Dennen Steel Announces New Plant at Yellow Creek Port

State and local officials announced last Thursday that Dennen Steel, a Grand Rapids, Michigan-based steel processor, will be the latest company to locate in Tishomingo County.

Dennen joins several steel processing and fabricating companies that have made the Yellow Creek Port, on the Tennessee River in the northern end of Tishomingo County, an important steel and metal processing center in recent years.

Dennen Steel plans to build a 100,000-square-foot steel processing facility that will employ 50 people within the next three years, reported the Mississippi Development Authority, who helped Dennen in choosing the location.

Dennen manufactures steel coil, precision stampings, fabricated metal parts and tooling assemblies. Family-owned and operated, Dennen operates

its company uniquely by integrating and consolidating several stages of the steel production process.

"The Mississippi Development Authority, Tishomingo County and the Tennessee Valley Authority really went to bat to provide assistance and support to us," said Andrew Dennen, president and CEO of Grand Rapids, Michigan-based Dennen Steel Corporation. "We just fell in love with Yellow Creek Port."

"The Port offers a combination of benefits for us - its proximity to customers and suppliers, as well as potential industries we can supply," explained Dennen. "Additionally, the logistical support of the Port with rail and water access, loading and unloading of barges and railcars - it is everything we have wanted for our Southern location."

"We have been made to feel overwhelmingly welcome by everyone in Tishomingo County,"

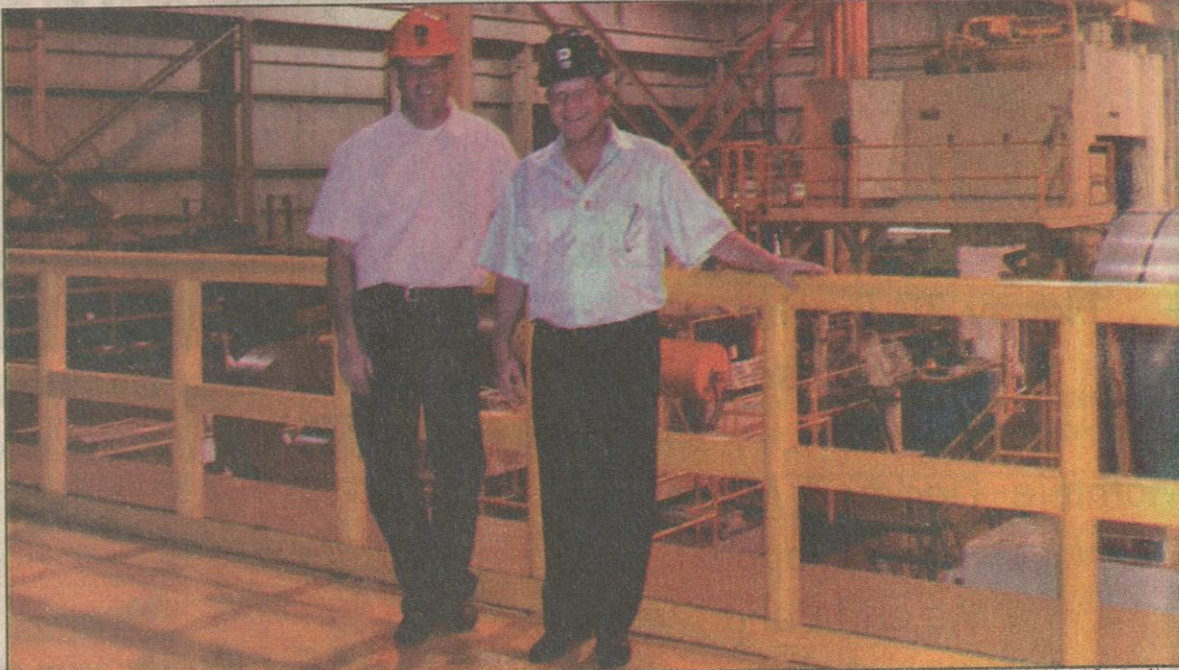

said Andrew Dennen last week during his short visit.

