

Officiale Lecus Wounings

A winter storm watch has een issued for Tishomingo county and the surrounding reion for Wednesday and Thursay of this week, and predictions re for record cold temperatures arough the weekend.

Accumulating snow, possily 1-2 inches, is likely Wednesay night and Thursday, and itterly cold temperatures will illow. Low temperatures will ip into the single digits, acording to NOAA weather fore-

Emergency officials are rging area citizens to take preautionary actions, and provide otection for outside animals nd tender plants.

Wind chills, especially will

be in the dangerous range, so dress warmly, with several layers, if you have to spend any time outside, and wear mittens or gloves and a hat. Most importantly, be sure to dress children warmly.

Protect your home from frozen or bursting pipes by leaving cabinet doors open to allow heat to reach pipes, and leave faucets going at a fast drip until thawing temperatures. In case pipes do burst, know where and how to turn the meter off.

Everyone is urged to be sure to check on neighbors, especially elderly people, to make

sure they are warm enough. School officials make a determination before 6 a.m. if

schools will be session, and if roads are safe enough for student transportation.

"We err on the side of caution, we don't want anyone to get hurt," said Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall.

Channel 9/WTVA news and Fun91 will carried news of possible school closings, and the school mass communication system will be used to notify homes.

Remember, your correct phone number must be on record with the school to receive direct notification. Many homes have cancelled land lines and gone to cell phones, and may need to notify the district of the change, said Kuykendall.

Recent Investigations Going Slowly, says Sheriff

Investigations into two recent cases are going slowly, but still look promising, according to Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock.

Holt Murder

No arrests have been made in connection with the brutal beating murder of an elderly Burnsville man, but they have several good leads and have had a crime scene investigation unit in the county.

John Holt was found beaten to death in his own home the week before Christmas, but "it's just moving slowly," said Whitlock of the ongoing investiga-

Crosby Disappearance

Regarding the December 18th disappearance of Johnny Crosby, of Dennis, the sheriff has had several believable reports of sightings in Corinth, but still have not actually found the 67year-old man who was last seen at his home near Tishomingo

If anyone has information regarding either of these investigations, they are asked to call the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department at 423-7000.

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors rejected all the bids received on the proposed new jail in the last meeting of 2009.

The board met for its first official meeting Monday, and Fifth District Supervisor James McDowell took over as board president, replacing the First District's Brandon Grissom, who has served since the current board came in office two years ago. Nicky McRae is the board vice-president.

In an unadvertised December 30th meeting, the board reviewed the bids on the jail, and opted to reject them all until a pared-down plan is prepared by the architects. The current plan, included several alternates (such as a separate sheriff's department building, and a building for prisoners' conjugal visits) that could be removed from the bids, but even with all the alternates taken out, the bids all came in far above the expected \$4-5 million that the board said they expected.

Also in the December 30th meeting, the board decided that state-aid funded road work in Tishomingo County will be administered/engineered by Cook Coggins Engineering of Tupelo.

County-funded industrial development projects would be done by Dean McRae Engineering of Iuka, and state/MDA funded development projects would require a Request for Proposals (RFP). Emergency engineering needs in the individual districts would be determined by the choice of the respective supervisor.

In the January 4th meeting the board opened bids for several supply services and items for road work, garbage hauling, and county banking. In the afternoon they met in executive session to deal with personnel issues, said McDowell.


The board members will be in Jackson at the Mid-Winter State Supervisors Association conference next week.

In the finals against two time 2A state champs Cold Springs, the score was tied at 11 after the first quarter. The Lady Cards had a strong second quarter as they outscored Cold Springs 20-8. They finished the game with a total team effort to win the championship.

"I am very proud of our team," said Coach Chris Higginbottom. "I know winning this tournament is big and I hope it sets the tone for the rest of the season - a total team effort!"


Duck Timbes' daughter Ciji Marlin spoke on behalf of the family, who were presented with a memorial flag by the firemen with whom their daddy served.
