Iuka Man Charged After Fred's Break-in

An Iuka man has been charged with two counts of burglary following a break-in at Fred's just after midnight last Thursday. According to Iuka Police Chief Randy Stringer, a passerby called the Iuka Police reporting an alarm going off at Fred's at about 12:20 a.m. Officers Randy Trimm and Chuck Dean responded, and called the keyholder to gain entrance to the store. When they entered the store, they heard the pharmacy alarm sounding, and saw someone in the area of the store, said Stringer.

The suspect fled through the back door, and officers pursued him on foot toward Gann Street, where he was apprehended with the assistance of a taser. Jody West, 31, has been charged with two counts of burglary and larceny, said Stringer. When apprehended, he had a box full of empty pill bottles, a cough syrup, and a Mountain Dew. West had apparently entered the building through the roof, said Stringer, but had opened the back door when he was inside. West has been released from the Tishomingo County Jail.

Board Authorizes Bond Issue Approval Process to Begin

County citizens have some input on possible \$5,200,000 bond issue

The Board of Supervisors passed a resolution Monday that states the approval process for a \$5,200,000 bond issue to build a jail in Tishomingo County. Along the same 3-2 lines as all the jail-related votes, the board voted to have the bond issue publicized for the next three weeks. If 1,500 or 20 percent of the qualified electorate doesn't file a written protest by the September 1 deadline, the bonds will be issued. If there is a valid protest, the bond issue could come to a county-wide vote. First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom, who along with James McDowell (5th), and Penny Ryan (3rd), voted for the bond issue, again presented arguments in support of building a jail, stating, "it's not going to be a burden on the taxpayers."

a state corrections official stating that the county would be able to house state prisoners in the new jail, for which they would be paid a daily amount that would essentially offset the monthly payment on the proposed bond issue. Second District Nicky McRae, joined by Steve Thorne (4th), stated that dozens of arguments against building a jail with taxpayer money could also be presented, but that the board should "just move on with the process, already." In other business, the board authorized some additional roof repairs in the amount of \$1,680 on the old health department building, which currently houses the county's Department of Human Services. Workers performing repair to the fascia boards discovered significant rotting of the decking under the current roof. The board authorized the final payment on an addition for

New River Homes in Burnsville. The board authorized Wanda Christian of Northeast Mississippi Planning and Development to seek emergency funding in the amount of \$100,000 to pay for two separate water system extensions to provide water to homes that are apparently beyond the reach of Dennis and Short-Coleman water associations current lines. The emergency grant would fund 100 percent of the required work, said Christian. According to Nicky McRae, some homes south of County Road 298 have been without water, and have been carrying spring water for household use. They should have water lines run in the next few weeks, McRae said, as he has been working on this issue for some time. The other area is in the Belmont bottom area, near County Road 68, said Fifth District Supervisor James McDowell.

Iuka Man Pushing for Wet County

An Iuka man is pushing for the county to hold its first referendum on alcohol sales since 1966, but time is not on his side for it to get on the November ballot. Charles "Tubby" Aldridge, of Iuka, is soliciting signatures on a petition to call for an election to legalize the sale of beer and light wine, and alcoholic beverages in Tishomingo County. To legalize beer and light wine sales, state law (Mississippi 1972 Code Annotated 67-3-7) calls for a petition with 20 percent of qualified electors to be presented to the county board of supervisors to be considered in a county election. The board would then present it to the circuit court clerk, who will verify if the signatures are valid. If all requirements are met, the measure could be considered in a county-wide election. However the law to legalize alcohol (Mississippi 1972 Code Annotated 67-1-11) calls for 20 percent or 1,500 signatures, whichever is less.

According to an official opinion by the Mississippi State Attorney General in a 2004 Tate County case, it will be up to the board of supervisors of the county to determine the sufficiency of the petition(s) in question. "If he gets them [the signatures], we will proceed in accordance with state law," said Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors President James McDowell. If there is a chance to get it on the November ballot, all the signatures must be validated, and the board has to issue an order to the election commission for it to be added to the November 2nd general election ballot no later than Friday, September 3rd. On that ballot at this time are national and state offices, and the second district school board position.

