The play is a hillbilly rendition of the story of Mary and Joseph and is sure to delight all ages.

At 1 p.m. center stage will move to the War Memorial for a special presentation by Mayor Jackie Bryant to Iuka C Troop 1-98th Calvary, Iuka's own National Guard Unit. ## First Book Signing Friday Night for Reprint of Eastport History

Just in time for Heritage Day celebrations, the new edition of *Gunboats and Cavalry: History of Eastport in the Civil War* will be available at a special event Friday night at the Tishomingo County Archives and History Museum.

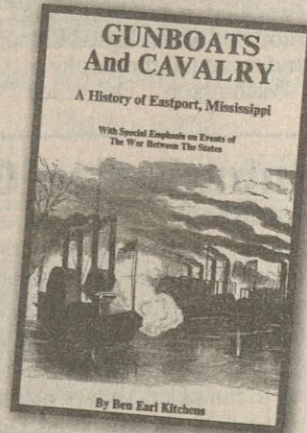
From 5 to 7 p.m. local history buffs can get their new copy of this historic work by Dr. Ben Kitchens. Dr. Kitchens himself will be available from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. to sign new or existing copies of the book he wrote describing the importance of the now non-existent bustling town of Eastport

on the Tennessee River.

Eastport predated Iuka, and was a critical strategic location during the Civil War as a thriving port, explained Harold Lomenick, of the Iuka Battlefield Commission.

Dr. Kitchens has donated all future proceeds from the sale of the new edition of *Gunboats*, and another soon-to-be-released book, *Rosecrans Meets Price: The Battle of Iuka*, to the Iuka Battlefield Commission, in conjunction with the Tishomingo County Historical & Genealogical Society.

## New River Homes Second Factory to Close in Two Months

### Meridian Furniture Closed Last Month

New River Homes announced this week that they were closing the business, making the second county employer to shut down in a month.

Meridian Furniture announced its closure about a month ago, along with 35 jobs.

New River has employed as many as 300 in its Burnsville facility, but recently about 60 workers were on the payroll, according to Tishomingo County Development Foundation statistics.

"The average family cannot borrow money nowadays to purchase a manufactured home," said owners Jack and Brad Beard in a statement released by Tishomingo County Development Foundation Tuesday. "The demand is great, but the money is non-existent."

"We are grateful for all the hard work by our former team

members," said Brad Beard. The state's rapid response team was in town August 25th to meet with former New River Homes team members to help them transition to a new job or retrain for another job, according to the release.

New River occupied a 100,000 square-foot facility that is owned by Tishomingo County. It consists of two buildings on a 39-acre site adjacent to Northeast Mississippi Waterfront Industrial Park, a 900-acre industrial park owned by Yellow Creek Port Authority.

The company has always been community-minded and not long ago built the band stand for Burnsville's Waterway Festival and other local events, stated the release. They donated eight computers and a copier from their offices to the Tishomingo County schools.

"We thank the county board

of supervisors and the mayor and board of aldermen of Burnsville for all their help and support over the years," said Jack Beard. "We feel that with the pro-business attitude of local officials and workers, Tishomingo County's economy will do well once the recession is over."

Meridian Furniture opened with a ribbon cutting November 2009, complete with an appearance by Lt. Governor Phil Bryant. It specialized in upholstered furniture, and its shutdown leaves only two furniture manufacturing companies operating in Tishomingo County, where there were once many.

Both companies claimed that the poor economic climate in the country, and the inability to borrow capital for expenses contributed to the shutdowns.

Services will be at 7 p.m. each Tuesday night, and everyone is invited.

