## Burnsville Special Election Ballot Set

The Town of Burnsville will hold a special election on February 16th to elect an alderman. The election will be to fill the unexpired term of J. R. Mackney, who resigned his board position when he moved out of Burnsville. According to Burnsville City Clerk Jill Lee, John Robert Rorie, Stevie Johnson, and Lisa Walker have qualified, and will be on the special ballot. Voting will be at Burnsville City Hall from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. February 16th, and city hall will be open Saturday, February 13th from 8 a.m. to noon for absentee voting.

## Tishomingo County Wins Economic Development Award

Trade & Industry Development Magazine has awarded Tishomingo County its 2010 Corporate Development and Community Improvement Award. Tishomingo County was selected from over 1,000 counties in North America because of the project. The award is Southern Business and Development Magazine's highest award. Tishomingo County is touted as the "hottest market in the Southeastern United States" with communities under 22,000 population. "Although we may not realize the importance of such an industrial site selection, industrial site selection and potential industries do," said Tishomingo County Development Foundation Chairman Dan Young. "The award is a prestigious award and is worth \$150,000 in marketing for Tishomingo County." "We are honored by this award and feel that the project we have in the pipeline will make a substantial difference in the lives of our citizens," said Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors President James McDowell. "Jobs are in short supply and families are hurting. The help is on the way. The board of supervisors is committed to the creation of jobs in all of Tishomingo County." ## Award Will Help TCDF's Shoestring Marketing Budget

The latest economic development award, and it's marketing power comes at a good time for a county that is in desperate need of additional support and investment by its community. For decades, Tishomingo County has been handed huge economic development opportunities with comparatively little effort or investment on their part. For example, the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway, the TVA project, and the NASA/Lockheed/Aerofjet ASRM project came with hundreds of jobs, and investment in the institutions and infrastructure of the county. Tishomingo Countians have just not had to make the kind of investments other areas have, and the learning curve is becoming critical, with competition for industry getting more intense each year. Tishomingo County Development Foundation spearheads most of the economic development efforts in Tishomingo County, cooperating with all the county, state and municipal government entities. It is run by a board made up of elected government leaders, a few business people, and retired businessmen, all of whom serve without pay or compensation of any kind. The private non-profit Foundation has about 300 members who invest \$60 annually (businesses invest based on employment) each for membership in the organization.

The membership funds, along with contributions from county and municipal governments go toward the efforts of the Foundation, including support of existing businesses and

## Board Considers Locating a Northeast Community College Satellite Facility in County

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors met with Northeast Mississippi Community College personnel Monday to discuss the possibility of locating a branch campus in the county. At the regular first Monday meeting of the board, NEMCC President Jimmy Allen, NEMCC Board of Trustees President Jimmy Ramsey and Dr. Kelly Segars were first on the agenda. "We see the need to educate our young people, and those who want to return to school, and we may be able to help them have a more convenient way to accomplish this," said board president James McDowell. He also pointed out that such a facility would be an economic development plus to prospective industries and businesses. Dr. Allen explained that he had been through two off-campus developments for Northeast - one in Corinth and one in New Albany. He explained that this kind of facility was particularly helpful to adult students, or working students. The least bit of inconvenience, like driving 25 miles one way to Booneville, is enough for many of these potential students to pass up opportunities for college level training and education, he said.

Allen explained several steps in the process of locating a new branch in Tishomingo County, including:  
First, offer classes somewhere in the community, often at a school campus, and including core classes that will allow stu-

dents to do their first coursework closer to home. Second, the county involved funds the program, and Northeast usually asks for a millage commitment (4.25 - 5.25 mills in the other counties) to support development, and eventual renovation or building of a facility. Only Tishomingo County funds will be used for a Tishomingo County facility, explained Allen, whose college serves five counties. Private funding is also used for these programs, said Allen, and in fact, Segars stated that his bank, First American National Bank was interested in helping fund a satellite Northeast facility. "The good part is that the electorate usually sees this as a great investment in something that really helps the community," said Allen of the additional tax that has funded the other programs. Approval of several governing agencies will also be sought, explained Allen, including the Northeast Board of Trustees, the state board of Community Colleges, and the association of Southern Colleges. Allen said that approximately 450 students utilize the Corinth facility and 250 use the New Albany one, which is the fastest growing.

They also discussed the possibility of using the Tishomingo County Vocational Technical Center on Highway 25, due to its

## Two Arrested After Trying to Cash Checks on Holt's Account

Two women have been charged by Corinth Police after they allegedly tried to cash checks on the account of John Holt, an 84-year old man who was found brutally beaten to death in his Burnsville home December 23rd. According to Corinth Police Chief David Lancaster, Linda F. Holt, 51, and daughter, Terry L. Sparks, 32, were both arrested Thursday, January 21st and charged with uttering a forgery. Both were released on bond. Lancaster said the two women went through the drive-through of a local bank on December 22nd and cashed a check on the account of John Holt for

\$200. A short time later, they returned to the same bank and attempted to cash a second check which had originally been written for \$40, but altered to an amount of \$140. When the women were released on bond, Sparks was taken into custody in Tishomingo County for outstanding justice court warrants of phone harassment and malicious mischief, and violating probation. She is still in custody as of press time Wednesday. Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock said that the investigation of Holt's murder is still ongoing. No charges have been filed.

industry, small business development, and marketing to and pursuit of industrial prospects for the county, and the operating budget for the Foundation and its two employees that handle the daily business, executive director Gary Matthews and office administrator Theresa Cutshall.