The possibility of a special election would require additional consideration by county officials. 1966 Special Election According to newspaper archives, the last time the county considered the issue was in a special election in December 1966, when it was soundly defeated. At that time, there were two separate elections (beer and wine, and liquor).

More Signatures Needed

So far, he has nearly 100 signatures, but Aldridge said he was rained out when he had made the petition publicly available in Mineral Springs Park last Sunday. "It's not like you can't get a drink in Tishomingo County," said Aldridge on Tuesday. "It's just that Alabama, Tennessee and even Corinth get all the revenue and tax money from people going out of county to buy it; we get the garbage." Aldridge said he sat at an Alabama package store on a recent Friday evening and counted 931 Tishomingo county car tags coming through, and about 30 Alcorn county tags. Aldridge also said that it hurts the county when it is pursuing industrial clients. "No one is going to bring jobs to a county that's dry," he said. "Plus, the county tax payers are soon going to have their taxes increased to pay for a jail; we could pay for projects like that with tax dollars we are now sending away," said Aldridge. Aldridge said he has a lot of support. One lady took several petition sheets to distribute and collect signatures. "I'm not putting [the petitions] in businesses; I'm not asking people to jeopardize their business," he explained. "But if they want one, I will bring them one." "We've got the wettest dry county in the whole state - we ought to benefit from those tax dollars," said one Aldridge supporter who called the newspaper this week. Aldridge will be in the park again this Sunday from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m., he said.

Booneville Says No to Beer

In a Tuesday election, Booneville voters decided by a slim margin not to allow beer sales in the city. The unofficial tally was 1,362 against and 1,341 in favor of passing the measure - a 21 vote margin. The last time the issue was considered in Booneville was 27 years ago.



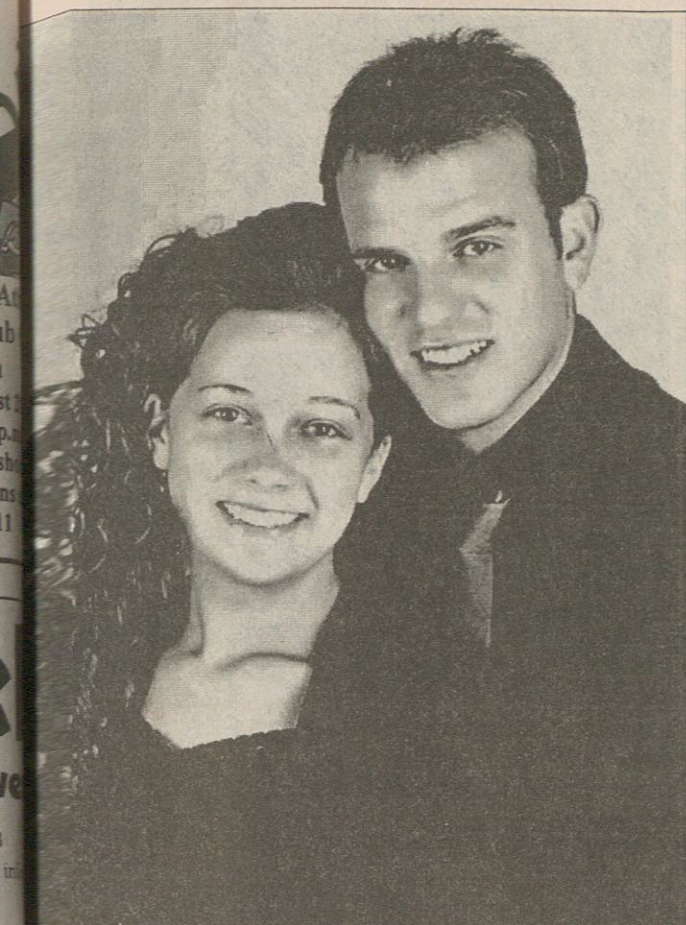

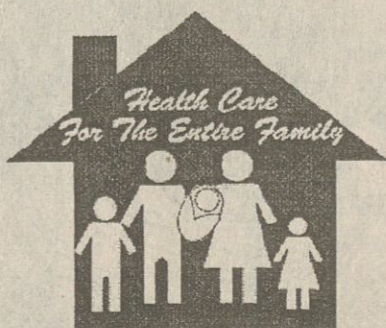

#### What should I do during a heat wave?

- ✓ Listen to your local radio for critical updates from the National Weather Service.
- ✓ Never leave children or pets alone in enclosed vehicles.
- ✓ Stay hydrated by drinking plenty of fluids even if you do not feel thirsty. Avoid drinks with caffeine and alcohol.
- ✓ Eat small meals and eat more often.
- ✓ Avoid extreme temperature changes
- ✓ Wear loose-fitting, lightweight, light-colored clothing.
- ✓ Slow down, stay indoors and avoid strenuous exercise during the hottest part of the day.
- ✓ Postpone outdoor games and activities
- ✓ Use a buddy system when working in the heat.

