Dennis Man One of Three in Lowndes County Meth Bust

A Dennis man was among three people arrested for possession of methamphetamine in Lowndes County early Saturday morning, according to the Lowndes County Sheriff's Department.

At 1:55 a.m. June 19th, Clay County Lowndes County Deputies received information about a vehicle allegedly coming from the Philadelphia area with a quantity of methamphetamine, explained Lowndes County Sheriff's Office Deputy Greg Wright. Officers from both departments, and Mississippi Highway Patrol officers sighted the car on Highway 45 Alternate/Highway 82, identifiable cause, and stopped it. The driver, Brad Russell Wilson, 28, of Philadelphia, was unable to produce a driver's license. Further investigation revealed the license was suspended, and that there was a significant amount of methamphetamine and marijuana in the vehicle. Also in the vehicle were Sarah Elizabeth Burrage, 21, of Philadelphia, Mississippi, and Billy Don Hall, 27, of 969 Highway 25, Philadelphia.

According to Deputy Wright, Wilson was charged with possession of marijuana, driving with a suspended license, improper equipment and possession of methamphetamine. Burrage and Hall were charged with possession of methamphetamine. All three were still in the custody of the Lowndes County Sheriff's Department Tuesday afternoon, awaiting court hearings, said Wright.

Supervisors Vote 3-2 to Start Jail Building Process

The Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors voted Monday to accept a bid for constructing the new jail and start planning financing options for the \$5.2 million project.

After an extended discussion that included the board members, Tishomingo County Sheriff Clint Whitlock, and John Henry Parrish, First District Supervisor Braden Grooms moved that the county accept the bid of CIG Contractors of Canada to build the jail for a lump sum amount of \$5,200,000 over a period of 425 days. Third District Supervisor Danny Ryan seconded the motion, and Board President James McDowell cast the deciding vote for the project.

Second District Mike McRae voted against the motion, stating that he "is not willing to add to the tax burden of the county" if promised funding from housing state prisoners fails to come through. Fourth District Supervisor Steve Thomas joined him in voting no.

Just after the current board took office in 2008, they have been discussing the need to build a new jail to ease overcrowding in the 1970's one building that was designed to hold about 25 prisoners, and also to bring it up to state standards so that state prisoners can be housed there.

According to Whitlock, all the counties in Mississippi are under a court order to bring jail facilities into compliance with state and state department guidelines.

Additionally, the current jail does not comply with the state prisoner standards, and the state pays about \$20 a day for those low security inmates. He said the state legislature call for expansion housing for state inmates - even from the county prison. State Corrections Commissioner has given the Tishomingo County Board a letter promising to fill the 77 beds included in the proposed jail design.

Ryan said that the former board probably had invested a half-a-million dollars in repairs for the current facility, but that was "just like putting a band-aid on a gaping wound."

John Henry Parrish pointed out that a jail ages three times faster than any other kind of public building, due to its purpose and materials.

"It's true we just went ahead and did this, we know, we have known for some time, it's coming," said Ryan.

The board discussed figures on payments and interest for some proposed financing, and compared them to the amount

they expect to be paid by the state for each prisoner, and the amounts were very close.

Sheriff Whitlock pointed out that it would be nice to be paid for housing the state inmates, but that it needed to be understood that law enforcement and a jail is a public service, and should not be expected to be a "money-making" venture.

"Our business (jail keeping) is not a popular one, but unfortunately it is one of the greatest risks and liability to the people of Tishomingo County," said Whitlock.

McDowell asked the clerk to present financing options, and ask the architect to attend the board's scheduled work session on Thursday to discuss some details of their bid, and a construction schedule.

In other business:

ADP (Adult Basic Education) Instructors Lisa Harfield asked the board to thank them for their support of the GED program. She said that about 400 people will complete their GEDs this year, effectively making that program the largest graduating class in the area compared to county and area high schools.

"We are glad to support this," said McDowell. "It's like a second chance for many of these students."

The board members said they had enjoyed the networking opportunities at last week's Mississippi Association of Supervisors conference in Tunica.

The board verified that county representative would attend the upcoming TVA session of land at the Yellow Creek Plant on July 8th at 11 a.m.

The Sheriff stated that he has appointed two new county law enforcement to take the place of Steve Grooms, who is stepping down from that position. They are Mike Milton and James Jones, and they will determine which investigations they will each handle.

There was an extended discussion on the school manager's office issue, and eventually the board voted they would fund the two officers' salary (\$27,000) during the July-December period during which the Tishomingo County School District has and they are unable to fund them. They will still pursue a possible grant through the sheriff's department for which Whitlock is applying, but they won't know until at least the end of July about that.