Dennen supplies some Toyota

suppliers both in America and Canada already, and local officials have claimed it is the first second-tier Toyota supplier to locate in Mississippi.

The company also supplies component parts for computers, refrigerators units, barbecue grills, trucks and a diverse array of other products.

Construction is scheduled to start in the next 30 days on the facility, according to Dennen.

The project has been in the design stages for some time, and

the auction of TVA-owned land adjoining the Port was one of the crucial steps to start the construction process.

In a process similar to how other Yellow Creek Port companies (Dynasteel, Skyline) acquired Port land, Tishomingo County purchased the 13.6 acres at auction for \$180,060, the minimum TVA would accept, and has received grants to make improvements to the land. Dennen will, over time, purchase the land from the county.

Meth Arrests Indicate Regional Problem

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has arrested and charged several local people with attempting to manufacture methamphetamine.

Monday, July 12th, Tishomingo County narcotics investigators arrested three Benton County residents in Belmont as they attempted to purchase pseudoephedrine, a precursor, or ingredient, of methamphetamine.

A law went into effect July that forbids the purchase of medication containing pseudoephedrine without a doctor's prescription, so these suspects are trying to buy boxes of pseudoephedrine from an individual, Jeff Palmer, Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department narcotics investigator.

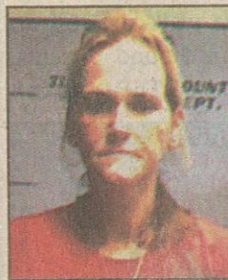
The three arrested Monday are all from Benton County: Patricia Bowen, 37, Steven Cody Bowen, 18, and Edward Sides, 37. Belmont and Golden police officers assisted in the arrest.

As a result of the arrest, investigators obtained information a meth lab at the Bowen residence in Benton County, which was subsequently searched by Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics investigators. Investigators found evidence that indicated the lab at Bowen place had been active more than a year, and that suspects had purchased precursors in Iuka, Booneville, Red Bay, New Albany, Ripley, Southaven and Memphis.

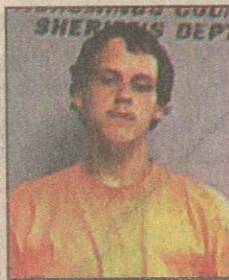
All three will be charged in Tishomingo County and Benton County with possession of two or more precursors,

with intent to produce.

"This is a regional problem, and it is critical that we continue to work in conjunction with other regional law enforcement agencies, and the state authorities to shut this down," said Tishomingo County Sheriff Glenn Whitlock.

On June 29th Tishomingo County narcotics investigators arrested two persons in Burns as they were attempting to purchase "precursors" the ingredients manufacturers use to make the toxic mixture that ends up as methamphetamine.

Mike Adams, 52, of Mantachie, and Christina Flores, 31, of Corinth were arrested and charged with conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine. The day before, June 28th, both were charged with the same offense, in Fulton, and additionally were charged with possession of two or more precursors.

Adams was already out on

bond in Prentiss County for a charge of possession of two or more precursors with intent to manufacture methamphetamine.

According to Palmer, this is the third arrest of Adams in the past 6-7 months.

The investigation is ongoing, as authorities seek other people who are allegedly involved in this operation, said Palmer.

On July 5th, TCSD investigators arrested Gary Bo Massey, of County Road 94, Tishomingo, for possession of methamphetamine with intent to distribute, and possession of two or more precursors with intent. Massey is currently on five years probation in Alabama for possession of methamphetamine, and is awaiting sentencing.

The sheriff's department had received numerous reports that Massey was still involved in meth manufacturing activities in Tishomingo County.

Northpoint Bingo Began Operation Monday in Former Ford Building

Northpoint Bingo, Iuka's third bingo charitable gaming operation, opened this week in the former Iuka Ford location on Battleground Drive.

The Northpoint facility opened Monday afternoon with a good crowd, said Shawn Phelps, Administrative Director for Mississippi Community Education Center (MCEC), the non-profit, charitable organization that the new Northpoint operation will help fund.