- ✓ Check on family, friends and neighbors who do not have air conditioning.
- ✓ Check on your animals frequently to ensure they are not suffering from the heat.

- ✓ Weakness
- ✓ Dizziness
- ✓ Headache

Seek medical attention if symptoms worsen or last longer than one hour



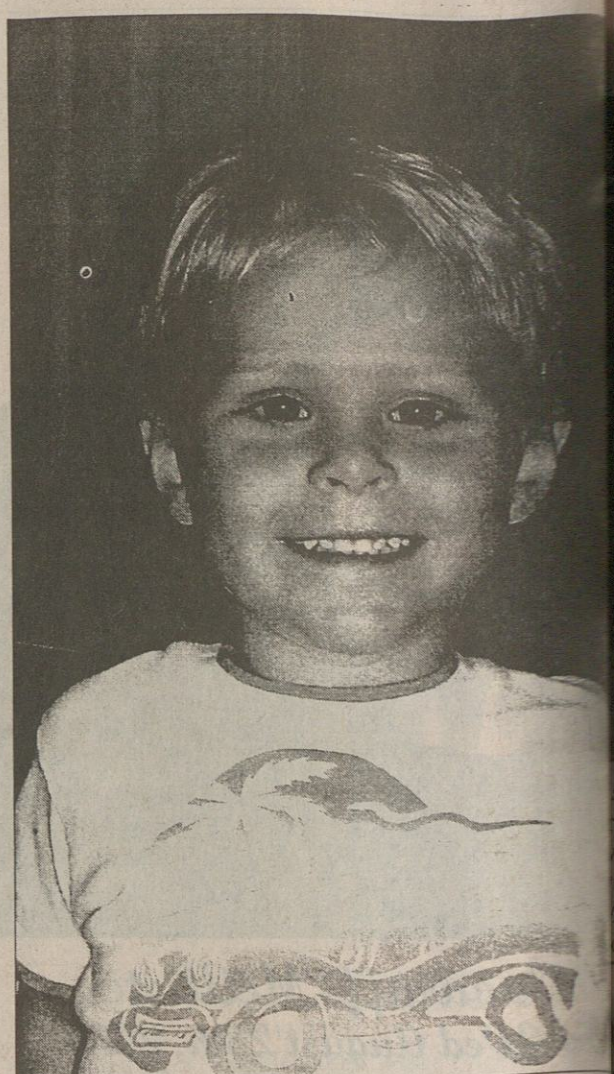

# The Life of Sneaky Snake

GRILLED ONION SALSA

2 large onions, sliced  
2 large tomatoes, chopped  
1/4 cup seeded jalapeño peppers, chopped  
1/4 cup fresh cilantro, chopped  
1 teaspoon cumin seeds  
Freshly squeezed lime juice  
Salt

Grill the onion slices. Coarsely chop the grilled rings and mix with the chopped tomatoes, jalapeño peppers, cilantro and

cumin seeds. Season with salt and fresh lime juice. (Makes about 3 cups.)

ROASTED CORN AND SALSA

2 ears corn in husks (about 1 1/4 cups)  
1 tablespoon vegetable oil or olive oil  
1 cup chopped onion  
1/2 cup coarsely chopped cilantro leaves  
3 tablespoons

squeezed lime juice  
1 teaspoon sugar  
1/2 teaspoon cumin seeds, crushed  
mortar  
1 teaspoon hot crushed red flakes or 1 tablespoon fresh chilies  
2 to 3 teaspoons chipotle, canned adobo sauce  
1 to 2 teaspoons sauce from chipotles  
Husk corn kernels from cobs (long-bladed knife, about 2 cups). Heat large skillet over heat. Add corn and for about 2 minutes until lightly golden and sauté longer. Remove heat and combine all other ingredients in bowl. (Makes 12 or 3 cups.)

