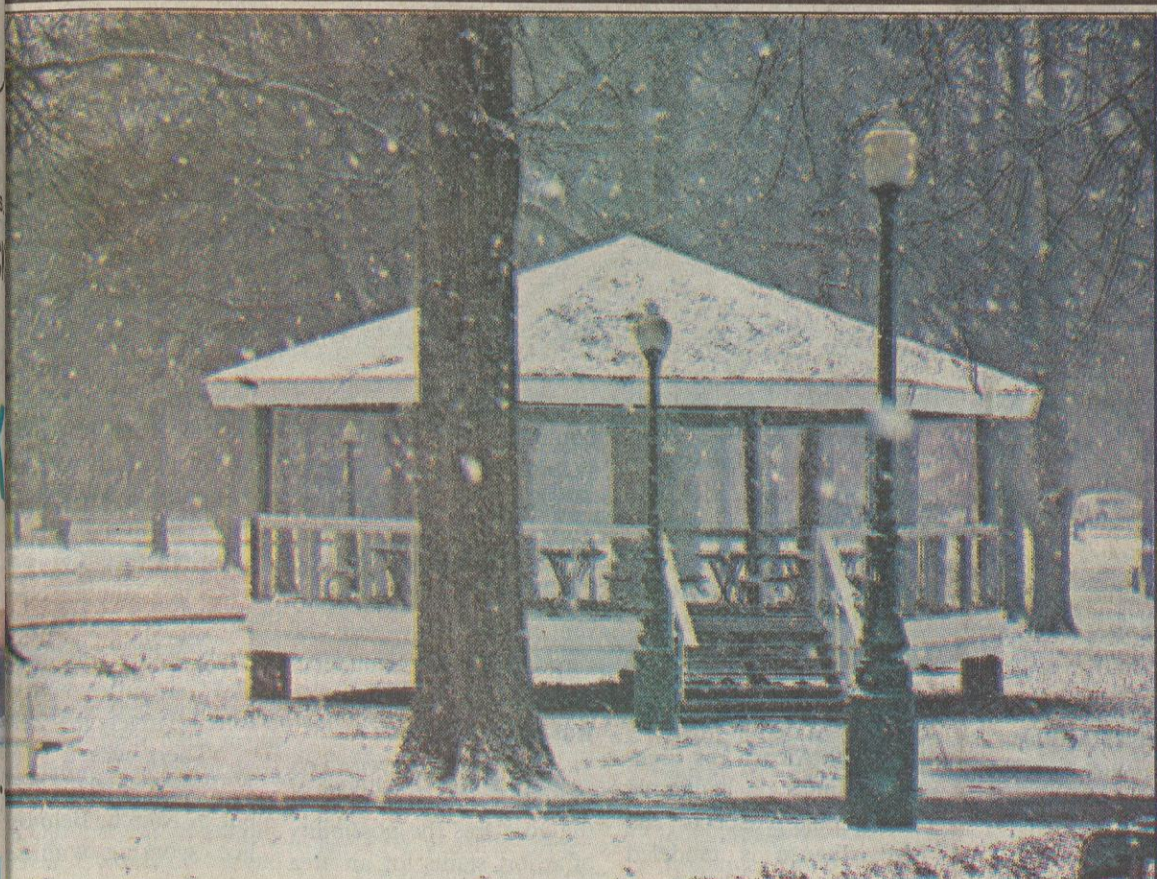

Winter Weather Hits Area

Mineral Springs Park in Iuka was a winter wonderland Thursday morning after an overnight snowfall blanketed the area. Winter weather was the concern of the week for Tishomingo County residents. Freezing rain on Wednesday evening followed by the snow and extreme temperatures caused county schools to be closed Thursday and Friday, and open late in the day Monday. Slick rural roads hampered travel in the county throughout the weekend as bitter cold from an arctic front stayed around too long.

2009: A Look Back at Our Year

Here are some of the top stories, and summaries of other issues that dominated the news in 2009 in Tishomingo County.

Woman Rescued from Car

One of our most popular stories this year was the heroic action of an Iuka man who saved a woman from her car as it was sinking into Woodall Mountain Lake on October 28th. Galeus Jordan saved the life of his neighbor, Peggy Walker, 64, after her car went off the levee and into the lake. He noticed it, called 911 and jumped into the cold water to help. He was assisted by another neighbor, Lesa Meador.

