed by the applicant or any individual member of an entity cannot exceed \$500,000.00.

FSA emergency loans cover losses from designated disasters and are made to qualified farmers who cannot obtain credit from other lenders in the local area.

**Insight Into Eyesight**

**Vision Tips As We Age**

As we age, our eyes change in several ways that make vision less clear. Many of the changes are unavoidable. Excessive sun exposure is known to accelerate cataract formation and to damage the retina (both of which also occur in aging), we should at least try to slow these effects as much as possible. Wearing proper sunglasses whenever in the sun.

We can help ourselves by having eye tests regularly for glaucoma, a condition that becomes more likely if we take certain medications, including antihistamines, cough medicine, some types of sleeping pills, antidepressants, and drugs for Parkinson's.

These medications do not cause glaucoma but can aggravate it if it already exists. Furthermore, since these medications are often essential, never discontinue them on this account without a doctor's orders. However, if you are taking one of these medicines, regular glaucoma testing is especially important.