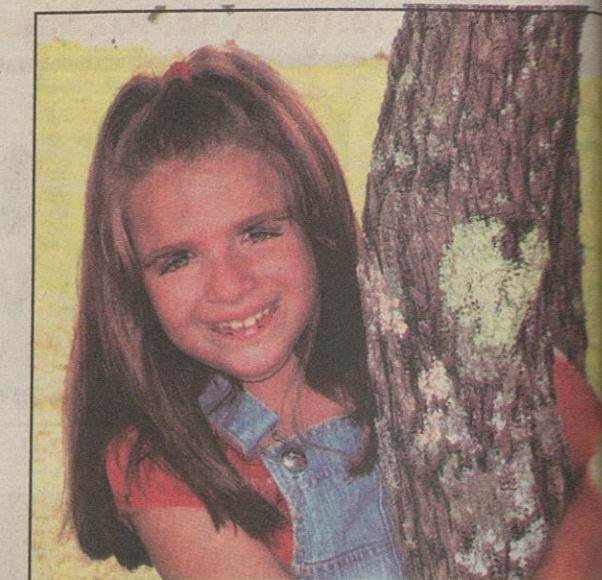
## Important Changes to the County Fair Tiny Tot and King & Queen Contests

Age divisions are as follows: 0-6 months, 7-12 months, 13-18 months and 19-23 months as of October 9th.

The King & Queen show is also set for Saturday, October 9th beginning at 5:00 p.m. This contest is open to all girls ages 2-19 years old and boys ages 2-7 years old as of October 9th who are residents of Tishomingo County. Age divisions are as follows: 2-3 years girls/boys, 4-5 years girls/boys, 6-7 years girls/boys, 8-9 years girls only, 10-11 years girls only, 12-13 years girls only, 14-15 years girls only, 16-17 years girls only and 18-19 years girls only.

## Conservation Corner

### Remembering a Great Sportsman

Sportsmen lost a great friend on August 9, 2010 when former U.S. Senator Ted Stevens of Alaska died in a plane crash in a remote corner of Alaska. He and a group of friends were flying to the Nushagak River to fish for silver salmon. Four other passengers perished along with the former Senator. The tragic accident was declared to have been caused by Alaska's treacherous weather.

Stevens always loved Alaska fishing and on numerous occasions his dear friend Thad Cochran joined him. Toward the end of his 40-year-long Senate career, he wrestled a monster king salmon out of the Kenai River and mounted the trophy in his Washington, DC office.

Many a meeting about appropriations or public lands policy would be interrupted by the tale of catching the big one which hung there on the wall.

He was a strong supporter of hunting. During the late 1970s, the Carter Administration had closed millions of acres of Alaska public lands to hunting. All of the wonderful opportunities for hunting brown bear, caribou, Dall sheep, moose and mountain goats were cut off by the stroke of a pen. Stevens fought to reopen many of these lands and was successful in 1980.

Like his friend Thad, Stevens was a long-time member of the powerful Appropriations Committee which writes the government

funding bills. He served as Chairman from 1997-2001 and 2003-05. He was always interested in Interior programs and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, where his daughter, Beth, now serves. He was a long-time defender of access to public lands and the protection of duck hunting and conservation programs, something we in Mississippi also cherish.

Years later, he played a key behind-the-scenes role in the enactment of the 1997 Refuge Improvement Act, something I played a major role in as well. This important law makes hunting and fishing "priority public uses" of the Refuge system (and cut off endless anti-hunter lawsuits seeking to terminate hunting on these public lands). The bill passed the House but Senate approval was up in the air until Stevens broke the road block.

One of his legacies is the Magnuson Stevens Act that sets ocean fishing policy. This Act makes conservation of our precious fishery resources the law of the land. He was always committed to assuring that our great fisheries would be managed scientifically for the benefit of anglers and commercial interests alike.

Stevens was very popular. Alaskans loved Ted Stevens as much as Mississippians love Thad Cochran. And that is a lot.

Like Senator Stevens, I hope I live to be 86 years old and have led a life as full as he did. And if I crash into a mountain in Alaska with my waders on, fly rod in hand, at age 86, so be it. There are worse things.