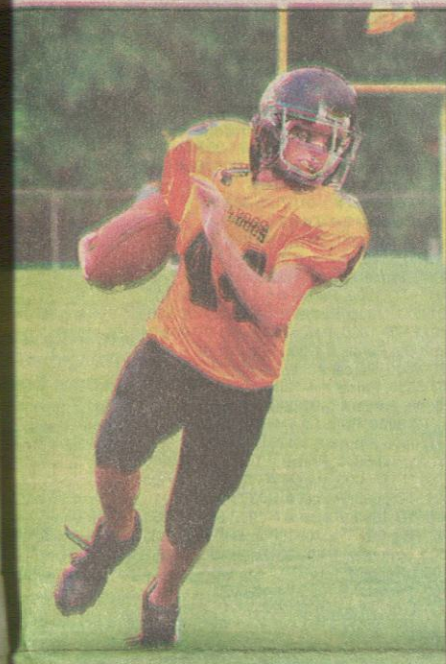


# Crowds Enjoy Annual Middle School Jamboree Despite Downpours

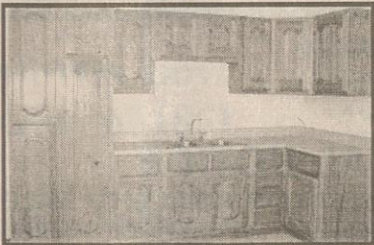

### LEGAL NOTICE

There came on for consideration at a duly constituted meeting of the Mayor and Board of Alderman for the Town of Tishomingo, Tishomingo, Mississippi, held on the 3rd day of August, 2010, the following Ordinance:

#### ORDINANCE

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF TISHOMINGO TO PROHIBIT THE USE, PURCHASE, POSSESSION, DISTRIBUTION, SALE OR OFFERING FOR SALE OF SYNTHETIC CANNABINOIDS OR OTHER SYNTHETIC PRODUCTS**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Alderman of Tishomingo, Mississippi, have determined that certain businesses within the Town of Tishomingo, Mississippi, are selling certain substances that have been treated with chemicals which have not been approved for human consumption and which, when ingested, produce intoxicating effects similar to THC or marijuana and/or Methcathinone; and

WHEREAS, the products so treated as marked as "not for human consumption", however, they are being packaged, marketed, sold, and used by citizens as an alternative to marijuana and other controlled substances and are potentially dangerous to users; and

WHEREAS, marketing efforts have made it clear that the actual intended use of these products is for ingestion for the intoxicating effects, with such names as "Fake Weed", "Mr. Smiley", "Proze Smoke", etc.; and

WHEREAS, clinical studies such as the THC Pharm study reported on December 15, 2008, and the Zimmerman, Winkelmann, Pilhatsch, Nees, Spanagel, and Schulz testing (reported as "Withdrawal Phenomena, and Dependence Syndrome After Consumption of 'Spice Gold'") have confirmed the existence of the addition of synthetic cannabinoids to these products, as well as their potency and deleterious effect upon the health of those consuming these products; and

WHEREAS, based upon these scientific studies as well as other scientific studies and reports, alerts, and warnings from various local, state, federal, and international law enforcement officials and agencies, it has been determined that the effects of these substances are a threat to the health, welfare, safety and well being of the citizens of the Town of Tishomingo, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the Town of Tishomingo, Mississippi, have determined the need to exercise municipal police powers of the Town by establishing regulations preventing the use, possession, purchase, distribution, sale or attempt to use, possess, purchase, distribute or sell or publicly display for sale any one or more of the chemicals identified herein, and the products that contain them within the city limits of the Town of Tishomingo, Mississippi; and therefore adopt the following regulations and penalties related thereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMAN OF THE TOWN OF TISHOMINGO, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the matters and things set forth in the above preamble are hereby accepted as stated as the findings of the Tishomingo Board of Alderman.