Train Wrecks

There were two train wrecks this year at McKinney Crossing, one in March, and one the week of October 1st. The city has put up signs warning trucks not to cross, and opened Eastport to truck traffic. They have hired a Dupelo engineering firm to look into solutions to the problem, since the railroad company has not indicated any intention to do so.

An Iuka woman was killed in a collision with a train over in Cherokee August 4th.

Burglaries/Robberies

Burnsville Discount Drugs was robbed at gunpoint September 1st, and the suspect ran off in the woods. A chase ensued. The sheriff's department arrested the man a week later.

There was an armed robbery in Belmont of the BP in late August. Police Chief Donald Reno announced the arrest of the suspect shortly thereafter.

Jury Trial

There was a rare jury trial in May, that resulted in Jack D. Moore, Jr. being found guilty of two counts of child molestation in connection with events that occurred in 2003 and 2006.

Flu Outbreak

The H1N1 flu affected county schools in a big way late in September and into October. At one time the district had as many as 227 absences, up from the regular daily average of 130 students absent. Iuka Middle School was the most severely affected, with as many as 60 students out. School did not close, and there were very few serious cases reported. "It was just the flu," said many teachers of the 3-4 day illness that the national media had very much scared about.

The Tishomingo child was treated for more than a week in an induced coma for complications from H1N1. Four-year-old

The schools participated in a vaccination program in which workers from the Segars Clinic administered H1N1 vaccine to students who had parental permission.

Family of 9 Gets New Home

A coalition of churches and volunteers united to build a new handicapped-accessible home for a Tishomingo blended family of nine. The family includes two wheelchair-bound special needs children and one with Down's syndrome. They had been living in two trailers on Bethlehem Road. Thanksgiving weekend was one of their first in their

home for the Watson family.

Nelson's Changes Ownership

The first of September, Iuka got a new owner for the long-established Nelson's Supermarket. Brooks Davis took over the store, and renamed it Brooks Grocery. Several interior improvements and outside cosmetic changes have resulted, and have proved popular with longtime customers, as well as attracting some new ones.

New 4-H Agent

The MSU Extension Service hired Kindra Wood as the new 4-H agent, and the year kicked off with a meet and greet. Wood has gotten more kids active, and even started a youth livestock show at the Fair this year. She said she hopes to extend the livestock show to regular evening fair hours, and include more animals than just the cattle who were shown this year.

The group is the first group of graduates to complete the Tishomingo Master Teaching Initiative, a partnership between the College of Education at Delta State University and the Tishomingo County School District, made possible by the Tri-State Educational Foundation. The Foundation is chaired by DSU alumnus, Dr. Bob Ferguson of

Iuka. Dr. Ferguson and his wife Sylvia, also a Tri-State board member and DSU alumnus, are longtime educators whose philanthropy in education post retirement spans K-12 through college programs. This recent Initiative is their response to a need in the Tishomingo School District for providing advanced study for teachers.

Iuka businessman, Earl Daugherty, 80, died Saturday, January 9, 2010 after suffering an apparent heart attack at his home. He died at the North Mississippi Medical Center in Iuka a short time later surrounded by his family.

He was the owner of Daugherty Refrigeration and Daugherty Rentals and at one time owned the Hughes Ice Plant in Iuka. He retired from the Tishomingo County Hospital where he worked 33 years as the maintenance supervisor before going to work full time in his family business which included his wife and son, and later grandsons.

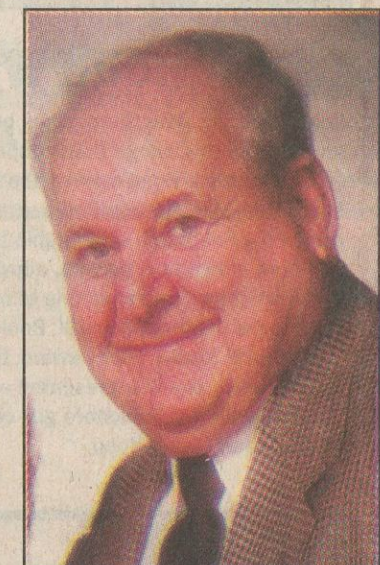
James Earl Daugherty was born September 2, 1929, the son of the late D. C. and Blanche Daugherty of the Snowdown Community. He married his wife of 63 years, Nancy Elizabeth Riley, on December 21, 1946.

