Braves and Lady Braves Playoff Action Begins Friday

The TCHS baseball and softball teams have progressed to the playoffs, and games begin Friday.

The girls ended their season in Division 1-4A with a record (8-2 division). Friday night they welcome the Lady Braves field team for the first game of a three series.

They will go to Houston for the second game, which begins at 7 p.m. Saturday. If a third game is necessary, it will begin immediately afterwards at Houston.

The Braves finished their season with a 16-10 record, and they beat Pontotoc last year in a dramatic 13-12 game. Their final regular season game at Tupelo last Saturday was a 10-0 shutout.

Friday, the Braves open the playoffs at home beginning at 7 p.m. (21-3), beginning at 7 p.m. The second game will be at home beginning at 4 p.m. and if a third is necessary, it will be Monday at Amory.

Tuka 2009 All Stars Presented with Inaugural Hurst Trophy for Sportsmanship

It took a while for the trophy to get here, but Monday night, last year's 11-12 Tuka All-Stars were presented with an award for sportsmanship they won at last year's state tournament.

In a brief ceremony between games at Woodall Park, Dixie Youth Assistant Director for District 2 Pete Walker presented the All-Stars and coaches with the first ever Terry D. Hurst Award for Sportsmanship, based on their performance at the state tournament last July in Greenville.

The Tuka team was among twelve others at the state tournament, and they did not go far in the tournament, but were recognized for their good sportsmanship at that time. It just took a while for the beautiful crystal trophy to get to the team in Tuka, explained Anne Marie Brown, who was then secretary of the Tuka Baseball League.

The award was started in memory of Terry Hurst, formerly of Belmont, who was the District 2 Director for the Mississippi Dixie Youth, representing the teams and leagues in Tishomingo County, and some surrounding areas. He was killed in a tractor accident about a year ago, explained Brown.

Supervisors Award Several Contracts in Rescheduled Meeting

In a meeting on April 15th that was rescheduled to accommodate the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors' trip to Washington state, the board voted to award several contracts.

On the recommendation of Dean McRae Engineering of Tuka, the board awarded a contract for repairs to the Miller building at Tri-State Commerce Park to Graham Roofing, for \$24,688 in grant money, said purchasing clerk Lynn West.

APAC was awarded the contract for repairing a road on Goat Island. The board referenced a

\$46,900 emergency grant to pay for it, since it was torn up to repair a burst water main.

The board rejected bids on some landfill equipment.

The board voted to install a handicapped-accessible ramp and door at the Family and Children's Services building (the old health department building.)

The board met with school superintendent Malcolm Kaykendall, and school resource officers Jeff Sparks and Ryan Glower to discuss how to fund the school officer program, since it has become the victim of funding cuts

in the school budget. They are looking into the possibility of some funding through Homeland Security.

The board denied, with a 3-2 vote, again, a request of the Tishomingo County Tourism Council to enact a 2 percent tax on restaurant and lodging bills, that would have gone toward marketing the county.

The board awarded an engineering contract to Cook Coggins Engineering of Tupelo to design repairs to the International Converter Building on Paul Edmondson Drive.

The board's next meeting is May 2nd at the regular 10 a.m. time.

The program uses evidence-based counseling and medication to help people quit using tobacco. Counseling and medicines are free to Mississippi residents who take part in the six-week program. Cases are followed up for a year, to help kick the habit, said Stephanie Carr, of the center.

NEMCC Announced Graduates from Iuka and Booneville Welding Classes

Booneville, Miss.—A new group of students completed a six week comprehensive welding training program covering shielded metal arc welding, gas metal arc welding, flux core arc welding, and gas tungsten arc welding on March 26.

Overall, there were 18 students who became the newest graduates of the Northeast Mississippi Community College program offered in Holliday Hall on the NEMCC campus and also at the NEMCC Mobile Welding Lab-- located behind the Tishomingo County Courthouse in Iuka.

NEMCC's Division of Workforce Training and Economic Development offers the six-week welding course to give trainees basic welding knowledge to prepare for industrial employment. Admission priority is given to the unemployed. WIA and Tri State Education Foundation funding have been available to pay tuition for most trainees. A new group of trainees have already started the latest class at both locations.

Class rolls are now forming for the Iuka and Booneville classes. A new day class in Iuka is scheduled to begin May 3. A new day class in Booneville will begin May 10. Iuka day classes meet Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. for six consecutive weeks. Booneville day classes meet Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. for six consecutive weeks.

Insight Into Eyesight

The Eye Drop Solution

One of the most common questions we receive in our office is: "How in the world can you keep your eyes open when you try to squeeze eye drop medication into them?" The solution is easier than you think.

Many children, and even some adults, find it almost impossible to relax their lids when eye drops are being given. Even when they wish to cooperate, their lids are held so tightly shut that the drops fail to get into the eyes and dribble down the cheeks instead. A good way to get around this problem is to ask the patient to lie down on his or her back and close their eyes (or do it yourself if you're the offender). One or two drops of the medication are then put on the lids where they meet at the hollow at the the nasal side of the eyes (the inner canthus), and the patient is then asked to blink. By gravity, and without any struggle, the drops will then run into the eyes as the lids are opened. This is one solution that really works.



Nasal Allergies
 There are 3 types of nasal allergies, which are called rhinitis:
 • Seasonal allergic rhinitis (symptoms come and go when various plants bloom)
 • Perennial allergic rhinitis (you have symptoms year-around and you are most likely allergic to indoor allergens such as dust mites, mold, or animal dander)
 • Non-Allergic rhinitis (symptoms caused by medication, exposure to cold air, strong smells or fumes, eating or exercise)

Symptoms
 • Stuffy, runny nose
 • Sneezing
 • Postnasal drip
 • Coughing
 • Itchy or sore throat
 • Itchy, burning, watery, or bloodshot eye

Treatment Plans
 For seasonal allergic rhinitis
 • Keep windows closed
 • Use air conditioners instead of fans
 • Limit outdoor activities

For year-around rhinitis
 • Put bedding in sealed plastic and wash in hot water to kill dust mites
 • Bathe pets weekly
 • No carpet in bedroom
 • Use a dehumidifier

There are three treatment plans
 • Avoid triggers
 • Use medication, ask your doctor about your choices
 • Consider immunotherapy or allergy shots

Sammie Linton, Sworn In As SGA President For University Of TN