1. No person shall use, possess, purchase, distribute, sell or attempt to use, possess, purchase, distribute or sell or publicly display for sale any one or more of the following chemicals, either alone or in combination with other legal or illegal substances, within the city limits of the Town of Tishomingo, Mississippi:

a. 1-Pentyl-3-(1-naphthoyl) indole (IUPAC name: Naphthalen-1-yl-(1-pentylindol-3-yl)methanone) which is sometimes marketed under the name JWH-018/spice, or other names;

b. 1-Butyl-3-(1-naphthoyl) indole (IUPAC name: naphthalene-1-yl-(1-butylindol-3-yl)methanone) which is sometimes marked under the name JWH-073, or other names;

c. 1-(3-(trifluoromethylphenyl) piperazine (IUPAC name) which is sometimes marketed under the name TFMP, or other names;

d. 4-methoxymethcathinone and Ethylcathinone; 3, 4-methylenedioxypropylvalerone and related analogs and CP-47,497 and related homologs (also seen in spice), such as C6, C8, and C9;

e. Or any structural analogs similar to those listed above, including but not limited to synthetic cannabinoids.

2. If any of the aforementioned substance shall be found in the possession of any person, unless specifically excluded herein, the substances shall be confiscated and destroyed by law enforcement officials.

3. It shall not be an offense under Paragraph 1 above of this

Ordinance if a person shall be acting at the direction of an authorized agent of the Town of Tishomingo, Mississippi, to enforce or ensure compliance with this law prohibiting the use, possession, purchase, distribution or sale or the attempt to use, possess, purchase, distribute or sell or publicly display for sale the aforementioned substances.

4. This ordinance shall not apply to any person who shall commit any act described in this Ordinance pursuant to the direction or prescription of a duly licensed physician or dentist authorized to direct or prescribe such act. This Ordinance shall not apply to the inhalation or anesthesia for a medical or dental purpose which inhalation or anesthesia shall be administered by or under the supervision of a duly licensed physician or dentist.

5. Any person found to be guilty of violation of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail not to exceed six (6) months or both.

SECTION 2. This ordinance is necessary for the immediate and permanent preservation of the public peace, health, welfare and safety of the Town of Tishomingo due to the unchecked use of these substances, particularly by juveniles, therefore, this ordinance shall become effective immediately if adopted by unanimous vote of all members of the Board of Alderman, or in thirty days otherwise, but shall in any event be published as provided by law. It shall be spread on the minutes of the Town of Tishomingo Aldermen.

The above and foregoing Ordinance, after having been first reduced to writing and read by the Clerk, was introduced by Alderman Gary Harlan, seconded by Alderwoman Fredia Hale, and was adopted by the following roll call vote: Alderwoman Barbara Oaks voted yea, Alderwoman Shirl Butler voted yea, Alderwoman Anne Taylor voted yea, Alderman Gary Harlan voted yea, and Alderwoman Fredia Hale voted yea.

WHEREUPON, the Mayor declared the motion carried unanimously and the Ordinance adopted, this the 3rd day of August, 2010.

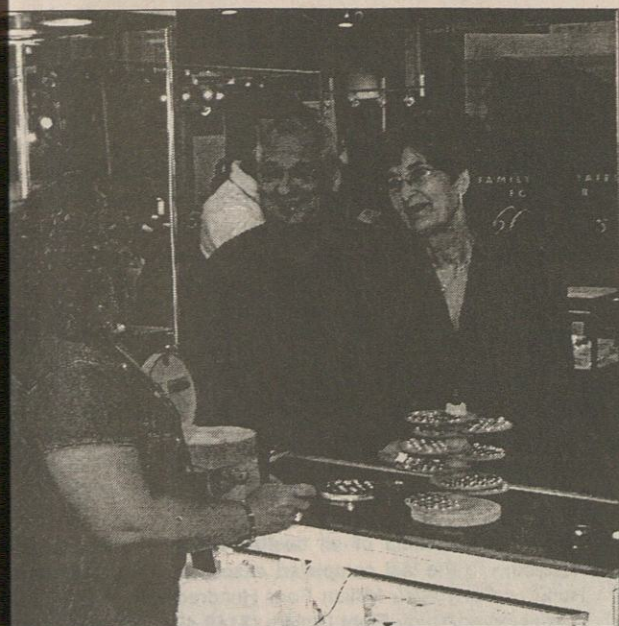

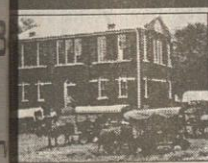

### Civil War Boys in Gray of 1861

Committed to the Tishomingo County Historical & Geological Society by Jan Scher and Helah Wilson; described by RaNae S. Gagn on June 16, 2010. Source: *The Tishomingo County News* (Iuka, Miss.), May 13, 1971.