The total marketing budget is about \$20,000 annually, according to Matthews, and it doesn't go far.

"Last year, we advertised the county in just one trade journal to let automotive parts manufacturers know about the value of locating in Tishomingo County," explained Matthews. "That ad cost of \$10,000, which was invested by Tishomingo County Elec-

tric Power Association." Aggressive marketing of the county could cost as much as \$100,000 in just a few months, but those kinds of resources are just not available to TCDF. As a result, Tishomingo County may not get looked at like surrounding counties who are throwing significantly more funding into the intense courtship for the few companies looking to locate or expand into a new area.

Already the county contributes \$137,496 annually to TCDF, almost enough to cover the office operating expenses, but the private support is significantly less than what other local economic developers utilize. In neighboring Alcorn County, they also have

about 300 members in their economic and community development entity - The Alliance. Their members contribute \$180 each annually - or more depending on the type of business and the number of employees. In some counties, development partners invest \$1,500 each annually.

Tennessee Valley Authority and Mississippi Development Authority recommendations for county marketing budgets for a community this size are more than \$300,000, which makes the Corporate Investment and Community Impact award all the more significant, since TCDF's budget is so minimal.

ideal, central location to all parts of the long county.

"I think the vocational center is a great location to start this program, and we are looking into how we can help make this happen for the people of Tishomingo County," said Tishomingo County School Superintendent Malcolm Kuykendall.

The board told Allen to start looking into the possibilities, and to discuss utilization of the Vo-Tech center with Tishomingo County School authorities.

### Jail Business

In other business, the board discussed the current status of the proposed jail,

and Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock was present.

They authorized a specification be written to accept quotes from local contractors to clean up the remaining rubbish at the proposed site, where the old shoe factory building has been demolished.

All salvageable material has been salvaged, explained First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom. A contractor salvaged the metal for a 50/50 share, and the copper for a 60/40 arrangement. The exact amount the county received wasn't reported, but Grissom said it was enough to cover the county's costs for asbestos removal.

The board then directed board attorney Phillip Whitehead to contact the jail architect, and have him provide whatever updated plan he has to replace the one which came in at more than twice the \$4.5 million which the board had reportedly initially been told the jail would cost. After reviewing it, the board will decide its next step in the ongoing jail building process.

### Other Business

In other business, the board decided to talk to all the county fire chiefs regarding the replacement of Jerry Bonds as county fire/911 coordinator, who is retiring soon.

They also decided to order new road signs for the Tishomingo County Fairgrounds; a project which apparently had already been approved, but that had never been accomplished. Third District Supervisor Danny Ryan said he would take care of it.

The Grand Jury visited the board meeting, but had no questions for the board.