Bingo operations in Mississippi support a charitable organization by state law. According to Sonny Weatherby, Director with the Mississippi Gaming Commission, MCEC sought the Northpoint license, and it funds educational workshops, and funds the New Summit School in

Jackson, a program in Carthage, Mississippi, and a program in Lee County. He suggested the www.mscec.org website for additional information.

Phelps said Tuesday that he had been hired by MCEC to help them expand their operations in northeast Mississippi, and he looks forward to continuing to help people in Iuka and Tishomingo County.

"My kids are here, I've lived here a long time, I told them I had to see them doing things to help this area," explained Phelps of his new position at MCEC.

Phelps said he has been very busy with getting Northpoint up and running, and that he has already helped MCEC to seek grant funding for a childhood obesity awareness program.

Riverhills Bingo Reorganizing; Plans to Reopen July 26th

Last week's news that the Riverhills Bingo establishment was temporarily closing, had many people in the area concerned about their scholarships, but Dr. Bob Ferguson says that they are well on their way to reorganizing and ensuring that the millions of dollars in Tri-State Foundation scholarships will continue.

In an interview Tuesday, Ferguson confirmed that the Tri-State Foundation Board of Directors has hired Lisa Buck as the new executive director of the non-profit Foundation, and is hiring personnel to operate the Riverhills Bingo establishment on Highway 72 in Iuka, which funds the Foundation.

Dr. Ferguson is one of the five members of the Tri-State Foundation Board, which oversees

the operation of the foundation founded 11 years ago. The day-to-day work of the Foundation is the responsibility of the executive director. There are four other members of the board, including Sylvia Ferguson, Dr. Ferguson's wife.

Tri-State Foundation has awarded more than \$7 million in scholarships to area junior college, college, and trade school students, said Ferguson, and they have funds in reserve. They will continue to try to honor the scholarships that are active, he said.

Bingo operations in Mississippi are governed by the Mississippi Gaming Commission as fundraisers for non-profit organizations.

Tri-State Foundation never lost its gaming license, contrary to some local speculation.

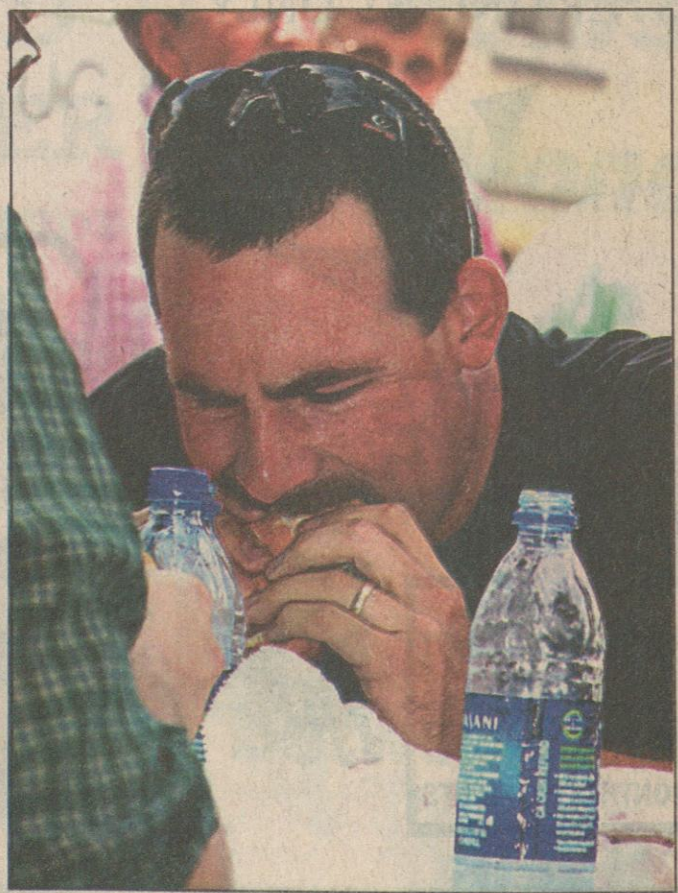
Smith & Puckett Win at Slugburger Festival - Second Year in a Row!