Mr. W. R. Akers of Beloit, Miss., sent *The Tishomingo County News* a copy of a clipping from a newspaper about the turn of the century. This clipping contained information about a Confederate company that entered into the service in 1861.

Mr. Akers believes this company was recruited at the Horn, a few miles northwest of the present site of Bay-Springs. He says the Horn was the voting precinct of this area, and the company was known as the "Horn Grays." Many of this company are buried in Mackey's Creek Cemetery on the hill north of Bay-Springs, which is on Highway 4 from Dennis to Oneville.

The roll of original members of the 26<sup>th</sup> Mississippi Regiment will doubtless be of great interest, and through the courtesy of Mr. Akers, we are publishing a list.

## I Remember Eastport

From Dr. Ben Kitchens' book, *Gunboats and Cavalry: A History of Eastport, Mississippi, With Special Emphasis on Events of the War Between the States*.

"I well remember the first time I ever saw Eastport, Mississippi. It was in the 1850s and I was a small boy, not over 10 years of age. I begged for and obtained permission to go with Uncle John Davis to market. We then lived in Itawamba County over 60 miles from Eastport, but it was our nearest market. It took six days to make the trip with close driving of steers. We carried six bales of cotton on an old tar wagon, homemade at that."

"I watched everything closely on that trip, as would be expected of a boy on his first trip away from home."

"We reached the head of Hungry Hollow, about two miles from Eastport in the afternoon of the third day and stopped to get water at a big spring just north of the road. An old man with a big crowd of girls and boys lived there."

about 2:00 p.m. and I hurried through the town to get a look at the Tennessee River. There was a wharf boat there kept by a man named Castleberry and two steamboats were alongside loading with cotton. It was a busy scene. The way those Negro roustabouts handed that cotton was wonderful. After looking till my curiosity was satisfied, I returned to the town on the hill."

"There were 15 or 20 stores all told, but some of them had enormous stocks, especially of groceries and hardware. Uncle John had already sold the cotton to a man named Briggs, and was buying goods, mostly salt, tobacco, flour, sugar, and coffee. We raised everything else in the

eating line at home. He bought me a cloth cap with tassels of which I was immensely proud."

"Mr. John Briggs kept a large general line of merchandise in his store including cotton yarn, plate glass in boxes, prime sugar, "London Ladies" Irish potatoes, die stuffs, oils, paints, and a variety of medicines including Jayne's Family Medicine. Briggs also handled iron, nails, and castings of all sorts and sizes, and a good assortment of furniture. Whiskey, bacon, salt, flour and all other kinds of groceries as well as a good lot of Eastern tan upper and sole leather were kept for sale. He had slat and plow plates and assorted sizes of the best Juniata iron. Briggs had offered two of Pearce's best 60 saw cotton gins for sale and a large lot of baled hay, 40 kegs of nails from 4 penny to 20 penny in size, 400 sacks of Liverpool salt, 50 barrels of

sugar, and 6 fine rifles. A general assortment of staple and farming dry goods together with shoes, boats, hats, capes, and bonnets of the latest styles were sold in his store."

"It began raining before night. Uncle John had on a pair of buckskin pants; and as they got wet, they began to stretch and got under his feet. He would pull out his knife occasionally and cut off the ends. He did this several times. I think from the way he acted he had been drinking heavily. Briggs had several barrels of whiskey open and all anyone had to do was help himself. Well, about night it stopped raining and we camped near town. As Uncle John's breeches got dry, they began to crawl up his legs, and by bedtime they got up to his knees. The rest of the crowd laughed at him a great deal. He had to go back to town and buy another pair of pants."

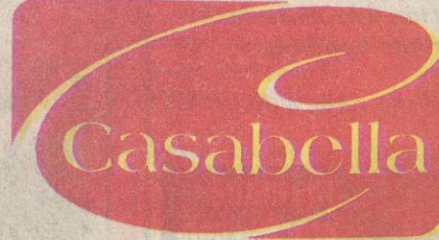