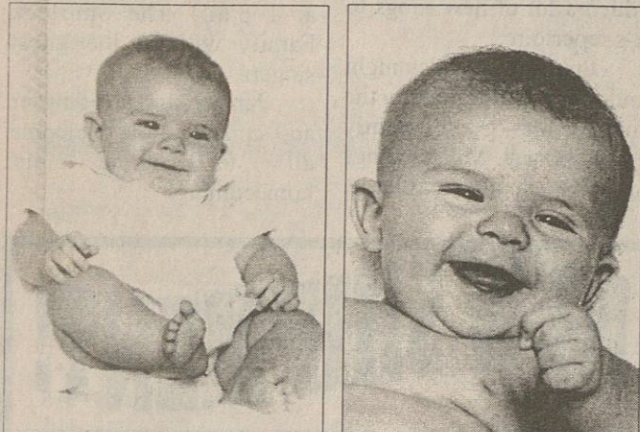

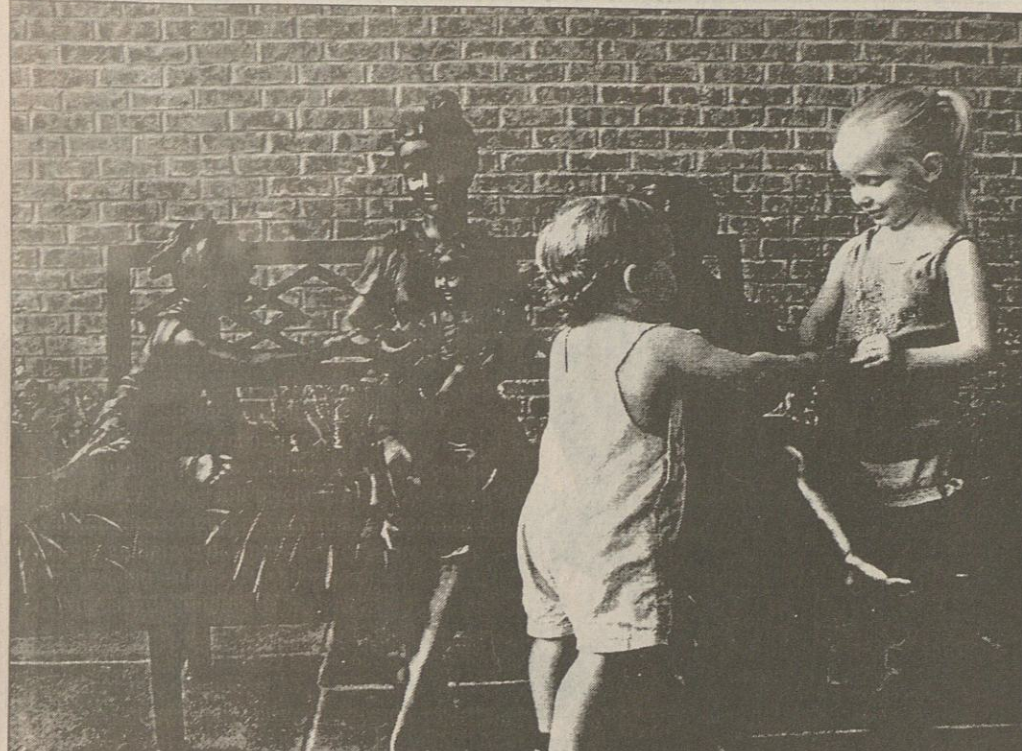
The City of Iuka Mayor and Board of Aldermen will hold a public hearing on its proposed budget for fiscal year 2010-2011 on Tuesday, September 7, 2010 at 6:30 p.m. at Iuka City Hall. At the meeting, a proposed advalorem tax revenue increase in the proposed budget will be considered.

The City of Iuka is now operating with a projected total budget revenue of \$5,671,000. \$224,000 of such revenue is obtained through advalorem taxes. For the next fiscal year, the purposed budget has total projected revenues of \$4,325,000. Of that amount \$243,000 is proposed to be financed through a total advalorem tax levy.