retirement, remain committed to improving education in our state," said Dr. Leslie Griffin, Dean of the College of Education. "Their hearts are in providing opportunities for individuals who might otherwise not have the means to advance their education. They genuinely care about students, and follow their progress, making every effort to remove obstacles that might prevent them from finishing their education. Their desire to provide teachers in Tishomingo County with the opportunity to advance their professional education is characteristic of their disposition towards improving educational opportunities for this state's citizens at every level. The Tishomingo Master Teacher Initiative provided a seamless model for candidates to complete

the 30-hour program while providing support to one another through the cohort model. The candidates took the same classes at the same time, meeting rigorous program requirements along the way. Their support for one another contributed to the low attrition rate in the program. Of 29 initial enrollees, 28 graduated together.

"My most lasting impressions of the Tishomingo cohort members will

be their sense of excitement at the opportunity provided for them by the Tri-State Educational Foundation and their desire to support each other," said Dr. Jenetta Waddell, Chair of the Division of Teacher Education at Delta State. "All members were fully engaged in learning and applying new knowledge and skills. All members collaborated with their peers to help each one of them succeed."

The group was recognized at a reception in Kent Wyatt Hall following Saturday's commencement. Delta State President Dr. John M. Hilpert applauded the group's effort. "I know receiving your degrees means a lot to each one of you," said Hilpert. "It's important for all of us to recognize that this will also mean a great deal to the students of Tishomingo County."

Economic Development

The county was recognized in the trade journal Southern Business and Development as the "Hottest Market in the Southeastern US for communities under 22,000" based on economic development activity over the past five years.

Gary Matthews, of Tishomingo County Development Foundation, reminds us that projects take an average of three to five years to actually get started up, and several are in the works. This year was a good one for the county, with announcements of hundreds of jobs coming open immediately or in the next few years. Some of the projects that announced openings or expansions in the county were G&G Steel, Meridian Furniture, and expansions at ATK, and Dynasteel. Several small businesses opened in the county, too.

County Government

The county board of supervisors signed an agreement with Alcorn and Prentiss Counties on economic development prospects. The TAP alliance is modeled after the successful PUL alliance of Pontotoc, Union and Lee counties, who succeeded, by working together to lure the Toyota plant to Blue Springs.

They have worked with development officials to help get new industry in the county.

The Board approved plans to build a new jail for the county. Bids came in at nearly \$8 million, much higher than the \$4.5 million anticipated, and the board

subsequently rejected them all. They are working with the designers to make it cost less.

High Winds and Cool Weather

High winds caused damage to various parts of the county, including significant damage to the Tishomingo County Electric Power Association building from a February 11th storm. TCEPA eventually bought the former Page Chevrolet building for storage, and at years end, were still repairing the roof damage. June 15th, and the preceding weekend, there were high winds and lots of downed trees, too.

Temperatures in the summer were abnormally below normal, and August was far from its usual heat and near-drought conditions. Fall sports seasons were severely affected by the nearly daily rain all through August, September and October.

Resort(?) Status

The issue on everyone's mind throughout the first of the year was the possibility of resort status for an area on Bay Springs Lake. It would be the first time alcohol could be legally served in Tishomingo County in anyone's memory. Martel Development came to the Board of Supervisors with a plan for a \$300 million luxury resort development on Bay Springs Lake that was supposed to include 900 cabins, golf courses, a hotel, and many other upscale amenities - but they wouldn't pursue it if they couldn't serve drinks to the

resort visitors.

The supervisors a mind toward economic development proved it, and the legislature approved it too, but as the supervisors spoke loudly against it, the county citizens never have a vote in the way it was they argued.

As of December there has been no progress on the part of Martel the development, for various reasons, say development officials.

Crime

Area law enforcement feared the declining crime rate would cause an increase in robberies and crime, but, compared to surrounding counties, Tishomingo has had a decrease, said Chief Deputy Reynolds and Sheriff Whitlock recently.

