Tax Free Weekend In Mississippi

Businesses throughout Mississippi will be offering a Tax ree Weekend, on Friday, July 30th and Saturday, July 31st, to help parents buy back to school merchandise. Only clothing and shoes will be sold tax free on Friday and Saturday. Local businesses will be participating and some are advertising their specials in this issue of The News.

This is Mississippi's second year to participate in a sales tax holiday. There will be a \$100 limit per item. Layaways are not tax exempt. Only store coupons and discounts can be used to lower the price below the dollar limit. Manufacturer's coupons can't be used to bring the price below the threshold. Rain check purchases are only exempt if the item is bought during the sales tax holiday.

Fatal Accident In Itawamba County

At approximately 4:55 pm, Wednesday afternoon, the Mississippi Highway Patrol responded to a motor vehicle collision involving a semi-tractor trailer near the Fairview Community on MS 25 in Itawamba County. Upon arriving it appeared Jose Rigual III, 23, of Golden, was northbound driving a 1990 Lexus, when he apparently attempted to make a left turn onto Burnt Fields Road and pulled into the path of a southbound 1998 International Semi-Tractor and Trailer, operated by Joby Morgan, 36, of Booneville.

A passenger in Rigual's vehicle was killed as a result of the crash. Jasper Rigual, 5 months old, also of Golden, was pronounced dead at the scene. The infant was properly fastened in a child safety seat at the time of the

Jose Rigual III was transported to North Mississippi Medical Center with non lifethreaten injuries. He was wearing his seat belt.

The crash disrupted traffic flow on MS 25 for approximately 2 hours. The accident remains under investigation by the Mississippi Highway Patrol.

Colds-Hog hoof tea, mullein tea, golden rod tea, and wild onion poultices on the skillful in doctoring and patient's chest were reputed to bring "fast relief" to sufferers of the common cold.

Consumption—There were several methods for treating consumption. Perhaps the most unusual called for the patient to drink the warm blood from a freshly killed bull. If there was a reluctance to slaughter a bull, the warm milk of a red cow could be drunk; if possible, it was best to drink the warm milk of a heifer with her first calf.

Ear, Tooth, or Stomach Ache-For these various aches, heat was applied in hot water "bottles" made of dried pigs' bladders. Poultices of hot salt tied in a woolen bag or sock were also used to apply heat to the aching region.

Headache—Cedar and elder leaves were placed together in warm water and then applied to the forehead to relieve headaches.

posedly caused by breaking up the soil and cutting timber. Both of these tasks caused a decay of vegetable matter, and this decaying matter produced congestive chills and fevers. Pioneers believed that trees planted around a house would keep out the malaria because the leaves would catch the fever-carrying mists which rose up from the swamps and low places. Pioneers also believed that bathing in sun-warmed water was good for chills; that whiskey, in which dogwood bark was steeped, was a sure cure for chills and fever; and that poultices of the leaves of the castor bean would relieve the headaches caused by malarial fever.

Nosebleed-If afflicted with a nosebleed, a patient was advised to hold a kernel of

termelon seed mashed up red corn on his nose. If this failed, the bleeding could be stopped by allowing some of the blood to drip onto an axe or knife which was then buried in the ground.

> Nightmares—A full night's sleep, uninterrupted by nightmares, could be obtained by placing a fork under the pillow.

Rheumatism—There were two cures for rheumatic pains. Most considered pole cat grease as the best cure. Others believed that relief could be obtained by carrying a buckeye in the pocket.

Snakebite—Certain herbs were always carried in the pocket against snakebite. One cure was fern snakeroot, wild hore-hound, and wild plantain or St. Andrew's cross. If bitten by a snake, the unfortunate victim would chew a quantity of any of these roots, swallow a part of it, and apply some of the chewed root to the wound. This procedure was repeated in proportion to the poison of the snake. However, competent medical personnel were very outspoken in their opposition

of this remedy.


"Sore Mouth" in Children-There were several cures for children afflicted with "sour mouth." These included putting a piece of pine top up the chimney (when the pine branch withered, the child would be cured); rubbing the mouth with the leaves of a white oak, and then crossing two white oak sticks in the mouth; and tying up a lock of the child's


Splinters-To "draw out" a splinter, the pioneer bound a piece of fat meat to the afflicted part.