This increase in advalorem means that you will pay more in advalorem taxes on your home, automobile tag, utilities, business fixtures and equipment and rental property.

Any citizen of the City of Iuka is invited to attend this public hearing on the proposed advalorem tax revenue increase in the budget and will be allowed to speak for a reasonable amount of time and offer tangible evidence before any vote is taken. If the Board of Aldermen passes this action, the city millage rate would go from 13.37 to 14.00.

Mayor Pam Oswald announced that Paden's new city hall should begin construction in September. Burnsville is also working on a new hall. The mayors are considering a plan to encourage citizens to shop at home. Approximately half of the income of citizens is spent outside the county. However, statistics do not reflect actual spending by citizens since the amount of money spent within the county includes the spending by visitors and by the sales at the wholesale-retail outlets in Belmont and Golden. The actual percentage of local income spent within Tishomingo County may be as low as 25%. No one can spend all of their income within Tishomingo County, but many of us can spend more of our income within the community. Just a small increase in local spending may lead to the creation of as many as 350 new jobs in retail service businesses.

The next Council of Government meeting is scheduled for November of 2010 in Paden.

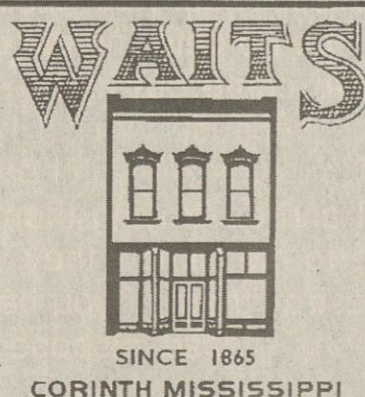

## Southern Cornerstones

### Eastport, Mississippi: Its Birth and Death

This item was written by Irene Barnes and transcribed by Rae Vaughn. It was originally published in the Tishomingo County News (Iuka, Miss.), December 9, 1976.

All ghost towns are not in the west. Eastport, Mississippi, located at the head of steamboat navigation on the Mississippi side of the Tennessee River in Tishomingo County, is extinct. The river port standing there is now flooded by the waters of Pickwick Dam Reservoir. Eastport, so early citizens have told, was in two separate localities. The first settlement was made on the water's edge and a disastrous flood came, sweeping away much of the town, but undaunted the citizens built a better town on the hill, overlooking the bend of the river with Bear Creek in the distance.

A more beautiful location could never have been found! Here on this beautiful bluff, overlooking the scenic Tennessee River, was built a town of good homes, brick sidewalks, two churches—Methodist and Baptist—a Masonic Lodge, an hotel called The Mansion House, and a female college in which were taught higher mathematics, mental and moral philosophy, Latin, French, fine sewing, the making of wax and hair flowers and various other subjects.

The school record of the Eastport Female Institute in 1857 with Miss J. B. Lindsey as teacher, shows the following students: M. Sander, E. Sanders, L. E. Whitaker, L. E. Rose, L. Barrett, B. Barrett, F. Winn, R. Winn, Charles Wamrack, J. Hughes, E. Biffle, F. Robinson, J. Wammack, R. McDaniel, L. McDaniel, A. Simcox, T. Simcox, Ida Christian, L. Coburn, and P. Coburn.

Eastport was given its name because it served as the port of contact with other towns and villages. It was to this shipping and supply port that plantation owners and armers brought their produce for shipment to market and it was from this port that manufactured goods and supplies from other parts of the country were obtained. Wagon trains traveled by day and camped at well-known camping grounds at night. A trip from Iuka to Eastport usually required three days and nights. Five or six steamboats at a time would often be tied up at Eastport, unloading merchandise and reloading with commodities for shipment to market.