Jeremy Smith finished first with a time of 4 minutes and 27 seconds. His prize was \$100 and a trip to New Orleans.

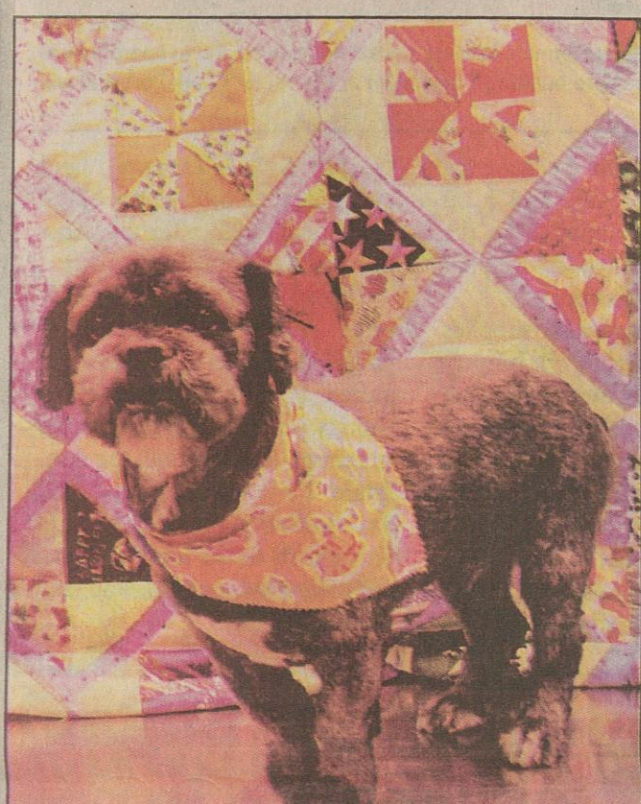

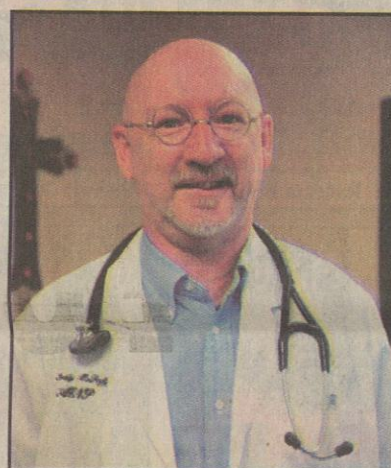
McDuffy Returns to Burnsville Clinic

The Burnsville Medical Clinic has welcomed Randy McDuffy, ACNP back to practice.

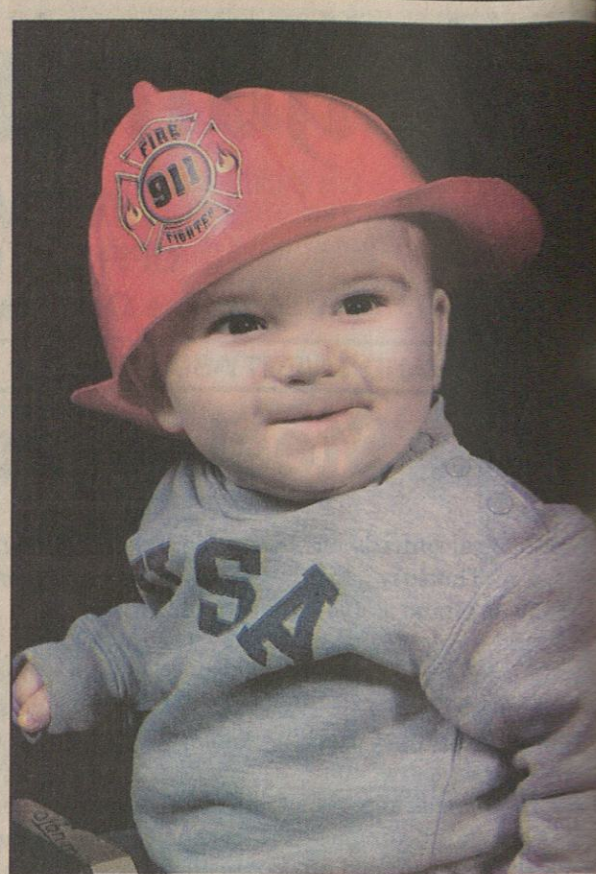
McDuffy is a nurse practitioner and he and his staff can treat nearly any acute or chronic medical conditions for patients older than 15 years.