They said that other departments have been struggling with many burglaries, and burglaries, but Tishomingo were relatively few. There was a spike in ATV thefts early in the year but in March, Belmone, working with other agencies, arrested men, and recovered stolen goods.

Insight Into Eyesight

Presbyopia Not Exotic

Presbyopia may sound like an exotic disease, but it's really just a commonplace vision problem. Most people don't begin to experience it until their 40s. By age 50, virtually everyone has it. Simply stated, presbyopia is a gradual decline in the ability of the eye lens to focus on nearby objects (hence, arm's length approach to reading).

Bifocals have been used to alleviate this problem for years. Lenses have segments with added power (typically the lower half) for reading. What's new is the improved version called "Progressive Addition Lenses." Instead of an abrupt change between the segments for distance and near vision, these lenses have a gradual increase in power as the wearer looks downward. The result more closely resembles more natural good vision, and people can use the middle portion of the lens to spot objects at in-between distances, like computer screens.

Teams of knowledgeable young people from 17-states competed for top honors by testing their knowledge on many levels of the dairy business at the November

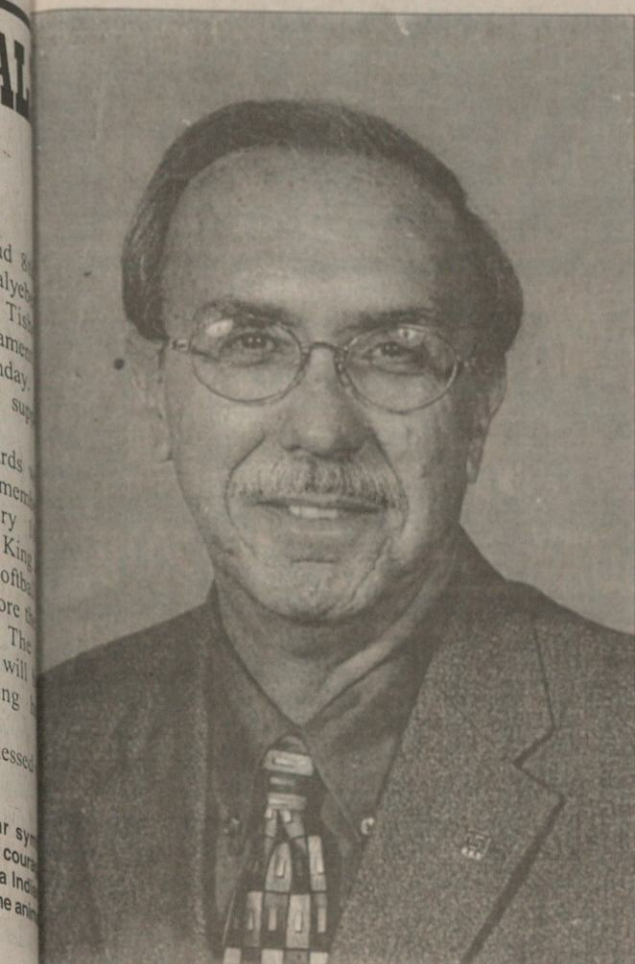

Carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning is another danger when using heating equipment fueled by fossil fuel. It occurs most often when equipment is not vented properly. CO deaths have been on the rise since 1999. On average there were 181 unintentional non-fire deaths from CO poisoning associated with consumer products per year from 2004-2006 compared to 123 from 1999-2001 (Source: Consumer Product Safety Commission). Carbon monoxide poisoning is most fatal to adults age 65 or older.

Preventing Home Heating Fires

In 2003-2006, the leading factor contributing to home heating fires (28%) and deaths (46%) was heating equipment too close to things that can burn, such as upholstered furniture, clothing, mattress, or bedding (Source: NFPA). Many heating fires can be prevented by following basic safety tips when dealing with any heating equipment:

- Keep or maintain a 3 foot clearance between all heating equipment and anything that can burn.
- Inspect and maintain codes. Or, make sure a qualified technician checks to see the unit has been properly installed.
- When buying a new portable space heater, make sure it has the label showing it is listed by a recognized testing laboratory, such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL).
- Space heaters should be turned off every time you leave the room and before going to bed.
- Keep space heaters at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn - including furniture, blankets, curtains, and paper products.
- Choose space heaters that turn off automatically if they tip over.
- Never use a space heater to dry clothing.
- Do not use your oven to heat your home.
- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home. For the best protection, interconnect all smoke alarms throughout the home. When one sounds, they all sound.
- Test smoke alarms monthly.
- Install and maintain carbon monoxide alarms to avoid risk of carbon monoxide poisoning.

