The Tishomingo County vill sorsheriff's Department has made nd poseveral arrests in the past few e speweeks in its ongoing battle against seed, legal drugs in the county.

August 31st, Audie Parker, ited to 42, and Kim Blunt, 43, were ding charged with conspiracy to dis-nform ribute oxycodone after the Alsissipp corn County Sheriff's Departsion (ment arrested them on behalf of 6 or the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Tishor Department, said Sheriff Glenn and Whitlock. Parker was already on strict probation for methamphetaminet, luk related convictions. The case is 423-still under investigation.

September 7th, Jacky South, 52, and Tanya Savell, 22, were e ren tharged with possession of methnt we amphetamine, after an investin ear ration that indicated South and Gree Gavell had been purchasing precursor chemicals at a local busi-

ness, reported Whitlock. Officers searched a vehicle occupied by Savell, and later gained consent to search the residence of Savell and South on County Road 982, where they seized one gram of methamphetamine. Savell was charged with conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine, and both South and Savell were indicted by Alcorn County for possession with intent to manufacture methamphetamine.

September 16th, the sheriff's department joined the Iuka Police Department in a search of William Cody McVay's residence at 72 County Road 246. William McVay has been charged with possession of cocaine with intent to distribute, and Allison Yvonne McVay, of the same address, was charged with conspiracy to distribute, said Whitlock.

Repealing their instructions, ssied two weeks ago, to all couny departments to cut 10 percent fom their budgets, the Tishomin-© County Board of Supervisors istead approved a plan to spend only regular, necessary overhead, ke utilities, and adopt an "emercy only" plan for spending bove and beyond that. Vote was st, 3rd, and 5th districts for; 2nd and 4th districts against.

"The department heads had lready cut everything they could when they submitted their budget equests to us," said First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom. Additional cuts would mean cutting staff."

The board met with Al Harris, of CIG Construction, who reported that his company is ready and willing to begin construction on the new county jail and would like to be taking advantage of upcoming good weather.

The Board has met with bond attorney Kelly Hardwick, of Jackson, and reported that financing will not be in place to pay the contractor before December 1st, without spending money from the general fund, or using an interim loan that might negate the interest savings anticipated from the cur-

Last Friday's game was summed up afterwards by several people: So Close!!

Many TC fans thought the Braves had a good chance for their second win of the season over the 0-3 Corinth Warriors in Friday night's game, and their performance had everyone's hope up. It was one of those games when the score didn't seem to properly reflect the effort of the team.

The Braves defense looked the best it's looked all year, and they gave Corinth quarterback Lew Johnson plenty of stress that helped keep the Warrior offense to only 209 yards.

In the next 15 seconds, Corinth had answered TC's score with an 80-yard touchdown run by Kendrick Williams, ensuring the lead with 17.