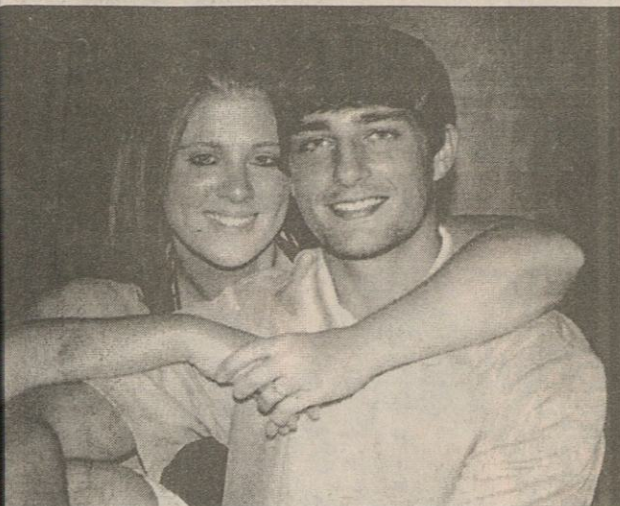

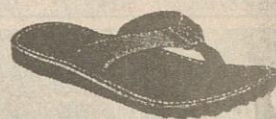

NOTICE OF TAX INCREASE TISHOMINGO COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District will hold a public hearing on its proposed school district budget for fiscal year 2010-2011 on July 19, 2010, 5:30 p.m., at the Superintendent's office. At this meeting, a proposed ad valorem tax effort increase shall be considered.

The Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is now operating with projected total budget revenue of \$28,270,054. 16% or \$4,511,219, of such revenue is obtained through ad valorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the proposed budget has total projected revenue of \$26,524,346. Of that amount 19% or \$5,166,307, is proposed to be financed through a total ad valorem tax levy.

For the next fiscal year, the Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District plans to increase your ad valorem tax millage rate by five mills from 35 mills to 40 mills.

This increase in ad valorem tax revenue means that you will pay more in ad valorem taxes on your home, automobile tag, utilities, business fixtures and equipment and rental real property.

Any citizen of Tishomingo County Special Municipal Separate School District is invited to attend this public hearing, and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken.

Application Process Program Is For 30 Days Only....

On July 7, 2010, Mississippi Emergency Management announced that the STORM SHELTER PROGRAM, "A SAFE PLACE TO GO", application process has begun.

Funding, the state will use Federal funds to reimburse up to 75% of the eligible costs of constructing or installing safe rooms or shelters of an amount not to exceed \$4,000.00 for Single family shelters or in-residence safe rooms. The 25% non-federal share or all amounts in excess of \$4,000.00 is the responsibility of the project applicant.

Who is eligible? Eligible recipients are individuals in recently declared counties for individual assistance. The first priority of the state is to make the grant funds available to homeowners that sustained documented damage to their properties as a result of the declared counties. The second priority is to offer the grants to those applicants within the declared counties that did not sustain damage.

Specifications. The construction of a safe room in-ground or above ground must meet written specifications in FEMA 320

and National Storm Shelter Association Standards. Note: In ground shelters can not be installed in a floodplain or other identified special flood hazard area.

Application Process. Applications must first be submitted to MEMA (Mississippi Emergency Management Agency). Website www.msema.org. Applications will be reviewed by MEMA and FEMA to determine project eligibility.