Wood Burning Stoves and Fireplaces

- Use a metal or glass fireplace screen to keep sparks from hitting nearby carpets or furniture.
- Be sure the fireplace or stove is installed properly. Wood stoves should have adequate clearance (3 feet) from combustible surfaces and proper floor support and protection.
- Wood stoves should be of good quality, solid construction and design, and should be evaluated by a nationally recognized laboratory, such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL).
- The stove should be burned hot twice a day for 15-30 minutes to reduce

the amount of creosote buildup.

- Have your chimney inspected annually and cleaned if necessary, especially if it has not been used for some time.
- Don't use excessive amounts of paper to build fires in fireplaces. It is possible to ignite creosote in the chimney by overbuilding the fire.
- Make sure your fireplace has a sturdy screen to prevent sparks from flying into the room.
- Keep flammable materials away from your fireplace mantel. A spark from the fireplace could easily ignite these materials.
- Before you go to sleep, be sure your fireplace fire is out. NEVER close your damper with hot ashes in the fireplace. A closed damper will help the fire to heat up again and will force toxic carbon monoxide into the house.
- If synthetic logs are used, follow the directions on the package. NEVER break a synthetic log apart

to quicken the fire or use more than one log at a time. They often burn unevenly, releasing higher levels of carbon monoxide.

- Do not use flammable liquids to start or accelerate any fire.
- Never burn charcoal indoors. Burning charcoal can give off lethal amounts of carbon monoxide.
- Allow fireplace and wood stove ashes to cool before disposing in a metal container.

Kerosene Heaters

Read and follow the procedure in the owner's manual before you attempt to operate or service the unit.

Learn the safety and maintenance procedures necessary to safely operate the heating unit.

- Always use water clear K-1 grade kerosene.
- Never use gasoline or any other volatile fuels in the unit.
- Never refuel the heater indoors, when it is hot, or in use.
- Do not fill the fuel tank past the full mark. The space above the full mark is there to allow expansion of the fuel when it is operated.
- Always provide adequate ventilation for the unit. Burning kerosene consumes oxygen, and produces carbon monoxide and other dangerous gases which may cause you to suffocate or have other respiratory problems.
- Check with your local fire department to make sure kerosene heaters are allowed in your community.

Electric Heaters

Keep space heaters at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn - including furniture, blankets, curtains, and paper products.

- Check to ensure the heater has a thermostat control mechanism.
- Choose a heater that will turn off automatically if it tips over.
- Never dry clothes or store objects on top of the heater.
- Never use extension cords with electric heaters.
- Keep anything that may burn at least 3 feet away from the heater.
- Never allow children to play with, or around, the heater.
- Never place anything inside the grill on the front of the heater.

Carbon Monoxide Safety

Each year unintentional carbon monoxide (CO)