An old timer once told of a trip he made to Eastport when he was 10 years old with his Uncle John from Itawamba County, Mississippi, in a steer wagon. It took six days to make the trip, carrying six bales of cotton in an old homemade tar wagon. The old timer said there were 15 or 20 stores with enormous stocks of groceries and hardware. After Uncle John sold the cotton to a Mr. Briggs and was buying supplies to carry home, he noticed Uncle John frequently visited the open barrels of whiskey stored in a side room. It was raining that day and Uncle John had worn buckskin pants. As they got wet and stretched, he kept cutting off the legs with his knife. When they stopped to camp that

night, Uncle John's britches got dry and crawled up to his knees. He had to go back to Eastport and buy him another pair.

As the last of the Chickasaw Indians left in 1837 for their new home in Indian Territory, many white families moved into the new country to establish homes and take advantage of the newly opened territory. Although no data has been found on record to prove its population, tradition says Eastport was a thriving town of some 2,000 people. There were manufacturers, carpenters, shoe makers, saddle makers, tanners, millers, merchants, cabinet makers, physicians, druggists, farmers, and traders of all sorts who came to settle at Eastport.

Two Governors of the State of Mississippi first settled at Eastport. Governor John M. Stone came to Eastport about 1854 from Milan, Tennessee, where he had been a school teacher. He clerked in a store in Eastport for a time before moving to Iuka to become station agent for the Memphis & Charleston Railroad, later known as the Southern Railroad.

Governor Robert Lowery moved from South Carolina with his father to Eastport in 1840 when he was nine years old. He then went to Smith County at the age of 10 years to live with an uncle, and from Smith County, he became

Governor in 1881.

George Price Hamnerly, born in Athens, Ala., in 1829, came to Eastport, Miss., at the age of 21 years and accepted a position as a salesman for A. T. Matthews. Mr. Matthews came to Eastport from Virginia.

John H. Doan, a merchant, was born in South Carolina. Mr. and Mrs. Doan located at Eastport where they reared 10 children.

Among others at Eastport were: J. M. Nelson, merchant from S.C.; Thomas Billings, grocer, Tenn.; John Briggs, merchant, Ireland; George Wingo, saddler, Ala.; J. Wheelock, carpenter, Mass.; W. B. Terry, planter, Tenn.; J. H. Hill, trader, England; John Barnett, farmer, S.C.; W. H. Muse, merchant, N.C.; Samuel Dewoody, druggist, Tenn.; R. T. Rutledge, merchant, S.C.; H. S. Brown, merchant, Va.; George Shehan, clerk, Ireland; Amber Bugg, farmer, Ga.; A. M. Scruggs, physician, Tenn.; J. B. Moore, physician, S.C.; Dan Castleberry, farmer, Ga.; J. McMahan, farmer, Ireland; G. W. Harvey, physician, Ireland.

Eastport had her part in the Civil War. In one instance, after the Battle of Shiloh, the Federal gunboats pushed up the river and assembled at Eastport. A report from Brig. Gen. Sherman's headquarters at Shiloh, dated April 2, 1862, says "Eastport Landing during the late freshet must have been about 12 feet water, but at the present stage the landing is the best I have seen on the Tennessee River. The levee is clear of trees and snags, and a hundred boats could land there without confusion." His object was to dislodge the enemy from batteries recently erected near Eastport. The old "breast works" thrown up throughout the hills surrounding Eastport are still plainly visible and souvenir hunters still rake the hill sides for relics of the Battle at Eastport.

A detachment of 500 men and three cannons had been sent from Gen. Forrest's headquarters in North Alabama to Eastport. They took a position on the hill overlooking the river landing and at daybreak opened fire on the Federal gunboats lying at anchor in the river. The Federals cut loose from anchor and pushed off to drift out of range of the cannon fire. This left the Union soldiers in camp near the landing in panic. Many Negroes had attached themselves to the Union forces, and remembering what had happened to the Negroes in another battle a short time before, they were seized with consternation. A great number of Negroes plunged into the river and tried to swim to the retreating gunboats and hundreds drowned, according to the report. Forrest's men, who were few in number compared with the Union forces, soon withdrew, having accomplished their mission of putting fear into the Union forces. The main struggle at Eastport occurred October 14, 1862.

