## Authorities Charge Six in Recent Meth, Cocaine Cases

The Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department has made several arrests in the past few weeks in its ongoing battle against illegal drugs in the county.

August 31st, Audie Parker, 42, and Kim Blunt, 43, were charged with conspiracy to distribute oxycodone after the Alcorn County Sheriff's Department arrested them on behalf of the Tishomingo County Sheriff's Department, said Sheriff Glenn Whitlock. Parker was already on probation for methamphetamine-related convictions. The case is still under investigation.

September 7th, Jacky South, 52, and Tanya Savell, 22, were charged with possession of methamphetamine, after an investigation that indicated South and Savell had been purchasing precursor chemicals at a local busi-

ness, reported Whitlock. Officers searched a vehicle occupied by Savell, and later gained consent to search the residence of Savell and South on County Road 982, where they seized one gram of methamphetamine. Savell was charged with conspiracy to manufacture methamphetamine, and both South and Savell were indicted by Alcorn County for possession with intent to manufacture methamphetamine.

September 16th, the sheriff's department joined the Iuka Police Department in a search of William Cody McVay's residence at 72 County Road 246. William McVay has been charged with possession of cocaine with intent to distribute, and Allison Yvonne McVay, of the same address, was charged with conspiracy to distribute, said Whitlock.

## County Adopts "Emergency Only" Spending; Makes Plan to Begin Jail in December

In Monday's meeting, county supervisors changed a previous order for 10 percent across the board cuts in all departments, and made plans for the jail contractor to start construction in November or December when financing comes through.

Repealing their instructions, issued two weeks ago, to all county departments to cut 10 percent from their budgets, the Tishomingo County Board of Supervisors instead approved a plan to spend only regular, necessary overhead, like utilities, and adopt an "emergency only" plan for spending above and beyond that. Vote was 1st, 3rd, and 5th districts for; 2nd and 4th districts against.

"The department heads had already cut everything they could when they submitted their budget requests to us," said First District Supervisor Brandon Grissom. Additional cuts would mean cut-

ting staff."

The board met with Al Harris, of CIG Construction, who reported that his company is ready and willing to begin construction on the new county jail and would like to be taking advantage of upcoming good weather.

The Board has met with bond attorney Kelly Hardwick, of Jackson, and reported that financing will not be in place to pay the contractor before December 1st, without spending money from the general fund, or using an interim loan that might negate the interest savings anticipated from the current plan.

Third District's Supervisor Danny Ryan moved that they should go ahead and proceed with getting the architect to issue a notice to proceed, with the understanding with Harris that building will start after December 1st. Vote was 1st, 3rd, and 5th districts for; 2nd and 4th districts against.

7. Reasonable care will be used at all times in handling entries, but entries will not be insured. The Tishomingo County Fair

Board will not be responsible for any loss or damages whatsoever.

8. All entries are eligible and will be judged for awards. A qualified judge will make selections for cash awards before the opening of the Fair. NO prize will be awarded in the absence of a quality entry.
9. Artwork will be accepted Monday, October 5th, from 11:00 a.m. -7:00 p.m. at the fairgrounds.

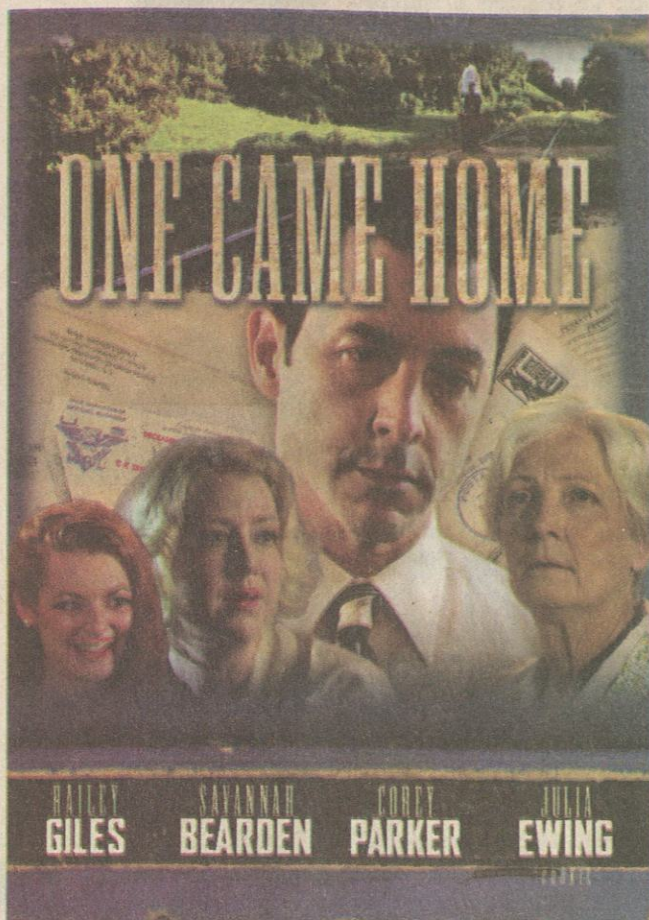
## One Came Home Tells Story of Mississippi Family in 1946