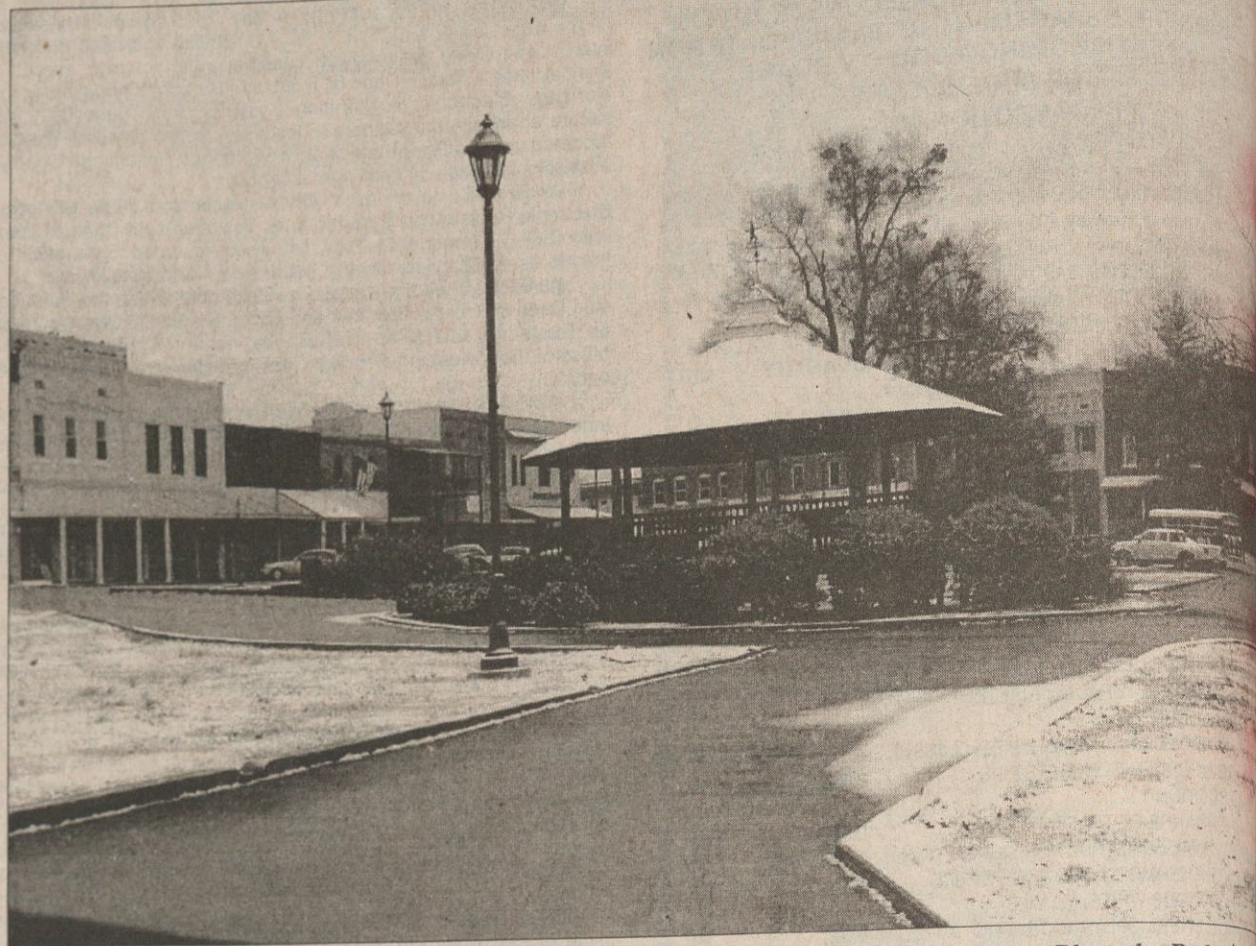

poisoning claims hundreds of lives and sends several thousands of people to the emergency room for treatment. At lower levels of exposure, CO causes mild effects that are often mistaken for the flu. These symptoms include headaches, dizziness, disorientation, nausea, and fatigue. The effects of CO exposure can vary greatly from person to person depending on age, overall health, and the concentration and length of exposure.

You can protect yourself and your family by following a few easy steps:

- Carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless and toxic gas. Because it is impossible to see, taste, or smell the toxic fumes, CO can kill before you are aware it is in your home.
- CO can come from several sources: gas-fired appliances, charcoal grills, wood-burning furnaces or fireplaces, and motor vehicles.
- Install at least one CO alarm with an audible warning signal evaluated by a nationally recognized laboratory, such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL), near sleeping areas and outside individual bedrooms. CO alarms measure levels of the gas over time and are designed to sound an alarm before an average, healthy adult would experience symptoms.

Have your heating system, water heater, and any other gas, oil or coal burning appliances serviced by a qualified technician every year.

Never use your range or oven to help heat your home and never use a charcoal grill or hibachi in your home or garage.

Never keep a car running in a garage. Even if the garage door is open, normal circulation will not provide enough fresh air to reliably prevent a dangerous buildup of CO.

Having a working smoke alarm dramatically increases your chances of surviving a fire. And remember to practice a home escape plan frequently with your family.