The first post office was established at Eastport on May 30, 1842, with John Buttrill as postmaster. Those who followed were: Samuel Dewoody, Sept. 23, 1850; Wm. C. Phillips, April 30, 1856; Joseph S. Leake, Feb. 12, 1857; Wm. C. Phillips, Aug. 6, 1857; James H. Gillespie, May 5, 1858; John B. Alexander, Nov. 9, 1865; Benjamin Bence, Aug. 18, 1869; Wm. H. Banner, June 15, 1877; John W. Price, Aug. 18, 1879; Pinkney H. Davis, Sept. 13, 1880; Wm. H. Banner, Oct. 12, 1881. The office was "discontinued to Iuka" on Dec. 18, 1883, but was re-established April 28, 1887, with Amelia Price as postmaster. It was discontinued again to Iuka on Nov. 9, 1889, but was re-established Feb. 20, 1892, with Rufus Skinner as postmaster. The post office was finally discontinued on Dec. 12, 1892.

Mr. Skinner was also the last merchant left after Eastport had met its doom. In 1892, he still conducted a general mercantile business in an old rundown shingled building, some 30 feet wide and 75 feet long. A number of similar buildings were along what had been "Main Street," but they were being used by colored families who had taken possession of them for living quarters. A few comparatively nice dwellings still remained at this time and were occupied by local farmers.

All went well with Eastport until the coming of the railroad. When the railroad surveys were made those in charge of the enterprise made propositions to the people of Eastport looking to

building of the road by that place. They asked for a donation of \$50,000 as a bonus. The short-sighted people at Eastport refused to do anything, probably thinking the railroad would necessarily be forced to come by, and at that time, they had good transportation by water anywhere. After it was too late, they saw their error and read the doom of their town. The railroad was completed in 1855.

Who the first white settlers were will never be known. Living so far from civilization, there were no gravestones erected to mark the last resting place of these pioneers.

Later when the town of Eastport ceased to exist, sacrilegious plows are said to have desecrated the graves of those where tombstones were erected. A few who were buried in private grounds are still intact, but they are not among the earliest settlers.

The hand of time has completed its work and now the town of Eastport is no more. Eastport is now a boat dock and fishing resort. The Pickwick Reservoir Waterfront, which surrounds the scenic hills of Old Eastport, is flanked with beautiful homes and cabins where owners come to enjoy the peace and solitude of this lovely spot.

To those who know its history and love its stories and legends, Eastport must always be an enshrined place. It was through

this port that many of our ancestors came more than a hundred years ago to establish homes and tame the wild country. In its ruin there is glory!

## LEGAL NOTICE

## ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE, PURCHASE, POSSESSION, DISTRIBUTION, SALE OR OFFERING FOR SALE OF SYNTHETIC CANNABINOIDS OR OTHER SYNTHETIC PRODUCTS

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi have determined that certain substances are being sold in the County of Tishomingo, Mississippi, that, when ingested, produce intoxicating effects similar to THC or marijuana and/or ethcathinone; and

WHEREAS, the substances described below are not yet categorized as illegal controlled substances under state or federal law; and

WHEREAS, the substances described below are often used as an alternative to marijuana and other controlled substances and are potentially dangerous to users; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the effects of these substances are a health concern to the citizens of Tishomingo County, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tishomingo County, Mississippi, have determined the need to establish regulations preventing the use, possession, purchase, distribution, sale or attempt to use, possess, purchase, distribute or sale or publicly display for sale any one or more of the following chemicals or substances within Tishomingo County, Mississippi; and therefore adopt the following regulations and penalties.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 21-13-11 of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1972), this Ordinance Prohibiting the Use, Purchase, Possession, Distribution, Sale or Offering for Sale of Synthetic Cannabinoids or other Synthetic Products is for the immediate and temporary preservation for the public peace, health and safety, and shall become effective immediately upon its adoption, and prior to being recorded and published, as the best interests of the public will be served by the immediate effectiveness of this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Tishomingo, Mississippi, as follows:

## PROHIBITION OF THE USE, PURCHASE, POSSESSION, DISTRIBUTION, SALE OR OFFERING FOR SALE OF SYNTHETIC CANNABINOIDS OR OTHER SYNTHETIC PRODUCTS

## Section 1. Prohibition

No person shall use, possess, purchase, distribute, sell or attempt to use, possess, purchase, distribute or sell or publicly display for sale any one or more of the following chemicals within Tishomingo County, Mississippi:

(A) Salviadinorum or salvinorum A: all parts of the plant presently classified as savia divinorum, whether growing or not, the seed thereof an extract from any part of such plant, and every compound, manufacture salts derivative, mixture or preparation of such plant, its seeds or extracts;

(B) (6aR,10aR)-9-(hydroxymethyl)-6,6dimethyl-3-(2methyloctan-2-yl)-6a,7,10, 10a-tetrahydrobenzo[c]chromen-1-ol- some trade or other names: HU-210;

(C) 1-Pentyl-3-(1-naphthoyl) indole- some trade or other names: JWH-018/spice;

(D) 1-Butyl-3-(1-naphthoyl) indole- some trade or other names: JWH-073;

(E) 1-(3-(trifluoromethylphenyl)) piperazine- some trade or other names: TFMP;

(F) 4-methoxymethcathione and Ethylcathinone;

(G) or any similar structural analogs.

If any of the aforementioned substances shall be found in the possession of any person, unless specifically excluded herein, substances shall be confiscated and destroyed by law enforcement officials.

## Section 2. Exemption

It shall not be an offense under this Ordinance if a person shall be acting in the direction of an authorized agent of the County of Tishomingo, Mississippi, to enforce or ensure compliance with this Ordinance prohibiting the use, possession, purchase, distribution or sale or attempt to use, possess, purchase or sell or publicly display for sale the aforementioned substances.

This Ordinance shall not apply to any person who shall commit any act described in this Ordinance pursuant to the direction or prescription of a duly licensed physician or dentist authorized to direct or prescribe such act. This Ordinance shall not apply to the inhalation of anesthesia for medical or dental purposes, which, inhalation of anesthesia shall be administered by or under the supervision of a duly licensed physician or dentist.

## Section 3. Penalties

Any person found to be guilty of violating this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisonment not exceeding six (6) months.

All provisions of the ordinances of the County of Tishomingo in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed and all other provisions of the ordinances of the County of Tishomingo not in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, legal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so adjudged to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional.

This ordinance shall become effective immediately. The Clerk of the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors shall cause the ordinance to be published in a local newspaper with a general circulation in the County of Tishomingo.

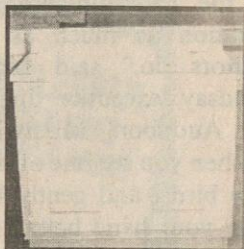
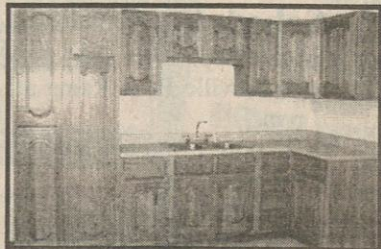

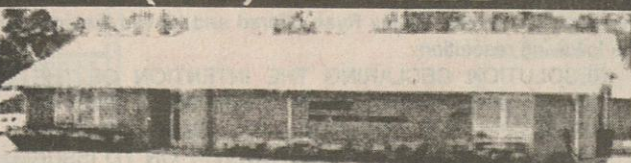