Ryan pointed out that these items are on the school page item, or the county page, then, "It's all taxpayer money, and this is a good thing for the taxpayers."

Access Road Repaired; Teen Injured in ATV Wreck

County crews from every district pitched in labor and materials on Tuesday to complete a temporary repair to County Road 321, the TVA Access Road, near Coleman Park and the Tin Stone Community Park, but not before a 15-year-old drove a four-wheeler off onto the gap about midnight Monday.

First District Supervisor Braden Grooms has been pursuing FEMA and/or Mississippi State Aid funding to repair the road that was completely washed away by flash flooding on May 2nd. Estimates to fix the road were as much as \$240,000.

"It's a temporary fix," explained Grooms on Tuesday. "But we had to get something done. I just got tired of waiting on them to send money to fix it. We'll just fix it to state standards

when they provide some funding."

Since May 2nd, the road has been completely blocked off, with concrete barriers and warning signs, which people have still been trying to go around.


Monday night, the 15-year-old apparently went around several warning signs, and then crashed his ATV by driving off the broken pavement into the gap created by the washout. According to reports the minor was hospitalized in Tupelo from injuries sustained in the wreck.

Grooms said he appreciates the patience of all those affected by the damaged road, and wants that it is still a rough crossing, and drivers need to go slowly over it until more permanent repairs are completed.

'Wall Street reform' bill misses target, hits consumers

Something happened on the way to Wall Street reform. The federal legislation now in the final stages of Congressional approval was supposed to address the causes of the recent financial crisis and reorganize the way Wall Street does business to protect taxpayers from a future crisis. While the legislation does address some important concerns, it imposes tremendous new burdens and restrictions on traditional banks like mine that had nothing to do with causing the crisis in the first place.

In short, this bill really hits our community, and its impact will not be positive. Instead of reforming the Wall Street investment giants, the legislation undermines the smaller, traditional banks that are needed to support economic growth and job creation. The bill that passed the Senate contains 30 new or expanded regulations that apply to community banks, and many of these regulations are not even remotely connected to the financial crisis. All these new burdens and restrictions will make it harder for bankers like me to make loans to consumers and small businesses in our local community.

For example, the Senate bill contains an amendment

that mandates government controls on the price retailers pay for accepting debit cards from their customers. This has absolutely no connection to the financial crisis and subsidizes giant retailers at the expense of community banks and consumers.

Another example is the newly proposed consumer financial regulator. The authority granted to this new federal bureau is so broad and ill-defined that it essentially puts government in the business of deciding what services are right for bank customers. A bank like mine could reasonably conclude that it is not worth offering some banking services that are specifically designed for our customers because the services do not have the bureau's stamp of approval.

This kind of invasive oversight undermines the essence and strength of community banks—namely, the relationships we have with our customers. How can we serve our communities if we can't tailor products to meet the specific needs of our customers?

Furthermore, the new consumer rules would apply both to banks and non-bank lenders, but there is not a strong system for examina-

tion and enforcement of rules for non-banks like the one state and federal regulators use to examine banks like mine. How will this legislation protect consumers from mortgage brokers or other financial entities outside the traditional banking industry?

Even more astonishing is the fact that this new consumer bureau is given no authority over securities transactions. Let me repeat that: this new consumer bureau is given no authority over securities transactions. The very essence of what separates Wall Street from traditional banks—the buying and selling of stocks and bonds—is not even covered by the new agency. It is very difficult to see how this legislation can be referred to as a "Wall Street reform bill."

Bankers support financial reform, including some of the key provisions in this legislation. But, this bill goes way beyond these needed reforms and heaps even more red tape and restrictions on banks like mine that have always put our customers first. Congress has missed the target of reforming Wall Street firms, the shadow banking system, ratings agencies and brokers that caused the recent financial crisis and have instead hit the traditional banks. As a result, our customers and communities will suffer, and yes, "Too Big to Fail" will still be with us.

Is this the kind of reform consumers had in mind?

Diabetic Retinopathy

Diabetic retinopathy is a disorder of the blood vessels in the retina stemming from diabetes. Visual impairment can result from swelling of the retina, from leaky blood vessels, bleeding from abnormal retinal blood vessels into the vitreous (the clear, jelly-like substance which fills the center of the eye), formation of scar tissue and detachment of the retina. The incidence and severity of retinopathy are generally proportionate to the duration of diabetes.

Photo coagulation, the use of strong, finely focused laser beams to seal off the abnormal vessels or destroy diseased retinal tissue can be effective in preventing or forestalling blindness in certain stages of the disease.