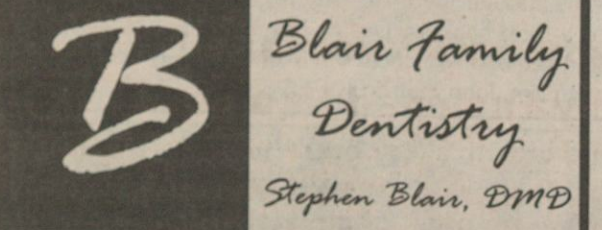

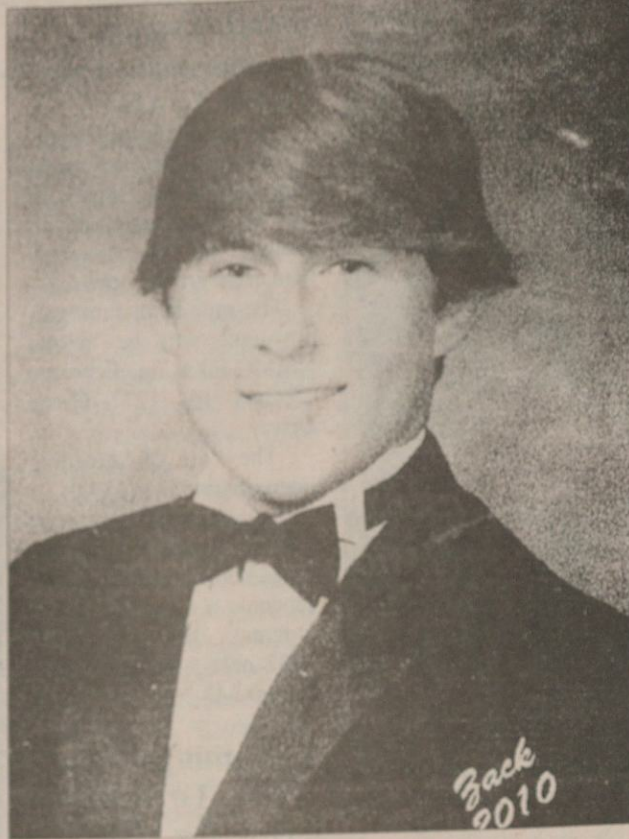

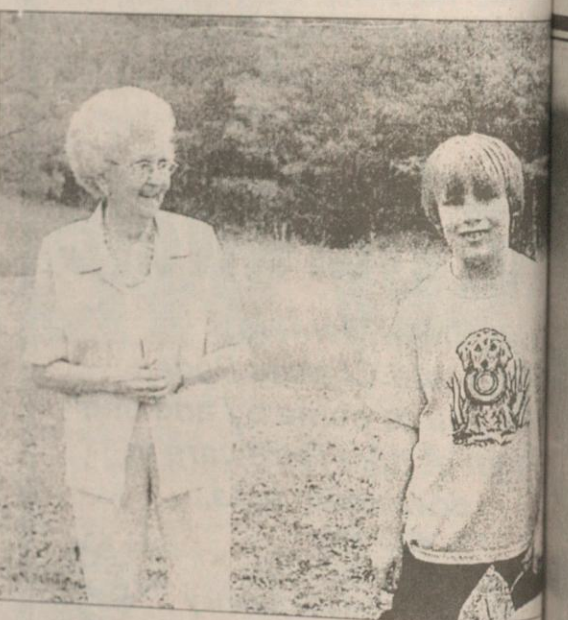
**Letter To The Editor...**

In the letting of public contracts, preference shall be given to resident contractors, and a nonresident bidder domiciled in a state having laws granting preference to local contractors shall be awarded Mississippi public contracts only on the same basis as nonresident bidder's state awards contracts to Mississippi contractors actually domiciled in Mississippi; and corporations, individuals, or partnerships, are to be granted preference to the same extent as provided by the laws of the state of domicile of the nonresident. When a nonresident contractor submits a bid for a public project, he shall attach thereto a copy of his residence in the current law pertaining to such state's treatment of nonresident contractors.

Bidders are directed to the contract requirement that not less than the minimum wages and salaries set forth in the Contract Documents must be paid on this project. General public provided opportunity to find out more about floodplain management in their community.

Officials representing the Mississippi Flood Map Modernization Initiative Team will host a Flood Risk Open House from 4:30 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 9th in the Crow's Neck Environmental Education and Conference Center, located at 281 County Road 115, in the town of Tishomingo.

The open house will provide the public with an opportunity to review the recently completed preliminary Flood Insurance Study (FIS) and its accompanying preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) that include base flood information and identification of areas subject to flood hazards within the county. The maps for Tishomingo County and its incorporated communities are also available for viewing at the MDEQ web site at: <http://ecology.deq.ms.gov/floodmaps/status.aspx?county=Tishomingo>

Local and state officials will be present to provide information about flood risk, flood insurance, floodplain management requirements, and the process used for floodplain mapping. Once the preliminary FIRMs become effective, these maps will be used by floodplain permit officials, builders and developers, lenders, realtors, insurance agents, and the general public to determine flood risk.

Property owners, realtors, lenders, and insurance agents are encouraged to attend and take advantage of this opportunity to learn more about flood risk and hazard mitigation within your community.

The maps can impact you directly, please contact your community Floodplain Administrator to learn if your home or business is located within a high hazard area, which will require flood insurance if you have a federally backed loan.



## Soil Erosion 101

## Why is it important to stop and prevent erosion?

Are you a landowner who has soil erosion problems on your land? Have you ever stopped to think about the consequences of soil erosion?

Why is it important to stop and prevent soil erosion? Nothing ruins the aesthetics or looks of the land or decreases the value of property more than the sight of gullies, washed out areas, or ditches and streams whose banks are caving in or cutting out into the edge of a field. Once the soil is gone, it can never be replaced. Erosion takes away the layer of topsoil making the land unsuitable for any

type of agricultural production or if severe enough, it can prevent the land from growing trees and hinder the use of any type of equipment or machinery.

What causes erosion and what are the different types of erosion? Water + Bare Ground = Erosion. Water is the main cause of erosion in Tishomingo County. The four different types of water erosion are splash erosion, where raindrops hits the bare soil and causes soil particles to become displaced; sheet erosion, where water movement is spread out over a wide area instead of in a

concentrated flow; rill erosion, where water concentrates in several small ditches over a wide area; and last is gully erosion, in which a broad area of water concentrates into one place and washes out a ditch or gully that becomes deeper and wider with each rain storm. Gully erosion is by far the worst type and causes the most damage to the land.

Where does all that soil go to that is carried away from its original place? The soil ends up down slope either settling on the vegetation, filling in around trees, or filling up streams and ditches to a point of being

inoperable.

If you have soil erosion problems and want to put an end to them but are not financially able to do it by yourself, for the Yellow Creek and Bear Creek drainage areas, there is cost share money available on a 60/40 basis to construct and implement structures and practices to help control or eliminate soil erosion.
